MURPH'S GUIDE TO GAINESVILLE EATING

INTRODUCTION / DISCLAIMER:

So, I've been meaning to do this for the last couple fest guidebooks, but never seemed to be able to squeeze it in. I wanted to do this to give some of the people coming in for the Fest a good idea of the places to get good food and drink while visiting Gainesville. This is by no means a complete guide of places to eat here in Gainesville, but merely some of my favorites, more or less. There are tons of decent restaurants not listed, mainly because I probably don't go there...but by all means, explore. If you are new to Gainesville, I hope this helps you find something that fits well into your tastes and price range. Some of you have been here before and have your favorites already... hopefully with this list you'll find something new! I will mention that I have been vegan for a while now and have a strong tendency towards drinking coffee and alcohol a bit too much...so if the places tend to lean towards establishments that cater to my "tastes", now you know why. At the end of each restaurant description, I've put a simple key: whether it's vegetarian/vegan friendly and what beverage choices I would go for (coffee/alcohol wise that is)...who drinks soda?

Also, don't forget about the BBQ's that are going on frequently at Common Grounds as well as a good cheap brunch happening at Wayward Council...I'm sure details to both are here in the guidebook.

Have fun this weekend...it's hard not to. Be kind and tip your bartenders/servers well...they deserve it. Most importantly, remember to eat okay? There's some good places here...oh yeah, and if you see me, buy me a drink.

I've listed the restaurants according to where registration will be and how you will head out from there...here ya go:

HEADING TOWARDS THE SHOWS (EAST)

LEONARDO'S 1245 W University Ave. (352) 375-2007

Coffee, pizza, pasta, salads and piecing together the night before are standard fare here. Every band playing the Fest will be redeeming their free food vouchers here and understandably, all the employees will look at you like they want to rip your face off and make you eat it ... you'll probably end up here at some point. (VEG: yes DRINK: beer/wine)

BISTRO (352) 376-0000

Right next-door and attached to Leo's. Solid bistro cuisine and great selection of wine. For fest goers that feel a little more fancy pants. (VEG: yes DRINK: beer/wine)

SAIGON LEGEND 1228 W University Ave. (352) 374-0934

Amazing and cheap Vietnamese food. I eat here way too much. But it's that good. The veggie Pho or the Bo Xao (tofu) and an icecold beer will make any hangover melt away. (VEG: yes! DRINK: beer)

CARIBBEAN SPICE 1121 W University Ave. (352) 377-2712

A big empty room with a single counter and a laminated poster of a large breasted Jamaican woman (just getting out of the water) may leave you a bit confused. Not to worry...a good simple selection of patties (veg, spinach, and meat) along with coco bread, soda and dessert are a great deal. Whatever msg/ crack-cocaine combo they put in the patties has had us coming back for years. (VEG: man, I hope so

DRINK: ginger beer)

GATOR DAWGS 1023 W University Ave. (352) 378-4353

This place has been a weekly staple for us No Idea employees for the better part of a year now. Not only will the decor blow your mind, but also the owner keeps a battle sword behind the counter. Awesome variety of veggie and meat dogs including: Frito Dawg, Rueben Dawg, Pizza Dawg, Greek Dawg and so many more ... please eat here often. (VEG: yes!! DRINK: beer)

GYRO PLUS 1011 W University Ave. (352) 336-5323

A good solid selection of Mediterranean fare: falafel, hummus, stuffed grape leaves, gyros, etc.. Probably the best French-fries in all of Gainesville. For some reason this place is a hit amongst the UK and Irish fest goers.

Ask them why.

(VEG: yes! DRINK: Turkish coffee)

REGGAE SHACK 619 W University Ave. (352) 377-5464

This place is great...seriously. A variety of Caribbean cuisine with a large vegan selection. The people are nice and the food is awesome. Worth checking out: curry palm hearts. spicy tempeh and the "festivals". (VEG: ves!!! DRINK: beer)

FLACO'S

200 W University Ave. (352) 371-2000 Open during the day, but great for late night munchies too! Nice selection of Cuban sandwiches. empanadas, pastries and great Cuban coffee. I like to take their coffee and pour it in a pint of Guinness... delicious. A fancy lad's "Sparks". People are great and so is the (VEG: ves/hopefully more for fest! DRINK:

It always takes a friend visiting from out of town to remind me how great this place is. Consistently awesome food and good drinks. If you get a chance to have a casual sit-down meal this weekend, make it here! Great selection of sandwiches, salads and entrees...vegan and not. If nothing else, make it here on

Sunday morning for a great brunch and stiff Bloody Mary. (VEG: yes!!! DRINK: beer, wine, booze)

2ND STREET BAKERY

1511 NW 2nd St. (352) 505-5039

This place will be hosting some of the Fest shows (Plan-itx, etc.) so you might end up here anyways. Absolutely great coffee, fresh baked breads, deserts and sandwiches. All made with fresh and organic ingredients. The owners get big thumbs up and this place is more than worth checking out. (VEG: yes!! DRINK: great coffee)

BUDDHA BELLY 25 NW 16th St. (352) 377-0287

Recently opened as an offshoot to Steamers. Good selection of curries, fried rice and sandwiches. All with tofu, tempeh and tons of other good stuff. Check out the zucchini fries and the peanut sauce...shit is good! (VEG: yes DRINK: hopefully beer and wine come fest time!)

