

MEDIA INFORMATION

The sports information office is located on the back porch of Titan House (1302-A), across the street and to the east of the gymnasium.

PRESS ROOM: Room 162 in the eastern wing of the gymnasium building serves as the press room for Titan basketball. Three telephones are available.

PRESS TABLE: Located on the south side of the playing floor, behind the scorer's table. A limited number of working spots are available.

OFFICIAL GAME SUMMARIES: Will be collated and distributed in Room 162 of the gymnasium building. Halftime box scores, play by play accounts and final box scores will be provided.

TELEPHONES: There is one telephone at the press table — (714) 773-3970 — which must be kept free for messages, scores, etc. Additional telephones can *not* be installed at the press table.

RADIO: The broadcast position is adjacent to the scorer's table. A telephone will be provided the designated commercial station for each visiting school in Titan Gym at a fee of \$25 per game, payable in advance to "Associated Students" (no charge for PCAA member institutions). No additional phones may be installed. Use (714) 773-3970 as your trouble number.

LOCKER ROOMS: Located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. George McQuarn will conduct post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office.

CREDENTIALS: Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. When time permits, credentials will be mailed. If not, Press Will Call is located at the western entrance to the gymnasium.

SCOUTS: Requests should be made at least one week in advance.

PARKING: Except on Monday thru Thursday evenings, ample free parking is available in the lot immediately west of the Gymnasium. On Monday thru Thursday evenings, parking is available only in Lot A at the northwest corner of campus. Requests made at least three days in advance will be granted complimentary passes. Otherwise two quarters are required upon entry for a daily permit.



CAL STATE FULLERTON CAMPUS



California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. Having first offered classes in 1959, the university has grown to 23,000 students and achieved national distinction.

In 1984, the university will host team handball competition at the Summer Olympics. It also will begin its 25th anniversary observance with the theme "Honoring the Past—Creating the Future."

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes: many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, nursing, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 82 degree programs—40 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-iob experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Still another strong point is the university's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances and the Cabaret Repertory Theater Company, which performs regularly in Brea.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Commitment to Mindpower." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.

ADMINISTRATION



Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980 to replace Dr. L. Donald Shields, who had resigned after a ten-year term to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Cobb had served as Dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglas appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and professor of Zoology for seven years. Previously, she was Professor of Biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology

from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.

TITAN ATHLETIC FOUNDATION

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization that exists solely to aid the athletic scholarship program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals with a genuine interest in athletics, the University and the community.

The foundation supports athletics by providing funds for scholarships that insure an effective re-

cruiting program which attracts the best athletes available. The 1983 drive totaled nearly \$150,000.

The TAF was founded in January, 1973 and the initital 150 members raised approximately \$30,000. Membership today totals more than 800.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first president. He was succeeded by Don Karcher, president of Carl Karcher Enterprises; Buck Johns, president of Home Works; Larry Slagle, vice president of Yellow Cab of North Orange County; and most recently Jim Woods, president and chairman of the board of Baker Oil Tools.

ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT



Lynn Eilefson, Athletic Director

Lynn Eilefson brought a background of fund-raising, marketing and stadium construction to Cal State Fullerton and his expertise in those areas already has shone brightly during his tenure.

Long dormant plans for a joint venture by the University and the city of Fullerton to erect a Youth Sports Complex featuring football/soccer and baseball stadiums have been revitalized with funding arranged and a 1985 completion date targeted. An "Orange Crush" theme for Orange County's largest intercollegiate sports program has been adopted and the most ambitious fund-raising goals in Titan Athletic Foundation history have been set.

"Cal State Fullerton has a great amount of untapped potential for an excellent program of intercollegiate athletics woven within

an outstanding academic framework," said Eilefson upon his Apr. 1 1982 appointment.

"I have no doubt that, with a proper perspective, we can strike a balance between academic and athletic excellence while building a most successful sports program."

Eilefson came to Fullerton after serving as senior assistant director at UCLA where he was responsible for alumni and booster liaison, marketing, promotions and sports information. He previously served for eight and a half years at Fresno State University in a variety of positions including associate athletic director, coordinator of the stadium development fund and six years as executive director of the Bulldog Foundation. Prior to that he held posts at Lawrence University and Montana State University.

