VCCW Status of Women and Girls Scope of Work

The consult will oversee the five-phases of the VCCW Study of Women and Girls in Ventura County, including keeping the project on task and on time with a start date of April 1. A draft of the entire project should be completed by September 2012. The deadlines for completion may change if the VCCW-VCCF agree to the change. Specifically, the consultant will oversee completion of Phase I, updating the secondary demographic information with the most up-to-date Census data; Phase II, the consultant will work with the VCCW to find experts and partners to comment and develop conclusions on the data; Phase III, the consultant with the help of research assistants will coordinate and conduct community focus groups/and or town hall meetings. That work will include compiling tables, gathering nonprofit and government data; Phase IV, the consultant will oversee the editing process along with the VCCW including developing appendices, figures and tables and baseline measures for future monitoring of women's progress in Ventura County; Phase V, the consultant will assist in distribution including developing strategies for distribution, fact sheets and key findings. In addition, the consultant will oversee the basic training of members of the Ventura County Commission for Women and student research assistants involved in the collection of data and any work needed to assist with the project as outlined.
