Note that the Fall 1982 fees for 6.0 or more units came to \$136 vis-a-vis \$178 for Spring 1983, and the \$218 for Fall 1983. For 1982/83 and prior years, there was no differential between undergraduate and postbaccalaureate. The additional \$12 in the State University fee structure is thus a new item.

The application fee, effective as of 20 July 1983, was raised from \$30 to \$35. The non-resident (and foreign student fee) is increased from \$70 to \$72 per quarter unit.

2. MERIT SALARY ADJUSTMENTS. While not all details concerning these have been clarified as of this writing, it is assumed that these will be met as scheduled.

3. PROMOTIONS. If promotions are approved, funds for them will not be taken from merit salary increases if such a step decreases the amount available for merit salary adjustments. This office believes that the promotions can be effected, but it is requested that those concerned wait until final word on this has been received from the Chancellor's office (probably next week).

4. LIBRARY REDUCTIONS. Although reductions in the Library personnel budget are more severe than anticipated, it is not the intention of the College to lay off any permanent personnel. Funds for student assistants for 1983/84, however, will be short or non-existent and some adjustments in hours of Library service may be made as a result.

This office will keep all College personnel informed of budget changes and clarifications as they occur.

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
