Woodshop member helps LV resident restore precious model sternwheeler

The boat — a model sternwheeler to be precise — is 64 years old and precious.

"My grandfather made it for me when I was born," explains Villager Peggy O'Reilly. "I've moved at least a dozen times in my life, and it always goes with me."

So, when Peggy moved into Leisure Village six years ago, the boat — named the Peggy Ann — dry-docked in her house as usual. But it was showing its age — the rigging was frayed, the wiring tattered, the paint chipped. She knew it was a long shot, but Peggy took

her family treasure to the LV Woodshop.

"Any chance someone could save this?" she asked. It was 2009.

"The boat was disintegrating, but I could see what it meant to her," recalls Ted Lansing, longtime Woodshop member. "I took a close look at 50 handmade pulleys the size of peas, rigging made of hemp, a disintegrating 110-volt electrical system for the paddlewheel and tiny lights."

Don Kanallakan is legally blind and has a seeing eye dog named Trooper. Surprisingly, Don is a golfer with many years of membership in the Leisure Village Men's Golf Association (LVMGA).

No, Trooper is not his caddie in the traditional sense, but he does keep Don from colliding with trees, low-hanging branches and the occasional wayward hand-pulled golf cart. He is a great dog

who doesn't chase and chew golf balls as my dog, Lucy did.

Fourteen years ago, Wet Macular Degeneration robbed Don of his sight in his right eye but left him with 10 percent vision in his other eye.

"I can see contrast and movement but no perception of depth," admits Don

"We want to increase awareness of how valuable

volunteers are," John says.

His personal experience with volunteering helps drive the new LVTV program. For 12 years, John has gone to Los Robles Hospital every Sunday morning. He remembers not being confident about his abilities in the beginning.

"I was wrong. I learned quickly that everyone has a gift to share," he explains.

Which brings him back to LVTV's spotlight on volunteers. John and Bob welcome nominations.

"When we see what one person can contribute, what fun it can be, we learn that when volunteers give of themselves, they get 10 times more back," John says, hopeful that new attention to those who give will inspire others to do the same.





Living Trust a consideration for Leisure Village homeowners

Most homeowners in Leisure Village have a Living Trust, and when they go to sell the property, even if one of the owners is deceased, the Trust clearly states who has the right to sell the property.

Please keep in mind that a Power of Attorney does not give the power to sell a home, as a Power of Attorney can only be effective for a person. A Trust is not a person; therefore, the Power of Attorney can only sell a home if the Trust states that the Power of Attorney can take this action.

I am currently working with a seller who refinanced his home in 2003. The lender required that the owner take the property out of the Trust with the intention of recording the house back into the Trust once

the refinance was completed. In the meantime, the wife died, and the owner has decided to sell the house. Once the escrow was opened, while doing the title search, the title company reported that the house is not in the Trust and there is no other vesting. The owner has had to hire an attorney.

In this particular homeowner's case, this will have to go to probate. There's no way of knowing how long this will take, or if the buyer will be willing to wait until this all gets resolved.

Congressional candidates will square off at LV on Oct. 10

The hotly contested race for the 26th Congressional District seat is coming to Leisure Village. Incumbent Julia Brownley and challenger Jeff Gorell will face off on Friday, Oct. 10, at 7 p.m. in the AR. Less than a month before the November election, the two candidates will present their respective positions and then answer questions from the audience. The event was organized by LV's Current Issues Forum; it will be moderated by Jay Balter.

Brownley, a Democrat, is the incumbent, first elected to Congress in 2013. She is the ranking member of the House Veterans Affairs Subcommittee on Health. Prior to

He says Peggy's grandfather did "an exquisite job," and Ted set out to bring it back to life.

It must be said that woodshop regular Ted Lansing also has been the LV Treasurer and Board Member for six of the past seven years. He's active in the Camarillo **Emergency Radio Association** and leads a monthly class in the Village called LV 101. However, the Peggy Ann grabbed him.

"I was in the Navy for nearly eight years. I've always loved boats," he explains. "Plus, I wanted to meet the challenge of excellence that Peggy's grandfather set."

Her grandfather was "in the Coast Guard and loved to sail as a young man," says Peggy.

She didn't want to lose her precious boat. Before she moved to Leisure Village, she asked others for repair.

"No one else would fix it," she

She expected that the Woodshop was another long shot.

Peggy O'Reilly didn't know Ted Lansing. After a couple of months of working on it in the Woodshop,

he moved the Peggy Ann to his garage. He "pawed through the Internet for two years," looking for compatible components. He carefully changed the dangerous 110-volt electrical — it was a sewing machine motor — to a safer 12- volt. He found hemp at Michael's art store and recreated the rigging. He matched old paint at Home Depot.

In all, Ted estimates he spent 200 hours rebuilding the Peggy Ann. He admits his wife grumbled occasionally about the time and the space he and it occupied in their garage.

In late July 2014, Peggy O'Reilly heard a knock at the door.

"Your boat's done!" said Ted. "It brought tears to my eyes," says Peggy. "His dedication, the kind of work he did! There's no way to thank him for what he did."

Peggy describes her move to Leisure Village six years ago as "the best decision I ever made in my life." And that was before the re-creation of the Peggy Ann.

"This is not about me or even the boat," she says. "It's about Ted and people like him in the Village."

"I began to lose my sight in 2000," recalls Don. "At first I stopped all activity until I got Kojak, my first seeing-eye dog. He got me off the couch."

Don soon returned to golf and practiced his swing by going to a range in Simi Valley where he hit a bucket of golf balls almost every day.

Now he plays at the LV Course on Tournament Tuesday as well as meeting fellow retired firefighters at local golf courses other days.

LVMGA members Mike McClary, who played with Don on a recent Tuesday, said: "He's twice the golfer I am."

Joe Miller reflects: "It's amazing how he plays. He's got the neatest dog, too."

This reporter recently walked several holes on the back nine with Don. I observed dedicated cooperation from golfers within the group, which resulted in two pars and one birdie. He skillfully hit the ball onto the green in one stroke for three consecutive holes. (For you non-golfers: This is damn good.)




Amateur Radio Club




