

STUDENT AFFAIRS

Student Affairs provides an organized administration of educationally related services designed to support each student and the instructional program. These services include student activities, counseling, advising, testing, the Educational Opportunity Program, financial aids, foreign student assistance, veterans, handicapped, health, career planning, and placement services. The program also provides students with nonclassroom experiences which are primarily of an educational nature, such as general orientation to the university, cultural enrichment, and tutorial projects. The program and individual services are described in more detail in the following sections of this catalog. Administrative responsibility for these functions rests with the Dean of Student Affairs.

NONDISCRIMINATION ON THE BASIS OF SEX