THE "EASTSIDE"

For many who are settling in to Gainesville, the northeast side is becoming the place to call "home". Many of my friends are buying houses in this area, as well as opening great places of business.

THE JONES 401 NE 23rd Ave. (352) 373-6777

A great little sit-down style café/diner that serves a nice selection of breakfast and lunch ftems. They use tons of fresh and local ingredients including bread from the 2nd Street Bakery. Very vegan friendly and a great place for a hearty breakfast. Worth seeking out. (VEG: yes! DRINK: good coffee)

SATCHEL'S 1800 NE 23rd Ave. (352) 335-7272

There are several reasons why this is one of the best places in Gainesville: the food is absolutely incredible, the staff consists of some of the best people in town. and the atmosphere is uniquely amazing. They make it more than worth your wait for their pizza, calzones and salads. Wander around Lightning Salvage (in the back) while sipping on a cold beer, sorting through bins of Florida trinkets, listening to live music and perhaps playing Bocce Ball! If you have the time, go

HEADING NORTH FROM REGISTRATION

El Indio 407 NW 13th St. (352) 377-5828 Cheap, fast and tasty

Mexican food. Popular with those on a budget. They even have a breakfast menu. Check out: tempeh burrito, apple burrito, hot carrots and a lot of people seem to dig the fish tacos. (VEG: yes! DRINK: Mexican sodas)

CAFÉ @ BOOKS INC. 505 NW 13th St. (352) 384-0090

ALL vegetarian/vegan restaurant tucked inside a book store. They have a good, healthy variety of sandwiches, salads. and other goodies. Sit outside if the weather is nice. Hi-five some Religious as Fuck band members behind the counter, while looking out for dudes playing "Magic: the Gathering" at the tables around you.

(VEG: obviously YES! DRINK: good coffee and chai)

MOTHER EARTH 521 NW 13th St. (352) 378-5224

I mention this place for those looking for a health food store within walking distance. They have a small deli section, bulk bins and organic produce...the usual. Try to make a trip to this place if trying to stay healthy during the fest- meaning, stock up on Emergen-C packets to put in your morning beer.

(VEG: vep DRINK: coffee/organic wine)

MURPH'S GUIDE CONTINUED

43RD STREET DELI 1505 NW 13th St. (352) 373-3354

Pretty large sit down, deli style restaurant. Recommended for cheap and filling breakfasts. Variety of vegan options that I give the thumbs up on. (VEG: yes DRINK: good coffee)

HEADING SOUTH FROM REGISTRATION

BAHN THAI 1902 SW 13th St. (352) 335-1204

A little pricey, but really good Thai food. They do a good job on the veggie side offering tempeh, tofu and seitan. (VEG: yes DRINK: beer/wine)

LA TIENDA 2204 SW 13th St. (352) 367-0022

VERY authentic Mexican grocery and restaurant. I enjoy drinking beers on the patio, and from what I can tell, the food is fantastic.

(VEG: doubt it DRINK: cold beer)

CHOP STIX CAFE 3500 SW 13th St. 9352) 367-0003

One of the most popular restaurants in Gainesville and for good reason. Huge pan-Asian menu. Tons of veggie options, good drinks and located on a beautiful lake chock full of alligators.

(VEG: yes!! DRINK: full bar, great Thai ice tea)

MERLOIN 3610 SW 13th St. (352) 376-8998

I haven't eaten year yet, but I mention it because people say it has a huge vegan menu (tofu, tempeh, fake meats, etc.) and supposedly is really good. If you go there, tell me what you think

(VEG: yes! DRINK: I assume the works?)

HEADING WEST FROM REGISTRATION

BURRITO **BROTHERS** 1402 W University Ave. (352) 378-5948 Man. I've eaten here

for years...but not a lot lately. Standard variety

of Mexican food that is a huge favorite among UF alumni throughout the country...so much so that they have a service to Fed-Ex their food to ex-Gainesville residents around the country...I'm serious. Get it double wrapped, add hot peppers and rice and vou're good to go.

STEAMERS 1618 NW 1st Ave. (352) 374-9920 Sandwiches, curries and fried rice, (akin to Buddha Belly). Cramped quarters but damn good food and ice-cold cheap beer.