At Fresno State he drew up a capital fund campaign to build its 30,000 seat on-campus stadium. He raised cash contributions from \$30,000 to more than \$500,000 during his term and also launched the "Red Wave" mania that has captured the San Joaquin Valley.

Eilefson is a 1957 graduate of the University of Montana with a degree in Business Marketing Management. He and wife Bev live in Placentia. His children are all graduates of Fresno State University, and make their home in Fresno.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

Success in the classroom as well as on the court is the goal of Cal State Fullerton basketball coach George McQuarn and he has responded by establishing an academic enrichment program for his student-athletes.

"While I believe an athlete is responsible for his academic progress, I also believe it is the responsibility of a coach to establish an atmosphere and environment conducive to academic success." said McQuarn.

The program has been accelerated with the recent appointment of Alison Cone as the Athletic Academic Coordinator. She will be assisting the student-athletes in reaching their academic goals by organizing a tutorial program, study halls and advisement sessions. Foundation and developmental classes also will be made available to help perfect basic skills.

Another requirement for athletes will be enrollment in a Speech Communications class. Coach McQuarn believes this effort will help enhance verbal communication skills necessary in the classroom and future career endeavors.

To assist freshmen and transfer student-athletes in making a successful transition to Cal State Fullerton, a college preparation and career orientation course will be offered during their first semester on campus. They receive information on and are encouraged to use the many campus support services which will further assist them in achieving their personal, academic and career goals.

"We are a goal-oriented program and the graduation of our players is an important goal to me," said McQuarn.

George McQuarn enters his fourth season as head basketball coach at Cal State Fullerton riding the crest of a wave of momentum which has seen him turn a barren program into one commanding national attention.

The Titans were the nation's most improved team in 1981-82 with an 18-14 record and they continued that growth through a most memorable 1982-83 season. They set a school record for regular season victories (21-8), posted their best-ever PCAA mark (12-4), earned their first berth in the National Invitation Tournament and defeated the nation's No. 1 ranked and last unbeaten team — Nevada-Las Vegas — before an overflow crowd in Titan Gym, where they were undefeated in 13 games.

McQuarn's accomplishments did not go unnoticed by his peers as he was selected District 15 Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

"We had a tremendous year," said McQuarn, 42. "If someone had told me before the year started what we were about to accomplish, I wouldn't have believed him.

"As we became more successful through the course of the season, I think our expectations got greater and losing our final three games was a disappointing way to finish up. But looking back, we accomplished a lot. Even after we were 8-2 we looked at the remaining schedule and couldn't find 12 more wins.

"We moved up from third to second place in the conference. If Nevada-Las Vegas hadn't come into the PCAA last year, we would have been the champions. We were the only team to beat them, which was a great achievement for our program."

The possibility of winning 39 games in two years was far from McQuarn's mind on March 8, 1980 when he was hired at Fullerton. Two returning part-time players from a 12-15 team and a senior redshirt who had been dropped by a conference rival were the nucleus of his first squad.

"I think people forget how far the program had dropped," said McQuarn. "We've come a long way and in a hurry, at least a year ahead of my schedule. The real challenge today is to sustain the program at its present level."

McQuarn's standards for his program were shaped in great part by his four successful years as an assistant to Jerry Tarkanian at Nevada-Las Vegas, which was 93-28 (.769) during his tenure. He gained a reputation as a top-notch recruiter and it has been enhanced by his performance at Fullerton.

The gem of his first recruiting crop in 1980 was guard Leon Wood, whom he converted from a shooter into a phenomenal point guard over the course of a redshirt season after his transfer from the University of Arizona.

In 1981, McQuarn signed blue chip freshmen Tony Neal and Gary Davis, junior college sharp-shooter Ricky Mixon and Wichita State center Ozell Jones. The following year he landed three top junior college forwards — All-American DeWayne Shepard, All-State Johnny Wilkes and All-Conference Craig Fuller.

This past spring, he corraled the state junior college and the CIF 2A players of the year in guards Darnell Fletcher and Jon Samuelson, respectively.



McQuarn quickly proved himself more than a recruiter during his first year at Fullerton. He molded a young Titan squad into a deliberate unit as opposed to the up-tempo groups of the last two years. This season he hopes to play more aggressively on defense while maintaining the offensive tempo.

While his recruiting and coaching abilities are the more visible of McQuarn's attributes, equally critical to his success at Fullerton have been his attention to discipline and academic success.

