PRESS CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. When time permits, credentials will be mailed.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only and must be worn in plain sight at all times. NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the field and the team areas and these rules will be strictly enforced. Special permission is required to shoot from the press box.

PARKING CREDENTIALS: A very limited number are available and will be granted only to requests received in time to handle by mail. The fee to park at Anaheim Stadium is \$2.50 without a credential. Enter via the State College Boulevard (west) entrance.

PRESS BOX: Is limited to working members of the press, radio, television and others whose duties require use of the press area. No one will be admitted without proper credentials. Refreshments will be provided. Play-by-play reports by quarters, halftime and final statistics, scoring summary and post-game quotes will be distributed throughout the press box. The press box is located on the State College Boulevard (west side) of Anaheim Stadium. Entrance is via elevator near gate 3.

TELEPHONES: A limited number of "collect only" instruments will be available. Private lines must be requested well in advance through Pacific Telephone Co. - Dave Smith (714) 972-7365.

TELECOPIERS: One will be available on a page-by-page, first-come first-served basis.

BROADCAST SPACE: Individual broadcast booths are available if requested at least two weeks in advance. Per PCAA by-laws, one telephone line will be provided the designated commercial station broadcasting in the visiting team's home market.

INTERVIEW ROOMS: After a 10-minute cooling-off period, the Cal State Fullerton locker room will be open to the media. It is accessible by elevator.

SCOUTS: Professional scouts will be issued credentials if they are requested at least five days prior to the game. Scouts from opposing schools will be issued passes in accordance with NCAA rules and only if requested at least five days in advance.

ROAD CREDENTIALS: May be requested through the host institution's sports information office or we will be happy to make the arrangements for you upon proper notice.



CAL STATE FULLERTON CAMPUS



California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. Having first offered classes in 1959, the university has grown to 23,000 students and achieved national distinction.

In 1984, the university will host team handball competition at the Summer Olympics. It also will begin its 25th anniversary observance with the theme "Honoring the Past-Creating the Future."

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes: many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, nursing, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 82 degree programs-40 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-thejob experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.


Still another strong point is the university's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances and the Cabaret Repertory Theater Company, which performs regularly in Brea.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Commitment to Mindpower." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.

ADMINISTRATION





Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980 to replace Dr. L. Donald Shields, who had resigned after a tenyear term to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist

University.

Dr. Cobb had served as Dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and professor of Zoology for seven years. Previously, she was Professor of Biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the

west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization that exists solely to aid the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals with a genuine interest in athletics, the University and the community.

The foundation supports athletics by providing funds for scholarships that insure an program effective recruiting

which attracts the best athletes available. The 1983 drive totaled nearly \$150,000.

The TAF was founded in January, 1973 and the initial 150 members raised approxi-

mately \$30,000. Membership today totals more than 800.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first president. He was succeeded by Don Karcher, president of Carl Karcher Enterprises; Buck Johns, president of Home Works; Larry Slagle, vice president of Yellow Cab of North Orange County; and current president Jim Woods, president and chairman of the board of Baker Oil Tools.

ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT



Lynn Eilefson, Athletic Director

Lynn Eilefson brought a background of fund-raising, marketing and stadium construction to Cal State Fullerton and his expertise in those areas already has shone brightly in his first 18 months in the athletic director's chair.

Long dorman plans for a joint venture by the University and the city of Fullerton to erect a Youth Sports Complex featuring football/soccer and baseball stadiums have been revitalized with funding arranged and a 1985 completion date targeted. An "Orange Crush" theme for Orange County's largest intercollegiate sports program has been adopted and the most ambitious fund-raising goals in Titan Athletic Foundation history have been set.

"Cal State Fullerton has a great amount of untapped potential for an excellent program of intercollegiate athletics woven within an outstanding academic framework," said Eilefson upon his Apr. 1, 1982 appointment.

"I have no doubt that, with a proper perspective, we can strike a balance between aca-

demic and athletic excellence while building a most successful sports program.'

