

This Call is For You!

There is a good reason why so many Village meetings include the familiar phrase, "We're always looking for volunteers."

This is not about those of us who volunteer to join clubs or participate in social activities for our personal enhancement or pleasure, though those organizations also have an on-going need for volunteers who will do some of the heavy lifting, such as serving as the required elected officers. This is about the Village's constant need for residents to volunteer, to step up to do the jobs that make Leisure Village unique among retirement communities. For example, we are governed by our own Board of Directors (all volunteers) who, in turn, rely heavily on the "eyes and ears," that are provided by the seven Advisory Committees (and two sub-committees), that work constantly to insure the overall quality of Village life and the continuing efficiency of our basic services and amenities. In most communities, professional companies are in charge from top to bottom.

A couple of years ago, former Board President Lin Grant figured that nearly 300 volunteers perform services that would require hiring more than a dozen full-time employees at an overall cost of more than \$800,000 a year, including benefits. Grant's bottom line estimate was that the additional cost would add, on average, \$330 dollars a year to each household's assessment.

St. John's Readies \$80 Million Remodel Revamp

Villagers can get a preview of all that's new at St. John's Pleasant Valley Hospital at the Grand Opening Celebration on Saturday, September 22. Tours of the extensive construction project will be available along with health screenings, prizes, and a children's fun zone as a way to introduce the \$80 million dollar project to the community.

The new sections of the hospital feature a state-of-the-art cardiac catheterization lab, three new surgical suites, and fifty new private patient rooms, plus a new lobby, chapel, and family waiting area. Ground was broken on the project on September 24, 2015; patients will be admitted to the new facility on September 29.

Perhaps as a way to celebrate, the Dignity Health hospital donated a new smart TV to Leisure Village. The 75" LED set will be installed

Check. It's hard to imagine a repair to anything wooden that cannot be made in LV's Woodshop by Ron Quick and the team of LV woodworkers. "We take on just about any project," Ron, the Shop Chairman, says with a smile as

he hunches over a sander in the Woodshop Annex.

Woodworking has been a part of Ron's life since he was a child growing up in South Dakota. His grandmother and mother were creative; his mom built a checkerboard in the floor of their house. "There was nothing we couldn't build," he recalls. As an adult, Ron was an electronics technician in the San Fernando Valley. But in off-hours at home with his wife Marj and their three sons, he continued that family tradition, his "hobby," he calls it, building things like kitchen cabinets and outdoor decks. "I visualize the project," Ron explains. "I'm not a perfectionist. Sometimes Marj will run her hand over a finish and say with a smile, "Not good enough!"

When the Quicks moved to Leisure Village six years ago, Ron brought his “hobby” with him. One day he walked into the Woodshop and got cleared to use the equipment. “I had no intention of building anything,” he recalls. That soon changed.

In fact, what Ron – and his Woodshop colleagues, he is quick to add – have built is a Village resource second to none. For residents: a free repair service for broken furniture. For the Rec Center: improvements in every room such as new cabinets for supplies of the Art Club, new shelving in the Village Library, new newspaper racks, new storage areas in the Sewing and Garden

Rooms, an equipment rack for the Ping Pong Club, plus benches in the Gazebo area. When a break room was proposed for staff in the Rec Center, Ron and his Shop Brothers designed and built all the cabinetry. As always, there are no price tags. Recipients may pay for materials or donate to the Woodshop, if they choose.

He lobbied hard and successfully for the expansion of the Shop into the room across the hall. He’s busy now organizing for a fundraising garage sale in October. And Ron is in the Woodshop by 7:30 most mornings. “I like to make things work,” he laughs. “Old doesn’t matter. I just keep at it ‘til things are fixed.”

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


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Landscaping Options

Leisure Village has a signature landscaped presentation. Village common areas and greenbelts are visually appealing and the residential landscaped beds that frame each home display a wide variety of ornamental plants.

There are Three Categories of landscape choices that Leisure Village homeowners can choose from and can even be mixed and matched. These options are defined in the 2017 Community Directory-Phone Book under Article VII, Landscape Changes, Rules & Regulations (pgs. 113-115). A new 2018 issue is coming.

