There will be four contests: Pumpkin Carving and Decorating, Chili Cook-Off, Baked Goods with a Pumpkin Base and the Costume Contest.


There will be many great prizes again for the four different contests, as well as prizes for participants. Tickets will be sold for \$1, which covers the admission and a chance to win a prize.

A look back

September 1989, 20 years ago: Keyboard Club (now LV Musicians) presented John Lee, Disneyland pianist, in concert.

September 1994, 15 years ago: The Camera Club was allowed to display photographs on corridor walls of the Recreation Center.



expeditionary forces on the Queen Mary and trained with the British Army and Black Watch in Ireland and Scotland. He was part of "Operation Torch," which was the invasion of North Africa on November 8, 1942. His unit liberated Casablanca, Bizerte. Oran and Tunisia and participated in the El Alamein campaign, Casserine Pass and Hill 609.

Jules was attached to Major Gen. Lucian Truscott's Third Division, and on July 10, 1943, under the command of Gen. George Patton, they invaded and liberated all of Sicily to the Port of Messina. They went on and invaded Italy at Salerno and liberated Naples. Jules fought at Mount Cassino before making an amphibious landing on Anzio Beachhead on January

22. 1944, under the code name "Shingle," where Jules was wounded and sent to a field hospital in Caserta.

After his recuperation, Jules rejoined the Third Division, which was the first army to liberate Rome from the south. They then had an audience with Pope Pius XII.

After invading southern France on August 15, 1944, and liberating Alsace-Lorraine, Jules' unit penetrated into Germany as far as the town of Bischoffingen. He was sent home on rotation after spending three years in active combat and making seven landings. The night before he left Le Havre, France, on a hospital ship, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower came to say goodbye and thanked him for his service to our country. When he noted Jules' helmet with the Third Division insignia,

he asked what outfit he was in. When Jules told him the 39th Field Artillery, Eisenhower extended his hand and said "Damn good outfit!" They shook hands, and it remains a memorable moment for Jules.

Jules returned to the United States on March 12, 1945, thrilling to the sight of the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor. On May 12, 1945, which was Redeployment Day, Jules was discharged from the Army with the most points (146) in the Army on that day. The event was broadcast on radio news throughout the metropolitan area and written up in local newspapers. He appeared on a radio program with Bennett Cerf, Bill Slater, Rex Stout and the ambassador to Italy to represent the returning servicemen.

Jules and Leatrice were married on March 25, 1945, 13 days after his return to the States. Leatrice, who worked for the War Department during the war, had sent letters by the bagful along with packages full of canned foods, chocolates, salami, etc., to Jules when he was overseas. When Jules was attached to the 15th Infantry division, he became friends with Audie Murphy, World War II's most decorated soldier. Audie always asked if Leatrice had sent "matso."

Jules and Leatrice moved from the East to Leisure Village in July of 2000. They were two of the nine residents who originated the New York Club, and Jules was the club's first president. They have two daughters, Nadine in New York and Diane of California, plus five grandchildren and one great-granddaughter. They love living in Leisure Village, and with Jules, the Village has another genuine hero in its midst.





Prescription discount cards are now available

The year 2009 has been an emotionally and financially challenging vear for residents and families throughout our state and county. I would like to take this opportunity to provide you with some truly good news for a welcome change.

As chair of the County of Ventura Medical Oversight Committee, we adopted over a year ago the use of the free discount prescription (Rx) Coast-2Coast card for clients in our medical system. Our Ventura County Health Care Agency determined that the discounts provided through this card

are some of the best available among those currently in the marketplace. With successful performance over this last year, I brought the Coast-2Coast discount Rx card to a Board of Supervisors meeting for our official county endorsement, and it was unanimously approved.

The Coast2Coast discount Rx card is made possible through a partnership with several pharmacies and can help residents save up to 65 percent for each prescription filled and an average savings of 38 percent annually on prescription medications. Savings is anticipated for brandname drugs, generic drugs, drugs not covered in other plans and some pet prescriptions.

The savings on your prescriptions is a benefit provided by the County of Ventura and participating pharmacies to help residents in the county. The discount card is available free for individuals and families - everyone qualifies. The card is ready to use and is honored at all major chain pharmacies and many independent pharmacies in the county. It also provides mail-order capability. There is no paperwork to fill out and there are no limits on usage or health condition restrictions.

You can learn more about the discount card on a Web site at www. coast2coastrx.com/venturaca or call 1-800-931-8872. The Web site provides locations of participating pharmacies, drug prices and an option to print a card. The CVS

Pharmacies in the Santa Rosa Plaza and on Mission Oaks Boulevard are both identified as locations that accept the card.