Naked Raygun is one of Chicago's most beloved and respected punk bands of the '80s and early '90s. Put them in league with Hüsker Dü. They fit into punk—because punks were smart enough to like 'em—but actively resisted the constraints that far too many punk bands at the time were willing to self-apply. Taking early inspiration from Wire, The Buzzcocks, Stiff Little Fingers, and Gang of Four and being more than merely derivative by mixing occasional horns into a good dose of melodic weirdness, they delivered what punk had promised early on: original music with uncertain boundaries. Along the way, they became more than precisely American; they helped form a sound that's become distinctly Midwestern: a touchstone that countless other bands would be compared to decades later.

THE NAME

The band that was later to be called Naked Raygun was first formed in February of 1980 by Marko Pezzati and Santiago Durango (who would go on to Big Black). Both were students at the University of Illinois at Chicago. Marko convinced his younger brother, Jeff, who was singing in a cover band and had a huge afro, to sing for them. They played under the name Negro Command for one show, calling it their "coming out" party. Marko left the band shortly after, in 1981. Over the years, in all incarnations, singer Jeff Pezzati would remain the only constant member.

In August of 1981, the band debuted as Naked Raygun. The origin of the name is still in dispute. One thing that's clear? All band members are emphatic that it wasn't a perversion of "Nancy Reagan." Santiago is believed to have come up with the "Raygun" part. Jeff claimed that it was chosen almost at random, but that he'd really wanted "something like 'nude'" in the title somewhere, but "Nude Raygun" wasn't quite right. It's rumored that when they drove past a porn shop on Rush St. in Chicago, they saw the word "naked." The name, Naked Raygun, has been giving them trouble for the past twenty-six years.

WHAT STYLE OF MUSIC DOES NAKED RAYGUN PLAY?

It's pretty simple, really. Jeff explains: "'Punk' is preferred to 'hardcore,' but we hate to be pigeonholed. We play aggressive, melodic, intense, chanty music." It was a hit early on. Naked Raygun opened up for the Ramones at the 5,000-seat Aragon Ballroom in Chicago in 1984... before releasing their first album.

WHAT ALBUMS SHOULD I KNOW?

Naked Raygun released five full-length studio albums. The first four, we'll be quick and say they were met with "nearly unanimous praise." A neat thing about Naked Raygun albums? Even at low volume, they mysteriously sound loud. Some things don't change that much over time in DIY punk rock. Their full-length debut. Throb Throb. was recorded the summer of 1983 but because the band was flat-ass broke, it wasn't released until 1985. In March of 1983, the band did its first tour of the East Coast. They opened up for Mission Of Burma in Washington DC. Quickly on the heels of Throb Throb's release came 1986's All Rise. Shortly after, ex-Minor Threat guitarist Lyle Preslar signed Naked Raygun to a three-album contract. He apparently cracked the whip. Naked Raygun released three albums in as many years, starting off with Jettison in 1988. and Understand? in 1989, which they supported on their first European tour. Steve Diggle of the Buzzcocks joined them onstage for an encore. Raygun... Naked Raygun, was released in 1990. It didn't do so well and met a lukewarm reception. Pretty much each band member, years later in interviews, admitted that what was to be their last full-length wasn't very good, although there are a few bright spots on it.

WHAT DO THEY SING ABOUT?

"We're just trying to point out things, rather than make a huge statement," Jeff explains. "We're definitely not a band that preaches. It's pretty obvious that we're just pointing out some things. We're not singing about semi-love pop shit, either... To get with our music—as opposed to our lyrics—we'd like to get across that you can be aggressive and good without being repetitious of other bands and other widely known styles of music."

DID THEY REALLY PLAY ALL FOUR CORNERS OF A ROOM ONCE?

Yes, they did, in Fresno, California, at a place called the Cubby Bear. "It was really hard to sing together," Jeff recollects. "It was cool. People were really confused, standing in the middle."

HOW MANY "OH'S" ARE IN A GOOD NAKED RAYGUN SONG?

Eric Spicer: "More "Oh's" than Cheerios."

Jeff Pezzati: "It would be easy to put 'whoas' in every song, but they'd have to be really good 'whoas."

WHAT HAPPENED? WHEN DID THEY BREAK UP?

In early 1992, Naked Raygun called it quits. They never had a "final show," or issued a statement of kaput. They just stopped playing shows. Life's real fuckin' tricky. Shit changes. John Haggerty and Pierre Kezdy joined up with Larry Damore of the Bhopal Stiffs and formed Pegboy.

WAIT FOR IT... WAIT FOR IT...

Five years went by and then Naked Raygun scheduled two shows for a reunion. Tickets sold so fast, they added an extra night. Chicago's Metro went wild. Naked Raygun said that they had no interest in getting back together. In 1999, Jeff Pezzati began fronting The Bomb.

WHAT POOR GODS WE DO MAKE

In January 2007, following their reunion show at Riot Fest 2006 in Chicago, Naked Raygun—Jeff Pezzati, Bill Stephens, Pierre Kezdy, and Eric Spicer—announced that Naked Raygun were officially back together.

