

HOW TO GET HERE

The campus is located within 40 miles of three major airports (LAX to the West, Ontario to the Northeast and Orange County/John Wayne to the South). The campus is located immediately adjacent to the Orange (57) Freeway, which is accessible from most major Southern California freeways.

The Titan Softball Complex is located to the south of the baseball field (Goodwin Field) and just east of the soccer stadium and track.

From the 57 freeway, take the Yorba Linda exit and turn left (when heading north) or right (when heading south). Make a left at the first light which will be Associated Blvd.

Parking is located on your immediate left in either Lot "G" or Lot "A". Daily Permits may be purchased at machines located throughout both lots for \$3 per day. Regulations are enforced Monday-Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 10:30 p.m. Parking is free on Friday nights after 5 p.m. and all day Saturday and Sunday.

3 | TITAN SOFTBALL COMPLEX

A "Gem" of a Diamond... Welcome to the Titan Softball Complex!

Fully remodeled for the 2001 season, the Titan Softball Complex stands as one of the top collegiate softball venues in the nation.

After spending the first five seasons at Lions Field located at Brea Blvd. and Lemon St., the Cal State Fullerton softball program moved to its permanent home on campus in 1985 where it has remained ever since.

With the addition of the baseball stadium and the 10,000-seat multi-purpose Titan Stadium in 1992, the Titan Softball Complex also received some additions. An upgraded press box and expanded seating for up to 3,000 fans on portable bleachers were in the works as well as the addition of the message board to the existing electronic scoreboard beyond the leftfield fence.

With the start of the 1995 season, the stadium received its second face-lift that featured concrete pavement around both backstops for added fan comfort and safety as well as expanded batting cages and bullpens.

Before the start of the 2001 season, the face of the complex was drastically changed as the main softball diamond was literally flipped on end, to expand seating for Goodwin Field and create more of a stadium atmosphere for softball.

The primary diamond features el-



evated grandstand seating with permanent box seating behind home plate. Chair back bleachers were added down both baselines to hold a capacity of 1,000 fans. A permanent expanded two-tiered press box was added as well as a beautifully landscaped grassy knoll that runs from foul line to right centerfield in the outfield.

The main field also features two complete bullpens with room for two pitchers to warm up simultaneously and sunken dugouts for both teams. The soft-

ball and baseball fields are joined by a structure between the two fields which houses the Doubek-Wilson VIP room, expanded locker rooms and clubhouses and offices for the coaches.

The current configuration encompasses two lighted and fenced softball fields that are utilized at their capacity during Cal State Fullerton's two premier spring softball tournaments, the Worth Invitational and the Kia Klassic, as well as year-round use by the City of Fullerton and other area organizations.

or all of the success the Cal State Fullerton softball team has had in the past, fourth-year head coach Michelle Gromacki and her staff have been quick to remind their players that it is all exactly that... the past.

For the present, 2003 may just be the Titans' chance to exorcise those demons of the past three years and make some history of their own.

"The 2003 season is made up of a whole bunch of 'today's'," Gromacki said. "Our expectations lie within. Each one of us must commit to helping us win a national championship beginning today."

Fullerton returns 11 letterwinners (including six starters and the team's top two pitchers from a year ago) and a core group of seven seniors which will power the Titans throughout the season.

"We've seen both sides of having this much experience this past fall," Gromacki said. "We've worked hard to have everyone on the same page and, if that stays consistent throughout the year, that will be our greatest strength."

That group includes two first-team All-Americans, the 2002 Big West Player of the Year, three All-West Region selections and five All-Big West Conference selections.

he offense is powered by the bat of two-time All-America senior catcher Jenny Topping, who has set the school single-season record for average in each of the last two seasons.

The two-time Big West Player of the Year hit .472 last season with nine home runs and 33 RBI after missing the first 11 games of the year due to injury.

She led the team in six different offensive categories and finished the year ranked fourth in the nation in batting average and ninth in slugging.

Seniors Jodie Cox and Gina Oaks will have opponents wishing they only hit or pitched, but not both.

Oaks was named a first-team All-America utility player last season after posting a 22-4 record with a 0.73 ERA in the circle while hitting .301 with a teambest 52 runs scored, 10 home runs and 32 RBI.

Oaks was named to the All-Big West Conference first-team as both a pitcher and third baseman in 2002 – the first player in conference history to accomplish that feat.

Cox wielded a big bat as a junior, hit-

ting .325 with nine home runs and 38 RBI. She also scored 43 runs (which ranked second on the team) and smacked nine doubles.

Her average improved 73 percentage points last year from the end of 2001 and she posted an 18-5 record (including a perfect 9-0 Big West record) in the circle to go with a 1.54 ERA.

In some ways, senior shortstop Amanda Hockett is the most dangerous player on the Titan roster.

