Formerly the Annex, Clubhouse opens at LV

Remember the Annex? Like the frog that turned into a prince, what used to be that strange structure with old shuffleboard lanes, no real roof and storage space for theatrical sets is now 4,000 bright square feet for Leisure Village activities, appropriately called The Clubhouse.

New roof, new flooring and carpet, new lighting, new paint and new furniture in three new rooms greeted Villagers at the official ribbon-cutting party on Jan. 22.

The project — proposed four years ago by the strategic planning committee — has added a new larger home for Wii Bowling, a ping-pong room with specialized flooring and a cabaret room for parties, dances and classes.

Budget calls for assessment increase of 3.845 percent

At the January Town Hall meeting, LV's proposed 2014-15 budget was outlined for homeowners, after a line-byline effort by the Homeowners Association staff and the Board of Directors that took several months. The budget grand total for the upcoming fiscal year is projected to be \$11,725,988.

Based on that figure, the homeowner's assessment will be increased in the next fiscal year by 3.845 percent. That translates into an approximate \$12 to \$18 monthly increase, depending on the size of the house.

The facts and figures for 2014-15 were presented to the audience — in the AR and those watching at home — by the Board's Treasurer, Ted Lansing, using a PowerPoint Presentation.

There are no significant lower costs in this new budget. Increased expenditures for the upcoming year include

2.4-mile tree-planting project completed along LV Drive

A drive down the 2.4 miles of Leisure Village Drive — that's East Gate to West Gate — is now a verdant example of the generosity of LV residents.

Thanks to donations from Villagers and the efforts of LV's landscape crew, 84 new trees have been planted along the route, filling in the open spaces between the curb and sidewalks.

This "street tree" project, first suggested in the 2010 Master Plan, cost nearly \$11,000, and 90 percent of that came from contributions by Villagers and Village groups, according to Karen Snethen, LV's landscape assistant.

The new saplings are mostly flowering trees, "specifically chosen because they will put on an ongoing show," says former Board member and landscape

The volunteers cannot do returns involving depreciation or rental property schedules, health savings accounts, part-year or out-of-state residents or small businesses with losses or expenses over \$10,000.

insurance costs (\$77,000), sewer expenses (\$90,000) and cable (\$54,000).

"Some of the figures are 'what if accounts," said General Manager Bob Scheaffer. "If the sewer breaks, the money is spent. If it doesn't break, we don't spend it."

Lansing said that over the previous 38 years, the average annual increase in assessment has been 4.48 percent. "The increase this year is obviously less than that," he added.

"Browsing the Internet" is offered on Feb. 12 or 26 and March 12 or 26. Space

is limited, and reservations are required. Please call the Reference Desk at 805-388-5811.

In addition, on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons from 2 to 3 p.m., the library offers a "drop-in" lab for those with questions about their laptops, iPhones, iPads and Kindle devices. Library staff will provide assistance with photo and document management, email accounts, basic Internet questions and more. Sign up is required at the Reference Desk because of the limited number of available computers.

Another training resource offered at the Camarillo Library is the program "lynda. com." It is a comprehensive library of 2,000-plus instructional videos taught by industry experts and uses a self-paced online video method of instruction. This program is available only at

the Tech Lab at the Camarillo Library. A subscription can be purchased for use on your home computer.

If you don't have your own computer, you are welcome to use the computers Leisure Village has available for residents. A key is required to access the Tech Center and can be obtained after completing a Key Request Form available at the Rec Office. Hopefully, between the lessons available at the library and those our Tech Center is planning for the future, LV residents will be able to navigate the Internet, email their family and friends, upload and view family photos and enjoy all the wonderful resources now available to everyone in this electronic age.

available to the community. There are books, books on tape, music CDs, videos, ongoing educational and entertaining programs and so much more — all free to the public.

Our local library also has an Adult Learning Center that provides tutoring, mostly in speaking, reading and writing English, but also in math, science and history. They also provide assistance to those preparing for their GED. Several current volunteers are Leisure Village residents.

Since so many of our residents are retired teachers, volunteering at the library can be a perfect fit. How rewarding it is to see the progress when someone with limited English skills becomes proficient in the language. Some of those seeking assistance are well-educated but feel inadequate in their ability to communicate well in English. Others have the need to learn the basics of English.

The tutors also help those who are preparing for their citizenship examination.

Wendy Batstone is the coordinator

of the Adult Literacy Center.

The library does an outstanding job for those in our community seeking tutorial assistance — and at no cost. The designated room for the tutors has bookshelves full of books for those working on their English skills. The reading level of the books runs from basic to more advanced, and the books can be checked out to the students.

A series of classes is offered to new tutors to acquaint them with the skills needed to be a successful volunteer. Tutors are free to work with their learners to schedule meeting times and places. It is so rewarding and often a life-changing experience for both the tutor and the one being tutored.

Services that you can offer are: one-to-one tutoring in reading, one-to-one tutoring in writing and one-to-one tutoring in spoken English. No prior teaching experience is necessary. Some of those learning simply need experience talking to someone in English.

Barbara Williams, a Village resident and library tutor for almost five years, shared how rewarding her experience has been. Belen, her student, originally from Mexico, came to her with limited