1. Full Maintenance (F.M.) beds are cared for by LV professional gardeners contracted out to Camarillo Landscape Partners, under the in-house leadership of LVA staff; Mike Udem-LV Landscape Supervisor and Jerry Salas-LV Landscape Foreman. F.M. plants are owned by LVA. A free List of LVA Approved F.M. Plants is available at the LVA office and online.

2. Red Stake (R.S.) beds are cared for, and plants are owned, by homeowners who have opted to maintain their own landscaped residential beds. Owners must also care for any elective hardscape (non-plant features). "Exclusive" enclosed home patio planted beds are R.S. status. LVA gardeners do not maintain any R.S. planted areas.

3. Yellow Stake plant (Y.S.), is a six foot maximum height grafted, semi-dwarf Citrus. By submitting a Landscape Permit Application, LVA allows homeowners to seek approval to plant and self-manage, (per bed, in either F.M. or R.S. beds). Only a single approved semi-dwarf Citrus variety, is allowed per bed, with choices delineated in the Board Approved Plant List, Y.S. section.

The current Board approved F.M. Plant List itemizes over 70 individual plant species & varieties that LVA gardeners maintain. This service is included in your HOA monthly fee. Homeowners have the option to seek an elective change of a F.M. bed (at their own expense and effort), by submitting a Landscape Permit Application. If approved by the Residential Landscape Committee, an owner has 60 days to change and install newly approved plants, while the status of the bed is on hiatus during this conversion. Once finished, LV groundskeepers again maintain these F.M. plantings. All irrigation maintenance must be done by LVA, no exceptions.

Some Village folks are curious why the F.M. Plant List has deleted, over the years, some formerly approved (grandfathered) plants. Trees and vines are no longer allowed within F.M. residential planted beds because of: crowding, safety, encroachment, and high maintenance issues. Some of the plants may be grown as container plants or in Red Staked beds.

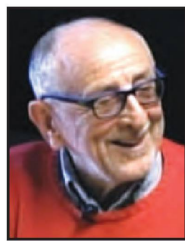

Longtime LV Inspector Retires

It's been challenging lately for Karen Snethen to make her daily inspection rounds in the Village. Often residents see her rolling down the street in her Mule and wave her over to the curb. "You can't go!" says one woman. "Don't leave us," shouts another. As Karen recounts these encounters, she gets tears in her eyes. "It's overwhelming to hear it," she says. "People have been so kind."

After working for LVA more than two decades, Karen is retiring. Since 1996, she has been a Resident Services Inspector dealing with everything from green sheets and repair forms to lease and escrow inspections to overseeing the care of the 6500 trees that shade Leisure Village. She's particularly proud of the recent progress with the trees.

"We have a good staff and competent outside help now," Karen explains.

Over the past two years, nearly 200 trees have been removed due to age, pine beetles, wind damage, etc. "I see beauty and challenge," she says. "We are trying to replace them with sustainable trees." Her work took her outside about 50% of the time, something she has always liked about the job.

Karen's previous career was in banking: making and closing loans in corporate offices, mostly in Northern California. But she was also interested in horticulture; she studied it at San Diego State. So when she moved to Ventura to help care for her mother, the Leisure Village position seemed like a good fit. She says she's witnessed many positive changes here: no more wooden fences facing the main streets, updated houses (including "many total remodels," she adds), better landscaping, and fewer resident complaints. "The Village is quite snappy looking," Karen adds with a smile.

She is looking forward to traveling, family visits, and volunteering in the next chapter of her life. She'll miss her co-workers and all those appreciative Villagers.

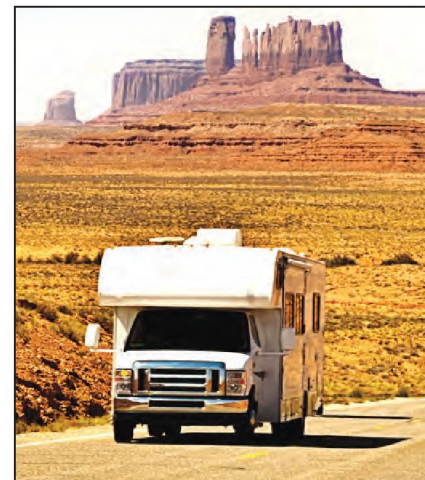
prior to September 22 and will not be available on event day.

