
The professional judges at the Ventura County Fair reviewed 2,000 pictures and awarded the Leisure Village Camera Club members 15 winning ribbons.





First sports film will air in 2 parts, Sept. 10, Oct. 8


The original Olympic Games were held in Olympia, a sanctuary of ancient Greece in Elis from 776 B.C. through 393 C.E. That means that the original Greek games lasted for 1,160 years, taking place every four years.

When the games were played, they took precedence over all else. Wars were put on hold, national events were postponed. Olympic Truce prevailed. All the Greek city-states participated, as did some of the surrounding territories.

The word "Olympiad" originally referred to the four-year period between games. It has drifted into English, erroneously, as the name of the games themselves. (Much like I just received some tickets to an event in the "AR Room."

There is no "AR Room."
"AR" stands for "Assembly
Room." So the "AR Room"
would mean "Assembly
Room Room," absurd on the
face of it. Just like "La Brea"
means "the tar." Therefore,
"The La Brea Tar Pits" really means "The The Tar Tar
Pits.")

Back to our subject. In early years, the games consisted of mainly track events. Running, jumping, throwing the discus and the spear were all part of the original games. Speed and grace were highly prized. Competitors usually performed in the nude. Winners were lionized, celebrated in song and poetry, and statues were sculpted of them as the human ideal. Winners were also crowned with a wreath of olive leaves. The olive branch has remained ever after as a symbol of peace



and tranquility.

Eventually the power of Greece waned and Rome became ascendant. The games

took a bizarre turn when the Roman Emperor Nero decided to participate in the games in 68 C.E. He introduced chariot races because he intended to participate himself, and he was fairly good at guiding a chariot. Not good enough, however. He fell out of his chariot and bruised himself. Due to the large amounts of baksheesh he had distributed amongst the judges, he was declared the winner anyway. He also introduced poetry reading as a sports event. He won that as well.

Presently Christianity overtook the Roman Empire. The Emperor Theodusius outlawed the games as pagan rituals in 393 C.E., and they were dormant thereafter until 1896.

Pierre de Frédy, Baron de Coubertin, was inspired by the recent discovery of the site of the original games at Olympia in the early 1890s. He had been looking for a means of bringing the youth of the world together in peaceful competition to keep them from making war. To publicize these plans, he organized an international congress on June 23, 1894, at the Sorbonne in Paris. There he proposed to reinstate the ancient Olympic Games. The congress led to the establishment of the International Olympic Committee (IOC), of which de Coubertin became the General Secretary. The first of the modern games was held in Greece in 1896.

Interestingly, only one major event in 1896 was won by a Greek: the Marathon, so named because of the great achievement of



Monthly recipe: Sticks au Gratin

Allow about half a pound per serving for these baked small fish fillets.

Prepare for cooking small drawn, boned skinned fish, pieces of fish or fish fillets. Dip them in 1/2 cup whole milk or cream, then in seasoned bread crumbs or crushed cornflakes. Let the fish dry on a rack for at least 20 minutes.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Bake until golden. Baste twice during the cooking period with melted butter.



each of its clients.


4. Continued administration, purchasing and packaging by Bob Amantia and Pat and Ed Holly.



Pheidippides after the Battle of Marathon in 490 B.C. The traditional story relates that Pheidippides, an Athenian herald, ran the 42 km (26 miles) from the battlefield by the town of Marathon to Athens to announce the Greek victory over Persia in the Battle of Marathon (490 BC) with the word "Nenikékamen!" ("We were victorious!") and died on the spot. The 26-mile run in 1896 was won by the Greek favorite, Spiridon Louis, against all odds. The Greek patois for being victorious when victory is seemingly impossible is still "Going Louis" to this day.

Motion pictures had been invented shortly before 1896, and a few brave souls

brought cameras to some of the early modern games. But it wasn't until 1936 that the Olympic Committee decided to commission a memorial film of the games. They contacted a former dancer and actress named Leni Riefenstahl. She had directed several films before, including the celebrated propaganda film about Adolf Hitler, "Triumph of the Will.'

Nothing was spared in the production of "Olympia." She had literally over 100 cameramen covering every event from every possible angle. She invented the dolly on rails for tracking shots, and it has become a staple of films and TV shows ever since. She used it to track with the runners and other participants as they competed.

Dog owners: Listen up

Many Villagers love to walk early in the morning. There are many Villagers who are still sleeping. Sometimes when you have loud conversations they are very close to people's bedrooms. Please try to keep the noise level down, especially when you are calling your dog.

In fact, Leni Riefenstahl invented the sports film. Sports films produced in 2006 are all in imitation of what she achieved 70 years ago. Even TV shows, with their immediacy, are artistic shadows of Riefenstahl's

The movie is four hours long — four fascinating, riveting hours of historical footage, beautifully photographed and amazingly edited. We will see the first part on September 10 and the second part on October 8. We will watch the horsemen of all the countries attempt the steeplechase; the diving experts perform an aerial ballet, all accomplished by Riefenstahl's masterful editing; and the amazing sights of Jesse Owens winning his gold medals.

Much nonsense has been written about Riefenstahl's "Olympia," that it was a Nazi propaganda film, that it was commissioned by Hitler, and so forth. Nothing could be farther from the truth. The film is a celebration of sports and of the human body in motion. It is almost
