ABOUT THE COVER

Pictured on the cover of the 1978-79 Cal State Fullerton media guide is All-America candidate guard Keith Anderson. Anderson, a starter the past two seasons, helped lead the Titans to the finals of the 1977-78 NCAA West Regionals in Albuquerque, N.M. Also pictured is head coach Bob Dye, heading into his sixth season as the Titan's head man.

A REMARKABLE GROWTH RATE

California State University, Fullerton is a young institution having opened only 18 years ago. However, it already has grown to 22,500 students and achieved national distinction in many fields.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 800-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, journalism, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 77 degree programs — 36 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is one of the largest internship and cooperative education programs on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the continuing education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Continuing education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Yet another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series which brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A new development is the formation of a professional caliber chamber orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with high-quality music.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 5,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

A further example of community outreach is the university-operated Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary in the Santa Ana Mountains.

Meanwhile, construction is under way on campus on a 25-acre arboretum. This preserve represents a joint venture of the City of Fullerton and the university.

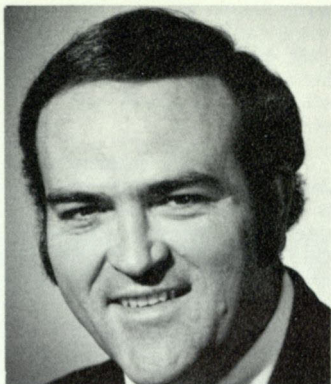
To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community service, President L. Donald Shields has recently embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to achieve the president's chief goal for the university. That goal is to make Cal State Fullerton the foremost bachelor's degree granting institution in the nation within five years.

DR. L. DONALD SHIELDS

PRESIDENT

Dr. L. Donald Shields became president of California State University, Fullerton in 1971. At the time he was 34, making him the youngest chief executive of a major state university in the nation.

Since 1974, Dr. Shields has served as a member of the National Science Board, having been appointed by President Ford and confirmed by the U.S. Senate. He also is the only person from the western United States currently serving on the National Commission for Cooperative Education.



Dr. Shields received his undergraduate education at University of California, Riverside, then went on to earn his Ph.D. in chemistry from UCLA.

Dr. Shields joined the Cal State Fullerton faculty in 1963 as an assistant professor of chemistry. He became an associate professor in 1966 and a full professor in 1967. He was elected chair of the Faculty Council in 1967 and later that year became the campus' first vice president for administration. From October 1970 to May 1971, he was acting president of the University.

Dr. Shields has authored three books and numerous articles in professional journals. He had addressed or participated in professional meetings throughout the United States, and in 1976 represented the National Science Board in Vienna, Austria, at the first biennial international symposium at the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis.

Among Dr. Shields' community activities are having chaired the Disneyland Community Service Awards Committee, being a trustee of the World Affairs Council of Orange County, and being a director of Orange County Sports Celebrities.

At present, Dr. Shields' foremost goal is to make Cal State Fullerton the most outstanding bachelor's/master's degree granting institutional in the nation within the next five years.



NEALE R. STONER

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Neale Stoner, a former athlete at Cal State Fullerton in 1961 and '62, returned to his alma mater in 1972 to take over the reins as director of athletics.

Stoner, 42 who replaced John Caine in August, served as head basketball coach and assistant athletic director at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo for three seasons and previously held the same positions at the University of California-San Diego, from 1966 to 1969.



At San Luis Obispo, Stoner's basketball teams compiled an overall record of 48-32 and did not suffer a losing season in three years. In 1970-71 the Mustangs reached the NCAA Western Basketball Regionals. During the 1971-72 season Stoner's team drew an average of better than 2,000 fans per game as the Mustangs shared the CCAA basketball title with UC-Riverside and Cal State-Northridge.

As Cal Poly's assistant athletic director, Stoner was responsible for the on-campus scholarship program, scheduling, budget preparation, the athletic job program and fund raising through the Mustang Boosters' Club.

In 1966 Stoner was named UC-San Diego's first basketball coach and in three seasons compiled an overall record of 40-32; leading the Tritons to the NAIA District III playoffs each year. He also coached tennis at San Diego from 1966 to 1968.

