

## Longtime resident Art Kaufman lights up LV

Art Kaufman is a Leisure Village generator! He can literally light up the place, having spent a lifetime working as a lighting director, a gaffer to studio people, with two years at RKO Studios, 28 years at Universal Studios and 10 years at Columbia Pictures Studio, where he spent seven years of the 10-year period working on the TV show, "Bewitched."

Today he is one of the few who practically owns his own generation: He's 95 years old!

Art was born in Patterson, N.J. He grew up there until it was decided to move to Los Angeles, where he attended L.A. High School. He graduated L.A. High in 1930.

After graduation, he joined the Merchant Marine which shipped all over the world, and he was a ship's

navigator. He was in the Merchant Marine for one year. He returned to Los Angeles at age 19, searching for work, but there was no work available at that time. So he went gold mining for six months, then returned to L.A.

At that time, there still were no jobs available, so he joined the U.S. Navy in 1932 and got out in 1936. He served as a Coxswain in the Navy.

Art is a widower and lost his loving wife Mimi nine months ago. It was a 68-year love affair. Art met Mimi through a friend at RKO Studios. On the studio lot, he ran into his friend who was throwing a party that night. His friend said he wanted Art to meet a lady named Mimi. Art met Mimi and took her to the party that night — they married 11 months later!

He has lived in the Village for 30 years. He doesn't like living alone and doesn't cook. He spends a lot of his time with his family;

they are very close. Art's sister, Rosalie Volin, and his nephew, Howard Rosin, live here in the Village. He has a daughter, Laurel Rose, living in Montecito. Laurel Rose's daughter, Erin (Paris) Rose, lives in Carpinteria, with her 2-month-old daughter, Amara. So, Art has a sister and a nephew here in the Village, a daughter, a grand-daughter and a great-grand-daughter living fairly close by.

He has been active and always available to help Leisure Village with his vast knowledge of lighting, electrical, einematography and things theatrical. He's a whiz! He's grounded, and although he doesn't admit it, he almost knows it all! He's been there, done that!

Art was the "father" of the Leisure Village CCTV channel. A Leisure Villager suggested starting this channel. Art took over and made it happen. Western Cable gave Leisure Village a camera, a monitor and sound equipment that no one knew how to use. You needn't guess: Art set it all up and thus the start of the Leisure Village Closed Circuit Television.

After 40 years of work in the movie industry, Art and Mimi decided that he had worked enough. They had what they needed, and although Art had some ambivalent feelings about retirement, Mimi convinced him to quit working in 1977. He was 63 years old.

He quit, and the couple bought a motor home and toured the United States, Canada and Mexico. They traveled back and forth across the United States at least three times. They enjoyed it all!

## County supervisor meets with Village residents

In January, I had the pleasure of attending the Single Active Seniors club meeting at Leisure Village.

The focus of the meeting was Pandemic Flu Preparedness, presented by Diane Visencio of Ventura County's Public Health Department. It is encouraging to see how the community came together to get information on Pandemic Flu, emphasizing the importance of awareness and personal preparedness.

The Ventura County Public Health Department is dedicated to helping residents understand health-related disasters such as the Pandemic Flu and urges us to be personally prepared in case of the emergence of a pandemic in the United States. Every winter, we

have a flu outbreak that is estimated to kill 36,000 people a year in the United States. Older people and those with compromised immune systems are at an even higher risk of getting a serious illness or dying from the seasonal flu.

Pandemics are causes for a deeper concern because they are more deadly then the seasonal flu. Our personal preparation is the most important step we can take to ensure that we stay as healthy as possible during a pandemic outbreak.

Protect yourself by taking such steps as staying three or more feet away from someone with the flu (in case they sneeze or cough), avoid shaking hands or taking objects from people with the flu, use alcohol-based cleaning solutions (hand sanitizers), wash

your hands on a regular and frequent basis, wear a mask if you feel sick or stay home, and store at least two weeks of supplies at your home for

you and your family.

I would like to commend Naomi Brill as president of the Single Active Seniors for organizing the program.

# Law would change taxes on seniors' property

#### By Senior Senator Dick Griswold

This letter solicits your attention and hopefully your prompt action to help pass legislation in Sacramento that will be of monetary benefit to all seniors age 62 and older.

