PRESS ROOM: Room 162 in the eastern wing of the gymnasium serves as the press room for Titan basketball. Five telephone lines are available -- two at all times and three after the conclusion of radio post-game shows.

PRESS TABLES: Primary beat reporters and broadcasters will be located on the south side of the playing floor, adjacent to or behind the scorer's table. Auxiliary media seating and scout seating will be available at tables along the base line.

GAME SUMMARIES: Will be collated and distributed in Room 162 of the gymnasium building. Halftime box scores, play-by-play accounts and final box scores will be provided.

PRESS/PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. "Visiting" media may make their requests through their respective "home" SIDs. Photo credentials must be worn in plain sight at all times. Photographers may shoot only from the designated areas behind both baselines.

PARKING: Parking is available by:

- a) Using Lot A at State College and Yorba Linda Boulevards or Lot B off State College Boulevard and paying \$1.50 upon entry for a daily permit, or:
- b) Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential to the Visitors Information Booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the intersection of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues.

Parking regulations are enforced 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

BROADCAST SPACE: One table is allocated to each team's designated commercial radio station. Each holds three persons comfortably across the working counter with one cramped seating space available to the rear.

TELEPHONES: There is one telephone at the press table -- (714) 773-3970 -- which must be kept free for messages, out-of-town scores, etc. Additional telephones CANNOT be installed at the press table due to the physical limitations of the building. Please call if you have special telephone needs.

LOCKER ROOMS: Located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. Brad Holland will conduct his post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office just outside the Fullerton players' locker room, which is CLOSED to the media. Players will be brought to the office area upon request after a reasonable cooling-off period.

SCOUTS: Requests should be made at least one week in advance. Seating is limited.

The University

California State University, Fullerton is a large, comprehensive institution in which learning is preeminent. A caring university, it is dedicated to fostering the development of humane leaders prepared to meet the opportunities and challenges of a changing, diverse world.

With an enrollment of approximately 25,000 students, the university maintains its tradition of excellence in liberal arts programs both as ends in themselves and as foundations for equally excellent professional programs.

The main campus is located in Fullerton and has been in operation since 1960, a year after the university's opening. A satellite campus offering upper-division and graduate courses has operated in Mission Viejo since 1989.

Students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and nations. Most students commute daily to and from classes, although nearly 400 now live on campus in residence halls opened in 1988.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 700-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university is fully accredited and enjoys national recognition for both its array of traditional academic programs and a wide list of independently accredited professional programs, including art, athletics training, business, chemistry, communications, computer science, dance, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told, there are 88 degree programs -- 41 of them at the graduate level -- plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Complementing the regular instruction program is the extended education program, which provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of admission to the university.

Another of the university's features is the cultural events program. Besides student productions, it includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students, but also open to community members, is another highlight, as is a growing network of support groups, including the Alumni Association, which represents the university's 95,000 graduates, and the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Further examples of community outreach are the Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience support group.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the opening of a Marriott hotel on campus in 1989, the university and the city of Fullerton opened the Titan Sports Complex in 1992. A 10,000-seat muiltipurpose stadium, an adjoining baseball stadium and a separate track facility are newly completed features of the complex.

Other partnerships include one with the Orange County NewsChannel that has enhanced the university's ability to provide televised instruction to businesses, schools and government and another with the Pacific Symphony Orchestra that has paved the way for the formation of a new orchestral institute for talented young musicians.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and the expansion of community servies, the university conducts a variety of fund-raising activities. The purpose of these activities is to generate the necessary non-state support to make a very good university one of the nation's most successful.



Administration



Dr. Milton A. Gordon, President

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on Aug. 6, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for four years, as dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for six years.

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as a mathematician at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences.

He is the California state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and serves on the governing boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, California Coalition for Mathematics, Orange County Chamber of Commerce, Orange County Community Foundation, United Way of Orange County, YMCA of Orange County and Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, he is on the advisory boards of Pioneer Bank, St. Jude Medical Center and The California State University's Institute for Teaching and Learning.