Eilefson came to Fullerton after 17 months as senior assistant athletic director at UCLA where he was responsible for alumni and booster liaison, marketing, promotions and sports information. He previously served for eight and a half years at Fresno State University in a variety of positions including associate athletic director, coordinator of the stadium development fund and six years as executive director of the Bulldog Foundation. Prior to that he held posts at Lawrence University and Montana State University.

At Fresno State he drew up a capital fund campaign to build its 30,000 seat on-campus stadium. He raised cash contributions from \$30,000 to more than \$500,000 during his term and also launched the "Red Wave" mania that has captured the San Joaquin Valley.

Eilefson is a 1957 graduate of the University of Montana with a degree in Business Marketing Management. He and wife Bev live in Placentia. His children are all graduates of Fresno State University, and make their home in Fresno.

ANAHEIM STADIUM



The Titans return in 1983 to their original home—Anaheim Stadium, which has grown by about 26,000 seats since Cal State Fullerton played its last home game there in 1973.

Perhaps the foremost multi-purpose stadium in America, the "Bigger-A" serves as home of the California Angels of the American League and the Los Angeles Rams of the National Football League as well as a variety of special events including rock concerts, exhibits and festivals.

Located at 2000 S. State College Boulevard, about six miles south of the Fullerton campus, Anaheim Stadium seats 69,000 fans for football and has parking for 13,500 autos and 400 buses. It originally was opened in 1966 at a cost of \$24 million with a capacity of more than 43,000. It was enlarged in 1980 at a cost of \$30 million to accommodate the Rams with new sound and lighting systems, a new football press box, 108 luxury suites and a \$2 million scoreboard.

The turf is natural with a composition of tiff-green hybrid Bermuda grass.

In the event of inclement weather, the games of Sept. 10 and Oct. 1 could be moved to an alternate site to prevent damage to the playing surface.

YOUTH SPORTS COMPLEX

The long-awaited dream of a permanent on-campus football facility for Cal State Fullerton is nearing reality with recent developments involving the State of California, the City of Fullerton and the Hilton Hotel chain. Private funding in the approximate amount of \$750,000 and the removal of a few legal barriers are all that stand in the way of the start of construction of a football, soccer and baseball complex that also will house athletic offices.

State land will be used to build a Hilton Hotel with the land-lease funds being used to maintain the facility, which will be built primarily with funds from the City of Fullerton. Much as the recently lighted Titan baseball field is used by other community teams, the facility would also host local high school and junior college games.

HOME STADIUM HISTORY

The Titans' return to Anaheim Stadium for the 1983 season brings the program full circle since a five-site odyssey began in the 1970 inaugural season. All home games were played at Anaheim that year but in 1971 the Santa Ana Bowl and the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum also served as home fields. Santa Ana served as the home field with the exception of one game from 1972 through 1975 before the program switched to Cerritos College for the 1976 through 1979 seasons, a span which featured only 13 home games.

Coach Gene Murphy and his staff instituted the erection of "Titan Field" on campus from 1980 through 1982 with portable bleachers providing a taste of true on-campus football. Home field records:

The phenomenal growth pattern of the Pacific Coast Athletic Association continues in 1983 with the addition of New Mexico State University to the 10-institution organization.

The Lobos from Las Cruces won't begin playing a PCAA football schedule until 1984 but their presence since July 1 gives the conference a four-state spread of the west—California, Nevada, Utah and now New Mexico—as it enters its 15th year of existence as one of the eight Division I alignments in the nation.

Schedules include more and more Division I powers and the PCAA has had good success in recent years against the Pac 10 among others. With three of the Top 20 total offense leaders in the nation returning for 1983, it looks like another exciting year for the aerial-minded conference, which has led the nation in passing for the last several seasons.

Only two years old, the California Bowl already is developing a reputation for having the most exciting post-season contests in the nation.

The long-awaited inaugural game in 1981 found Mid-American Conference champion Toledo upsetting PCAA champion San Jose State with a last-minute field goal, 27-25. Last year the tables turned as Fresno State scored three touchdowns in the fourth quarter including the game winner with 11 seconds to go for a 29-28 victory over Bowling Green.