Despite hitting just .250 with eight home runs and 33 RBI, Hockett had a knack for jumpstarting the Titan offense by getting on base thanks to being hit by a pitch 20 times in 2002.

Hockett was an All-Big West second team selection last season, slugging .429 and boasting the fourth-best on-base percentage (.386) among Titan regulars.

Senior infielder Amy LaRocque had a career year as a junior, making 56 starts in 59 appearances, LaRocque hit .272 with a pair of home runs and 25 RBI while setting career bests in just about every category.

LaRocque saw action at three different positions in 2002, playing mostly at third base when Oaks was pitching, and designated player.

Senior Kristy Halagarda saw action in 36 games last season, mostly as a lateinning defensive replacement in the outfield or as a pinch runner.

Halagarda hit just .174 in 23 at-bats while scoring nine runs and tying Cox for the team lead with two triples. She amassed an on-base percenatge of .406 and was a threat to steal, swiping 3-of-6 bases for a team which did not run very much in 2002.

Senior Krista O'Hanian, who is in her second season with the Titans after tranferring from Illinois State, wowed the crowd on more than one occasion with diving catches in the outfield and should compete for starting time at the position this year.

O'Hanian appeared in 38 games for the Titans, mostly as a defensive replacement or pinch-runner, but did show some skill with the bat when given the chance. She hit .294 on the year with The junior class is thin for the Titans, but all will play major roles for Cal State Fullerton in the upcoming season.

With the loss of Topping for 11games early in the season due to injury, Jennifer Holt did a stellar job of holding the pitching staff together. After missing the latter part of her freshman year due to injury, Holt hit just .167 on the year with six runs scored, a pair of doubles and two RBI. In the field, Holt made just one error in 267 chances (.992), ranking fifth on the team in that category.

Sparkplug Julie Watson, who enjoyed a stellar rookie campaign in 2001, struggled in 2002, hitting just .214 on the year with 19 runs and six RBI. However, she was very productive with runners on base, finishing second on the team with seven sacrifice hits.

Sophomores Heather Saltarelli and Caylin Hornish saw limited action as rookies in 2002, but should compete for playing time on the squad this season.

Saltarelli appeared in 39 games, mostly as a pinch runner, scoring 12 runs and stealing 3-of-6 bases.

Perhaps the highlight of her year came on the road in the rarified air at Utah State, where she smacked a two-run home run down the right field line for her first career hit.

Hornish appeared in 14 games, making six starts at catcher and first base early in the year with the losses of Topping and Monica Lucatero to injury. She hit just .211 on the season with a double and two RBI.

Cal State Fullerton will welcome four newcomers for the 2003 season, two of those via the transfer.

Junior Inez Vasquez from Santa Ana College will provide the Titans with a little bit of everything after a stellar career with the Dons.

The outfielder finished her career with a .355 average – including .394 as a freshman – 38 RBI and 37-of-40 in stolen bases. Vasquez, a two-time All-Orange Empire Conference selection, amassed a career total of 66 runs scored which stands second in school history.

Sophomore Jody Campbell came to Cal State Fullerton after one season at Cypress College where she helped the Chargers to the Orange Empire Conference title as a freshman in 2002.

Cypress College went 46-8 overall in 2002 and was the No. 2 seed in the state tournament before finishing fourth.

Campbell hit .308 with 31 RBI and 28 runs scored, while leading the team in doubles with 12.

Freshman Roxy Moran will shore up the pitching staff and, if bloodlines have any say in things, she may be destined for greatness.

Moran was a four-time all-league selection and a two-time All-CIF honoree at Cajon HS. Her sister, Lana, was a 1998 All-America pitcher at Oklahoma and was part of the 2000 National Championship squad.

Freshman Crystal Medina will add depth and speed to the Titan infield in 2003. Medina, who played second and third base and even did a little pitching with Mt. Whitney HS in Visalia, Calif., was a three-time all-league selection for the Pioneers.

"As far as the newcomers go, we will have to include our sophomores as well," Gromacki said. "We, as a staff, think they need to step up and contribute positively, whether that be on or off the field.

"It is vital for the future of the program and we will push for that to happen."

he schedule will be up to par with recent years as Cal State Fullerton will face 14 teams ranked in the 2002 final polls – six of those in the top 10 – and the possibility of five other top 25 teams at the Kia Klassic.

The Titans will face Pacific-10 Conference powerhouses Arizona and UCLA in non-conference doubleheaders, while taking on defending National Champion California in Fullerton's first game of the 2003 Worth Invitational.

Nationally-ranked Nebraska, Oklahoma, LSU, South Carolina, Stanford, Texas A&M, and Massachusetts will dot the schedule in four tournaments at UCLA, Arizona State, UNLV and the NFCA Leadoff Classic in Columbus, Ga.

Oregon State will close out the Worth Invitational slate and a three-game home series with conference rival Pacific will highlight an always difficult schedule in an ever-improving Big West.

