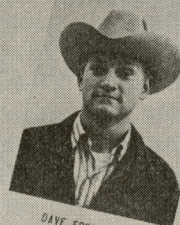

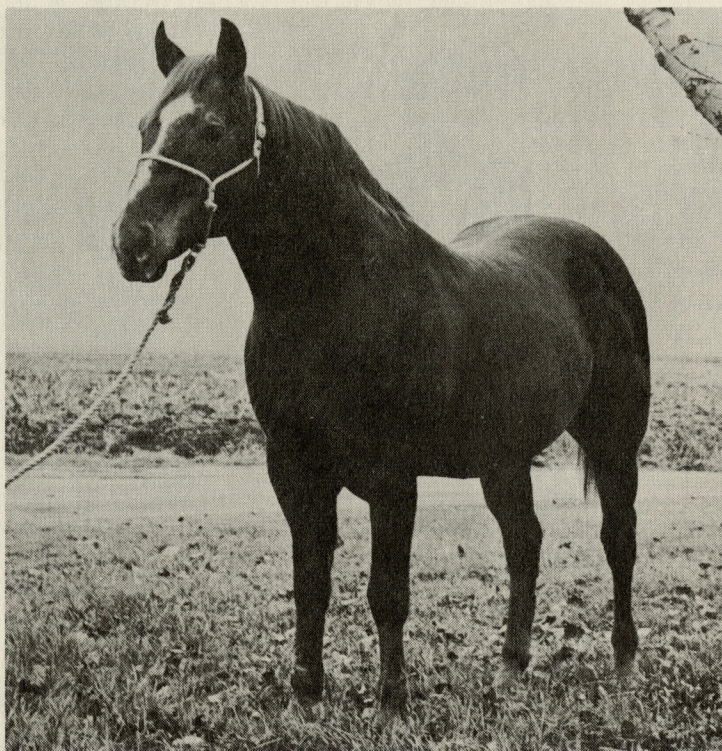

# DESCRIPTION OF EVENTS

## SADDLE BRONC RIDING

Riding rein and hand must be on the same side. To qualify, rider must have spurs over the break of the shoulders and touching the horse when front feet hit the ground first jump out of the chute. Rider disqualified for: being bucked off; changing hands on rein; losing stirrup; or touching the animal, saddle, or rein with his free hand.

## BAREBACK RIDING

One hand rigging to be used. To qualify rider must have spurs over the break of the shoulders when horse's front feet touch the ground, first jump out of the chute. Horses will be ridden for eight seconds. Rider cannot touch horse with free hand.

## CALF ROPING

If cowboy intends to use two loops, two ropes must be carried. Cowboy must dismount, go down rope, throw calf by hand and tie any three feet. If calf is down when the roper reaches it he must allow calf to get up and then throw calf. If roper's hand is on the calf when calf falls, calf is considered thrown by hand. Tie must hold for six seconds after roper calls time.

## BULL RIDING

Riding to be done with one hand and loose rope, with or without hand hold. Rope must have a bell. Bull will be ridden eight seconds. Rider will be disqualified for being bucked off or touching animal with free hand.

## TEAM ROPING

In dally roping, ropes are loose from the saddle horns, and after making the catch, the ropers must take a wrap around the horn. Time is taken when both ropes are tight and both horses are facing the steer. There are strict rules defining a fair head catch. The rope must be around the horns, the neck, or one horn and the neck. There is a five second fine for catching only one hind foot and five second fine for header picking up one front foot with legal head catch.

## BULL DOGGING

Steer must be caught from horse. If steer gets loose dogger may take no more than one step to catch him. Steer will be considered down only when it is lying flat on its side, all four feet and head straight. If dogger misses steer, flagger must ask dogger if he wishes another jump.

## RIBBON ROPING

Two loops will be permitted. A timed event. Time starting when calf leaves barrier and time ends when the roper has got the ribbon off the tail of the calf and run back over barrier line.

## GIRLS CALF TYING

Calf must be caught and tied securely until passed by the judge. This is a timed event.

## GIRLS BARREL RACE

Rider must follow clover leaf pattern around barrels without touching them or knocking them over. This is a timed event.

