

CLUB AND ORGANIZATIONS -- LET'S GET BACK ON COURSE

The civil rights movement have left most organizations limp. More sacrifices by the parents are in order and the fact that the parents did not have an opportunity to go to school is no excuse to pass this on to the children. 
We can only laugh at the memories of having watched himrun full speed down the streets with the City pound hot on his trail, yet never quite fast enough or tricky enough to nab him.

El respeto a la profesion periodistica

En el numero 6 del año 14 de EL EXCENTRICO de fecha 5 de enero de 1964. Aparece un articulo firmado por el Sr. Luis Miguel Valdez y se titula "El Machete".

El articulo a que hago mencion empieza con un parrafo de Jose Vasconcelos, tomado de "La Raza Cosmica" escrito en Español (Castellano). A continuacion el Sr. Valdez escribe en Ingles.

Las personas que entienden y pueden leer los dos idiomas, se habran percatado de que la persona que escribe, tiene indudablemente alguna preparacion escolar; aunque por otra parte demuestra no tener educacion, si tomamos en cuanta la contestacion del abuelito. Entre gente educada no se usa ese vocabulario que si bien es comun en corrillos de amigos, resulta una gran falta de educacion si se usa entre familia o en presencia de personas que nos merezcan respeto.

Entre la cultura y la educacion existe una diferencia. La cultura se adquiere en la escuela con el estudio. La educacion se aprende en la familia y de la gente con quien se convive. Se puede ser culto y a la vez estar mal educado; como se puede ser inculto pero bien educado. No se necesita ser un santurron para ser educado, pero hace falta conocer el lugar apropiado en el que se puede usar cierto lenguaje.

Cuando una persona escribe para el publico, no puede usar el lexico florido propio de una taberna a pesar de ese modernismo ramplon y malcriado que usa palabras inmundas y con el cual se quiere dar una impresion de realismo de vulgaridad soez, que las familias educadas y de buenas costumbres no pueden tolerar. Escribir para el publico exije de la persona que escribe, el uso de palabras que se puedan leer en cualquier parte, ya sea escuela, iglesia o el hogar, y por cualquier personas, hombre o mujer, niño o ñina, y que la lectura no provoque sonrojos ni ofenda el recinto.

Volviendo al escrito en cuestion, se quiere dar en el una leccion de civismo, usando como textos las películas que en forma bastante desfigurada, tomando personajes y conflictos de la historia de Mexico, se toman como reales. Se olvida lamentablemente que las películas se hacen como diversion, no como libros de texto.

La incertidumbre que segun el autor del "Machete" existe entre los Mexico-Americanos, por lo que respecta a su latinidad o sajonismo, es un asunto que tiene viejas raigambres; no solo anteriores al descubrimiento de America, o a la llegada del Mayflower a este continente, sino mucho antes del poderio romano y anterior tambien a nuestra era Cristiana. Muchas de las calamidades que la humanidad ha sufrido, sufre y seguira sufriendo, se deben en gran parte a la forma desorientadora y poco constructiva de personas que ascriben sin saber que su mision, ademas de orientadora debe ser conciliadora. Escribir para el publico crea la obligacion de aquilatar con exactitud el efecto que causara el escrito en la opinion publica, a la que se debe consideracion y respeto. Una equivocacion, de buena o mala fe, en un escrito que se publica, puede hacer tremendos estragos en la mente de los lectores.

Mi intencion en estas lineas; no es la de crear una polemica o hacer una critica infundada. Todo lo contrario, trato de hacer una observacion constructiva sin alardes de erudicion o sabiduria y solo me anima el deseo de ayudar a que nuestras publicaciones lleven un sello de pulcritud, que en ninguna forma pueda lastimar la moralidad y la educacion de la sociedad, con la cual, al escribir, contraemos el compromiso de respetar.

La profesion del periodista requiere: Valor, Honradez, Conocimientos y Educacion. Valor para atacar la maldad en cualquiera de sus formas. Honradez para juzgar imparcialmente y dar a conocer quien tiene la razon o el derecho. Conocimientos para poder orientar y no desorientar a los lectores, en los topicos que se toquen. Y por ultimo; Educacion para no ofender a la sociedad a la que estamos obligados a servir.

The recent figures of our City of San Jose, California, revealed a most fantastic growth, the statistics demonstrating that we increase our yearly population by nearly 40,000 people or the equivalent of the City of Palo Alto.

Among the statistics, one very important item was not stressed that being the explosive growth of our school children population. This in turn has created a gigantic problem of insufficient school houses, personnel and equipment. Here are some pertinent facts that will inform you factually and why a YES vote is indicated:

In the next five years the San Jose Unified School District will have to provide additional school housing for 8,727 NEW students. The actual student count on October 10, 1963, was 28, 316 students attending the San Jose Unified School District and it is known by as close as 1% that by October 10, 1968, the San Jose Unified School District will have over 35, 534 students!

This growth, the result of both increased population and birth rates, is already upon us. This year it has been necessary to have double sessions at three elementary schools and split sessions at one high school because of the classroom shortage.

Your Board of Education and a Citizen Bond Study Committee have carefully scrutinized the demands this increased enrollment will place upon the district. It has been determined that a bond issue of \$15,750,000 will be the minimum necessary to meet the end. This will provide seven additional elementary schools, one junior high school and one senior high school and five additional school sites, and 54 additional classrooms needed at older existing schools. Where possible, these will be portable classrooms of the type which have already saved taxpayers many thousands of dollars.

Also included are major additions to present junior and senior high schools which are necessary, not only to take care of the growth, but to expand new teaching programs required to give our children a first rate education. These include foreign language laboratories, science and increased space for team teaching.

