

**109T. Topics in Art History (1-3; max 3 per area) (Former Art 105T)**

Specific areas in art history not normally covered in the regular course offering. Possible topical areas include African, Pre-Columbian, Primitive, Early Migrations, American Indians, Buddhism, Chinese Painting, Happenings, Cinematography, Picasso, Duchamp.

**Western Art Surveys\*****120. Italian Renaissance (4) (Former Art 105T)**

Artistic revival of classical antiquity in Italy between 1300-1550.

**122. Northern Renaissance (4) (Former Art 171)**

Painting and sculpture from the Netherlands, France and Germany between 1300-1550.

**124. Italian Baroque (4) (Former Art 105T)**

Baroque art from its conception in Rome to its dispersal throughout Italy.

**126. Northern Baroque (4) (Former Art 105T)**

Diffusion of Italian Baroque art to the Netherlands, France, Spain, Germany and Austria between 1600-1700.

**128. Rococo to Neoclassicism (4) (Former Art 105T)**

European art during the eighteenth century.

**130. Nineteenth Century (4) (Former Art 105T)**

Painting and sculpture from neoclassicism (1800) to symbolism (1900).

**132. Twentieth Century (4) (Former Art 174)**

Painting, sculpture and architecture from Post Impressionist (1875) to the present.

**134. America (4) (Former Art 176)**

Art from colonial times to 1945.

**136. Art Since 1945 (4) (Former Art 175)**

Prerequisite: Art H 132, or permission of instructor. Topics on the visual arts since WWII.

**Asian Art Surveys\*****140. India (4) (Former Art 177)**

Painting, sculpture, and architecture of India-Asia starting with the Indus Valley civilization.

**142. China (4) (Former Art 178)**

Painting, sculpture, and architecture of China, starting with the Yellow River culture.

**144. Japan (4) (Former Art 179)**

Painting, sculpture, and architecture of Japan starting with the prehistoric Joman era.

**Primitive Art Surveys\*****160. Africa (4) (Former Art 105T)**

Sculpture, painting, architecture, festivals and personal adornment of sub-Saharan Africa.

**162. Oceania (4) (Former Art 105T)**

Art of the Pacific basin, including Australia.

**Art of the Americas Surveys\*****170. North American Indian and Eskimo (4) (Former Art 105T)**

Arts of the indigenous North American cultures from the Arctic to the American Southwest.
