No additional phones may be ordered without the permission of sports information director Mel Franks. Telephones for games at the Anaheim Convention Center must be ordered through Pacific Telephone in Anaheim (714) 972-7511.

SCOUTS: Requests should be made at least one week in advance.

PARKING: The closest area is the coin-operated (two quarters to get out) lot immediately west of Titan Gym. Toll gates usually are in operation Monday thru Thursday nights. At the Anaheim Convention Center, show your credential at the employees' entrance on West Street.

# CAL STATE FULLERTON CAMPUS

California State University, Fullerton, is a relatively young institution, having opened only 22 years ago. However, it already has grown to more than 23,000 students and achieved national distinction.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 81 degree programs — 39 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain onthe-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Yet another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A more recent development is formation of a professional caliber symphony orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with high-quality music.


An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has recently embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make the university the foremost bachelor's-master's degree institution in the nation.

# Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President



State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and Professor of Zoology for seven years. Previously, she was Professor of Biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.

# Coach George McQuarn



When George McQuarn arrived at Cal State Fullerton prior to the 1980-81 season he wanted to downplay his reputation as a recruiter, an assignment he had performed so proficiently during a four-year term as an assistant to Jerry Tarkanian at Nevada-Las Vegas. But after the crop of new players he harvested for this season, it will be a difficult tag to erase.

McQuarn recruited six players — three from the junior college ranks and three high school seniors — with credentials strong enough for the group to be ranked second to only UCLA among West Coast universities. Add the presence of transfers Leon Wood and George Hawthorne from their redshirt seasons and you have the foundation for a

revived basketball program.

In McQuarn's mind, the 1981-82 season represents his "rookie" year at Cal State Fullerton. He refers to his first season with the Titans as "those horror films on the shelf."

"We're starting from scratch as far as I'm concerned," said McQuarn, 40, who was appointed March 8, 1980 to replace Bobby Dye. "We're pro-

ceeding as if it never occurred."

After a tremendous winning record on the high school level and then at UNLV, McQuarn had to make drastic adjustments last year. He was forced to abandon the fast-paced offense with which he always had been associated for a more deliberate style that better suited his available personnel.

McQuarn's inheritance from a once-proud program consisted of two returning part-time players and a senior redshirt who had been dropped by Fresno State. He brought in two talented freshmen in Victor Green and David Gilreath and a standout junior college transfer in Michael Anderson and molded a remarkably competitive unit. The Titans played many close games including four overtime defeats and their ability to register two late-season upsets with their patient play testified to McQuarn's coaching ability.

At UNLV the Rebels were an explosive "run and gun" team. They reached the final four of the NCAA Championship Tournament in 1977 and gained the semifinals of the National Invitational Tournament in his last season (1979-80) with a

23-9 record.

Players recruited to UNLV by McQuarn include Michael Loyd, Flintie Williams, Sid Green, Michael Johnson, Larry Anderson, Richard Box, Michael Burns and Greg Goorjian. Some of that talent came back to haunt him when the Rebels beat McQuarn's Titans last Fall in the Los Angeles Times Classic.



# **Assistant Coach John Sneed**


Experience with winning programs at the Division I level and a remarkably successful record as a high school coach make John Sneed a valued assistant to

George McQuarn.

Sneed was an assistant for one year at the University of Arizona, a 21-6 season (1976-77) which took the Wildcats into the NCAA playoffs. During 1977-78 he was an assistant at San Diego State and the 19-8 Aztecs won the regular season PCAA title before being eliminated in the season-ending tournament by Cal State Fullerton. He also was at San Diego for the 1978-79 season.

Sneed, 33, succeeded McQuarn at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles in 1974 and won the CIF 4A title and CIF Coach of the Year honors with a 30-2 record. The next two seasons the Eagles won two more Camino Real League titles with 28-1 and 23-5 seasons which gave Sneed a career mark of 81-8 for a .910 winning

percentage.

# **Assistant Coach Phil Mathews**

First-hand knowledge of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association and a winning background on the high school level are two of the major assets Phil Mathews brings to the Titans' basketball program.

Mathews, 30, played and coached at the University of California, Irvine and most recently served as head basketball coach at Santa Ana Valley High School before assuming his new role at Fullerton for this

season.

A graduate of North High School in Riverside where he was an All-League and All-County selection in 1967-68, Mathews played two years at Riverside City College for coach Bill Mulligan and then transferred to Irvine where he played under coach Tim Tift. Mathews was a third quard as a senior and averaged 5.2 points as UCI went 16-14 and participated in the Division II regional playoffs.



After obtaining a bachelor's degree in social science in 1972, Mathews remained at Irvine as an assistant to Tift and during that five-season period the Anteaters were 70-65.

While coaching, he earned his master's degree at UCI in education.

In 1977, Mathews moved to Santa Ana Valley where he posted three winning seasons. The Falcons were 12-10 his rookie year and then won a pair of Century League championships with a 22-5 mark in 1978-79 and an 18-7 slate last season. His three-year record was 52-22. Among his players last year was current Titan forward Tony Neal.

Music is Mathews' primary interest away from the gymnasium. The Riverside native is

single and lives in Santa Ana.

McQuarn's career includes a phenomenal tenure at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles where he started out with a 25-0 record as the freshman coach and between 1969 and 1973 won four consecutive CIF titles on three different level of competition. The final team went 32-1 on the AAAA (highest) level and completed McQuarn's prep career at 123-8 for a .939 winning percentage.