The prosperity of our community depends on skilled and educated citizens. Our schools must remain adequate and effective to meet this challenge. When education suffers, everybody suffers – not just the children.

Further delay in meeting these critical building needs will result in widespread double sessions, curtailed educational opportunities for our children, and increased expense to the taxpayer because of the rising costs.

AMONG THE VALIANT DAY

On February 1, 1964, the Santa Clara Chapter of the American GI Forum and Ladies Auxiliary are bringing to the people in the Northern area, the man who paid tribute to all those men who fought, lived through and gave their lives for their country.

Raul Morin, a native of Lockhart, without any journalistic experience, wrote a full length account of the people he proudly represents through hard work and sheer determination, while recovering from wounds received near the German Border. This is the only book of its kind.

The book, AMONG THE VALIANT, is a hard hitting saga of the Mexican American soldiers, their pre-war days, their hectic days in training camps and their many anxious moments of fear and bravery on the firing lines with the dogged infantry, the rugged Marines, the daring Paratroopers and with other famed units of the United States Armed Forces, during WW II and the Conflict in Korea.

Raul takes you with him through training and war with Co. E of the 313th Regiment, 79th Division. He also tells the stories of those Mexican Americans who won the highest military honor this great country awards. There were 17 Mexican Americans who were awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor. However, nine sacrificed their lives symbolic of the determination and courage manifested by the Mexican American during the wars. You also read about the famous Texas 36th Division and how Captain Gabriel Navarrete who was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross, 2 Silver Stars, the Bronze Star and Purple Heart among his decorations, went after the Major who ordered his men to cross a river that meant only disaster to his company. Gabriel is from El Paso, Texas.

Raul also wrote of Pfc Cleto Rodriguez of San Antonio, Texas, who actually deserved the Medal twice. The first time, he and another buddy killed 82 Japanese soldiers while their company was bogged down. The fact that his buddy was killed in that action, the Medal was awarded to his buddy, John M Reece of Oklahoma City. The Medal can be awarded to only one person for one action. Ten days later, Rodriguez single handed killed six more Japanese while exposing himself to open fire. Then, without a doubt, his name was submitted for the award.

You will also read the stories of Pfc Silvestre Herrera of Phoenix, Arizona, Sergeant Macario Garcia of Sugarland, Texas, Sergeant Joseph Rodriguez

of San Bernardino, California, Sergeant Jose Lopez of Brownsville, Texas, Sergeant Alejandro Ruiz of Loving, New Mexico, Sergeant Luciano Adams of Port Arthur, Texas, and Cpl. Rudy Hernandez of Fresno. California. They lived to receive their award.

Some received theirs from the President of the United States.

Pfc. David Gonzales of Pacoima, California gave their lives in the greatest tradition of valor and supreme sacrifice in reflecting the lasting glory and in the honored traditions of the military service.

No better life has he, that lays his life down for his country.

The Santa Clara City Council, in paying tribute to the Mexican American people, has proclaimed February 1, 1964, as AMONG THE VALIANT DAY on a resolution passed on January 14. The Santa Clara Chapter and Auxiliary will present books of AMONG THE VALIANT to all school libraries in the City of Santa Clara and also to Foothill College. The book is not out for public sale. You get it only thru the GI Forum. It is a book every Mexican American should have in his home. Raul will be endorsing books at the Santa Clara City Library, Lexington and Main Streets on February 1, 1964, at 8:00 P.M. Because of the limited space, you will have to contact me if you plan to be there and also if you want a book you will have to call me so that Raul will bring a supply. Please call 243-5967. The foster parents of Santa Clara County, numbering more than 700 couples, will be honored at the Annual Foster Parent Recognition Event. To express the gratitude of the entire county. Community leaders joined by agency board and staff members will join together on Sunday, February 9th, at 2:00 P.M. at Abraham Lincoln High School. The Community Council of Central Santa Clara County and the Willow Glen Kiwanis are sponsoring this get-together.

The planning committee is chaired by Mrs.

Alden Campen. Assisting with the planning are the six placement agencies who work with the honored families: Eastfield, Ming Quong, Santa Clara County Welfare Department, Catholic Social Service, Santa Clara Juvenile Probation Department and Children's

Home Society.

Throughout Santa Clara County, there are more than 700 families who have opened their home to the thousand plus children needing a temporary family. Of these special families, over 100 are of Spanish-Mexican origin and they are meeting a great need in our community. By offering 24-hour care to provide for the physical well-being of children and by offering love and affection to children of all ages who for various reasons cannot live with their own parents, these foster parents are making it possible for children to grow into healthy and useful citizens.

Children in need of a home are placed with a licensed family by a placement agency who will supervise while the child is in the home and who will share the responsibility with the foster family for the child's

welfare.

Foster homes must meet with standards set by the State, and must be licensed by the County Welfare Department or given a certificate of approval by an authorized agency. Generally speaking, the foster home should provide a happy, secure and loving home life so that a child will feel wanted and comfortable.

All foster families are special—some have children of their own, others do not. Some families have a great deal of education, others have little. Some have high incomes, others have limited income. Some are young couples, others have already raised their own children and are now grandparents.

Not all mothers and families are able to be foster parents, but there are deeply satisfying rewards

for those who have the capacity. The rewards for the time and hard work put forth by foster parents are the knowledge that they are helping a child to grow into a happy and responsible person and to know they are providing the kind of love and care which can only be given in a family setting.

Anyone interested in becoming foster parents may obtain information by calling the Welfare Department at 299-2981, or by calling one of the placement

agencies direct.

Perhaps next year you will be among the honored citizens whom the community representatives will applaud and give a sincere thanks.




