County pay their fair share of state taxes and they have a right to expect a fair return for their tax dollars."

Mrs. Tolmach said that the issue of a four year college for Ventura County is a perfect example of one of the unmet needs of the County. "Ventura County is now one of the most populous counties in the state. Yet, our young people, if they wish to continue their education must either commute to Lom Angeles or Santa Barbara or make arrangements to live away from home while they are in school. This adds an intolerable amount of expense to a college education, especially for low and middle income people." Mrs. Tolmach praised the efforts of State Senator Omer Rains on this issue, and pledged to join with him in working to make a four year college a reality in Ventura County.

At the level of state government, Mrs. Tolmach believes that the most urgent is in the area of tax reform.

problem which California faces in the legislature and the result of the first time in majority in the legislature and the Governor have begun, for the first time in fifty years, to bring some degree of equity and justice into the tax laws of California. to make certain that we do not allow a shift back to local property taxes which tend to be regressive and discriminate against people of modest means and those on fixed incomes."

"My past experience in local government and in civic affairs has taught me taught me that one cannot effectively represent people unless one is willing to commit one's life to hard work and serious study of the issues and problems. My time, my energy, and my loyalties will not be divided between my duties as a legislator and my concerns for my own business affairs."