FEST VI

Contrary to previously printed reports, this is the first time the reunited Naked Raygun has played Florida, and they're only playing one show. Welcome to the Sunshine State, fellas.

TRIVIA

Billy Bragg likes Naked Raygun a lot. In 1985 for their Thanksgiving show at the Metro, Jeff chainsawed a turkey onstage and threw the chunks out to the audience.

Jeff is an architectural / design engineer. He also has "twenty pairs of underwear and that's because I hate to do the laundry and I do it every time my underwear runs out."

Pierre's family was almost killed in a tsunami when he and his family were traveling through Alaska when he was ten. Luckily, the tsunami didn't hit.

Eric Spicer's first erection came upon him during an episode of I Dream of Jeannie.

Billy Reese Peters frontman, Aaron Lay, has a tattoo of the character from the Jettison cover.



It was a Saturday night after a Gator home victory. I think I was about 18 years old at the time. I was lingering around outside the Hardback before the show and there were 3 extremely wasted Gator fans near the door debating on whether or not they should go inside. There had been some stupid fight right when they got there, and you could see a bit of fear in their eyes having realized they had just become strangers in a very strange land. After debating for several minutes, they decided to go in... the dollar drafts and 3 dollar cover being the obvious deciding factor. Because of previous unprovoked incidents with wild men drunk on draft beer and a fresh home field victory, I was a bit worried that these guys might have been there to start trouble and I made sure to keep an eye on them in case they decided to "celebrate" Florida's win on my face. They had been there only several minutes when the band that was about to play had finished tuning but couldn't find the lead singer so they could start the show. If I remember correctly, they just started playing a song, sans singer.

About 30 seconds into the song, a flailing maniac with a shiny bald head and two beers in one hand came tearing through the crowd with the help of two friends, fell into the mic stand and began singing right in sinc with the song that had already begun. The look of fear in the eyes of the Gator fans that was present had now morphed into one of absolute terror. It was obvious that these three men had never seen anything like this before in their life. It only took two more songs before the fear in their eyes changed to complete and utter elation. By the end of the set, they were hoisting the guitarist into the air and buying the entire band rounds of beers. That band was Fay Wray. It wasn't because these guys had never seen a punk rock show before that they reacted the way they did - it was because they had never seen Fay Wray before. If at some point this

weekend, you stop and think to yourself that there is no way in hell you could possibly have more fun that you're having at that exact moment, go see Fay Wray. Trust me. If you're disappointed after the show, I'll buy you a beer, drink it, and pee it onto your shoes.

Fest 6: It's been 7 years (Christ, has it been that long?) since Fay Wray has played a show. How does it feel to come back to Gainesville and play after being away for so long?

Jeff London: I'm hoping to not get my ass kicked. I was pretty drunk and obnoxious when I lived in Gainesville. Believe it or not, I quit drinking and smoking about four years ago...so in truth I am looking forward to experiencing Gainesville in the raw (as an old sober domesticated harmless bald fat guy)...without the insanity that comes from chemical excess. So...in truth, I wish I could tell you how grateful I feel about the prospect of coming home but I worry that I would just sound disingenuous... nevertheless I really do I feel like a kid again...scared, excited, and humbled by the opportunity. I think when I lived in Gainesville (from 89 to 99) and the Hardback was beginning to generate more and more enthusiasm and momentum and Var was just starting to do his thing with No Idea, I took a lot of it for granted. House parties with HWM or Radon playing in somebody's living room or kitchen...Dave stealing beer from Jawbreaker backstage....Green Day hanging out in Jon's living room....all that hysterically funny and embarrassing scenester type of shit...it all seemed very normal to me cause it was all that I/we knew back then...now...it is easier for me to see how important those years were for me and the life that I live now...with my wife and daughter...trying to live an authentic life. After everything is said and done...l am most excited to hang out with some of my friends who still live in Gainesville and see a bunch of some of my favorite bands like This Bike is a Pipe Bomb. Billy Reese Peters, Radon, NR, and Youth Brigade.

I am only bummed that Whiskey & Co. will not be playing the fest...they are pretty much my favorite band right now.

F6: You've never been afraid to write songs about potentially embarrassing personal issues. I've always admired your guts for that. On the other hand, you've also written songs about drinking Natural Light with-Lonnie Anderson, telling Superchunk to kiss your ass, and being mad at your microwave. Lyrically, a lot of bands follow a fairly rigorous "formula", never straying too far from one style of writing. Could you say a bit about being in a band that has allowed you to have complete freedom in that respect and why the things that fired you up enough to write about them did so?

