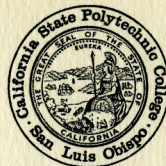

CALIFORNIA STATE POLYTECHNIC COLLEGE
SAN LUIS OBISPO

The California State Polytechnic College, San Luis Obispo, was established as a state academic institution in 1901 by legislative act. In 1938 the College added a branch campus in Los Angeles County and this was consolidated with an additional campus near Pomona in 1949 into the Kellogg-Voorhis branch. In 1966 this branch became the 18th California State College.

Today, the California State Polytechnic College, San Luis Obispo, consists of five schools: Agriculture, Applied Arts, Applied Sciences, Engineering, Architecture.