"I believe in teaching mental discipline and insisting on total concentration," says McQuarn. "I want my players to play through outside elements they have no control over, including a coach with an aggressive personality. I seek players who are willing to accept this concept."

McQuarn is equally adamant about attention to classroom studies. At UNLV he set up an Academic Support Program and at Fullerton he has established a similar program to assist his

players in succeeding academically.

"We are a goal-oriented program and the graduation of our players is an important goal to me," says McQuarn. "While I believe an athlete is responsible for his academic progress, I also believe it is the responsibility of a coach to create an atmosphere and environment conducive to academic success."

McQuarn graduated from Long Beach State in 1966 with a degree in physical education. He earlier had attended UCLA on a baseball scholarship and earned All-West Coast honors as the Bruins' catcher.

A Fresno native, McQuarn graduated from Centennial High School in Compton where he earned All-CIF honors in basketball and baseball before attending Compton College, where he was selected to the JC All-American baseball team.

McQuarn's coaching career began with a phenomenal tenure at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles. Between 1969 and 1973 he guided the varsity to four consecutive CIF championships and had an overall record of 123-8 (.939).

David Greenwood, Roy Hamilton, Raymond Lewis, former Titan Keith Anderson and current assistant coach Donny Daniels are some of the Eagles who played for McQuarn.

An appointment as the Recreation Superintendent for the City of Compton lured McQuarn away from Verbum Dei, but he returned to coaching with the UNLV appointment in 1976. The 1977 Rebel team reached the final four of the NCAA Championship Tournament and the 1980 squad gained the semifinals of the NIT with a 23-9 record.

JOHN SNEED — is in charge of scouting the opposition and coordinating the academic program and services for members of the basketball team. He also has made a major contribution toward the promotion and marketing of Titan basketball, which has more than doubled attendance during his four-year tenure at Fullerton.

Sneed brought experience with winning Division I programs and remarkably successful high school teams to Fullerton when he became a member of head coach George McQuarn's original

staff in 1980.

Sneed was an assistant for one year at the University of Arizona, a 21-6 season (1976-77) which took the Wildcats into the NCAA playoffs. During 1977-78 he was an assistant at San Diego State and the 19-8 Aztecs won the PCAA title before being eliminated in the post-season tournament by Cal State Fullerton. He also was at San Diego in 1978-79.

Sneed succeeded McQuarn at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles in 1974 and won the CIF 4A title and CIF Coach of the Year honors with a 30-2 record. His Eagles won two more Camino Real League titles with 28-1 and 23-5 seasons and three times he was league coach of the year. His career prep mark was 81-8 (.910) and the 1974 team was recognized as national champion by the National Sport News Service.

A Long Beach State graduate, Sneed served two years as an assistant to McQuarn at Verbum Dei. He is a native of Gastonia, North Carolina.

PHIL MATHEWS — is in charge of recruiting high school and junior college basketball prospects to Cal State Fullerton and coordinates game scheduling. He also assists with scheduling and monitoring classes and tutorial services.

Mathews brought PCAA experience as a player and coach to the Titan staff with his appoint-

ment in 1981 after a highly successful high school coaching career.

Mathews played two years at Riverside City College under coach Bill Mulligan and then transferred to UC Irvine and played for coach Tim Tift. He was the third guard as a senior as UCI went 16-14 and participated in the Division II regional playoffs. Mathews was an all-league and all-county selection at North High School in Riverside.

After obtaining a bachelor's degree in social science in 1972, Mathews remained at Irvine as an

assistant to Tift and during his five-year tenure the Anteaters were 70-65.

After earning a master's degree in education, Mathews moved to Santa Ana Valley in 1977 where he posted three winning seasons. The Falcons were 12-10, 22-5 and 18-7 and won a pair of Century League titles.

DONNY DANIELS — begins his second year on the staff as a part-time assistant. The former Titan player (1974-76) and assistant to former head coach Bobby Dye also worked one year (1981-82) in a volunteer capacity for head coach George McQuarn.

Daniels played two seasons for McQuarn at Verbum Dei High School before attending Los Angeles Harbor College. He played two years under coach Jim White before transferring to

Fullerton, where he was the club's top defensive player in 1975.

SEASON PREVIEW

The Cal State Fullerton basketball program is faced with the formidable challenge in 1983-84 of continuing the pattern of constant, dramatic progress it has achieved during George McQuarn's first three years of coaching.