The President has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of Louisiana.

Athletics Department



Bill Shumard, Director of Athletics

Bill Shumard is in his second year as Director of Athletics at Cal State Fullerton after a most eventful inaugural year.

Shumard, 41, assumed his post on Aug. 1, 1991, soon after the start of a two-year, \$6 million capital campaign to put the finishing touches on a \$14 million Sports Complex. He immediately had to replace two of his associate athletic directors while working under drastic budget constrictions handed down by the state and State University system.

While instituting a new 10-year gender equity plan for CSUF athletics and helping prepare an accelerated marketing plan to showcase the new football/soccer, baseball and track

facilities, he was also busy hiring several new head coaches. Brad Holland was appointed men's basketball coach in April and Deborah Ayres (women's basketball) and Mary Ellen Murchison (women's volleyball) were hired in June.

"The challenge before us is immense as we seek to set realistic goals and parameters for our program," said Shumard. "But despite the obstacles, CSUF never has been in a better position to realize its true athletic potential as we enter this new era and move into our new facilities."

Shumard called his Fullerton appointment the achievement of a "lifelong personal goal. Because of where we live (Brea), and having children in the process of growing up, this is where I set my sights. I'm a graduate of the Cal State system (Long Beach State, 1972) and my desire was to get back to this level.

"An athletic department run with ethical and financial responsibility can mirror a successful university. It can bring people to the university in a myriad of ways. There are 80,000 Cal State Fullerton graduates living in the Los Angeles area. We've got the opportunity to use our program to bring them back to campus. If we have a program that is competitive and makes an honest effort at moving athletes toward graduation, I think that's a lot to stand up and cheer about."

Shumard came to Fullerton after three years as an assistant athletic director at USC, where he was part of a five-person team that raised \$7 million per year. His projects included supervising 12 regional Trojan Club support groups and staging a dinner in the Los Angeles Coliseum for 3,000 persons to highlight the university's athletic centennial celebration.

Shumard's 13-year career with the Los Angeles Dodgers began in 1975 as an assistant in public relations and publicity. He became Director of the Speakers Bureau in 1977 and was appointed Director of Community Services in 1981. The title was enlarged in 1983 to include Special Events as he supervised a staff of 15 employees responsible for game and community promotions and all publications as well as coordinating the activities of the Dodger Alumni Association.

His first athletics position was as Sports Information Director at his alma mater in 1972 and 1973. He spent the next two years at Cal State Los Angeles where he was an assistant professor in journalism and physical education, was advisor to the campus pep groups and served as manager of the Athletic News Bureau.

Shumard's athletic career terminated as a freshman quarterback at Compton Junior College, where he obtained his Associate Arts degree in 1970. Bill and his wife, Kim, live in Brea. He has three sons -- David, 21; Matt, 17; and Mike, 14.

Nickname and Mascot

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that pop into the minds of media and fans when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, here are the recognized legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explains Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname 'Titans.' "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the

job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body at the outset, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College. They voted to organize as a student body and to assess themselves a fee of \$10 per semester.


"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek

history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormi-

tories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until, of course, the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest "happening" on the campus to this day. The "gag" attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as



the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek.

The mascot outlived the race. In 1963, one elephant charged the crowd causing minor injuries and an early sign of a now-common liability insurance crisis nipped a tradition in the bud.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was an appropriate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics

Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue in uniforms and printing instead of the "reflex" blue of recent years was initiated in 1992 with a de-emphasis of the orange, furthered by former athletic director Lynn Eilefson in the mid 1980s.

And, finally, there is the matter of the school's name. As mentioned earlier, the name originally was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State College Boulevard. And that's only the start of the confusion.