JL: When I am writing with Rob and my other friends, I try not to boss people around...I don't like it when I am micromanaged and I imagine that nobody else likes getting bossed around...the creative process needs to be held in a "safe place" were folks can express their ideas and visions of a song without... fear of some asshole jock mentality being pushed on them...where someone calls someone else a "girl man" for talking about (and intelligently distinguishing between) what sounds/ideas are working and what sounds/ideas are not working...intimidation and the whole tough guy punk rock bullyboy bullshit kills the creative process...I hate to see power struggles within bands...the outcome is always bad...either lousy songs are the result or the band breaks up as the result...when I am with my friends I like to take off the armor that I have to wear in the outside world to survive... l like to relax and be who I really am without fear of being attacked for expressing myself...I ask the same from those I write with in return...no fronts and no personality hype ego driven nonsense...just friends being friends doing what they love and what they are really really good at...writing songs and playing music.

F6: I know you're a married father. However, I've always wondered what motivated you to write a song celebrating bisexuality. Pray tell....

JL: I think that songs (or lyrics rather) write themselves during the improvisation process...I am just the conduit that engages in unconscious babble while I am improvising with a recording or with my friends that are playing with me in practice....I usually record myself and the accompanying music as I improvise and listen for (decipher) the actual words later....when I am improvising with my voice and a microphone and with a PA system... I have no idea what is coming out of my mouth at the moment...I have to sit down with the recording later and figure out the words that were coming out of my mouth... after that...I have to figure out the larger meaning of the lyrics and the song as a whole...so sounds come first, words come second, and meaning comes third...in other words, the song drives the idea of the song...I never start with an idea and then try to write the song with Rob and the rest of my friends...some of our best songs were written very quickly and

arrangements were always the last priority...as far as the bisexuality thing goes...for the most part (and I apologize to everyone for saying this) I think dudes are nasty looking....and women are these amazing perfect forms of art and beauty....I love the things women say, I love how they think, and I love the way they communicate through nonverbal forms...I hate to say it, but I am pretty much a boring heterosexual breeder...but that is not what that song was about...it was (for me) about trying to make a stand (albeit a small stand) against the fundamentalist religious right...I had enough of the hate mongering that was/is going on against people who choose to do what they want with their privacy and freedom...intolerant and ignorant people make me wretch, they hate freedom and they hate our constitution and the protections that it insures for us all....these fundamentalist authoritative lunatic fringe megalomaniacs divide an conquer...the only way we can stop them is by advocating for those who are targeted by their campaigns of hate and misinformation...the fundamentalists of the religious right are defined by their black and white rigidities...what these people can't dominate...they try to destroy...what they can't destroy...they try to exclude...so I got sick of it all and I started to say, "Hey, you want to destroy? Destroy me. You want to hate? Hate me." These lunatic right wingers have embraced fascism and I eventually became sick with my own apathy...that is when I began to fight back in a lot of different ways (not just through music and art)....l am not going to have my daughter grow up ir a neo-fascist America. I am a very tolerant person, but I am not going to tolerate that bullshit, not anymore. Sorry for getting up on my soapbox, but the past 7 years has been unbearable in this county. If we want to change things for the better, we are the ones that have to bring that change into reality. Sorry...I should not have used this interview as a venue to rant about the ill winds of today's politics.

F6: Over the years, Gainesville has gotten a lot of attention due to the worldwide popularity of a hand full of great bands. There have been countless amazing Gainesville bands that, despite having a record out here and there, generally fly under the radar...like Fay Wray. Could you say a bit about all the great bands from here that sort of rose and fell without making much of splash outside of north central Florida?

JL: Well let me put it this way....there were a couple of bands that were just there (i.e., Hardback/ Gainesville) before their time...Don's Ex-Girlfriend, Panthro UK United 13, Highyway 66, The Jeffersons Grain, Vanbuilderass, Sissy, Ash County Sluggers, Wordsworth, and I'm sure a bunch of other bands that I forgot about...I miss those days and those times....we were all really broke in those days, but we were free to create back then...but then again I don't ever want to go back to those times...it would kill me if I went back...

You know when you were a little kid fukkin around on the swings in the local playground, and you saw those bad kids walking through the park: long hair, jean jackets, crazy black shirts with skulls on them, and you got hit with that mix of fear and awe? Your parents warned you "don't you ever...", but it was always there in the back of your mind. Then you got older and you discovered metal, and you realized exactly what bands those mysterious people from your youth were blaring from their car stereos, and which shirts they were sporting and you were completely stoked... but then you started to realize that while the music was cool and the fuck-all attitude was right on, something just wasn't right; something about metal just kept you at bay... the end of that feeling comes with Municipal Waste. They have everything you want in a metal band: ripping solos, songs about toxic holocaust, denim and hair; but everything you want in a punk band: tongue in cheek sense of humor, DIY spirit and a supreme need to have a good time. Whether it's beer bonging off the drum riser, or moshing with a dude in a shark suit, or hugging the lead singer while he makes fun of your stage dive, Municipal Waste might be the best time you have this weekend.

Fest 6: So why is it that it took you guys so long to make down to the Fest...what the fuck?

Municipal Waste: Well, we have always wanted to play. We were asked to play the past three years in a row, but we already had tours booked or recording obligations during the time. Touring is our life, and we always plan shit way in advance, so we kind of screwed that one up. That was our bad. Sorry. We know we have to make it up to everyone, so were bringing the big guns to this one!

