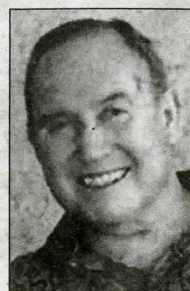
## Former ILV editor Schulman dies

Leisure Village has lost one of its most prominent and admired residents with the death of Gerald Schulman on August 17.

Gerry was the editor of Inside Leisure Village for 28 months until health issues forced him to give up a job he truly loved. I

reluctantly took over for Gerry in February 2008, only on the condition that he would be available for consultation and advice whenever I felt I needed it. And he never failed to provide that help whenever I called on him. His impact on ILV was exceptional, from originat-

ing the Editors Corner to initiating the policy of not printing inflammatory or profane letters.

Gerry's educational background is equally impressive. Born in 1931 and raised in Brooklyn, he attended CCNY, graduating with a bachelor's degree in 1955. He also attended the University of New Hampshire and received a law degree from St. John's

Paraphrasing a famous introduction to an old television program, we can truly say there are over 3,000 stories in Leisure Village, and this is one of them.

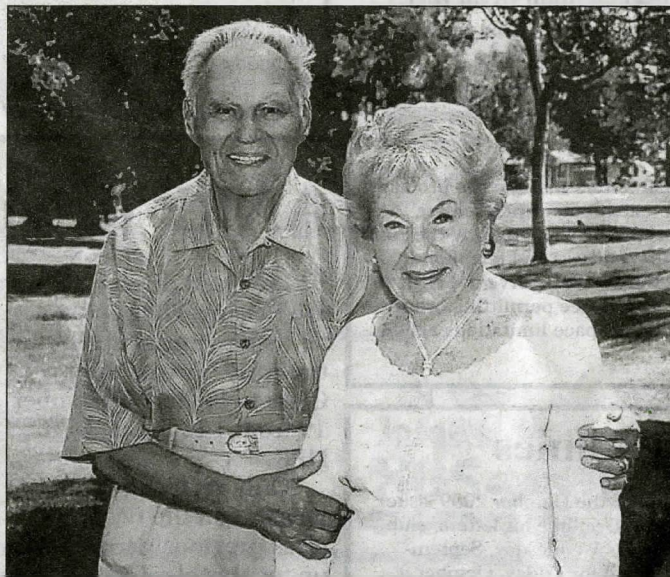
Jules and Leatrice Posner live in Village 23, and Jules joins an incredible number of residents who certainly qualify as heroes.

enlisted in the Army and trained in Fort Riley, Kan. He shipped overseas in March 1942 with the first

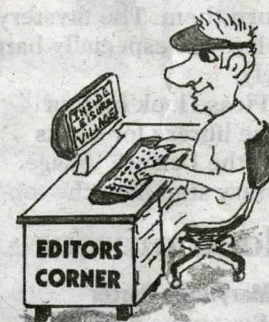

There will be four contests: Pumpkin Carving and Decorating, Chili Cook-Off, Baked Goods with a Pumpkin Base and the Costume Contest.