How many such trips does the club enjoy each year? "We try to do one a month, but generally wind-up with six to eight," Hayutin said. "Some months when people are on vacation or its family time or whatever, we don't plan any trips."

Next journey on the LVRV Club trip list is set for November, and targets Flying Flags Campground in Buellton, CA, located a few miles northwest of Santa Barbara.

And then there's considerable side



tripping going on. "We do a lot of sight-seeing." As an example, Hayutin mentioned Buellton side trips he has planned include a visit to a local brewery and a distillery, and then - for atonement no doubt - a trip to old California, LaPurisma Conception Mission near Lompoc.

A primary advantage to motor home traveling is the unique perspective it provides on the world, Hayutin points out. "You travel roads you wouldn't normally take, you are up higher, going slower because you are big and towing a car, and so you see a lot more than when you're zipping down the freeway at 75 m.p.h. In a motor home, doing 55 or 60, you have a chance to look around ... you are seeing a lot more and it is wonderful."

In the RV world, affordability is not the final consideration; "Somebody once told me," Hayutin said, "if you're looking at how much money is spent on gas for a motor home, you can't afford it." But, when you own a motor home, folks don't question gas cost, "The first thing people ask you is, how many does it sleep."

LVRV Club will meet next on Tuesday, Sept. 11, at 7:00 p.m. in the Recreation Center Santa Rosa Room located in the Clubhouse near the golf course, and all are welcome.

And one last thing. I have it on good authority that it is not cool when motor home traveling to do like my kid sister did when we were growing up, and holler out every few minutes, "RV there yet?"

little bit harder to contact.

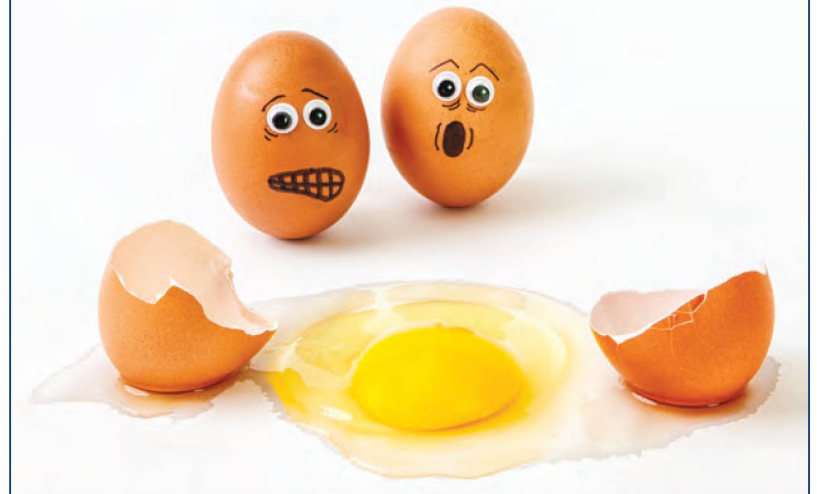

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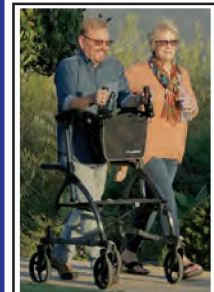
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VETERAN'S CLUB

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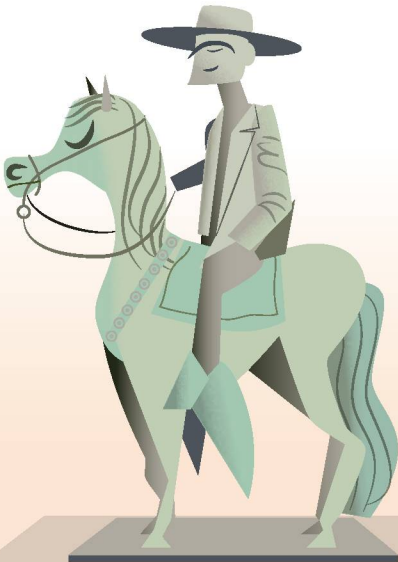
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