The California Bowl, like only the Rose Bowl among major bowl games, regularly matches the champions of two conferences—the PCAA and the Mid-American. The Greater San Joaquin Valley Sports Association sponsors the game with the beneficiary being the Valley Children's Hospital and Guidance Clinic. Seating capacity in Bulldog Stadium in Fresno is 30,000.

Head Coach Gene Murphy



Gene Murphy has laid the foundation for a competitive total football program at Cal State Fullerton and appears to have the Titans poised at the brink of the kind of success that everyone can understand—in the victory column.

Murphy and a young, enthusiastic coaching staff have spent the past three years collecting the raw materials and developing the resources necessary to build a launching pad for a young Division I program that will take off in some new directions in 1983:

—the erection of an "instant" on-campus "stadium" help spur the push for a soon to be built Youth Sports Complex and until the new facility is ready, the Titans will move into beautiful Anaheim Stadium.

-the impact the football staff had in bringing

overall fund-raising in the community to record levels will be extended to a new football booster group.

—a freshman-oriented recruiting program will finally bring balance of the classes to the playing roster.

—there will be significant changes among the assistant coaches for the first time in Murphy's tenure with all four departees "stepping up" in responsibilities.

"Our progress has been slow (10-24) but steady and that's what we expected here," says Murphy, 44, who came to Fullerton following two very productive years as the head coach at his alma mater, the University of North Dakota.

"We had to go back to square one—the stadium, fund-raising, recruiting, building a weight room, creating office space, housing a true fall camp, everthing—to build a broad base. This program still is in its infancy and has needed time to develop.

"Physically, we're just about there in terms of being competitive in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association, especially in the line. We've got only 14 seniors on this year's roster and five of them are recent transfers. Starting next year we will have that ideal balance of classes and not have such a drastic turnover in personnel every two years."

Despite his background as a quarterback and offensive coordinator, Murphy's Fullerton teams have developed a penchant for strong defense. Last year's unit was ranked in the Top Twenty in the nation in overall and rushing defense until the final two weeks of the season.

"I came to California to throw the football," admits Murphy. "But to throw the ball you've got to have it and it's up to the defense to get it for you. A good defense also enables you to gamble more on offense. We may have gotten too conservative offensively last year, trying not to let a young team beat itself."

Playing primarily "smash-mouth" (three yards and a cloud of dust) football at North Dakota, Murphy guided the Fighting Sioux to a 15-7 record in his two years as head man. They climbed as high as No. 3 in the Division II national rankings in 1979 when they were 10-2. He spent a total of 16 years at UND including three as a player, one as a graduate assistant and 10 as offensive coordinator.

"I was very comfortable at North Dakota, too comfortable," says Murphy, who served a four-month term as interim athletic director in 1981. "I needed a challenge and came to California to see the sun. I've had more fun coaching at Fullerton than ever before."

Murphy initiated his "squirrel derby" offense in 1980 when the Titans' attack often featured fake punts, false huddles, naked reverses and passes to every receiver. An aerial circus? Murphy's team have thrown the ball 363, 425 and 446 times in the past three seasons.

"We will be striving for more balance in 1983," he says.

Born August 6, 1939 in Jersey City, New Jersey, Murphy was an all-sports star at St. Peter's High School in New Brunswick and earned all-state honors in football and baseball (shortstop). He was recruited to the University of Minnesota by Ray Malavasi, then an assistant coach to Murray Warmath. After finding himself on the bench behind Gopher star Sandy Stephens, Murphy transferred to North Dakota and as a senior was the All-North Central Conference guarterback.

After attaining his bachelor's degree (physical education) in 1962, Murphy served one year as a graduate assistant and then coached football, baseball and swimming at North St. Paul High School before returning to UND. While he was offensive coordinator, the Sioux won six conference championships and participated in three post-season bowl games (1966, 1972 and 1975). As head coach, he won the conference title in 1979 and was named conference coach of the year. He also spent five summers (1967-71) as an assistant "guest" coach with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders of the Canadian Football League.

Murphy, who received a master's degree in physical education in 1963 and secondary administration in 1977, was married to the former Kathy Fischer on September 25, 1964. They honeymooned at a Minnesota Vikings game. They have two sons—Tim (17) and

Michael (13)-and live in Anaheim.