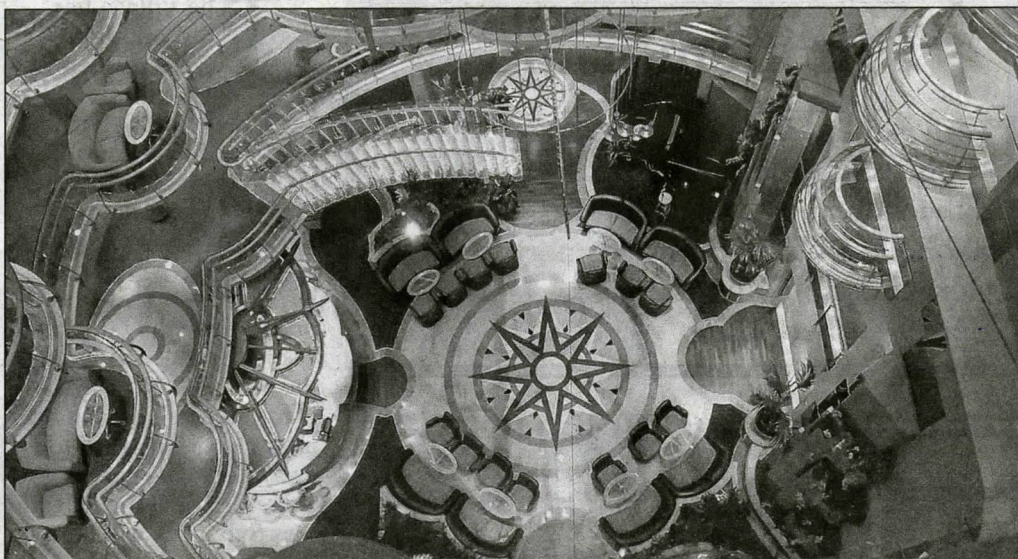
There will be many great prizes again for the four different contests, as well as prizes for participants. Tickets will be sold for \$1, which covers the admission and a chance to win a prize.

expeditionary forces on the Queen Mary and trained with the British Army and Black Watch in Ireland and Scotland. He was part of "Operation Torch," which was the invasion of North Africa on November 8, 1942. His unit liberated Casablanca, Bizerte, Oran and Tunisia and participated in the El Alamein campaign, Casserine Pass and Hill 609.

Jules was attached to Major Gen. Lucian Truscott's Third Division, and on July 10, 1943, under the command of Gen. George Patton, they invaded and liberated all of Sicily to the Port of Messina. They went on and invaded Italy at Salerno and liberated Naples. Jules fought at Mount Cassino before making an amphibious landing on Anzio Beachhead on January

22, 1944, under the code name "Shingle," where Jules was wounded and sent to a field hospital in Caserta.

After his recuperation, Jules rejoined the Third Division, which was the first army to liberate Rome from the south. They then had an audience with Pope Pius XII.

After invading southern France on August 15, 1944, and liberating Alsace-Lorraine, Jules' unit penetrated into Germany as far as the town of Bischoffingen. He was sent home on rotation after spending three years in active combat and making seven landings. The night before he left Le Havre, France, on a hospital ship, Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower came to say goodbye and thanked him for his service to our country. When he noted Jules' helmet with the Third Division insignia,

he asked what outfit he was in. When Jules told him the 39th Field Artillery, Eisenhower extended his hand and said "Damn good outfit!" They shook hands, and it remains a memorable moment for Jules.

Jules returned to the United States on March 12, 1945, thrilling to the sight of the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbor. On May 12, 1945, which was Redeployment Day, Jules was discharged from the Army with the most points (146) in the Army on that day. The event was broadcast on radio news throughout the metropolitan area and written up in local newspapers. He appeared on a radio program with Bennett Cerf, Bill Slater, Rex Stout and the ambassador to Italy to represent the returning servicemen.

Jules and Leatrice were married on March

25, 1945, 13 days after his return to the States. Leatrice, who worked for the War Department during the war, had sent letters by the bagful along with packages full of canned foods, chocolates, salami, etc., to Jules when he was overseas. When Jules was attached to the 15th Infantry division, he became friends with Audie Murphy, World War II's most decorated soldier. Audie always asked if Leatrice had sent "matso."

Jules and Leatrice moved from the East to Leisure Village in July of 2000. They were two of the nine residents who originated the New York Club, and Jules was the club's first president. They have two daughters, Nadine in New York and Diane of California, plus five grandchildren and one great-granddaughter. They love living in Leisure Village, and with Jules, the Village has another genuine hero in its midst.

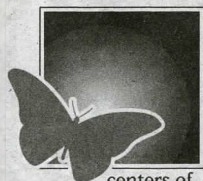

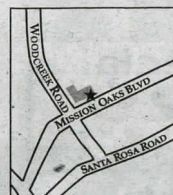

Law School in 1961. He served in the Army from 1955 to 1957, assigned to the Judge Advocate General Office at Fort Hood, Texas.