"We believe that this year's schedule is our most difficult," Gromacki said. "More knowledge is gained and more lessons are learned early on. We're not afraid of that.

"Sailing the ship through adversities is the only way we are going to win the national championship."

Turns out you can go home again.

Now entering her fourth season at the helm of the Cal State Fullerton softball team, head coach Michelle Gromacki has not only come back to the school which she helped lead to a NCAA National Championship in 1986 on the field, but now has the Titans on the verge of breaking into the Women's College World Series as a head coach.

Hired as an assistant to Judi Garman in 1995, Gromacki was promoted to head coach in 2000 after Garman's retirement. In her three seasons as head coach, Gromacki has led the Titans to three straight Big West Conference titles and three trips to the NCAA Regionals – including the regional championship game in 2002.

Gromacki earned Big West Conference Coach of the Year honors in her first season, leading a young Titan squad to a 45-15 record and its first league title since 1993. With more experience on the field in 2001, Gromacki's Titans finished 48-14 overall and won the conference for the second consecutive year after going 19-2 in the Big West.

The 2002 season was a banner year as Gromacki led Fullerton to a 53-13 overall mark (the most victories in a season since Gromack led the Titans to 59 wins as a player in 1987) and a 22-2 mark in the Big West – the highest conference winning percentage in school history.

Gromacki has also twice headed-up Speedline/NFCA West Region Coaching Staff's of the Year in 2000 and 2002.

The past two summers, Gromacki has had her chance to shine on an international level as well, serving as an assistant coach on the 2001 USA Blue team which competed in three international tournaments, and serving as an assistant on the US National "Elite" Team which competed in the Canada Cup and served as a "sparring" partner for the US National Training Team in 2002.

As an assistant coach at Cal State Fullerton, Gromacki helped lead the Titans to a 184-129 (.588) overall record and a 79-69 (.534) Big West mark in five seasons. Fullerton posted a 20-8 league record in her first season as an assistant in 1995 (46-17 overall) and finished second in the conference before advancing to the Women's College World Series where the Titans finished fifth.

Regarded as one of the best catchers in the nation, Gromacki helped lead the Titans to a combined 170-19-1 overall record and a 65-10-1 mark in conference play as a player while claiming the 1986 NCAA National Championship.

In 1995, Gromacki was invited to participate in the first-ever Olympic try-out camp and led the Redding Rebels to three of four ASA Women's Major Fastpitch National Championships. She was also named an ASA All-American that season, an honor she has earned eight times during her career. Gromacki was also selected as a member of the US National Team that participated in the tournament to open the Olympic Complex for the 1996 Summer Games in Atlanta.

In 1994, Gromacki was a member of several US National Teams which claimed gold medals at the South Pacific Classic Tournament, the World Championships in Canada, and the Pan Am Qualifier in Guatemala. She was a participant in the Olympic Sports Festival in St. Louis as both a player and an assistant coach to Ralph Weekly.

From 1985-92, Gromacki participated in three Olympic Sports Festivals and was a member of two US National Teams that took gold medals in international competition in China (1987) and Japan (1985). She also spent eight months playing on a traveling team in New Zealand from 1988-89.

Aside from playing, Gromacki has also been involved in numerous

Gromacki is also a contributor to numerous athletic publications, including authoring a monthly column for Southern California Softball Magazine and writing articles for the National Fastpitch Coaches Association newsletter.

A native of Antioch, Calif., Gromacki currently resides in Huntington Beach. Her parents are Rick and Adeline.



2nd Season Missouri '85



Assistant coach Terry Schweikert enters her second season as Michelle Gromacki's top assistant after spending the pervious five years at a pair of Big 12 schools. Hired in July, 2001, Schweikert is Gromacki's "defensive coordinator" and recruiting coordinator.

Schweikert came to Fullerton after a three-year stint at the University of Nebraska as an assistant coach under Rhonda Revelle. She helped the Cornhuskers to regional final appearances in 1999 and 2000 and played a hand in Nebraska's back-to-back 2000 and 2001 Big 12 championships.

Schweikert, who also assisted Revelle in recruiting, worked primarily with the middle infielders and coached two-time All-American Jennifer Lizama. In addition, Schweikert coordinated and directed camps, clinics and community outreach programs for Nebraska.

Previously, Schweikert was an assistant coach during the 1997-98 seasons at her alma mater, Missouri. Schweikert helped the Tigers win a Bia 12 title and return to the NCAA Tournament in 1997. In 1998, Missouri reached as high as ninth in the NFCA Top-25 poll.

"Terry has been involved with some nationally reputable programs and I think that experience will be invaluable," Gromacki said. "She certainly has shown that she can effectively work with student-athletes."