After logging the greatest improvement of all Division I schools in 1981-82 with an 18-14 record, the Titans last year compiled a 21-8 mark to set a school record for regular-season victories and earn Fullerton its first berth in the National Invitation Tournament. They finished second in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association to Nevada-Las Vegas, which saw its unbeaten season and No. 1 national ranking disappear in a defeat in Titan Gym in late February.

Finding a replacement for sharpshooter Ricky Mixon and getting more point production out of a front line weakened by injuries are the primary goals for McQuarn, who was selected District 15 Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

"We won 39 games the last two seasons with Ricky Mixon and he will be extremely difficult to replace," said McQuarn. "He had a tremendous impact on this program.

"Our physical condition at forward and center also is of great concern. We don't know how much or if DeWayne Shepard can play after knee surgery last spring. And the loss of Craig Fuller to injury on the first day of school is something we aren't prepared to handle. Our depth is non-existent."

Six of last year's top eight regulars return led by All-American point guard Leon Wood, who was selected to play this summer on the United States' team in the Pan American Games. Wood led the Titans in scoring (18.1 ppg) and the nation in assists (11.0) with a collegiate single season record of 319 while earning his second All-PCAA berth.

Six-foot-six juniors Tony Neal, who led the team in rebounding (10.0 rpg), and Gary Davis, who is expected to play more guard than forward this season, are back for their third years in the program. Returning for a second campaign will be centers Ozell Jones (6-11) and forward Johnny Wilkes (6-5) but Shepard is a question mark.

"We really can't count on DeWayne being able to play this year," said McQuarn. "We want that knee to heal completely. He would have made a dramatic difference to our team last year had he been healthy."


With Davis expected to take Mixon's spot at off guard, Wilkes will battle newcomer Rob Otis (6-6) for the small forward position. Otis was an All-Oregon Community College Athletic Association choice from Mt. Hood CC in Gresham. He shot 65.5 per cent from the floor while averaging 17.9 points and 8.8 rebounds in league play on a 21-4 club.

If Davis plays forward, two junior college transfers will be vying for the off guard spot. Darnell Fletcher (6-2) averaged 23.5 points for Pasadena City College last year and was the State JC Player of the Year while Kevin Henderson (6-4) was the top scorer (13.7 ppg) as a freshman at Saddleback College.

Jon Samuelson (6-5) was the CIF 2A Player of the Year as he led Sonora High School to the CIF championship by averaging 16.8 points, 5.6 assists and 9.1 rebounds per game. He is expected to relieve Wood at point guard.

Expected to back up Neal will be transfer Gary Moeller (6-7), who played two seasons at UC Santa Barbara before returning to junior college last year. Oliver Seeley (6-7) is the likely back-up to Jones at center, the position he played at San Fernando High School two years ago.

Fullerton, which has beaten the eventual NIT champion in each of the last two seasons, opens the campaign Nov. 22 by hosting the Australian Olympic team in an exhibition. The Titans begin regular season play Nov. 25 and 27 at the Tip-Off Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii. The Titans play a December tournament in Montana as well and meet strong non-conference foes in Pepperdine, St. Mary's and Arizona.









MOST OFTEN ASKED QUESTIONS OF LEON WOOD

Q.: Why did you pass up the NBA draft last June?

A.: "There really wasn't much of a decision. My mother really wants me to get my degree and I'm real close. And at the time of the draft, my foot was in a cast so my bargaining power would have been low. I also want to play in the Olympics next summer. That's been one of my dreams all along."

Q.: What was your experience at the Pan-Am games like?

A.: "It was different alright. I had to adjust to playing off the ball and without the ball. We had to give it up as soon as we could. The international style of play is quite a change, too."

Q.: Why did you transfer from Arizona?

A.: "From the first day of school there, I just knew it wasn't the place for me. I'd grown up in Santa Monica and there I was out in the middle of the desert. I wanted to leave right away but my mother told me to stick the year out."

Q.: Everyone assumed you were going to UCLA out of high school. What happened?

A.: "They made the coaching change, bringing in Larry Brown, and we thought he might be a little intense. Coach (Larry) Farmer had recruited me real hard and I think he thought I was going there all along."

Q.: Why did you choose Fullerton?

