

CSUCI Student Programming Board to Host Annual Picnic

Camarillo, Calif., April 16, 2009 - CSU Channel Islands Student Programming Board is hosting their annual SPB Picnic Saturday, April 18 from 3 to 8 p.m. in the North Quad on campus. The event serves as the culmination of the Student Programming Board's "Battle of the Majors" week and features food, fun, family and music. This year's picnic theme is "All 1 Earth."

John West, a barefoot musician from Louisiana, will be opening for the nationally-recognized power-pop band Cute Is What We Aim For. The group will be headlining a concert scheduled in the evening.