Stoner earned his bachelor's degree from Cal State Fullerton in 1962 following an athletic career that included two years of varsity basketball and tennis experience at CSUF. The Titans' 1962 squad reached the NAIA quarterfinals. Prior to attending CSUF, he went to Fullerton Junior College and Montebello High School.

Following graduation from Cal State Fullerton, Stoner became the school's business services officer for four years and coached the freshman basketball team.

He earned his master's degree in physical education and school supervision in 1972, and is currently working on his doctorate at Brigham Young University.

Stoner is married to the former Lynda Del Giorgio of Fullerton. They have five children.

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization with the express purpose of aiding the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals, not necessarily alumni, who have a genuine interest in athletics and the University.

It is community involvement for some, business involvement for others, or simply an interest in a fine sports program that has attained recognition and respect in the past few years.

The Foundation supports the athletic program by providing funds for scholarships and grants-in-aid which insure an effective recruiting program that will attract the best student athletes in the country.

The Titan Athletic Foundation was founded in January 1973, and is the University's official athletic booster organization. In the TAF's first year, approximately \$30,000 was raised and 150 members enlisted. Just five years later the TAF raised over \$175,000 and has a membership exceeding 650.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first president, and was succeeded by Don Karcher, executive vice-president of Karcher Enterprises. Buck Johns, general manager of Trane Home Comfort Center, is scheduled to become the TAF's third president later this year. Ralph Barkey is the executive director of the Foundation.