A.: "Coach McQuarn convinced me that I could become a point guard and with my size, that was probably the only way I was going to make it to the NBA. It also was a chance to come back home and help build a program."

Q .: Don't you ever get tired out on the floor?

A.: "Not really. I play two or three games a day in the summer so conditioning isn't a factor. Some guys really bang on me, though, and that can get you down a little."

Q.: How do you feel about all the publicity you have received and being in the media spotlight?

A.: "So far, it's all been pretty positive and I kind of like it. But I try to keep everything in perspective."

"We're really excited about the prospects of all of Orange County and a good portion of the rest of southern California being able to listen to our games," said coach George McQuarn.

Rebenstorf has been the voice of Titan basketball and football for the past three seasons and has done selected baseball games. A native of Danville, Illinois, Rebenstorf covered high school basketball and minor league baseball before moving west in 1971 to UC Riverside.

He served as sports director of KSOM in Ontario and KBON and KMEN in San Bernardino and has covered numerous events.

Fresno State's 69-60 win over DePaul in the championship game of the National Invitation Tournament capped what undoubtedly was the most successful basketball campaign in the 14year history of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association.

Coach Boyd Grant's Bulldogs, who finished fourth in the PCAA's regular season standings and second in its post-season tournament, were one of a record four conference teams to participate in either the NIT or NCAA tournaments and their NIT championship was the first-ever post-season tournament title for a PCAA school.

Establishing itself as one of the top collegiate conferences in the nation, the PCAA compiled the seventh best conference win-loss percentage in the nation against outside NCAA Division I competition, according to figures released by the NCAA's statistics bureau. In fact, the conference's final won-loss record of 61-34 (64.2 percent), was more than 10 percentage points higher than any of the other four major conferences west of the Rocky Mountains.

Even more impressive is the PCAA's top four teams' (UN Las Vegas, Cal State Fullerton, Utah State and Fresno State) combined record of 39-9 (81.2 percent) against outside Division I

Against other conferences on the West Coast, the PCAA compiled the following combined records: Big Sky, 13-7 (65.0%); Pac-10, 4-6 (40.0%); Western Athletic, 8-2 (80.0%); and West Coast Athletic, 17-6 (73.9%) for a total of 42-21 (66.7%). The top four teams had marks of 10-1 against the Big Sky (90.9%), 3-1 against the Pac-10 (75.0%), 6-0 against the WAC (100%), and 6-1 against the WCAC (85.7%) for a remarkable total of 25-3 (89.3%).

The 1982-83 season will also be remembered for a number of other achievements, including the conference's first-ever nationally-ranked No. 1 team — UNLV — which climbed to the top of both the UPI and AP college basketball polls in February after bursting to a 24-0 record.

The PCAA's post-season tournament, held for the first time at the spacious Forum in Inglewood, smashed its all-time attendance record by attracting more than 33,000 customers over its three-day run. The championship game was televised regionally over CBS-TV.

Two PCAA players, UNLV's Sidney Green and Cal State Fullerton's Leon Wood, were honored on numerous post-season All-America teams and UNLV's coach Jerry Tarkanian was named the national Coach-of-the-Year by UPI for leading the Runnin' Rebels to a magnificent 28-3 record.

Utah State's Aggies recorded the largest turnaround in the country, when coach Rod Tueller led them to a 20-9 record after a 4-23 campaign in 1981-82.

The Aggies were one of just four PCA schools, also a conference record, to notch more than 20 wins with UNLV checking in a 28-3, Cal State Fullerton at 21-8 and Fresno State at 25-10.

TELEVISION PACKAGE

The Pacific Coast Athletic Association has reached a three-year agreement with Katz Sports, a division of Katz Communication, Inc., for the television syndication rights of the conference's regular season basketball games.

Under the terms of the agreement, Katz Sports will hold the rights to 30-35 PCAA conference games a season, including all games in the conference's post-season tournament, over the next three years and will distribute the games to stations in each of the conference areas.

In addition, the conference and Katz are negotiating the television rights of those same conference games with CBS-TV and NBC-TV and the major cable networks.

As planned, the conference regional network will span five states including California, Nevada,

Utah, New Mexico and Texas.

"The PCAA is extremely happy to have come to an agreement with a company the stature of Katz Sports," enthused PCAA commissioner Lewis A. Cryer. "It's one more building block in propelling the PCAA into the upper echelon of NCAA Division I basketball."
