

D Mossy Creek
April 1st, 1864

Dear sister once more I take my pen in hand to write a few lines to you in answer to one that I received the other day it was with fathers and written some time ago. I were verry glad to hear from you and to hear that you was well. I am well and harty as ever we have had some verry uneaven weather for a week or too some snow and (end of page) rain it snowed at one time about six inches and it has bin cold more or less ever since it rained last nite the most of the time.

The twenty seventh Michigan has gon to Kentucky and I have not seen Ebonezer Fuller as yet and do not espect to ever see him as long as we stay in the army for he has gon down on the Potomac. Wall Julia it has bin twenty months the twenty ninth of march since I enlisted. My time is over half and wall Julia I must close and you must excuse my short letter for this time write often and all the news this from a brother in the army