Schweikert played softball for Missouri from 1982 to 1985, earning Missouri's Rookie-of-the-Year honors as a freshman and Player-of-the-Year honors as a junior. She helped the Tigers to their only Big Eight Tournament title and first College World Series appearance in 1984. During her junior and senior years, Schweikert captained the Tigers and was named all-region both seasons.

After earning a bachelor's degree in physical education, Schweikert returned to her hometown of Springfield, Mo., to serve as the head swimming coach, head volleyball coach and assistant basketball coach at Parkview High School. She also spent four years at Hopkins High School in Minnesota, where she served as the head softball coach and led her teams to two state tournaments. In 1996, she led Hopkins to a perfect 14-0 conference mark and was named the Minnesota High School Coach of the Year.

Throughout her coaching career, Schweikert has continued to play softball competitively. In 1990, she was named an Amateur Softball Association All-American while winning a national championship.

Schweikert currently resides in Placentia. Her parents are Bill and Dorothy.





1st Season UCLA '94



Former UCLA standout pitcher and Wisconsin assistant coach Dee Dee Weiman enters her first season as an assistant coach under Michelle Gromacki at Cal State Fullerton. Hired to her position on Sept. 1, Weiman will work mainly with the pitching staff while assisting Gromacki with other aspects of the program.

"I am excited to have DeeDee join our coaching staff," Gromacki said. "She is the piece of the puzzle that will help our program continue to grow and build a solid foundation for future success."

Weiman spent the last three seasons as an assistant coach at Wisconsin, where she was in charge of coaching the Badgers' pitching staff and also working with the catchers. During her tenure with Wisconsin, Weiman helped lead the Badgers to three straight Big Ten Tournaments and appearances in the NCAA Tournament the last two

While with the Badgers, Weiman coached the school's first-ever first-team All-Big Ten Conference pitcher in Andrea Kirchberg, who also owns nearly every pitching record at Wisconsin.

This past season, Weiman, head coach Karen Gallagher and assistant coach Ali Viola were named the 2002 Speedline/NFCA Division I Mideast Region Coaching Staff of the Year, sharing the honor with the Notre Dame coaching staff. Wisconsin posted its third consecutive 30-win season and a fourth-place finish in the conference – the best in the history of the program.

As a player, Weiman was a member of the 1990 and 1992 UCLA national championship-winning squads while earning All-Pacific-10 Conference honors twice in her career and first-team All-America honors as a senior in 1994. A Honda Broderick Award nominee in 1994. Weiman finished her Bruin career with a 59-13 overall record, a 0.79 ERA, 746 career strikeouts and 16 no-hitters. Weiman's 359 strikeouts in 1994 still stand as a single-season school record.

Weiman also holds the NCAA career record for strikeout ratio at 10.4 strikeouts per seven innings.

She continued her playing career in the Women's Professional Softball League, playing four seasons (1997-2000) after being drafted as the 10th selection in the second round of the 1996 Amateur Draft.

Weiman won the 1999 WPSL championship with the Tampa Bay Firestix and recorded the first strikeout, complete game, victory, save and shutout in team history. She was also the first-ever pitcher to throw a perfect game in WPSL history, shutting down the Carolina Diamonds on Aug. 1, 1998.

Weiman was a two-time WPSL All-Star selection in 1998 and 1999, and ranks first in league history in games started (83), complete games (70), innings (640.3) and appearances (113). She ranks second in strikeouts (446) and saves (6) while ranking third in wins (46) and shutouts (10).

This season, Weiman will be reunited with her catcher on the 1993 ASA Women's Open National Championship in Gromacki, when the duo helped lead the Redding Rebels to the national title.

Weiman graduated from UCLA with a bachelors degree in sociology in 1994. She has a six-year-old son, Tyler, and resides in Fullerton.

GROMACKI EARNS 100TH WIN

Cal State Fullerton head coach Michelle Gromacki reach the 100-win plateau in the Titans' 6-0 victory over Massachusetts at the NFCA Leadoff Classic.

Gromacki reached 100 wins in just 134 games, breaking the all-sports school record held by former head baseball coach Augie Garrido, who earned his first 100 victories in 135 games. Former softball head coach Judi Garman won 100 games in 143 games.

Gromacki enters the 2003 season with 146 career wins and could reach the 150-win mark as soon as Feb. 1 at UCLA's Stacey Winsberg Memorial Tournament against Loyola Marymount.

SWINGING FOR THE FENCES

Cal State Fullerton's offense in 2002 was one for the books as the Titans set six school and three Big West Conference records over the course of the year.

Fullerton's 65 home runs in 2002 broke the old record of 54 set during the 1999 season, the 326 runs scored smashed the 1987 record of 316 runs and the 288 RBI by the Titans broke the 2001 record of 279.

The Titans also set new school records for runs per game (5.09), walks (203) and hit by pitches (55).

HOME SWEET HOME

You can't blame the Titans if they wanted to play every game at home in 2002.

