




CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON



California State University, Fullerton is a relatively young institution, having opened only two decades ago. However, it already has grown to 21,500 students and achieved national distinction.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its over-all program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, journalism, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 79 degree programs — 37 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is

the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Yet another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A new development is formation of a professional caliber symphony orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with high-quality music.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is an-

other highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community service, President L. Donald Shields has recently embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to achieve the president's chief goal for the university. That goal is to make Cal State Fullerton the foremost bachelor's/master's degree granting institution in the nation.

Dr. L. Donald Shields - President

Dr. L. Donald Shields became president of California State University, Fullerton in 1971. At the time he was 34, making him the youngest chief executive of a major state university in the nation.

Since 1974, Dr. Shields has served as a member of the National Science Board, having been appointed by President Ford and confirmed by the U.S. Senate. He also is the only person from the western United States currently serving on the National Commission for Cooperative Education.


Dr. Shields received his undergraduate education at University of California, Riverside, then went on to earn his Ph.D. in chemistry from UCLA.

Dr. Shields joined the Cal State Fullerton faculty in 1963 as an assistant profession of chemistry. He became an associate professor in 1966 and a full professor in 1967. He was elected chair of the Faculty Council in 1967 and later that year became the campus' first vice president for adminstration. From October 1970 to May 1971, he was acting president of the University.

Dr. Shields has authored three books and numerous articles in professional journals. He had addressed or participated in professional meetings throughout the United States, and in 1976 represented the National Science Board in Vienna, Austria, at the first biennial international symposium at the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis.

Among Dr. Shields' community activities are having chaired the Disneyland Community Service Awards Committee, being a trustee of the World Affairs Council of Orange County, and being a director of Orange County Sports Celebrities.

Since 1978, Dr. Shields' foremost goal is to make Cal State Fullerton the most outstanding bachelor's/master's degree granting institution in the nation within five years.

Mike Mullally — Director of Athletics

Mike Mullally, who guided Eastern Illinois from the doldrums to the forefront of intercollegiate athletics at the Division II level the past six years, is the new director of athletics at Cal State Fullerton. He replaces Neale Stoner, who is now director of athletics at Illinois.

Mullally became athletic director at EIU in August 1974, when the Charleston institution's programs were in disarray. In five of the following six years, EIU has had the nation's most outstanding Division II program, as determined by polls conducted by University of California, Davis, among others.

Last year (1978) the Panther men won the national championship in football, made their fifth straight trip to the NCAA basketball tournament, finished second in wrestling and third in soccer.

The Panthers won the national championship in cross country in 1977 and the track title in 1974. They also compete in baseball (fifth in 1978), swimming (third in 1975), tennis and golf.

EIU's women's softball team won the Illinois state crown last year. Thus far this year, its field hockey team as captured its state championship, and the volleyball and cross country teams are contenders for state and national titles.

Before joining EIU, Mullally served eight years at University of Oklahoma.

In 1973-74 he coordinated a stadium expansion project that raised \$4.7 million to add a 9,600 seat deck to Memorial Stadium, while in 1971-72 he coordinated a campaign that raised \$2.2 million needed to complete a \$6.1 million, 11,250-seat multipurpose arena.

While at Oklahoma, he also was a regional director for the Alumni Association (1973); assistant to the vice president for development and director of foundation and governmental support (1971-73); director of special student programs and assistant to the vice president for the university community (1970-71); director of residential programs — Greek housing (1969-70); and a graduate teaching and research assistant (1966-69).

He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees at University of South Dakota with the undergraduate work in politi-



cal science and the graduate work in history. In addition he has taken doctoral studies in history at Oklahoma.

He is 40, married (Carole) and the father of three (Heidi, Edward and Matthew).



Head Coach Augie Garrido



A national championship, six consecutive conference championships, twice national coach-of-the-year and a winning average the past six years of over 75-percent.

Those are just the highlights of Augie Garrido's sevenyear coaching career at Cal State Fullerton.

Garrido took over the reins of CSF's baseball program in September 1972. In eight seasons of intercollegiate play prior to his arrival, Cal State Fullerton had compiled a record 145-267-2; winning just 35-percent of its games.

His first team (1973) finished with an undistinguished 19-33-1 mark. The tide, however, had been turned.

In 1974 Cal State Fullerton compiled a 37-17 record, and won its first-ever conference championship in the California Collegiate Athletic Association. Garrido was named CCAA Coach-of-the-Year for his efforts (for the second time, as he was so honored in 1971 as head coach of Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo). The 1974 team participated in the NCAA Far West Division II regionals, losing to eventual national champion UC Irvine.

Cal State Fullerton moved to Division 1 of the NCAA in the summer of 1974, and switched conferences, joining the Pacific Coast Athletic Association.

The Titans responded by winning the PCAA title, the NCAA West Regional (knocking off five-time NCAA champion USC along the way) and representing District 8 at the College World Series in Omaha. Garrido was again named conference Coach-of-the-Year after his squad posted a 36-16-1 record, but that was later topped by his being named NCAA Coach-of-the-Year by the **Sporting News.**

The 1976 Titans won 48 games (losing 15) enroute to a second straight Pacific Coast Athletic Association championship, and reached the finals of the NCAA West Regional championship.