This proposal, titled SP4 in the California Senior Legislature passed on consent — without being amended or with any change — last October at the CSL Convention in Sacramento and was voted among the top 10 proposals adopted at the convention.

The proposal changes the county property tax exemption from \$7,000 to \$27,000 for seniors 62 and older who own their own homes. This means an annual savings of some \$356 in real money to seniors.

Here is what you are asked to do: Send an e-mail to Ryan.Flanigan@ASM. CA.GOV requesting the Legislature to pass AB 351 Property Tax Exemption Bill.

Ryan Flanigan is the Legislative Director for Assemblyman Cameron Smyth of Simi Valley, who is sponsoring my proposal in the California Legislature.

It has been 39 years — since 1968 — that the \$7,000 exemption was adopted. There has been no change since 1968 in spite of inflation factors averaging 3.5 percent per year. It hardly seems possible that an equitable adjustment has not been made to compensate for the reduced purchasing power of the dollar. It's unfair!

Many seniors are living on small fixed incomes and cannot afford to pay 39 years of annual increases in their property tax.

Please help me correct this problem.

Your prompt action will help alert our legislators in Sacramento who do respond to our letters and which does influence their voting records.

impish as she happily explains things like the difference between "buenos dias" and "buenas tardes," to something more advanced.

Mary Louise Torres has worked for the Village for the past 24 years, mostly at the West Gate.

Her retirement, in 1997, at age 65, didn't last long. One month later, "bored," she says, she decided to come back part-time. On average, she works 25 hours a week and does not object to the occasional 12-hour shift on the weekend.

She rarely takes a break and prefers to take her meals standing up. Despite what many a retiree would consider obvious discomforts, Mary Torres likes it that way, and says assuredly, "I always have."

Mostly, though, what she likes about Leisure Village is us — you and me.

She also likes to travel, especially to Oklahoma, where she visits her long-time friend, a former neighbor when both were young mothers in their early 20s.


Together, the two have been to Europe and the Middle East and next plan to see France. On the way, Mary would like to see "that big clock, the one in London."

"I give them a silent blessing as I open the gate," Mary says, smiling in confidence. "I simply wish them, 'Vaya con Dios."



of V.17, Hanna Huber of V.18, and this writer. An invitation was passed to all 16 graduates, plus a group of Police Explorers, which is the older version of the Boy Scouts, specializing in police disciplines. It was ostensibly administered by the Camarillo city DART (Disaster Assistance Response Team).

The exercise was based upon a simulated school bus accident off a bridge over Calleguas Creek, in which an "unknown number" of children were lost into the "swirling river."

Two teams were set up with DART, Explorer and CERT members included in each. Of the total of six CERT graduates who participated, five were from Leisure Village. Each team was then split into three subteams assigned respectively to the east, west and center portions of the riverbed.

Based on responses to DART IC (Incident Commander) questions, Allan and I were assigned to the Command Post to set up and operate the Triage and Treatment areas. A total of nine "victims" were subsequently discovered and brought to the Command

Post with injuries from scratches to broken legs and ribs. We treated them as time and supplies permitted, with some success.

All in all, the de-brief was most complementary. The LVA presence was a significant one, in that we were the test of CERT capability, and it appeared that we were successful.

Such drills will probably occur in the future as more CERT Program graduates become available. ESO encourages able-bodied and dedicated individuals to become CERT-certified to augment our present fiveperson search and rescue



Diane Visencio is with the Ventura Public Health Department and is involved with bioterrorism around the world. She gave a most interesting talk on what we can expect if the Flu Pandemic appears in our area.

Pandemic means "spread around the world." The flu, which is carried by birds, shows up every 20 to 30

years. In 1918, there was a terrible outbreak and many people died. It is a highly contagious disease and can be spread by persons sneezing, coughing or just shaking hands. The best prevention is to wash hands with a 70 percent solution of alcohol. Using a face mask when in a group situation also helps to prevent the spread.

The best thing to do if you have the flu is to stay home and away from other people. The symptoms are high fever, coughing, sneezing, diarrhea and just not feeling well.

It's best to stockpile drugs such as Advil, Tylenol, and Robitussin and keep cans of food for six weeks. in case there is an outbreak and the stores run out of supplies.

This type of flu attacks the elderly and the very young. Be prepared to help those who can't help themselves.