SEASON PREVIEW

If the offense can be brought up to the standards of last year's defensive unit, Cal State Fullerton should have a very successful 1983 season as it moves into a spacious new home at Anaheim Stadium.

A veteran unit minus three key players returns on defense where the Titans were ranked in the Top Twenty in the nation until the final two games of the 1982 campaign. Offensively, virtually the entire starting lineup returns with a bigger and stronger line holding the key to the expected improvement despite the loss of two underclassmen guarterbacks.

"We have plenty of starters back on offense and it's a matter of building upon that experience and eliminating those youthful mistakes," said coach Gene Murphy, entering his fourth season at Fullerton. "We're just about there in terms of being physically competitive in the Pacific Coast Athletic Association, especially in the line.

"Defensively, Rick Senteno, Rodney Weber and Mike Kennedy are gone but we still have an outstanding nucleus. We need to develop some depth among the new faces so we won't

wear down as we did at the end of last season."

Eight starters return on both the offensive and defensive units among 36 returning lettermen. Standouts on defense are All-PCAA middle guard Joe Aguilar, three-year lettermen Terry Hubbard, linebacker, and Al Clark, defensive end, and 1981 All-PCAA cornerback Lee Miller. Offensively, junior Damon Allen is the undisputed signal caller who will be operating behind 1981 All-PCAA tackle Larry Baker, who has moved to guard, and in front of All-PCAA return specialist Roy Lewis, the starting tailback.

"On the Road Again" will be the Titans' theme song once more with eight games scheduled away from their new home, Anaheim Stadium. Four changes in Murphy's coaching

staff are sure to turn up some new wrinkles as the season progresses.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK—There is no quarterback controversy this year with Damon Allen ("the best athlete we've had at quarterback since I've been here"—Murphy) lined up as No. 1. The opening day starter in 1982, the younger brother of Heisman Trophy winner Marcus injured an ankle and never reasserted himself ahead of Bob Caffrey, who has quit football to concentrate on baseball, nor Alex Espinoza, who transferred to another school. Allen has a strong arm and is a breakaway threat as a runner but he lacks experience. He suffered a broken collarbone in the spring alumni game but is 100 per cent. Yale Keckin, who broke five passing records last year at Santa Monica City College, moved into the No. 2 QB spot during spring drills. Behind him there is a scramble among at least six candidates including squad member Bob Murvin, JC transfers Andy DeLuca, Whit Brown and Kevin Jan and freshmen Jim Thornton from Analy High in northern California and Roger Reynoso from Mater Dei High in Santa Ana.

RUNNING BACK—The top five running backs of a year ago all return. Versatile Roy Lewis (3.5 yards per carry) has the edge at the "tailback" spot while Jimmy Render (3.7) and Todd Gerhart (4.1) battle at the fullback slot. Backing up Lewis are Terry Whaley (4.3) and Van Campfield (2.2). Lewis was the No. 1 receiver a year ago with 45 catches for 351 yards. Freshmen speedsters Darnell Wheeler and Steve Morford have the natural ability to make contributions.

INTERIOR LINE—The return to health of 1981 second-team All-PCAA pick Larry Baker fills the only hole caused by graduation to the physically larger line. Baker still goes 250 pounds but everyone else has grown over the past year. Durable Bill Smith (220-235) is at center with last year's Most Valuable Lineman Darryl Titsworth (245-250) and Baker on his flanks at the guard spots. A better muscled captain Al Krueger (260) and Daren Gilbert (255-275) are the probable starting tackles but in the wings are John Parke (250-280) and Hank Goebel (230-258). Junior college transfers David Sii (250) and Larry Waldo (240) could provide help at guard.

TIGHT END—Could be the most improved position on the squad with newcomers Marvin Williams (230) and converted linebacker Russ Maybury (210) battling for the job along with former UC Irvine basketball player Curtis Crossley (6-5, 235). Williams has speed and hands while Maybury is an explosive blocker and improving pass catcher. Crossley has been out of the game a while and it shows but he has superior physical ability.