To out-of-staters, the picture clouds quickly because most don't realize there are two distinct systems of higher education in the state — the University of California and the State University system. So, the school has been called everything from Cal-Fullerton to UC Fullerton to California State Fullerton State to simply Fullerton State. The preferred moniker is Cal State Fullerton, with no hyphens or commas, which is what most of the more than 95,000 graduates recognize. But since there are only two other major institutions known as Titans (Univ. of Detroit and Oral Roberts University), just call Fullerton teams the "Titans!"

History of Titan Athletics

Obstacles and adversity. Grass-roots support and coaches with "sandwich board" signs. Stunning upsets and courageous performances. All have been a part of Cal State Fullerton athletics as "Titan Pride" has taken limited resources to athletic successes disproportionate to such a young institution.


How many universities can claim national championships in seven different sports, a perennial All-Star major league third baseman, baseball and men and women basketball players in the Olympics, two rookies in the Super Bowl, the subject matter of a Walt Disney feature film and the first player selected in the major league baseball draft?

The tenor was set by the first Titan intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only their second season, the Titans of coach Alex Omalev advanced five rounds into the NAIA national playoffs in 1961-62.

Sixteen seasons later, the entire nation watched another "cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the Western Regional.

The basketball tradition, which included a women's national title in 1970 and coach Billie Moore and star Nancy Dunkle on the women's 1976 Olympic team, was continued in 1984 as Leon Wood helped the men to a gold medal before he became a first-round NBA draft choice. Coach George McQuarn's teams were usually factors in the PCAA race and had national Top 20 rankings and a victory over the nation's No. 1-ranked and undefeated team to their credit. Fullerton, which seemingly specialized in last-second wins behind 1992 NBA slam dunk champion Cedric Ceballos, also has competed twice in the post-season NIT Tournament while the women have recently been in both the WNIT and the NCAA fields. In 1991, Genia Miller was selected a Kodak All-America after ranking No. 2 in the nation in scoring and blocked shots and No. 7 in rebounding.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton more fame. Former men's Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had recent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation led by former Chinese Olympian Li Xiao Ping. Lynn Rogers began the women's



program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation virtually every year and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while more recently Tami Elliott won 10 All-American awards before suffering a fractured vertebra in her senior season.

Baseball exploded on the national scene with the arrival of coach Augie Garrido. He broke the USC monopoly in the western regionals in 1975 and won the national title in 1979 behind the play of Tim Wallach, now of the Montreal Expos. He won the College World Series again in 1984 with players such as CWS Most Valuable Player John Fishel. The Titans won their first sixteam regional and finished third in the CWS in 1988 under the direction of Coach Larry Cochell, who in 1990 guided them to a Big West title, a regional championship at Texas and a sixth trip to Omaha in 1990. A total of 16 Titan products have played in the major leagues and now Garrido is back from a 3-year stint at Illinois. He punctuated his return with a share of the

1991 Big West title and a second-place finish in the 1992 College World Series despite losing his old diamond to construction for the new complex. Fullerton has a current 12-game winning streak in regional play -- all on the road at Starkville, Austin and Baton Rouge-- and boasted two players on the 1992 Olympic team in Phil Nevin and Jason Moler, who could not play due to an injury. Nevin, the College World Series MVP and Baseball America's College Player of the Year, also gained national attention as the first player selected (by the Houston Astros) in the 1992 amateur draft.

Women have sparkled on the Fullerton diamonds, too. Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and the Titans have been a powerhouse, making seven trips to the College World Series and 13 consecutive regional appearances. The Titans brought home their first NCAA Championship in 1986 and often have been ranked No. 1 in the country.

There have been national titles in men's cross country and women's fencing and individual standouts like golfer Martha Wilkerson and runner Mark Covert.