F6: You know something about fests... you guys are pretty closely associated with Best Friends Day. What do you expect from the fest down here in Florida? If there was a "Fest Off", do you think Richmond could hold its own against Gainesville?

MW: That's a funny question. I think Richmond and Gainesville have a lot in common - both are small college towns with large music scenes full of raging/creative people. As far as a "Fest Off", I don't really know. I don't really consider Best Friends Day a fest. I mean, there are a ton of bands, but it doesn't really revolve around that. It's more about exploring Richmond with your buds. I think the Gainesville fest is great because of the huge variety of bands. There is basically something for everybody, and I'm really looking forward to being a part of it. Oh, but you do lose points for calling it "The Fest." That's pretty much the most unoriginal name I've ever heard... BURN!

F6: One of my favorite things about Municipal Waste is the aura of community that you guys put out there, in regards to always making it a point to play with the same bands (Caustic Christ, Annihilation Time, Baroness, etc...) and going back to the same scenes. I remember a few years ago you were talking about creating this new underground... do you think you have made a dent towards that?

MW: You forgot Assholeparade! Haha! We definitely have our own community, but it's basically our way to keep in touch with our friends. We may go on long ass tours with "big" bands every once in a while, but it would be a huge bummer if that was all we did. We want to play with bands we love all the time. When we can do that, it's

really rewarding. We have had to make a lot of sacrifices in the past couple of years, but it's finally starting to pay off. Now we are at a point where we can play the shows we want to play and bring bands we dig out on tour and actually do it successfully. Within the next year we have a lot of interesting plans. I think things are going to get really good.

F6: You guys have been active for quite some time now, and you started very much apart of the DIY punk scene. Now that you are reaching so many more people, do you see a big difference in the crowds and vibes at shows?

MW: I think the crowd changes when any band gets more known, but the vibe is definitely still the same.

Occasionally, we will get a few metalheads and hardcore kids that don't mix well, but that usually gets squashed immediately when someone moshes them both while wearing a shark suit.

F6: What exactly does the Waste taste like? **MW:** Do you realize how gay that question made you sound? (Not that there's anything wrong with that!)

F6: In 1987 Anthrax's "Among the Living" and Cryptic Slaughter's "Money Talks" both came out. Which is more crucial?

MW: That's like making a parent pick which one of their kids they like most! That's a tough one. I'd go with "Among the Living". I think that album has better songs overall.

F6: So, y'all live in Richmond, which is a pretty well know and visited city. What should people know outside of Avail, Robert E. Lee, Philip Morris, the James River and Best Friends Day?

MW: There is a place there called Mojo's... it is the greatest place on earth. I think angels sprinkled bits of heaven on their cheesesteak subs.

F6: Are you looking forward to seeing anyone or anything at the Fest?

MW: This year I finally get to see Dillinger Freaking Four! They're one of my favorite bands that I have yet to see.



BALLS DEEP IN THE HOOPLA

I had to take pause vesterday when I was listening to the latest Dillinger Four, Situationist Comedy. To me, it's a new record. I got it when it came out. It was released in 2002. To a seventeen-yearold at Fest VI, that fuckin' record came out when they were twelve and they were "keeping the faith real" with Creed. How did that happen? Will our Midwestern pop mafia brethren ever release another album—or even a 7"—or will they drumroll directly into the festival circuit evermore? (According to the Guns'n'Roses release clock, they've got nine more years before we can righteously make an issue of the matter, but still.) Midwestern life's always been a little more complexicated than just "being a band" for D4. They speak a mysterious tongue and it helps to use a secret decoder ring to decipher the oftrepeated lines of "We're writing new songs," "It'll be out later this year," "Let's do a split together," and "The new record is called Civil War." They've been together since 1994, are one of the best bands on the planet, and whenever the next record comes out, you'll remember it more than the wait.

Let's take a peek at the members of this "delicate but bulletproof" band.

THE ONLY GOOD BOSS IS ONE THAT'S DEAD

Erik Funk, the higher-pitched singer and guitarist who's perpetually raccoon-eyed, has turned a "fledgling business proposition" into a "stalwart punk institution" by successfully being a co-owner (with his wife Gretchen) of the Triple Rock Social Club. oHoHoNot fucking up, paying bills, and not going out of business has kept Sr. Funk rightly occupied. DIY punk's a sham if you don't put in the hours. His parents used to write Erik's name in his underwear when he went to camp. They no longer do. Erik rocked Sebastian Bach-length hair when he was in Billingsgate.

