I know you will agree with me that the citizen can perform no more important function than participating in the selection of the Candidate whom the Democrats will offer as the next President of the United States.


The 84th Congress has just adjourned. We have accomplished much for the working man, the farmer, the small businessman and for the health and welfare of millions of our people.
