**PRESS CREDENTIALS:** Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. "Visiting" media may make their requests through their respective "home" SIDs. When time permits, credentials will be mailed.

**PHOTO CREDENTIALS:** Will be issued on a per game basis only and must be worn in plain sight at all times. NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the field and the team areas.

**PARKING:** At press time, parking regulations for the Titan Sports Complex still were being formulated. These regulations will be enforced 24 hours EVERY day.

**PRESS BOX:** Located on the west side of Titan Stadium. All facilities on the second floor, accessible by stairs at either end or elevator at the north end only.

**FAX/TELECOPIER:** One Panafax UF-270 will be available in the press box on a first-come, first-served basis.

## **BROADCAST SPACE:**

**RADIO** -- One booth with two complimentary telephone lines (modular jack, touch tone) will be provided the designated commercial station of each opponent visiting new Titan Stadium. The booth is air conditioned (windows do not open) and seats four comfortably across the front.

**TELEVISION** -- One booth with one complimentary telephone line (modular jack, touch tone) will be provided. The booth is air conditioned (windows do not open) and seats five comfortably across the front.

**TELEPHONES:** Two business lines (modular jack, touch tone) will be available on the lower press level on a first-come, first-served basis. A third but usually busy Sports Information Department line-- (714) 773-3970 -- also is available on the upper level of the main press section. Additional phones must be ordered through Pacific Bell by calling 811-3204 from California area codes or (818) 576-3204 out of state.

**INTERVIEW ROOMS:** Do not exist at the Stadium site, nor do locker rooms and shower facilities. Teams must walk approximately 200 yards to the south to the main gymnasium locker room and shower facilities.

**SCOUTS:** Professional scouts will be provided seats in the press box on a space available basis.

# The University

California State University, Fullerton is a large, comprehensive institution in which learning is preeminent. A caring university, it is dedicated to fostering the development of humane leaders prepared to meet the opportunities and challenges of a changing, diverse world.

With an enrollment of approximately 25,000 students, the university maintains its tradition of excellence in liberal arts programs both as ends in themselves and as foundations for equally excellent professional programs.

The main campus is located in Fullerton and has been in operation since 1960, a year after the university's opening. A satellite campus offering upper-division and graduate courses has opened in Mission Viejo since 1989.

Students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and nations. Most students commute daily to and from classes, although nearly 400 now live on campus in residence halls opened in 1988.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 700-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university is fully accredited and enjoys national recognition for both its array of traditional academic programs and a wide list of independently accredited professional programs, including art, athletics training, business, chemistry, communications, computer science, dance, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told, there are 88 degree programs -- 41 of them at the graduate level -- plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Complementing the regular instruction program is the extended education program, which provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of admission to the university.

Another of the university's features is the cultural events program. Besides student productions, it includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students, but also open to community members, is another highlight, as is a growing network of support groups, including the Alumni Association, which represents the university's 95,000 graduates, and the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Further examples of community outreach are the Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience support group.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the opening of a Marriott hotel on campus in 1989, the university and the city of Fullerton opened the Titan Sports Complex in 1992. A 10,000-seat multipurpose stadium, an adjoining baseball stadium and a separate track facility are newly completed features of the complex.

Other partnerships include one with the Orange County NewsChannel that has enhanced the university's ability to provide televised instruction to businesses, schools and government and another with the Pacific Symphony Orchestra that has paved the way for the formation of a new orchestral institute for talented young musicians.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and the expansion of community services, the university conducts a variety of fund-raising activities. The purpose of these activities is to generate the necessary non-state support to make a very good university one of the nation's most successful.




## Administration

### Dr. Milton A. Gordon, President

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on Aug. 6, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for four years, as dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for six years.

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as a mathematician at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences.



He is the California state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and serves on the governing boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, California Coalition for Mathematics, Orange County Chamber of Commerce, Orange County Community Foundation, United Way of Orange County, YMCA of Orange County and Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, he is on the advisory boards of Pioneer Bank, St. Jude Medical Center and The California State University's Institute for Teaching and Learning.

The President has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of Louisiana.

# Athletics Department



## Bill Shumard, Director of Athletics

Bill Shumard begins his second year as Director of Athletics at Cal State Fullerton after a most eventful inaugural year.

Shumard, 41, assumed his post on Aug. 1, 1991, soon after the start of a two-year, \$6 million capital campaign to put the finishing touches on a \$14 million Sports Complex. He immediately had to replace two of his associate athletic directors while working under drastic budget constrictions handed down by the state and State University system.