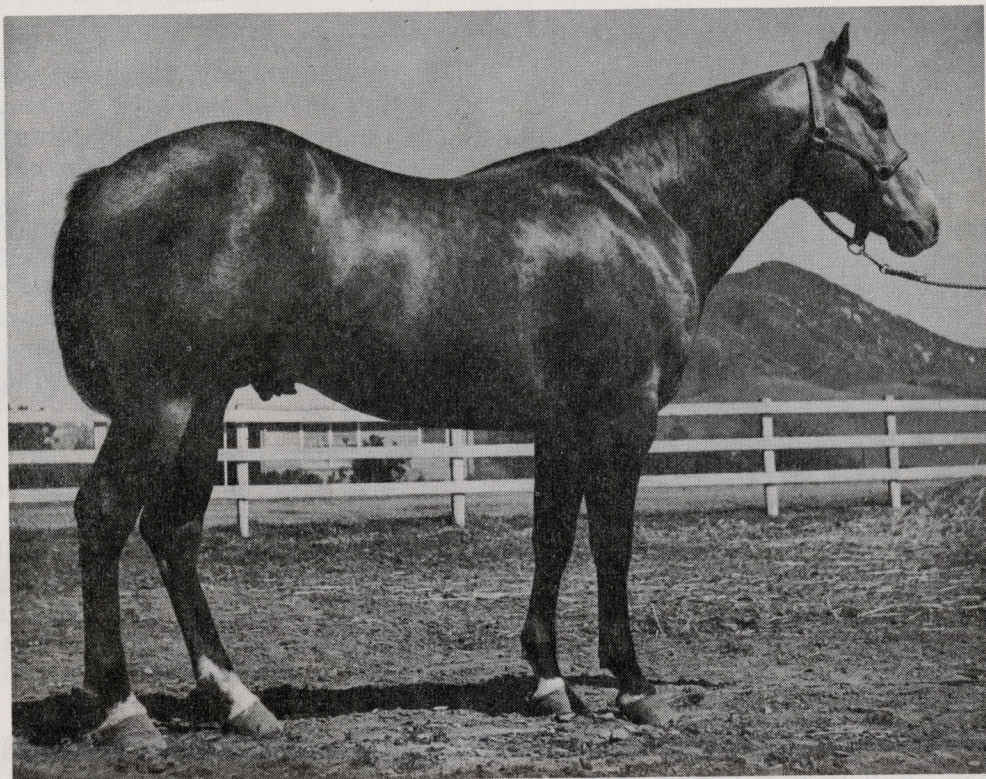

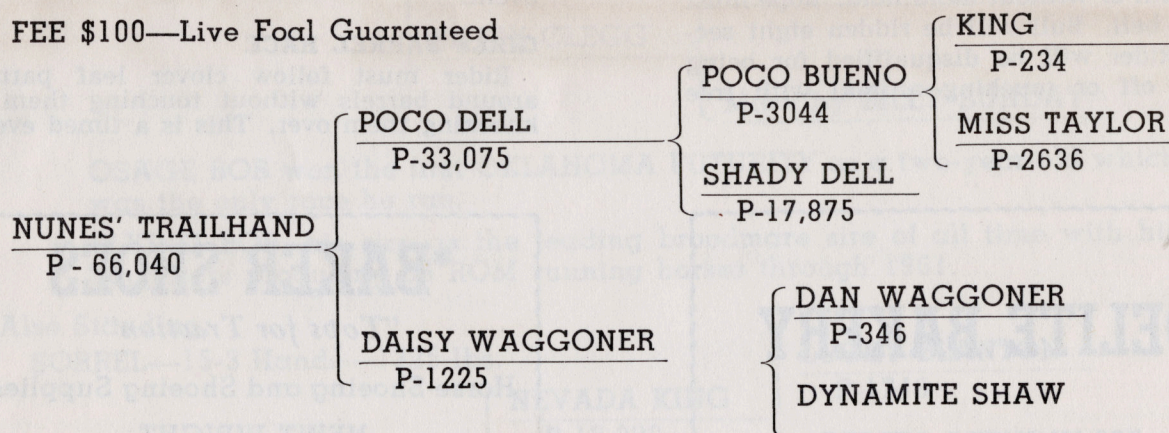