THIS VOICE, THESE HANDS DON'T FEEL LIKE THEY'RE REALLY ME

Paddy Costello. The last time I saw Paddy play in Bloodbath and Beyond, he looked an awful lot like Floyd and was so wasted there was no chord on his bass. He was rulin' it. But before that, he was laying down in the Sidebar's outdoor patio, using a cinder block as a pillow in the mid-afternoon. Aaron Lay, who Paddy'd fallen asleep beside the night before, sharing whiskey and good feelings, decided his friend would appreciate a little tea bag to wake him up. One doesn't usually equate lightning-quick reflexes with a sleeping log. Paddy's choke-hold was later forgiven... he just wasn't awake when the dukes were raised. Paddy's always leaving behind his wallet and cell phone, so if you see either on the ground, please hand them back to him.

DOUBLEWHISKEYCOKENOICE

In the same fields as Naked Raygun's John Haggerty, Billy Morrisette is both a bartender and a guitarist. He does this thing called "working consistently." He's been a calendar pin-up, periodically scores highly on Golden Tee, makes most people's version of "power drinking" laughable, and doesn't count a beer properly shot-gunned if any of it spills or remains in the can. His inner-Lemmy Kilmister has bushy sideburns, but the mustache needs firmer glue. Here are his comic book recommendations: Marvels and Ultimate Spider-Man. "You need them," he says. Billy's been in the process of selling his house, and that's always a time suck.

A NEW DISCUSSION OF AN AGE-OLD QUESTION

Drummer Lane "Monkey Hustle" Pederson has had a busy couple of years. Getting fully Ph.D.'d in psychology was only the start. He started his own practice, got married to a great lady, Courtney, and had a kid. Knowing that child raising is a couple steps up from hanging out with a pet Labrador, Lane decided that it'd be a better game plan to stay home when the kid started its development, rather than go on tour. Lane has a deep affection for the band Boston, and has a member of that band's number on direct dial on his cell phone.

You know how when you are really into music, people constantly ask you, "So, what's new? Is there a new band out there I should check out?" I always end up racking my brain trying to think of the last new thing I listened to that no one would have heard of yet, and it always seems to underwhelm people... "Oh, they suck", or "I'm not into that kinda stuff"...it can be so defeating. I do remember quite some time ago getting a 7" in the mail from a new band that I didn't recognize, and not thinking much of it. A few days later I heard someone listening to it and it piqued my curiosity... when I looked at what it was, I thought, "Oh, it's that one band... that's cool." A few months later, Var had convinced them to come down to Gainesville to play a show and kinda hang. One of the things that struck me when they were first here was that link between the anonymous 7" sent into a distro, to four guys anxiously waiting to play those four songs for you. After that first night, I went back to work, grabbed that 7", and listened to it a few times in a row. Turns out that they had a night off the next night, and they played again in town... that was all I needed to know: I had found a band that was to be that "Hey, you should really check these guys out." Over the next six or seven years, they made some great music and forged some solid connections. I'm really excited to get to share that moment with them again, as it kinda feels like the first time all over.

Fest 6: So. You just did a string of shows up in the Midwest. How did it go? Was it what you expected? Can you talk a little about the reason you did the shows (the benefit for your friends' illness) and how successful were those shows?

Matt Sweeting: Jim is a close friend of ours who was diagnosed with Leukemia earlier this year. Ben, Trav's brother (William) and Jim were all in the same grade and grew up together. He's an amazing guy and has had the most inspiring attitude about the whole thing. It also became obvious that the expenses that go along with the treatment are out of this world, so we figured that we could help out in our own, small way.

The shows were insane. I don't think we really knew what to expect, but the response was awesome. It was fun seeing old friends. We all came out of those shows feeling really good about how well everything went. It was ridiculous how sore and tired everyone was after those shows though. Most of us were sick for the week after that, it was a shock to the system to put that much rock down at once. We played 17 songs per set (two shows in Chicago) plus our other bands played too. I think I ended up playing something like 37 songs in Chicago.

F6: After having a fairly sizable break from the band and the music, how did it hold up when you started approaching it again? Did the songs seem different at all? How have they aged for you?

MS: Yeah, it was wild going back to the songs again. I hadn't listened to that stuff in probably six or seven years. Even when we were still together, I wasn't listening to any of the old stuff. It's definitely like cracking an old yearbook. Each song has it's own little story. For me, the guitars came back really naturally, but the vocals were the tricky part...just trying to yell for that long and remember all of the lyrics. Luckily the crowd was able to help out with that part.

F6: We are all so excited that ya'll are coming down to the Fest. As I figure that you owe us after Fest 2...So knowing that this will be your first one, do you have any expectations? Is there anyone or anything you are looking forward to? By the way, you know Small Brown Bike is actually one of the reasons that Stressface has attained such legendary status. Not sure if you know this but we actually played as Small Brown Bike that year you didn't make it...much to the delight of the crowd.

MS: Ha! Nope, I didn't hear about that one. I can definitely say that everyone is excited to come back to Gainesville. We've had a lot of good times there. It always felt like our second home.

