THE MAIN SCHOOL BUILDING—Laboratories for general chemistry, soils, physics. Freehand and mechanical drawing. Surveying instruments and equipment.

HOUSEHOLD ARTS BUILDING—Fully equipped for teaching cooking, sewing, dressmaking and millinery. Botanical laboratory has quarters in this building.

CREAMERY—A complete plant manufacturing butter daily. Refrigeration machinery and cold storage rooms.

GREENHOUSES AND WORK ROOMS—Propagation of plants, trees and shrubs from seeds and cuttings.

CARPENTER SHOP—Bench work and wood working machinery.

MACHINE SHOP—Lathes, drill presses, shapers, milling machine, heavy planer, and small equipment.

FORGE SHOP—A shop completely equipped for practical blacksmithing.
Pieces of student work will be found on exhibition in all of the shops.

ELECTRIC POWER PLANT—A completely equipped plant, supplying shop and school buildings with power, heat and light. Steam engines, gas engines, dynamos, motors, a variety of electric lamps, and testing apparatus. Special electrical exhibit during the afternoon.

DAIRY BARN—Fitted for the production of sanitary milk. Silo in connection.

PURE BRED LIVE STOCK—Percheron and Clydesdale horses. Shorthorn and Jersey cattle at the dairy barn. Take a walk up "Pork Alley" to see some fine Berkshires and Poland Chinas.