Football has had its moments, too. Dick Coury was the inaugural coach in 1970 and he built an instant winner at the Division II level. The Titans were 27-16-1 over the first four years under Coury and successor Pete Yoder before the growing pains of moving up to Div. I were endured. The program came of age under the guidance of Gene Murphy in the 1980s with a pair of conference championships and four runnerup finishes in a seven-year span between 1983 and 1989. The new stadium complex should add more luster to the Titan football and athletic reputation.

Head Coach Brad Holland



First Year UCLA, '79

Brad Holland, who has made his mark on Southern California basketball on the high school, college and professional levels, begins his head coaching career at Cal State Fullerton in the 1992-93 season.

An assistant to Jim Harrick at UCLA for the past four seasons, Holland was tendered a three-year contract on Apr. 8 by CSUF Athletic Director Bill Shumard.

"I'm excited and ready to get started at Fullerton," said Holland upon his appointment. "I feel very good about reaching a short-term goal to be a Division I head coach in a very competitive conference. There is the challenge of moving on and I am looking very much forward to it.

"I've grown up in Southern California and with Cal State Fullerton as a university and a basketball program. I have good memories of Titan Gym where I had a terrific game in the CIF-City All-Star game."

Holland, who will turn 36 on Dec. 6, helped Harrick and the Bruins return to national prominence while compiling a 93-35 record that took them to four NCAA tournaments. Holland worked with the offense and coordinated scouting and recruiting efforts while monitoring academics for this past year's 27-5 squad that advanced to the Final Eight.

Holland was a football and basketball star at Crescenta Valley High School. He was a four-year basketball letterman at UCLA and played with the Los Angeles Lakers and two other National Basketball Association teams before retiring in 1982 due to a knee injury. He entered private business and also was a broadcaster for PrimeTicket from 1985 to 1988.

"Brad has been around the game of basketball all of his life," said Shumard. "Despite his lack of head coaching experience, he has learned the game from and been associated with some of the greats in basketball."

Holland was a part of four Pac-10 championship teams at UCLA from 1976 to 1979, two under Coach Gene Bartow and two under Coach Gary Cunningham. The Bruins went 102-17 during Holland's playing career and he was an honorable mention All-America and second-team Academic All-America as a senior. That year he averaged 17.5 points and 4.8 assists and had a .598 field goal percentage, the best ever by a Bruin guard.

The Lakers drafted Holland in 1979 on the first round (the 14th player chosen) and went on to win the 1980 NBA championship. The rookie guard scored eight points in the decisive sixth game at Philadelphia. He finished his playing career in 1981-82 with Washington and Milwaukee.

Holland is the sixth head coach in Titan history following Alex Omalev (1961-72), Moe Radovich (1973), Bobby Dye (1974-80), George McQuarn (1981-88) and John Sneed (1989-92).

Holland and his wife, Leslie, currently live in La Canada with twin daughters Lisa and Kristin, 10, and infant son Kyle. They plan to relocate to Orange County.

Assistant Coaches



Chris Brazier

Montana State ('84)

Chris Brazier is an experienced but still youthful addition to Brad Holland's first Titan coaching staff.

Brazier, 32, begins his seventh year as a collegiate coach, his second full season on a fulltime basis. He worked last year as a full-time assistant to Ernie Kent at Saint Mary's College in Moraga after one season as a part-time coach at Santa Clara.

Prior to those West Coast Conference assignments, Chris was an assistant for two seasons (1988-90) at West Valley Community College in Saratoga where the Vikings won the

Golden Gate Conference championship in 1989-90 after a second-place finish in 1988-89. In 1986-87 and 1987-88 he was at the University of the Pacific, first as a graduate assistant and then earning a promotion to a full-time position after a mid-season coaching change.

Two head coaches directed Brazier during his playing career as a small forward at Montana State. Bruce Haroldson was the coach during his junior year and Stu Starner was the head man his senior season. Chris received his bachelor's degree in Organizational Communications and earned a master's in Human Behavior at National University in 1990.

Brazier has coached in numerous camps and clinics and worked with the Los Angeles Slam 'n Jam Development League. He is single and lives in Carson.