The 1977 season found CSF in the Southern California Baseball Association, and the Titans responded by winning the SCBA championship with a record of 44-14. Once again, CSF went to the NCAA playoffs (the Rocky Mountain Regional).

Garrido's Titans won their fifth consecutive league championship in 1978 with a record of 44-13, and for the fifth consecutive season completed the year in the NCAA playoffs (the West Regional).

All of that was topped off last season (1979) when Garrido led the Titans to a school record 60 wins (losing 14 and tying one), a sixth consecutive conference title, the NCAA West Regional title, and the NCAA national championship at the College World Series in Omaha. The NCAA title was the Titans' first-ever in Division I.

Garrido himself was honored for the second time as the NCAA's Coach-of-the-Year by the **Sporting News**.

Garrido, 40, a native of Vallejo, Calif. (born Feb. 6, 1939 in Vacaville, Calif.), received his bachelor's degree from Fresno State in 1961, following an all-star career with the Bulldog baseball squad. He joined the Cleveland Indians organization in 1961, where he remained until 1966 when he accepted a coaching position at Sierra High School in Tollhose, Calif.

He began his collegiate coaching career in 1969 at San Francisco State where he compiled a one-season record of 25-14. Garrido then moved on to Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo, where he compiled a three-year (1970-72) record of 85-62-1.

His current overall collegiate coaching record is 398-198-4, for a winning percentage of .668. At Cal State Fullerton, Garrido has compiled a seven-year mark of 288-122-3. However, the past six Titan clubs have compiled a combined record of 269-89, a winning percentage of .751.

Garrido formerly coached summer league baseball for the Anchorage (Alaska) Glacier Pilots, and is currently a member of the executive committee of the American Baseball Coaches Association, and the NCAA Baseball Committee. He and his wife, Necia, live in Yorba Linda.



Beginning his second season as a Titan assistant is Matt McCann, 27. McCann is a former Orange County Coachof-the-Year, following his Servite High School (Anaheim) team's winning the CIF-4A championship in 1978. He was also named CIF Coach-of-the-Year for his efforts. Servite finished the season with a 24-3 record. McCann is a '71 graduate of Sunny Hills High School (Fullerton). He was born Jan. 16, 1953 in Pomona, Calif., and is single.

Jody Robinson, 25, enters his fifth season as an assistant at Cal State Fullerton. Robinson was a two-time All-PCAA selection for the Titans' as an outfielder (1975 and '76). Robinson was an all-league player at Mesa JC (San Diego) and Morse High School in San Diego. Joseph Edward Robinson was born Sept. 2, 1954 in Great Lakes, Illinois. He and his wife (Sally) have one son (Parker).

Newest addition to Garrido's coaching staff is Wayne Rudolph, another former Titan player. Rudolph, 23, was an All-SCBA and All-District 8 selection in 1977 for CSF. He was an All-State choice at Sacramento JC, and an all-league pick at Sacramento High School. Wayne Donald Rudolph was born Oct. 1, 1956 in Sacramento. He is single.



1980 Cal State Fullerton Baseball Preview

"We could be a better baseball team this season than last," states Augie Garrido, coach of Cal State Fullerton's defending NCAA champions.

Garrido is not known as the shy, retiring type.

And if the experience of winning the national title means anything Garrido's statement would seem true.

The Titans return seven of the team's top nine hitters and the top seven pitchers which won 60 of 75 games (with

Heading the list of returnees is second team All-America Dan Hanggie. The junior third baseman hit .362 with 67 RBI and six homers. Junior second baseman Sam Favata led the squad with a .417 average and stole 66 bases. He was an All-District selection. Seniors Andre David (.376), Matt Vejar (.372) and Glenn Robertson (.301), and sophomores Mark Pirruccello (.333) and John Christensen (.295) hit .295 or better in starting roles last season.

CSF's four starters won 49 of 58 games last year and each returns. Junior righthander Tony Hudson was 10-4 and the College World Series' Most Valuable Player. Dave Weathermail, another junior righthander, won a school record 15 games (losing two), and yet another junior righthander, Jim Sutton, won 10 of 12 decisions. Senior Larry Navilhon, also a righthander, won 14 while losing one.

Relievers Ray Lane and Tim Miner combined for eight

wins and nine saves.

Overall, the Titans led the country in fielding (.973), hit .330 as a unit and had a team ERA of 3.62.

However, many will not be willing to mail the championship trophy to the Fullerton campus.

The main reason being the loss of college baseball's player-of-the-year, Tim Wallach. Wallach's graduation to the pros leaves the Titans without a proven power hitter. He hit 23 homeruns, 21 doubles, knocked in 102 runs, scored 98 and averaged .392.

Freshman redshirt Mike Rubel, a fourth round draft choice two years ago by the Chicago White Sox, will be given the opportunity to take Wallach's first base job when fall practice opens. Rubel, 6-4, 210-pounds, suffered a leg injury the first part of last season and sat out.

Three freshmen pitchers will come in the fall, and at least one, Eric Barry, will be given the opportunity to start. The others, Tim Thompson and Jeff Robinson are being touted by Garrido as the best group of freshmen pitchers ever recruited by Cal State Fullerton.

Besides winning the NCAA championship, the Titans won their sixth consecutive league title, and Garrido was named national coach-of-the-year for the second time (the first coming in 1975).
