And so it flows ...

Until recently, thanks to El Niño and other factors, unless you lived in Death Valley, water was something to waste, not celebrate.

But late last month, some of the area's top water suppliers gathered on the first tee to celebrate the new way Leisure Village took the responsibility for doing something about dwindling supplies of drinking water.

With a symbolic turning on of sprinklers sending recycled water over the first fairway, the event singled out for special recognition former Board President Bob Ellis and resident Al Fox, now president of the board of the Camrosa Water District. Ellis praised those who served on the Water Committee, especially Mike Shapiro and Ernest Houghton, and noted the

committee may now be disbanded.

Ellis, who made water conservation a main objective when he joined the board in 2003, said, "So far, we have cut by half the amount of drinking water we were using for non-drinking purposes by using recycled water for landscaping on the first nine holes of the golf course and for villages 4, 6, 16, 18, 22 and parts of villages 17 and 20."

He said that by the end

He said that by the end of the year, when the \$2 million project is completed, "we will be saving hundreds of thousands of dollars and making a major contribution to the area's ecology."

Ellis said we have to continue changing over our landscaping to native Southern California vegetation and to stress conservation of drinkable (potable) water.

And, he added, "Every





Enhance property value

It's springtime again and the time that many homeowners begin projects around the house.

In the past, some of those projects have been spring cleaning, general maintenance, painting, larger home improvements or maybe even complete remodeling. All of these. maintain, or in many cases, add to the value of your home.





The last word on dental implants, or bionic teeth

Does it hurt to have dental implants placed?

The actual procedure to surgically place a dental implant is done under local anesthesia and is generally not at all painful. When the anesthesia wears off about three or four hours later, you might expect some discomfort. The level of discomfort is quite different from patient to patient, but most patients do not have significant problems.

Some patients do have varying degrees of pain or discomfort that may last for several days. Swelling and black and bluing may also develop. In cases where there is prolonged pain, vou should see your dentist right away. Prolonged pain is not a good sign. If an implant is not properly integrating into the adjacent bone or if an infection develops, the implant may have to be removed.

What happens if I have dental implants and they are rejected?

Occasionally dental implants do fail, or, as some people say, they are rejected. In many instances, they can be replaced with another implant, usually of a slightly larger size. Failure rates are about 1 to 2 percent.

Do I have to go without my "teeth" while the implants are bonding to my jawbone?

Once again, the original protocol called for patients to go without wearing their dentures for at least two weeks after implant placement. Over the years, this has been modified considerably, and in most situations, patients leave the office wearing their teeth the day the implants are placed.

Bridge or a dental implant?

Suppose you are missing your lower left first molar. If a fixed bridge were to be used, your dentist would cut down the adjacent teeth (the second molar and the second bicuspid) and fit a three-unit fixed bridge over those two teeth. The missing tooth would be called a pontic, and it would be effectively replaced by the three-unit bridge.

If your dentist were to use an implant with a crown on it, he would place an implant in the site of the original first molar. He could do this immediately or at some date after the first molar was removed. There is no time limit here. The implant will take about three months to connect with the bone and then, at that time, your dentist can construct a single crown on the implant to replace the missing first molar.

The cost of each one

of these procedures varies from office to office, but a three-unit fixed bridge costs about the same as an implant and a crown.

The actual decision to do one over the other depends on the health of the adjacent teeth. It does not seem rational to cut down two healthy teeth or two teeth with a small filling for a bridge when a dental implant could be a more conservative solution.



I will be joining the County of Ventura's Area Agency on Aging at Leisure Village's Health Fair on May 16. We will host a booth that will provide Village residents with information about your healthcare options.



Don't shake and bake at same time: Get out of the kitchen

By Joe Foraker

The potential for serious injuries is great if you are in your kitchen preparing a large meal when a significant earthquake strikes.

Pots filled with hot foods could cause serious, painful injuries. Large roasts, a turkey or ham, casseroles and other dishes in a hot oven could suddenly become dangerous missiles.

In addition, cupboard doors could fling open, filling the room with debris. Tall refrigerators could topple, and heavy ovens and stoves might tear from their positions.

When a temblor strikes during meal preparation, occupants of a kitchen should move quickly to an adjoining room. If shaking makes it impossible to walk, crawl on your hands and knees to a safer area.

You can also make your kitchen more earthquake proof. Refrigerators can be anchored to wall studs with simple eye and hook combinations or with small cables.

Childproof cupboard latches will keep the contents of cupboards from flying

She loves Leisure Village and wouldn't want to live anywhere else.


Her most interesting events in Leisure Village have been participating in some of the Players Guild major shows and being in charge of running the fashion show last year for the LV Women's Club.





Singing releases endorphins into your system and makes you feel energized and uplifted. People who sing are healthier than people who don't.

Singing gives the lungs a workout.

Singing tones abdomi-

nal and intercostal muscles and the diaphragm, and it stimulates circulation.

Singing makes us breathe more deeply than many forms of strenuous exercise, so we take in more oxygen, improve aerobic capacity and experience a release of muscle tension as well.

As a part of a threeyear study examining how singing affects the health of those 55 and older, a Senior Singers Chorale was formed by the Levine School of Music in Washington, D.C. The seniors involved in the chorale showed significant health improvements compared to those in the control group, specifically, fewer doctor visits, fewer evesight problems, less incidence of depression, less need for medication and fewer falls and other injuries.

The seniors themselves also reported feeling bet-

ter both in daily life and while singing, that their everyday voice quality was better and the tone of their speaking voice did not seem to age as much, easier breathing and better posture.

Whether or not you become a world-class singer is not important. Sharing the joy of singing will enrich your life far beyond the notes and music. Add a healthy, new dimension to your life – try singing!

Your Village coordinator will quickly cover your Village, checking each house that has no Red Ribbon displayed and calling on the radio for immediate emergency assistance where needed.

Come to the slide show to see where you might find a fit. Volunteer opportunities range from participation only in time of disaster to coordinating plans for a specific type of response and ongoing interaction with other coordinators.