Bob Hawking joins Brad Holland's inaugural Cal State Fullerton staff after two seasons at UC Davis with Head Coach Bob Williams.


Hawking, 43, has deep Southern California basketball roots. He served the previous two years as an assistant at Pepperdine after a long and successful career on the high school level. He was the head coach for 14 seasons at Simi Valley High School where he took his teams to the CIF playoffs nine times and won five Marmonte League championships. His 1987 team

was ranked No. 4 in the state and the following year his team won the CIF championship and climbed to No. 3 in the state led by the play of Don MacLean, who went on to become the all-time leading scorer in the Pac-10 for UCLA. Hawking was selected CIF Southern Section AAAA Coach of the Year in 1988 and won similar honors from the Los Angeles Times in 1986 when Simi Valley was CIF runnerup. He was league coach of the year six times.

Hawking began his coaching career at Pater Noster High in Los Angeles before moving to Simi Valley in 1972 as the junior varsity coach. He has served as coach and director for numerous basketball camps and all-star games throughout California.

The playing career of Hawking began at Alemany High School in Mission Hills and continued at Pierce College in Woodland Hills and Cal State Northridge.

Bob and his wife, Jeannie, have three children. Kristin, 14, and Quinn, 10, are at home while son Butch is head coach of the Air Force Academy Prep School in Colorado Springs after graduating from the Air Force Academy in May.

Cal State Los Angeles ('51)

Ed Goorjian's presence on the Cal State Fullerton basketball staff for 1992-93 represents two "homecomings" of sorts. Goorjian returns to Fullerton where he was an assistant during the 1985-86 season under Coach George McQuarn. And, he returns a favor to Head Coach Brad Holland, who played for Goorjian at Crescenta Valley High School.

Goorjian served the past three years on Jerry Tarkanian's staff at UNLV. Before that he coached one year as a volunteer for George Raveling at USC after directing the Hellal Club in

Saudi Arabia for two years.

Holland was one of five prep All-Americans and 32 Division I players who played for Goorjian, who established himself as one of the top prep coaches in the state by compiling a 427-103 record at Crescenta Valley. He won seven league championships and won California High School Coach of the Year honors in 1977 and the William S. Hockwell Award as National High School Coach of the Year in 1978.

Goorjian moved to Glendale College in 1979 and guided the Vaqueros to 19 wins in his first season, an improvement of 18 victories over the previous year's total.

Loyola Marymount soon beckoned and Goorjian was an assistant for two years. He became head coach in 1980 and served for five years. He posted a 2-2 record against McQuarn and Fullerton.

Ed and his wife, Joyce, have three sons -- Brian, Kevin and Greg. The latter was an All-American player for Ed at Crescenta Valley and went on to play for Arizona State, Loyola Marymount and UNLV. Brian and Kevin both are coaching in the National Basketball League of Australia, where Brian was voted Coach of the Year for 1992.

Season Preview

"Adjustment" may be the most definitive one-word assessment of Cal State Fullerton's men's basketball program for the 1992-93 season.

New head Coach Brad Holland inherits a solid returning nucleus from last year's 12-16 Titans' club, but he's approaching the season with his eyes wide open.

"There most definitely will be an adjustment period, for me being a head coach for the first time and for the players getting to know our system and what we expect from them," said Holland, who was hired Apr. 8.

"We have a reduced amount of practice time and don't play our pre-season schedule until early December due to new NCAA regulations, so we will need to make further adjustments. Our staff doesn't know what anyone can do. The players will be competing freely for playing time and everyone will be given an opportunity to show what he can do."

Three starters return in second-team All-Big West Conference small forward Bruce Bowen, point guard Aaron Sunderland and center Sean Williams. Kim Kemp saw extensive duty as a starter and reserve at both the center and power forward spots. But all four are seniors and junior guard Greg Vernon is the only other player who boasts any signifiant Div. I playing experience.