Cal State Fullerton was an almost-perfect 30-1 at the friendly confines of the Titan Softball Complex last season, setting school marks for fewest home losses and best home winning percentage (,968). The lone loss? The season opener against San Diego.

TITANS VS. THE NATION

Cal State Fullerton finished 2002 ranked among the best teams in the nation statistically both as a team and individually.

The Titans finished 21st in the NCAA in batting average (.292). 14th in ERA (1.26), 25th in fielding percentage (.968), third in home runs per game (0.98), 16th in scoring (5.09), sixth in slugging (.457) and tied for seventh in winning percentage (.803).

Individually, Jenny Topping ranked fourth in the nation in average (.472), ninth in slugging (.761) and 13th in walks per game (0.66).

Gina Oaks was seventh in the nation in ERA (0.73) while Jodie Cox was tied for 18th in the country in strikeouts per seven innings (8.7).

BARRY BONDS? NO, JUST JENNY TOPPING


You think Barry Bonds walked alot this past season? We'd like you to meet his softball counterpart, Jenny Topping.

Topping, despite missing the first 11 games of the year, still finished with 35 walks (second in the Big West) and broke Sue Lewis' school career record of 89 set from 1981-84.

Topping, who has almost as many career walks (91) as she does career RBI (92), broke the record with her second walk in the first meeting with California at the NCAA Regionals on May 18.

UNBLEMISHED

Cal State Fullerton junior pitcher Jodie Cox, with some help from her pitching teammate Christy Robitaille, won her 17th game of the year in the Big West Conference title-clinching 4-3 victory over Cal Poly, which also moved her to 9-0 in Big West games.

Cox was the only pitcher to go undefeated in conference play, amassing a 0.68 ERA and seven complete games. She scattered just 28 hits in 51.1 innings, surrendering only nine runs (five earned) with 53 strikeouts and 16 walks.

Opponents hit just .153 against her in league play to go along with three shutouts and her first career save against UC Santa Barbara.

ANOTHER FIRST FOR OAKS

On May 10 against Cal Poly, junior pitcher Gina Oaks became the Titans' first 20-game winner since Jana Oetgen posted a 21-12 overall mark in 1999.

However, the fun didn't stop there. Oaks also finished the year with a 0.73 ERA, becoming the first Titan pitcher in nine years to post an ERA of less than a run.

Cheryl Longeway (0.93) and Tiffany Boyd (0.96) last accomplished the feat in 1993, and Oaks' ERA was the lowest since 1991 when Boyd posted a 0.68 ERA.

THIS BEAN BALL SPONSORED BY BAND-AID

Apparently Cal State Fullerton shortstop Amanda Hockett isn't the only one with a special attraction for the softball.

Aside from leading the team with 20 bruises, Hockett has been the recipient of 41 bean balls throughout her career – the most among any player to wear a Cal State Fullerton uniform.

Four others on the 2002 Titan roster are ranked in the top 10 among the all-time hit-by-pitch leaders as Gina Oaks (2nd - 25), Monica Lucatero (4th - 10), Jodie Cox (15th - 9) and Yasmin Mossadeghi (17th - 8) have all broken into the list.

Hockett broke her own single-season school record for being hit by a pitch on March 24 against Cal State Northridge as she was plunked for the 14th time, surpassing the 13 bean balls her body absorbed as a freshman.

On a little tangent, if this were baseball, Hockett

would rank tied for third on the career list, trailing all-time leader David Bacani (1998-01) by 17 bean balls and C.J. Ankrum (1995-97) by four for second place.

The 2002 Cal State Fullerton squad had more bruises than any other in the history of the sport at the university. The 55 batters hit by opposing pitchers in 2002 surpasses the 39 that were plunked in 2001 to set a new school record.

COX ON A ROLL... HOLD THE MAYO

Left-hander Jodie Cox finished 2002 by posting 14 victories in her final 17 appearances (14 starts, three relief appearances), allowing 12 earned runs over 88.2 innings to post an ERA of 0.95. She scattered 55 hits and amassed a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.9-to-1, putting up 102 strikeouts to just 26 walks.

During that time, Cox also saw her ERA drop almost a run, from 2.27 to 1.54. Of those 14 starts, seven were shortened thanks to the eight-run mercy rule.

Among the highlights of her streak: Cox struck out career-high 16 batters against Rutgers in the opening round of the Kia Klassic (a mark which surpassed the 14 batters she struck out against San Jose State on March 2 of last year at the Worth Invitational), and back-to-back no-hitters against Pacific and UC Riverside.

TWO TITANS NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR QUARTERFINALISTS

Cal State Fullerton's Gina Oaks and Jenny Topping were named as two quarterfinalists for the inaugural USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award, the Amateur Softball Association announced on April 5.

The award is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players around the country. Oaks and Topping were listed along with 23 other players.



