His next was one of the greatest battles ever staged in an Olympic ring against Carlos Chavez. Vivid memories will long linger in the minds of those who saw that second round in a battle that was won by Chavez. Only a few points was the difference of opinion in that scrap, and many fans present that night went home thinking that the boy from Mon-

terrey, Mexico had been robbed of the decision. Fans are still hollering for the retake.

Dade, former boss of the bantamweight division, is fast as lightning, and rates as a very dangerous foe for the Latin from old Mexico. Dade already holds a win over the Mexican scored in Sacramento. Those that witnessed the first battle between the pair said it was close all the way. Now that Salas has improved look for an even closer battle next Tuesday. Dade holds a pair of wins over Charlie Reiley, a lad that boasts of a win over new featherweight champ, Sandy Sandler.

Bernardo Ramirez, rugged Mexican featherweight, will shoot for his fourth victory over Mario Trigo when he tackles the switch-hitter in the main event at Ocean Park Arena, Monday night.

The "David" of the Municipal league and "Goliath" of the CYO circuit meet Sunday afternoon at Jordan High School. Kickoff is 2:00 p. m. Playing the role of David in the football picture are the rejuvenated Compton gridders, while Goliath will be represented by Moctezuma Indians.

As in the biblical story David rose up to unprecedented heights by knocking over Goliath, just like the Compton pigskinners have done in subjugating the St. Pedro JV's and tying the Shamrocks. Moctezuma or rather Goliath, finished an abbreviated CYO campaign winning three without any setbacks.

This scribe doesn't want to set history back thousands of decades, but it seems to me that this Sunday's big game will find Compton acting the part of Goliath and Moctezuma the role of David.

COMPTON PICKED

Due to the fact that Compton has acquired the services of Ma-

nuel Gonzales and line star George Pruder, both ex-members of the Omar Raiders, the Comptonites football stock has ascended. The result is that Messers Gonzales the key combination the squad lacked, therefore installing them as early favorites for Sundays tilt.

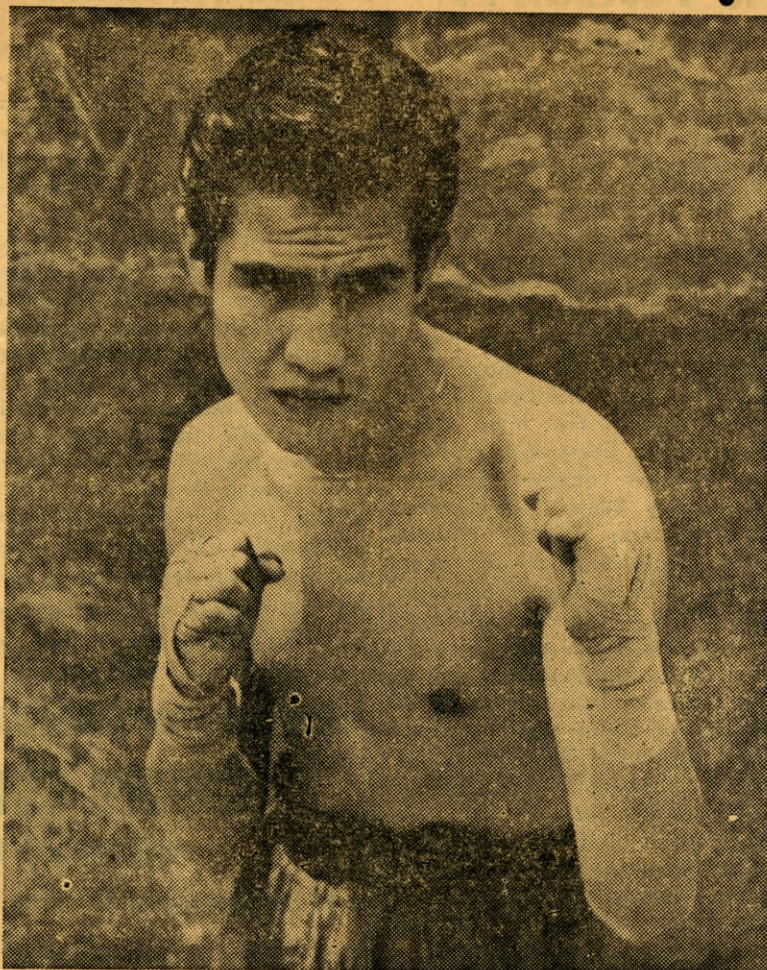

It was played at Jackson High School with the six point favored Saints playing true to form as they nabbed a 12-6 decision. The game was fought on still more even terms than the score indicates what with the victors accounting for only six first downs as compared with eighteen for the losers. The only disappointment of the hair-raising battle was the fact that the highly publicized fight for All Latin center honors between big Bill Cota of the Saints and last year's selection Eddie Villa failed to materialize due to an early injury sustained by Cota in the first period that handicapped the ex-Roosevelt High All City star. Villa performed sensationally at the thought of the importance of the game as well as of individual performances.

As was expected "the big Chief" Ben Chore was nothing shy of spectacular. A serious candidate for 1948 All Latin quarterback honors, Chore passed, kicked, and ran exceptionally well for the Green and White. Manuel Ocampo added tremendous stock to his chances for All Latin right half laurels. Toting the pigskin on virtually every other running play for La Purisima, Ocampo was one of the offensive stars of the fracas. George "Snake" Castruita, was a menace to the Saint's backfield all afternoon and undoubtedly his exhibition will gain candidacy to the All Latin. Mike Kicilinsky, one of those watch charm guards, was probably the outstanding La Purisima lineman of the day. Other noteworthy performances were turned in by Mike Blanco, Tommy Marquez, "Nachito" Ocampo, Mike Garcia, Kato Mendoza, "Mousie" Petralia, Dick Dominguez, and Nick Sadd.

For the Championship Lourdes, Bobby Lopez iced the nomination for All Latin halfback laurels by going wild in the ground gaining department. Eddie Serra, his running mate played his best game of the year. Masropion turned in the most brilliant lineman performances this writer has seen all season. Louie Reynosa was also superb. It is the consensus of opinion of the Association manager that McDougal is the backbone of Municipal Football. Almost single handed he has knitted the Association to what it now is....