David Greenwood, Roy Hamilton, Raymond Lewis and former Titans Donny Daniels and Keith Anderson are some of the Eagles who played for McQuarn.

An appointment as the Recreation Superintendent for the City of Compton Jured McQuarn away from Verbum Dei but he returned to coaching with the UNLV appointment in 1976.

A Fresno native, McQuarn graduated from Centennial High in Compton where he earned all-CIF honors in basketball and baseball. He attended Compton College where he was selected to the JC All-America baseball team.

A baseball scholarship took McQuarn to UCLA where he earned all-West Coast honors as a catcher. He graduated from Long Beach State in 1966 with a degree in physical education.

McQuarn and wife Jacqueline have two children (Tracey, 14, and Michael, 12) and live in Long Beach.

#### 1981-82 SEASON PREVIEW

Cal State Fullerton may be the most improved major college basketball team in the nation. Joining three returning starters from last year's 4-23 squad are two transfers from the University of Arizona, two junior college standouts and three outstanding freshmen recruits.

"We are pretty solid at four of the five positions but we're also a very, very young team," said coach George McQuarn, who officially is in his second year with the Titans.

"This is our first year and we're starting from scratch as far as I'm concerned," he said. "Last season is locked up in those horror films on the shelf and we're proceeding as if it never occurred.

"We have excellent perimeter shooting and good depth. We have good team speed up and down the court and pretty good quickness from side to side on the court. We will be working on becoming a good defensive team. We don't want to have any selfish defensive players — someone who won't give up his body to take a charge for the team."

In blending a variety of newcomers, McQuarn hopes to come up with a "starting eight" lineup.

"We want everyone to play as hard as he can for as long as he can and not pace himself," said McQuarn. "We didn't have the luxury of such depth a year ago. There should be no difference among the eight — they're all as good as each other. But all eight guys must accept the concept."

Center George Hawthorne holds one of the keys to the team's success. He had an outstanding freshman season at Arizona but then developed a viral infection which impeded his progress as a sophomore. After sitting out last year, he's got a virtual two-year layoff to overcome. Backup center Keith Stephens doesn't provide the offensive firepower of Hawthorne, who scored as many as 30 points in a game at Arizona.

The forward and guard spots are much deeper. Senior captain Michael Anderson and sophomore Victor Green return up front but they are being pushed by freshman Tony Neal and JC transfer Darrell Vetter. Anderson was slowed in the conditioning program by a stress fracture in his right tibia but he was the team's No. 2 scorer and rebounder as a junior.

David Gilreath, who made the PCAA All-Freshmen team last year with Green, returns at guard but faces the challenge of a trio of outstanding shooters in Leon Wood, Gary Davis and Ricky Mixon.

Wood, a sophomore transfer from Arizona, holds the California high school scoring record with 2,693 points for St. Monica's High School. Davis, from Compton High, was rated as good as anyone coming out of southern California last year and Mixon may have been the best shooter among California JC's.

And don't forget freshman Darrell Patterson from Long Beach Poly's CIF championship club. He doesn't shoot with the aforementioned trio but his defense and all-around savvy will earn him some playing time if he can sufficiently recover from minor knee surgery performed in September.

"With the exception of Long Beach State, our December schedule is the toughest in the conference," says McQuarn. "Pepperdine tied for the WCAC championship last year and has all five people back. Portland has the fifth winningest record on the West

Coast over the last few years and they expect to win the WCAC this year."

The Titans' schedule features at least three teams which are either nationally ranked or were in the NCAA playoffs last year. BYU knocked UCLA out of the tourney and the Titans draw St. Joseph's, which eliminated DePaul, in the Nike Classic at Santa Barbara. In the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, Fullerton opens with highly rated Wichita State and then faces either Michigan State or North Carolina State.

McQuarn rates U.C. Irvine the team to beat in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association

with defending champion Fresno State a strong challenger.

"With all five starters back and a player as strong as Kevin Magee, I've got to go with Irvine," said McQuarn, who has added Phil Mathews from Santa Ana Valley High School as an assistant along with John Sneed. "Irvine has better depth at point guard this year and they have a chance to build some confidence during their December schedule.

"Fresno State controlled games last year with its defense and they lost the two key guys — guard Bobby Anderson and center Pete Verhoeven. They've got some redshirts

who may be better but those are two tough people to replace."

A quartet consisting of San Jose State, U.C. Santa Barbara, Long Beach State and Fullerton falls in the next category.

"San Jose lost four of its top seven players but the Spartans have a little tradition going and excellent coaching. They believe in their system.

"Santa Barbara won more games than we or Pacific did last year and they lost only

one player and had a good recruiting year. They filled their needs.

"Long Beach is a mystery team. Anybody who could blow out Las Vegas the way they did and then lose to us by 13 points in the same year is a mystery. They have a lot of redshirts to fit into the scheme and they have to replace Dave Shutts and Craig Dykema.

"I don't see Pacific or Utah State being any better than they were last year. Pacific lost the finest player they've ever had there in Ron Cornelius and Utah State lost 75 per cent of their offensive punch."

And what about the Titans?

"We're just anxious to get going. Like I said, as far as I'm concerned, this is our first year."






