1. GE: Adding Title V American Institutions as a category

- Mozingo would like the GE and Curriculum Committee to explore the option of including 3 of the 6 unites for Title V into GE category D. Pettit will investigate other CSU procedures. Frisch will draft a proposal for Spring.

2. Course Substitutions

- The committee is asked by the Advising Center to review course substitutions for the multicultural and language requirements for GE certified students.
- Grier commented on the disconnect between the multicultural requirement and GE category C3b. In the Spring GE and Curriculum will explore a common policy and guidelines. The committee will ask the faculty that worked on the GE category to speak with the committees.
- The committee will be sending Advising a Memo regarding the needs of the faculty on the Course Substitution Form.

3. Policy on online courses

- Executive has asked the committee to explore the need of policy for online courses. Pettit will investigate policies at other CSU's.
- The committee will call a Faculty Brown Bag and ask Carol Holder to co-facilitate

4. Credit/No Credit policy for courses

- 2004-2005 Catalog will distinguish which course are available for C/NC and are only grade C/NC

5. How should Labs be presented in the Schedule of Classes?

- Not a curricular matter, needs to be discussed with chairs of programs affected and scheduler.

7. Other Items

- Changes to Academic Master Plan