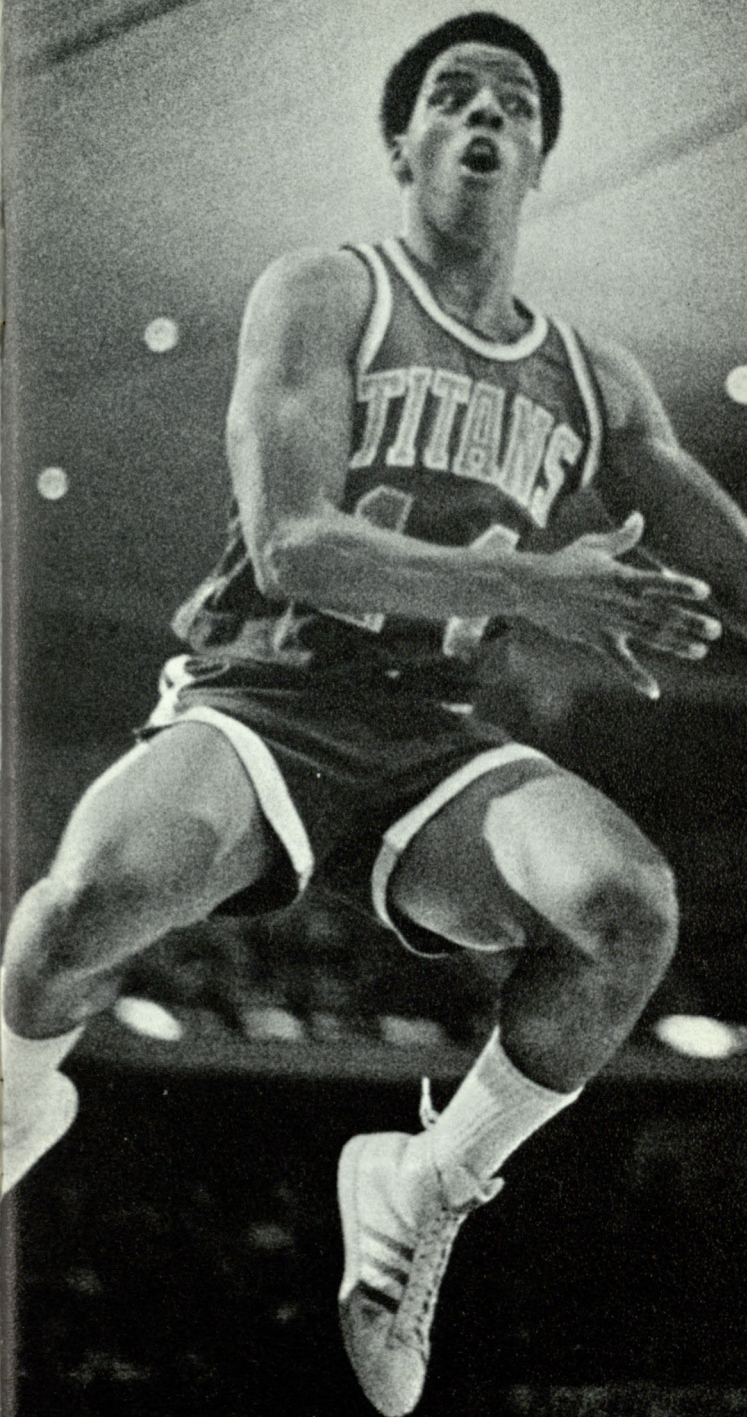

Success and Bob Dye. The word and the name are synonymous.

The close association of the two was finally realized last season as Dye led Cal State "WHO" past two nationally ranked teams (New Mexico and Univ. of San Francisco) to the finals of the NCAA West Regional in Albuquerque, N.M. Although the Titans came up three points short of defeating another nationally ranked team — Arkansas — sportswriters and sportcasters throughout the country proclaimed Dye the unofficial coach of the year.



The season was the best ever at Cal State Fullerton, with the Titans finishing 23-9 overall. CSF won two tournament championships (the PCAA Tournament and the Viking Invitational at Portland), placed second in the NCAA West Regional tourney and finished third at the Cougar Classic in Provo, Utah.

However, the remarkable season was the result of a slow, steady building program instituted by Dye when he was hired by CSF in May 1973.

For the nine years prior to Dye's arrival at Cal State Fullerton, the basketball program had been a consistent loser—none of those teams had compiled a winning record.

Dye's first season at CSF resulted in a 16-10 record. Succeeding teams compiled marks of 13-11 (1974-75), 15-10 (1975-76), 16-10 (1976-77) and 23-9 (1977-78). His Titan teams have won 83 of 133 games; a winning percentage of .624.

Turning programs around is nothing new for Dye.

Prior to taking over the reins at CSF, the 41-year old Downey, Calif. native (born May 16, 1937) was the head coach at Santa Monica City College. He took a team that had not won a league championship in 45 years of competition (losing 60-percent of its games along the way) and compiled a record of 115-53 (69-percent) during his six-year tenure.

Santa Monica City won the California Junior College championship in 1972, and Dye was named JC Coach-of-the-Year for his efforts. The Corsairs won their first conference title the same season. Sidney Wicks, an All NBA forward and former UCLA All-America, is one of the many standouts Dye coached at Santa Monica CC.

Dye graduated from Downey High School in 1956 following a prep basketball career that saw him earn All-CIF honors as a guard. He then attended Fullerton Junior College (under head coach Alex Omalev), where he started for two seasons. Dye was an All-Conference selection for the Hornets in 1957 and '58, and led the team in scoring both years.

The following two seasons found him at Idaho State. After graduating in 1962, he returned to Southern California as the head coach at St. John Bosco High School in Bellflower. His first year at St. John Bosco, Dye suffered his first, and only, losing season as head coach (8-12). In three years at St. John Bosco, Dye compiled an over-all record of 43-24 (winning 64-percent).

Dye became assistant coach at Cerritos Junior College under Jim Killingsworth in 1966, and in 1968 was named head coach at Santa Monica City. Dye became the Titans' third head coach in the school's history when he replaced Moe Radovich (Radovich coached the 1972-73 season, and Alex Omalev from 1960-72).

In 1975-76 Dye led the Titans to their first-ever conference championship, winning the Pacific Coast Athletic Assn. title; in only the second season as a member of the conference and the NCAA's Division I.

He and his wife, Judy, have two children—Kelley, 19, and Stacy, 6. They reside in Yorba Linda.

ASSISTANT COACHES

MEL SIMS (LA STATE '72)

Mel Sims, 37 is in his sixth season as assistant basketball coach at Cal State Fullerton. He came to CSUF as an assistant to then coach, Moe Rado-
vich.