The letters "H" and "S" have produced the most Titans with 15 apiece. The letter "M" is next with 14, followed by "G" with 13, "L" with 11, and "D" with 10.

***** #22 must be lucky. Although some players have worn different numbers during their careers, No. 22 has been worn by 12 different Titans - the most of any uniform number in the history of the program. Only #16 (10 times) has been worn by a Titan 10-or-more times.

Talk about specializing... Of the 173 players listed on the all-time roster (not taking into account mid-season changes of position due to injuries, etc.), 79 percent of those were listed on the rosters at a single position.

Only one player was listed as playing the infield, outfield and pitcher (Lisa Baker) and two players (Sue Lewis and Leslie King) were listed as playing catcher, infielder and outfielder.

The other 33 players were a combination of the four positions or utility players.

***** "L" Stands for "All-American"... The letter "L" has turned out five All-Americans in the history of the program at Cal State Fullerton, one of 14 letters of the alphabet to host an All-American in Titan history. Susan LeFebvre, Sue Lewis, Stephenie Little, Janet Lloyd, and Monica Lucatero have each earned All-America honors in the Titan careers.

Second on that list is "D" ("Mich" DeBree, Denise DeWalt and Valerie Douglas), followed by the letters "C", "M", "O", "T" and "V" with two All-Americans apiece.

24 of the 26 letters of the alphabet are represented on the Titans' all-time roster. The only two letters not used? The letters "U" and "X".

2003 CAL STATE FULLERTON SOFTBA

Of all the 173 players on the alltime roster, just 33 of them are four-year letterwinners. The majority (58) were in a Titan uniform for only two seasons.

Only two played for Cal State Fullerton for five seasons due to injury: Ann Van Dortrecht (1989-93) and Rachel Olvera (1997-01).



The National Fastpitch Coaches Association annually honors the top collegiate softball players with the selection of the Speedline/NFCA All-America teams. Head coaches choose three teams with 13 athletes on the first and second teams and 15 athletes on the third team. The teams are announced each year in conjunction with the Women's College World Series in May.

Cal State Fullerton's All-America history is deep. In all, 25 different Titan players have been selected to a total of 32 All-America berths. First baseman Sue Lewis is the only three-time winner among the Titans. Tiffany Boyd, Denise DeWalt, Susan LeFebvre, Chenita Rogers and Jenny Topping are two-time winners. Currently, the Titans have two All-Americans on their roster: pitcher/infielder Gina Oaks earned first-team honors in 2002 as a utility player while Jenny Topping earned first-team honors in 2001 and 2002 as a catcher.





Titan Athletics...A Proud History

From modest beginnings and never with abundant resources, the Cal State Fullerton Titans have achieved successes that are the envy of many older and larger institutions across the country.

"Titan Pride" has been the rallying cry for 11 national team championships in seven different sports, hundreds of individual All-Americans, dozens of eventual professional athletes, numerous national coach of the year award winners, Olympic basketball players, a Miss America candidate and the subject matter of a Walt Disney film.

The tenor was set by the first intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only his second season, Coach Alex Omalev advanced the Titans five rounds into the NAIA playoffs in 1961-62. Sixteen seasons later, the nation watched another "Cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association postseason tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the NCAA Western Regional.

The basketball tradition began even stronger on the women's side. Recent Naismith and Women's Basketball Hall of Fame inductee Billie Moore coached the Titans to the national championship in 1970 and star forward Nancy Dunkle was one of her players on the women's 1976 silver-medal winning Olympic team. The most recent Titan All-American was center Genia Miller in 1991.

The Titans earned gold in 1984 when point guard Leon Wood directed the men's Olympic team to victory in Los Angeles. The first-round draft pick of the Philadelphia 76ers went on to a 6-year National Basketball Association career and is now a veteran NBA referee, only the second former NBA player to make that career switch.

Future NBA performers Richard Morton, Henry Turner, Cedric Ceballos and Bruce Bowen were some of the stars of the 1980s and 1990s, when the Titans made NIT appearances on both the men's and women's sides. Ceballos gained notoriety for winning the NBA Slam-Dunk contest one year while the women can point with pride to Autumn Hollyfield, the nation's top 3-point field goal shooter in 1993-94, and Koko Lahanas, the nation's scoring leader in 1994-95. Miller still holds NCAA records and came back from a career in Japan to earn a spot with the Los Angeles Sparks of the WNBA as Eugenia Rycraw.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton considerable fame. Former men's Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division NCAA titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had subsequent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation. Coach Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation 12 times and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while Tami Elliott (1984-86) won 10 All-American awards before becoming Miss Virginia and competing in the Miss America pageant.

