Jan'y - 9 1879

Dear Boy -

It is just a week tonight
about this time since little Jeanie
died, and she mind tonight is almost
as high - its snowing and I am as
nervous as you ever saw me. I wish
you were here. I miss you very much.
I feel miserably - I am so tired and
worried. I fight against it with mustard
liniment whiskey & colass yet I can't sleep
at night and I feel real bad.
I think about Jeanie all the time - its
terrible to see poor Julia she feels
her loss and everything about her house
reminds her of Jeanie so she is
almost ill - she looks awfully bad.
Belente is none too well she sent

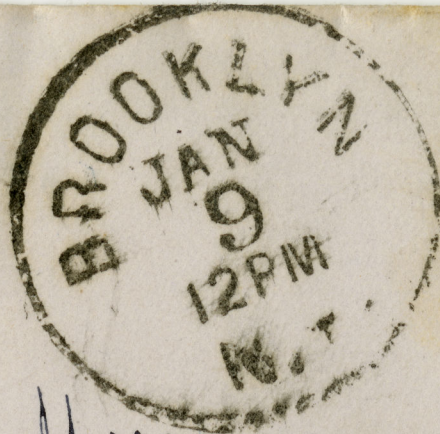
for Mr. Johnson for her last night - Sam
feels very sad - he was so fond of Jeanie
and looks her everywhere with him.
I don't want you to think me chicken
hearted for I am not. I do my duty the
best I can, and will - but I often wish to
see you - Mother is very poorly and I
would not leave her if I could now.
May's cold is very bad I steal down
my night to see if he is covered and
listen to his breathing - if he is taken
or any of them it won't be for careles-
ness on my part - It rained in
Toronto all day today so I kept
Sam home - tonight it windy and
snowing. I dress Sam very warmly
and do my best to shield him.
The Little Girls send their love and
Lulu denies herself stories fearing
there'll be none left for Papa
to read and everyday they ask when

are we going home? they want to see
Papa - I have your interesting letter of
the 21st and thank you for it -
The children are interested in hearing
about 'em Anello. I am very glad
that you are well and hope you won't
go out in the rain and take cold.
Father is well the Salimans are very
kind and want to take Papa. but I
miss him so much I keep him
here. Gray can say something - he is a
wonderful talker - he threw a spoon
at Louisa yesterday hit her in the
open eye and she has not recovered
from it yet. his doctors are all his
shot for him. I must go see mother
to bed and look after Gray
so Goodnight