Sims was an all-sports athlete at Banning High School, and joined the US Air Force in 1960 where he continued his athletic career. He attended Victor Valley Junior College and won All-Conference honors as a guard scoring 22.0 points per game.



Sims then attended Los Angeles State, where he was a two-year letterman (1970-71) under head coach Bill Miller. He graduated from LA State in '72.

Sims is very active in basketball camps throughout California during the summer. He is a native of Los Angeles, and now lives in Placentia with his wife, Faith.

MARK WARKENTIEN (CSF '76)

The newest member of CSF's coaching staff is Mark Warkentien, 25.

Warkentien was the head coach of UC Riverside's women's team last season, compiling a record of 18-7.

He is a 1976 graduate of Cal State Fullerton, and played basketball at Romona High School (Riverside) and Riverside City College. The Romona team finished 22-5 and won the Citrus Belt League championship Warkentien's senior season. He was an All-Mission Conference selection in 1972 at Riverside City under coach Bill Mulligan.

Warkentien was an assistant at Riverside in 1973 and '74 under Mulligan. Both teams won the Mission Conference championship, compiling 28-6 and 27-8 records.

In 1975 Warkentien moved to Saddleback Junior College with Mulligan, and in '76 Saddleback won the Mission Conference championship. Warkentien's two seasons at Saddleback resulted in 22-8 and 25-9 marks.

He was born April 16, 1953 in Huntington, Indiana.

1978-79 BASKETBALL PREVIEW

Cal State Fullerton, a team that last season won 23 of 32 games enroute to the finals of the NCAA West Regionals in Albuquerque, N.M., returns 12 of 14 veterans from that club, and 100-percent of the enthusiasm generated by the "Cinderella" Titans' march to the NCAA's round of eight.

Three starters and one part-time starter head the list of players that defeated fourth ranked New Mexico (90-85) and ninth ranked Univ. of San Francisco (75-75), before bowing to Arkansas (61-58) in the regional final game.

However, one of Cal State Fullerton's losses through graduation seems to those around the program as almost irreplaceable. Greg Bunch, the Titans' 6-6 all-everything forward, leaves a gaping hole in the hearts of Titan fans, if not in CSF's front line. Bunch led the Titans in scoring and rebounding four consecutive seasons, and may have led the country in clutch performances in those four years. Center Steve Shaw is CSF's only other loss.

But head coach Bob Dye, the media's unofficial coach of the year last season, is not exactly ready to phone in the scores to next season's opponents. He, and everyone around the CSF program, expects big things of his upcoming club.

Dye, whose Titan teams have compiled an 83-50 (64.2 percent) mark in his five years at Cal State Fullerton, feels he may have the top backcourt tandem on the West Coast, if not the country. Keith Anderson (6-2, senior), a 52-percent shooter from the floor and a 79-percent free throw shooter, and Mike Linden (6-0, senior), who handed out a school record 204 assists, give the Titans a pair of guards who compliment each other almost perfectly. Both have excellent speed, and Anderson's passing ability is indicated by his 279 career assists. He averaged 15.1 points last season, and is the top defensive guard in the West (last year he held the nation's leading scorer, Freeman Williams, to just 13 points. Williams was six of 25 from the floor. Anderson always draws the opponents' top scoring guard—none of whom scored their average last season).

Anderson himself has a reputation as a clutch player. It was he who shot a 20-foot jumper with 3-seconds left to beat USF. In six playoff games (three PCAA tournament and three NCAA tournament) Anderson averaged 17.7 points and 4.5 rebounds per contest.

"There isn't a better all-around guard in the country than Keith Anderson," states Dye. "Offensively, defensively and handling the ball he'll stack up against anyone. Additionally, he thrives on pressure situations, which is something you can't coach or teach."

Anderson, from Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles, is Cal State Fullerton's candidate for All-America honors.

George Barrios (6-0, sophomore) saw limited action last winter.