"Playing time will be based on three things -- work ethic, attitude and performance," said Holland, who spent the past four years as an assistant at UCLA. "Those who show these three things well are going to be the guys that play. Everyone needs to prove himself. They have to prove to us what they can do. I have an idea of ability but don't know about work ethic and how they practice day to day."

The quintet above has a big edge in game experience. Bowen is a two-year starter who averaged 14.6 points and 7.0 rebounds in 1991-92. Defense and scoring out of the transition game and off the offensive backboard are his strong suits.

Sunderland started all but one game last year after a redshirt season and averaged 11.1 points and 6.5 assists. Williams came on strong in the second half of the season and ended up averaging 9.1 points and 5.9 rebounds. Kemp played both interior positions, starting seven games, and averaged 4.4 points and 4.8 rebounds. Vernon served as backup the past two years for off guard Joe Small, who carried the scoring load (14.9 points) a year ago along with power forward Agee Ward (18.0 points and 7.5 rebounds).

"After this nucleus, the picture is very unclear and it will be interesting to see in pre-season practice who emerges that will help," said Holland. "Todd Satalowich, Dijon Bernard, Don Leary and maybe Casey Sheahan. If they emerge, they will make us more competitive."

Satalowich, a power forward, was a late transfer from the University of Missouri and played only 67 minutes last season. Bernard is a wing player from Ventura College who sat out last season. Leary is a perimeter shooter who transferred from Mt. San Jacinto College where he averaged 22.7 points while Sheahan is an incoming freshman from Taft High School in Woodland Hills who might play either point or shooting guard.

Rounding out the roster are sophomore forward Chauncey Woolridge, redshirt freshman forward Ray Hooper and walk-ons forward Andre Toliver and guard Sharif Metoyer. Woolridge and Toliver combined for only 17 minutes last year. Hooper is from San Diego's University High and Metoyer is from Long Beach Poly.

The Big West Conference is in its fifth year of existence since changing its name from the Pacific Coast Athletic Association prior to the 1988 football season and it has a new look for the 1992-93 basketball season

Dennis Farrell, who has worked in the conference office in a variety of roles since 1980, was named Commissioner in August. And Fresno State, a charter member in 1969, has moved to the Western Athletic Conference and been replaced by the University of Nevada.

The name was changed to reflect a simpler, more accurate description of the league's 11 member institutions -- Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State, Nevada, New Mexico State, San Jose State, UC Irvine, UC Santa Barbara, Hawaii (women's sports only), UNLV, Pacific and Utah State.

Basketball success among Big West institutions has been growing over the years and reached its apex in 1989-90 when UNLV won the NCAA championship in convincing fashion over Duke yet couldn't even claim sole possession of the Big West championship. New Mexico State tied the Rebels for the regular season title and actually was the No. 1 seed in the post-season tournament in Long Beach. The league's third-place team, UC Santa Barbara, went on to beat Houston in the first round of the NCAA tourney and help the Big West top all other conferences in tournament play with a .778 percentage (7-2).

In 1990-91, UNLV was ranked No. 1 in the nation all season until losing to Duke in the semifinals of the Final Four. New Mexico State again was ranked nationally, but Cal State Fullerton was the only other team to avoid a losing overall season. Last year, New Mexico State captured the nation's fancy by advancing to the Sweet 16.

1991-92 in Review

For the second year in a row, the Cal State Fullerton men's basketball team outperformed the pre-season prognosticators but not well enough to get over the .500 mark.

The Titans were predicted to finish eighth by both the media and the coaches at the annual Big West Conference Media Day in November but they gained a share of sixth place with Pacific at 8-10 in the conference and 12-16 overall.

