on pp. 47 & 48 partly supports the

to him, the interview gives one

sympathetic than might have  
been anticipated, and shows  
that a real problem exists in the  
area in which Ginsburg operates.  
P. 124 (marked #) gives Ginsburg's  
attitude on his conviction.  
Personally, I didn't expect it, and I'm  
a bit shocked over his imprisonment  
on a 5-4 majority Supr. Court decision.