Baseball exploded onto the national scene behind former Coach Augie Garrido by breaking the USC monopoly in the NCAA western regionals in 1975. The Titans won the national title in 1979 behind Tim Wallach, who would play 17 major league seasons. They won the College World Series again in 1984 and John Fishel was the MVP of the CWS. They were national runners-up in 1992 with another MVP in third baseman Phil Nevin, who also was the first pick in the amateur draft by the Houston Astros.

The Titans placed third in the CWS in 1994 and came back with their best season ever in 1995, going 57-9 en route to their third national championship. Leading the way was Player of the Year Mark Kotsay, now with the San Diego Padres, and one of 36 former Titans to have played in the majors. Fullerton had made two more trips to Omaha under Coach George Horton.

Women also have sparkled on Fullerton diamonds. Hall of Fame Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and won more games (913) than any previous coach. The Titans have made eight trips to the College World Series and 21 regional appearances. They brought home an NCAA Championship in 1986 and boast three national players of the year in pitchers Kathy Van Wyk, Susan LeFebvre and Connie Clark.

The now-defunct football program made great strides in Division I-A after its humble Div. Il beginnings in 1970. Coach Gene Murphy guided the Titans to two conference championships and four runner-up finishes between 1983 and 1989. Titan products included Super Bowl rookies Bobby Kemp (Cincinnati in 1982) and Mark Collins (New

York Giants in 1987). Titans have had remarkable success in the Canadian Football League. Allen Pitts is the CFL's all-time leading receiver and Damon Allen, who was still active this season, is the all-time leading passer. Mike Pringle is the No. 2 all-time rusher and could become No. 1 if he stays healthy for two more seasons.

With the loss of football, Head Coach Al Mistri's soccer program filled the void in Titan Stadium. A women's squad was launched in 1993 and it coincided with a memorable men's season that saw the Titans climb as high as No. 3 in the national rankings. They were led by All-American forward Eddie Soto - now an assistant coach with the program - and competed at the NCAA Final Four, placing third. There have been three subsequent trips to the playoffs and a No. 2 national ranking in 1996. On the international level, former Titan Brian Dunseth captained the U.S. Olympic team in the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

There have been national titles in men's cross country (1971) and women's fencing (1974) and individual standouts such as golfer Martha Wilkerson, runner Mark Covert and wrestler Laszlo Molnar, who finished second in the nation in 1994 at 167 pounds. Heather Killeen became the Titans' first Div. I cross country All-American in 1994, won three events at the 1995 Big West Conference track championships and was one of 10 finalists for 1995 NCAA Woman of the Year Award. The Titans have a multiple-sport star in Brandon Campbell. He completed his track and field career in 2002 with six school records while placing sixth in the high jump and 16th in the long jump at the NCAA championships. He still has one more season of basketball, where he was the team's No. 2 scorer last year.



"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that arise when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit to an area. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, there are some recognized legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explained Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname "Titans." "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels.

It was a unique student body, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done but then along came the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History.'

What began as a practical joke attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions of the caricature have been made to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek. The costume that brings the mascot to life also has changed. Tuffy even attracted a female Tiffy in 1992.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was appropriate on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue was initiated in 1992 with a de-emphasis of the orange.

NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills

Cal State Fullerton is a participating institution in the NCAA's CHAMPS/Life Skills program, which is aimed at enhancing the



quality of the studentathlete experience within the university setting. Throughout their career, Cal State Fullerton studentathletes are provided with resources that will assist their development in five primary

areas: academics, athletics, personal development, career development and community service.

Headed by Dr. June Kearney, the Athletic Academic Services department, tabbed as Titan Scholars, provides effective support services to help student-athletes reach their academic goals. The academic services staff takes a proactive role by coordinating study plans, study skills workshops, tutoring sessions, study halls, faculty and peer mentoring and campus services referrals. Staff members also monitor progress toward graduation, assist student-athletes in selecting and registering for classes and teach a Life Skills 100 class.

Coaches rely on Athletic Academic Services to track student-athletes' progress in classes and to alert them and the students to any potential problems. The department has an "early warning" system in place, which utilizes periodic grade checks and clear communication with faculty members when student-athletes may require additional academic support.

The department also provides a re-entry program for former student-athletes who return to Cal State Fullerton to complete their degree.

ATHLETIC TRAINING

The athletic training program at Cal State Fullerton plays a major role in maintaining the health of Titan student-athletes. Team physicians, three full-time certified athletic trainers, two certified graduate assistants and more than 20 student assistants comprise a program that is generally regarded as one of the very best in the country.

Titan athletic training personnel specialize in preventive medicine, recognition of injuries and rehabilitation. Student athletic trainers who are admitted into the highly selective ATEP (Athletic Training Educational Program), which is administered through the Department of Kinesiology and Health Promotion, must meet demanding requirements. In addition to taking 100 units of kinesiology and athletic training courses, they must serve five semesters and 1,500 clinical supervised hours. Before becoming certified, candidates must pass the National Athletic Trainers' Association Board of Certification examination. Since 1997, nearly 80 percent of Cal State Fullerton graduates have passed on their first attempt, compared to the national rate of about 30 percent. Since the inception of the program, dozens of alumni have moved into coveted positions across the country (see below).