In addition, Dye recruited two freshmen guards, Kevin Bowland (6-4) from Brea High School (Brea, Calif.) and Richard Polee (6-2) from Morningside High School (Los Angeles). Bowland averaged 18.9 points as a prep senior last year. Polee, a prep All-America, is the heir apparent to Anderson's job: He averaged 19.6 points last season at Morningside.

The forward positions figure to be almost as strong as the guards. Starter Mike Niles (6-6, 225-pound junior) averaged 11.8 points and 5.6 rebounds last season. Bunch's spot will have three candidates—converted guard Kevin Heenan (6-5, senior) who averaged 10.8 points as a part-time starter, Tom Morgan (6-6, junior) and highly touted recruit Calvin Roberts (6-7, junior). Roberts, from Merced Junior College, is a two-time JUCO All-America. He averaged 14.2 points and 10.2 rebounds last year.

Center has always been the Titan's weakest position. Dye was unable to lure a prospect to CSF at that position this spring, thus three lettermen will get the opportunity to start. Dave Rohde (6-11, 240-pound junior) played in 25 games last season, averaging 3.9 points and 2.5 rebounds. Greg Palm (6-8, sophomore) was highly acclaimed out of Mumford High School in Detroit, but averaged only 3.5 points and 2.9 rebounds in 22 games last year. However, his play in the CSF-Univ. of San Francisco regional game in the second half turned the game around for the Titans (holding 7-2 Bill Cartwright to just eight points and four rebounds) and indicated to the coaching staff some of Palm's promise as a player. Daryl Roper (6-8, junior) saw spot duty.

1977-78 RECAP; TEAM AWARDS

Coach Bob Dye's Titans finished the season with 23 wins and just nine losses. After completing the PCAA season with a 9-5 mark, the Titans won the PCAA Tournament, defeating San Jose State (88-78), San Diego State (64-50) and Long Beach State (64-53) to advance to the NCAA championships. Bunch was named the tourney's Most Valuable Player and Anderson and Linden joined him on the All-Tournament team.

Cal State Fullerton shocked nationally fourth ranked New Mexico, 90-85, in the NCAA's first round in Tempe, Ariz. The win was the first ever for the Titans against a nationally ranked team.

At the NCAA West Regionals in Albuquerque, N.M. Dye's club knocked off another nationally ranked foe—Univ. of San Francisco, 75-72. The Dons finished the season with a number nine national ranking.

Arkansas, the country's number five ranked team, just slipped by the Titans, 61-58, in the regional finals. However, Bunch and Anderson were named to the NCAA West Regional All-Tournament team following the game, and Dye was unofficially named coach of the year by the media.

"Despite what you've read about Arkansas' Eddie Sutton, the REAL coach of the year is Fullerton's Bobby Dye . . ." wrote Bill Finley of the San Diego Union.

The headline across the top of the Albuquerque Tribune of March 18 declared "Let's vote again for coach-of-year," then proceeded to nominate Dye.

David Israel of the Chicago Tribune echoed the same sentiments in a column March 19. "Dye has impressed upon the collective consciousness of the basketball world an image of the street-fighting coach. He had a team that was too short, too slow, and utterly over-matched, so he took off his jacket and rolled up his sleeves and got down on his knees and showed it that you can win basketball games as much with spunk as with jump shots."

Al McGuire, NBC color commentator and former head coach at Marquette, said, "Dye has proven that coaching can win ball games."

Joe Jares of Sports Illustrated wrote, "(Arkansas') victory was hardly greater than the triumph the Titans earned in their defeat."

During the NCAA Tourney not only did Titan boosters chant, "We believe," but basketball experts and fans throughout the country became converts.



Following the season Greg Bunch's Number 30 was retired, the first time ever a CSF athlete has been so honored.

Bunch was the team's MVP for the third straight year, and led the team in scoring and rebounding for the fourth consecutive season. He was named Southern California Player of the Year by the Miller Brewing Co., and was a three-time All-PCAA selection.

Keith Anderson was the team's Co-MVP, and won the award as the team's Best Defensive Player. The Most Improved Player award went to Kevin Heenan. Mike Niles was named the team's Most Inspirational Player for the second time.
