The Agriculture Division provides degree and nondegree curricula preparatory to professions and occupations in agriculture and related fields. For information concerning preveterinary medicine, see page 79. The college farm is organized and operated to provide experience and practical training. Eleven hundred acres serve as a laboratory and production unit where students carry on supervised farming programs in animal and plant science. In addition, livestock, vineyards, orchards, and crop land are maintained for laboratory use.

The division offers programs leading to the bachelor of science degree in agriculture with 13 specialized majors and in agricultural engineering; three-year technical curricula for students not desiring degree or transfer credit; an agriculture minor for the bachelor of arts degree; short courses for those not enrolled in the college program but engaged in farming or allied occupations.

Students may qualify for a general secondary credential with a teaching major or minor in general agriculture. Students desiring to qualify for the special secondary credential in agricultural education may complete the first four years of their program at Fresno State College.