Julie Max, Cal State Fullerton's Head Athletic Trainer, has been the driving force behind the development of an athletic training program that has received national acclaim. Max is in her 24th year at her alma mater since replacing her mentor, the late Jerry Lloyd. Recently, Max was elected to a second two-year term as president of the 25,000-member National Association of Athletic Trainers (NATA). Max, the first female president in the organization's history, previously served a six-year stint on the organization's board of directors and a one-year term as its vice president. In 1997, Max was honored with the NATA Service Award, which recognizes outstanding service to the athletic training profession at the state and district level.



LETIC FACILITIES

Titan Gymnasium

Titan Gym currently is undergoing major renovations. In the past few years, chairback seats have replaced most of the bleachers, portable basket supports have replaced the fold down backboards, new paint and banners have been applied to the walls and the playing surface has been redone. Scheduled for completion by the end of the academic year is an expansion which will feature numerous classrooms, physical testing laboratories and a new practice facility upstairs. Budgeted and due for installation soon are the balance of the chairback seats, new lighting and a new "drop down" scoreboard over center court. The facility also features practice and match rooms for the wrestling, gymnastics and fencing programs.

Goodwin Field

Goodwin Field was the host site for Cal State Fullerton's first NCAA Baseball Regional in the spring of 2000 and also played host to a Regional and Super Regional in 2001. A \$3 million expansion project, spearheaded by a \$1 million gift from Jerry and Merilyn Goodwin, has transformed the field into one of the premier collegiate facilities on the West Coast. The field now features the Wilson Clubhouse which includes lockerrooms, a reception area and offices for the coaches - and the Doubek VIP Room.

Titan Softball Complex

Having received a complete makeover since the 2000 season, the Titan Softball Complex boasts one of the top facilities in the nation. Utilizing the adjacent Wilson Clubhouse and Doubek VIP Room, the twodiamond complex can now adequately serve as a host site for postseason competition in addition to the annual Kia Klassic, the top regular-season tournament in the nation.

Titan Stadium

Titan Stadium is considered among the finest soccer facilities in the nation and regularly hosts professional and international soccer matches in addition to the Titan men's and women's programs. The facility, completed in 1992, was home to the Titan football program for one year before the sport was dropped after the 1992 season. The stadium is also a hot-spot for the entertainment industry and is regularly featured in television commercials and programs.



STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

Cal State Fullerton student-athletes have year-round access to the services offered by the Strength and Conditioning Program, under the direction of **Mike Nagler**. Aimed at developing speed, power, strength and endurance in Cal State Fullerton's student-athletes, the program plays a key role in the success of Titan teams.

Individual workouts are designed, implemented and regularly adjusted by Nagler to help each student-athlete develop the stamina needed to maintain the rigorous year-round workouts associated with Division I sports.

Located inside Titan Stadium is a 6,000 square-foot weight room facility featuring eight platforms, eight squat racks, plyometric devices and nearly 8,000 pounds in free weights. The facility will service more than 300 student-athletes over the course of the year.





Mike Nagler was named Cal State Fullerton's first full-time strength and conditioning coach on Jan. 4, 2000. Nagler had spent the previous 17 months as assistant strength coach at the University of Iowa. At Iowa, Nagler was in charge of developing and implementing weight lifting programs for women's basketball, volleyball, women's soccer, men's and women's track, gymnastics, softball and men's and women's golf. He also assisted with the men's basketball program.

He also previously worked as an assistant at Baylor University, the University of Washington, UNLV and Washington State and served as an intern with the NFL's Seattle Seahawks.

Nagler, 31, earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science from Washington State in 1993 and picked up a master's degree in kinesiology from UNLV in 1996.

Cal State Fullerton is nestled in sun-drenched Orange County, with its mountains, amusement parks, professional sports, cultural showcases and seashores among the top attractions. Students can reach ski slopes in 45 minutes and the beach in less than a half hour. Los Angeles, with its never-ending cultural and entertainment opportunities, lies just 30 miles northwest of the campus and San Diego is 100 miles to the south. The city of Fullerton itself, which has a fascinating history dating back to the late 19th century, boasts a beautiful historic downtown area that features dozens of restaurants, museums and shops.

The extensive development of the 42 miles of beaches in Orange County and attractions such as Disneyland, Knott's Berry Farm, the Laguna Festival of Arts and Pageant of the Masters, the Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim, Edison International Field and the Orange County Performing Arts Center continue to make tourism an increasingly important activity. So does the Mediterranean-type climate, with rainfall averaging 14 inches per year, and generally mild days (either freezing or 100-degree temperatures uncommon) with frequent morning fog during the summer.