F6: One of the things I always loved about Small Brown Bike was the idea of family that you guys always had... literally and figuratively...you always struck me as loyar people too, the people that were closest to you - always working with the same bands, recordings, friends etc. During this period of getting things back together, are those feelings all coming back? How have things changed outside the music? Do you view the band and that time of your life differently now that you have been able to step away from it?

MS: Thanks man, that's nice of you to say. Yeah, I definitely got that feeling again as soon as we all were in the same room, playing the old songs. It's also been cool playing now because there is way less pressure. Just playing music, hanging out with your best friends. It's funny because we always looked at playing music as an extension of our friendships. First it was building forts, then it was skateboarding, and eventually it became music.

F6: Looking back on the band, is there anything you would have changed? Outside of the countless times the your van blew up...

MS: Ha, nope. Wouldn't change a thing. I hate regret.

Seaweed's playing the Fest??!! When that news hit, most everyone in Gainesville over age 26 got up from their computer at work and ran outside to text their buddies from High School. When Seaweed was at their peak in the late 90's, hardly any of us believed we'd be working anywhere, let alone spending hours a day crippling our thumbs on the tiniest of telephone keyboards.

Seaweed managed to exist in the Northwest USA in a time where most music that made it out of there was over-distorted sludge, or Pearl Jam imitations. I've actually strengthened more than one friendship in the past month based on realizing we were at the same concert and were blown away by this opening band named Seaweed. Pogo dance tempo music with clear, smooth vocals carried them through six albums and straight into the partheon of alternative music.

It's now 2007. Seaweed is playing again, and I couldn't be happier. There was a time when these guys came to town frequently. They have described Gainesville as their home away from home, and we're pretty far from Tacoma, Washington.

FEST 6: How many times have you played here previously? Was the last time at the Covered Dish on the tour with Fitz of Depression, with then local act Hot Water Music? Why did Fitz have to cancel that show?

Aaron Stauffer: Fitz had broken up while on tour with us due to personal issues - I think they have worked it all out as they are a band again. I think we have played Gainesville 8 or 10 times. I really have lost count. I know we have played there with Radon once and we used to sleep on Var's floor and eat Little Debbie snacks.

F6: Did Var's Chihuahuas terrorize you in your sleep?
AS: Never. I have a Chihuahua/mini austie shepard mix
- Leo. He is a killer of rodents and bunnies. He caught
a bunny and I ate it. FREEGAN. It's not like I trained
him to do it, but it was dead when he laid it on my feet
(I was watering the garden), so I figured waste not want
not - it was a really good five bites. 100 mile diet yo!

F6: What do you think may have changed about Gainesville since then, and what do you expect to be the same?

AS: I can't even imagine. I like the new Iron and Wine album, and that dude seems to have a longer beard than the last record... I don't know if he even lived in Gainesville in 1995 or had a beard then.

F6: I don't think Sam from Iron and Wine ever lived in Gainesville, but it's hard to say with all those beards during that time.

AS: That's just it. I get all these beard guys and Florida college towns mixed up. Back in the day it was rare to know a beard punk, Dan from Lungfish or Bruce Pavitt from Sub Pop. Fuck, now beards are everywhere. I guess it's good for the planet, less plastic razors.

F6: I heard a rumor that Sub Pop bands of that era had a credit card with an account that Sub Pop set up for touring bands. Is that true? And if so, how many cards

were maxed out with cash advances to buy drugs? **AS:** No, we had no credit card from Sub Pop. They used to let us borrow a van. I have a black "X" on my hand.

F6: What are you looking forward most to playing Fest 6? Any bands you've been wanting to see? **AS:** I'm hoping to see Naked Raygun and The Draft.

F6: What's your day like in 2007?

AS: I get up really early (6 am) and light the fire, drink espresso, listen to the news... pack lunches for me. my daughter and wife and eat breakfast, drive an hour on a country road (often see wild turkeys and boars, etc.) to make it to my 8:30 am class. I also help coach my daughter's soccer team and study. My daughter's soccer team is so rad - they are the 6 and unders, and it is total chaos We had a game today and we are totally the Bad News Bears of soccer. A lot of coaching lil' ones soccer is a reminder of which way we are kicking the ball. Sometimes I skate or surf. I listen to records. I sometimes play with my band here called THE BLUE DOT, I go to bed early and read Thomas Pynchon or my text books, I'm straight edge, and I'm still with the same woman who all the songs from "Weak" forward are about. I'm picking a lot of tomatoes out of the garden right now, so I have that going for me, which is nice. I'm forever working on our house, trying to make it more house and less shack. Once I saw a huge mountain lion just down the road from my house, on the pavement - the thing was fucking huge, like something you only see in a zoo. It took me a week to be able to walk outside at night without some fear.

Did you know that the young wild pigs move in a pack like a school of fish? It 's true - and it looks super crazy.

F6: There have been hints of new recording plans/being a more active band. Please clarify.

AS: We are going to make an album! We have a lot of new songs and they are very good (I think).