WIDE RECEIVER—A mid-season injury last year to Jeff York forced three freshmen into action and that force-fed experience should lead to great improvement in 1983. James Pruitt was the No. 2 receiver with 20 catches for 264 yards but he will be challenged by junior Terry Smoot (13 for 107). On the other side, sophomore speedster Wade Lockett (14 for 212) will be challenged by Allen Pitts, who sat out last year, and Cornelius Redick, who averaged 31.3 yards the four times he touched the ball in 1982.

DEFENSE

ENDS—Three men rotated in the two starting spots last year and all return. Senior Al Clark has the experience, junior Eric Emery the deceptive strength and quickness and sophomore Sean Foy the aggressiveness and toughness to handle the difficult spot. Mark Chisom, the Defensive Scout Player of the Year in 1982, could see some playing time along with Rio Hondo JC transfer Scott Douglass.

TACKLES—This position started out strong in 1982 but disintegrated as returning lettermen Andre Pinesett (pre-season grades), Mike Kennedy (knee surgery in game 5) and Jed Henning (knee surgery in game 11) all went out. Pinesett is back on one side to be joined by San Francisco City College transfer Paul Taeleifi, an agile 280-pounder. Second-year freshmen Gil Barber (240) and Ron McLean (235) are small but quick in reserve. Don Cool (260) from Santa Rosa JC is questionable because of surgery to both knees in the spring. A sleeper could be found among Kelvin Shingleton (265) from Purdue or Randall Marve (235) from San Bernardino JC.

MIDDLE GUARD—If Joe Aguilar was three or four inches taller he would be a prime professional prospect. Tremendously strong captain who handles the usual double team as well as possible. Following in the footsteps of brother Richard, who won All-PCAA laurels on quickness. Second-year freshman Jim Baioa, a former linebacker, is the probable backup ahead of former wrestler John Cross.

LINEBACKER—Should be little drop-off despite loss of All-PCAA pick Rick Senteno. Junior John Nevens is back from a gunshot wound to team with steady Terry Hubbard, the No. 2 tackler the past two years. Letterman John West is back in reserve along with Long Beach City College transfer Prentis Walker. Touted freshman Gil Ogden could be a factor.

CORNERBACKS—Lee Miller was an All-PCAA pick in 1981 but opponents stayed away from him last year so the development of sophomore Mark Collins on the other side will be a key to the Titans' success in 1983. Former starter Steve Belardi is back from a broken foot to back up Collins along with squad member Wayne Allums. Behind Miller are squad member Irv Teeboom, a converted wide receiver, and two blue chip freshmen from Orange County in Reggie Pendleton and Kevin Olson.

SAFETY—Graduate student Rodney Weber stepped from Fullerton into the Los Angeles Express lineup and young veterans Duane Henson, Dale Thompson and Mark Pembrook will be asked to share the load. All three have started at one time but now face the pressure of carrying the load. Former quarterback Craig Austin has made the switch for insurance along with freshmen Tom Phillips and Randy Gonzalez.

SPECIAL TEAMS

KICKING GAME—Junior Greg Steinke is in the process of re-writing the Titan record book with his placekicking exploits despite limited calls last year. The punting game was a disappointment last year in the shadow of 1981 standout Scott Vernoy. Foothill College transfer Marc Wilkins will make a serious run at returnees Brian Fordon and Ken Andrews.

SPECIAL TEAMS—Consistency was a problem in 1982. The kick-off receiving team thrust Roy Lewis into the nation's Top 15 again and Lee Miller did an excellent job of returning punts. Coverage was adequate but long snapping problems contributed mightily to losses to Utah State and Hawaii.





Titan Football House

The Cal State Fullerton football offices are located in "Football House," a rehabilitated structure located on the north side of Gymnasium Drive, northeast of the gymnasium. The brick building was a residence on one of the citrus orchards which covered the land now occupied by the campus. 



Fullerton staggered through the first half and then had to hold on for a 19-15 win as the visiting Lumberjacks rallied in the final minute.

The Titans could manage only a Greg Steinke field goal in the first half and an errant snap on a punt gave Northern Arizona not only a safety but positioned it for a 58-yard touchdown drive and a 9-3 halftime lead.
