



May we point out, the title "president" continuously mentioned in these regulations does not mean the president of the ASsociated Sutdents, whose office once led the framework of student self-government, but means instead the president of the college administration.

This radical switch of power would seem to imply that college students are no longer deemed fit to govern themselves, but like children at a grammar school must once again have a principal imposed above them to govern the way in which they spend their own student funds.)

- Each organization must sign a written agreement with the Chancellor, listing the functions it intends to engage in. (Sec. 42501).
- Another possibly positive change here is the exemption of student association activities from this listing of functions.

This would seem to imply that organizations may engage somewhat less restrictively in areas of association activities such as cultural programs, recreation, support of college unions, tutorials, community service and