The 4-5 non-conference portion of the schedule went pretty much according to form. The closest thing to an exception was game No. 3 at Eastern Illinois, where the Titans squandered a late 5-point lead and then fell victim to some devastating foul and no foul calls in the final seconds of a 1-point loss. Otherwise, Fullerton lost as an underdog at Butler, UCLA and Houston and won as the favorite at home over San Francisco, Cal State Northridge and Drake. The Titans hung on for a road victory at improved Portland but couldn't beat eventual West Coast Conference champion Pepperdine in Titan Gym.

The Big West schedule maker put the Titans in a hole from the outset. After a home game against powerful UNLV, Fullerton went on the road for its next three games. The Titans were 0-3 before they halted the slide by holding on for a victory at UC Irvine. A frustrating home loss to UC Santa Barbara was followed by a thrilling overtime win over Long Beach State. That triggered a spurt where the Titans won five of seven games, losing only at Pacific and in the closing seconds at home to New Mexico State.

That positive momentum was abruptly reversed on a week-long road trip in late February. The Titans lost soundly at UNLV and then fell apart in crunch time in losses at Long Beach State and UC Santa Barbara. A return to Titan Gym cured those ills as the Titans easily beat Pacific and then had to rally in the closing minutes to beat last-place San Jose State. The season finale at Las Cruces was a narrow loss but also a confidence booster for the bench, which was pressed into starting duty by illness, injuries and disciplinary moves and responded surprisingly well.

The Big West Conference Tournament opened on Friday the 13th and if the Titans weren't superstitious before the game, they were after. First, because they lost a coin flip with Pacific, they had to play Long Beach State on its part-time home floor. They had a rusty Agee Ward, who hadn't practiced in 13 days due to back problems, and a rusty Joe Small, who had not played in a game in 9 days due to illness. To compound things, Bruce Bowen got into foul trouble, the 49ers had a collective hot hand from 3-point range and two key calls down the stretch went Long Beach's way. The result was a 77-71 49ers' win that ended the Fullerton season and the prolific careers of Ward and Small.

The three returning starters from 1990-91 played to mixed reviews. Forward Ward lifted his game and led the team in scoring and rebounding while increasing his playing time to about 32 minutes per game. Small forward Bowen improved his scoring and challenged Ward for the rebounding lead. But guard Small lost his shooting touch at Houston and never recovered in Big West play, where he had been the conference's No. 2 scorer a year earlier.

Newcomers progressed with the schedule. Point guard Aaron Sunderland developed into a scoring threat while cutting down on his turnovers and ranking in the top 15 in the nation in assists. Center Sean Williams rebounded from an educational non-conference schedule to average double figures in Big West play and Kim Kemp adapted to his role as rebounder and shot blocker while improving his shooting touch and cutting down on his fouls.

Fullerton finally got its first Big West victory, vitctimizing a rebuilt UC Irvine team and new Coach Rod Baker. The Titans spurted just before halftime and gradually increased their advantage before weathering a remarkable rally by the Anteaters.

The calendar read Friday the 13th and nothing but misfortune greeted the Titans as they began what they hoped would be a season-redeeming performance in the Big West post-season tournament.

Having lost a coin flip for seeding, the Titans had to play the hometown 49ers on their part-time home floor. They did it with a rusty lineup that had Agee Ward suiting up for the first time in nine days and he and Small playing for the first time in 13 days. To compoundthings, Bruce Bowengot into foul trouble, the 49ers had a collective hot hand from 3-point range and two key calls down the stretch went Long Beach's way.

The game began predictably as the rusty Titans had trouble running their half-court offense. They were trailed, 17-6,8 minutes into the game before several steals punctuated a 13-2 Fullerton run over the next five minutes for a 20-19 lead.

The 49ers scored 12 of the first 16 points of the second half for an 11-point lead at 44-33. The Titans whittled into that margin and were within 63-61 when Bryon Russell was awarded a continuation bucket and free throw instead of the ball out of bounds on a Small foul. Fullerton's last gasp disappeared when Aaron Sunderland was called for a block instead of the 49ers getting a charge.