Gerry was a noted philanthropist, instrumental in funding the largest bird breeding facility in North America for hand-fed parrots, located on 4-1/2 acres in Placerita Canyon

He also loved taking groups of his Leisure Village friends to the San Diego Zoo, where, since he was a major donor, his groups had exclusive access to view the animals up close. The zoo named an exotic bird hatchery after him, which was

included in these group tours.

Gerry loved the Village, and he enjoyed talking about how he felt whenever he came through the gates. He will be sorely missed by his numerous friends and close companion, Bernice Schornstein.

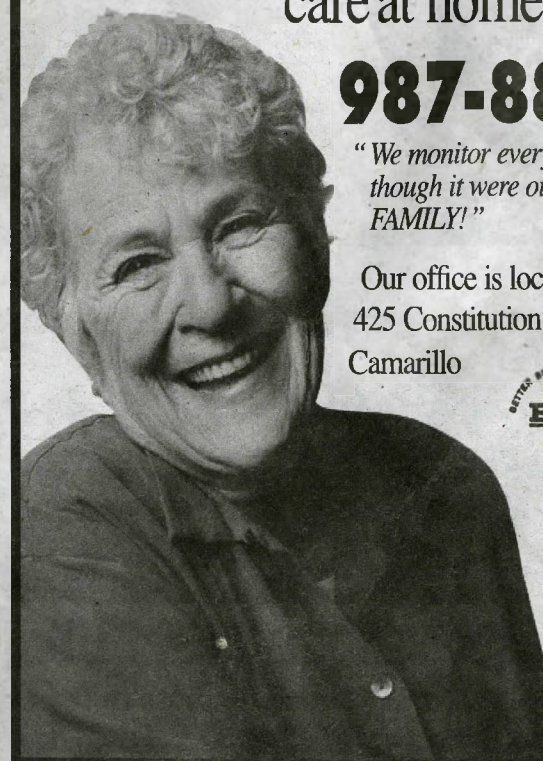

# Prescription discount cards are now available

The year 2009 has been an emotionally and financially challenging year for residents and families throughout our state and county. I would like to take this opportunity to provide you with some truly good news for a welcome change.

As chair of the County of Ventura Medical Oversight Committee, we adopted over a year ago the use of the free discount prescription (Rx) Coast-2Coast card for clients in our medical system. Our Ventura County Health Care Agency determined that the discounts provided through this card

are some of the best available among those currently in the marketplace. With successful performance over this last year, I brought the Coast-2Coast discount Rx card to a Board of Supervisors meeting for our official county endorsement, and it was unanimously approved.

The Coast2Coast discount Rx card is made possible through a partnership with several pharmacies and can help residents save up to 65 percent for each prescription filled and an average savings of 38 percent annually on prescription medications. Savings is anticipated for brand-

name drugs, generic drugs, drugs not covered in other plans and some pet prescriptions.

The savings on your prescriptions is a benefit provided by the County of Ventura and participating pharmacies to help residents in the county. The discount card is available free for individuals and families — everyone qualifies. The card is ready to use and is honored at all major chain pharmacies and many independent pharmacies in the county. It also provides mail-order capability. There is no paperwork to fill out and there are no limits on usage or health condition restrictions.

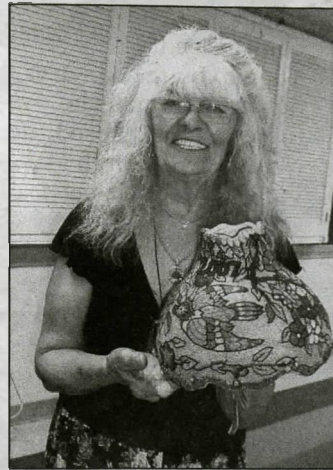