While instituting a new 10-year gender equity plan for CSUF athletics and helping prepare an accelerated marketing plan to showcase the new football/soccer, baseball and track facilities, he was also busy hiring several new head coaches. Brad Holland was appointed men's basketball coach in April and Deborah Ayres (women's basketball) and Mary Ellen Murchison (women's volleyball) were hired in June.

"The challenge before us is immense as we seek to set realistic goals and parameters for our program," said Shumard. "But despite the obstacles, CSUF never has been in a better position to realize its true athletic potential as we enter this new era and move into our new facilities."

Shumard called his Fullerton appointment the achievement of a "lifelong personal goal. Because of where we live (Brea), and having children in the process of growing up, this is where I set my sights. I'm a graduate of the Cal State system (Long Beach State, 1972) and my desire was to get back to this level.

"An athletic department run with ethical and financial responsibility can mirror a successful university. It can bring people to the university in a myriad of ways. There are 80,000 Cal State Fullerton graduates living in the Los Angeles area. We've got the opportunity to use our program to bring them back to campus. If we have a program that is competitive and makes an honest effort at moving athletes toward graduation, I think that's a lot to stand up and cheer about."

Shumard came to Fullerton after three years as an assistant athletic director at USC, where he was part of a five-person team that raised \$7 million per year. His projects included supervising 12 regional Trojan Club support groups and staging a dinner in the Los Angeles Coliseum for 3,000 persons to highlight the university's athletic centennial celebration.

Shumard's 13-year career with the Los Angeles Dodgers began in 1975 as an assistant in public relations and publicity. He became Director of the Speakers Bureau in 1977 and was appointed Director of Community Services in 1981. The title was enlarged in 1983 to include Special Events as he supervised a staff of 15 employees responsible for game and community promotions and all publications as well as coordinating the activities of the Dodger Alumni Association.

His first athletics position was as Sports Information Director at his alma mater in 1972 and 1973. He spent the next two years at Cal State Los Angeles where he was an assistant professor in journalism and physical education, was advisor to the campus pep groups and served as manager of the Athletic News Bureau.

Shumard's athletic career terminated as a freshman quarterback at Compton Junior College, where he obtained his Associate Arts degree in 1970. Bill and his wife, Kim, live in Brea. He has three sons -- David, 21; Matt, 17; and Mike, 14.

# Titan Stadium

Cal State Fullerton football makes its long awaited move into a permanent on-campus stadium in 1992. The 10,000-seat multi-purpose structure features red chairback seats and aluminum bleachers with backrests on a western grandstand that is capped by a spacious and modern press box featuring 11 separate booths, a work room and a food room as well as rest rooms and concession stands. On the eastern grandstand, concrete steps await the future installation of bleachers. There also is room for additional concession stands and restrooms on the east side.

The shower and locker room facility located in the south end zone has an incomplete interior. Finishing this stadium along with building the press and concessions pavilion at the baseball site are the top priorities of a \$6 million capital campaign beginning its second year. Thanks to a state of the art drainage system, the playing surface is virtually flat and holds a regulation soccer field with adequate room for corner kicks.



The Big West Conference enters its fifth year of existence since changing its name from the Pacific Coast Athletic Association prior to the 1988 football season. And many more changes are in store for this academic year.

The first two fall under an administrative heading. First is a new office location in Irvine, a few miles south of the previous address in Santa Ana. Second is new leadership with former associate commissioner Dennis Farrell serving as commissioner on an interim basis after the resignation in June of Jim Haney, now the executive director of the National Collegiate Basketball Coaches Association.

More seriously affecting football are the substitution of the University of Nevada for Fresno State and a new "consortium" formed for the football playing members only. Added to the schedules for 1993 are Arkansas State, Louisiana Tech, Northern Illinois and Southwestern Louisiana, all formerly Div. I-A independents. West Coast teams will play three games annually with the more eastern members, two at home and one on the road one year and one at home and two on the road the subsequent season.

Another major change not affecting football is the federation of several sports including soccer and wrestling on the Fullerton slate. New competitive alignments including primarily Western Athletic Conference teams have been arranged for financial, geographical and travel advantages.

When the league was formed in 1969, it consisted of seven charter members, all of which were located in California. In its 22 years of existence, however, the conference has expanded to include universities from states which are not on nor near the Pacific Ocean (Utah, Nevada and New Mexico). The 11 current members are Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State (currently no football), Nevada, New Mexico State, San Jose State, UC Irvine (no football), UC Santa Barbara (no football), Hawaii (women only), UNLV, Pacific and Utah State.

# Nickname and Mascot

“What exactly is a Titan?”

“Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?”

Those are two of the first questions that pop into the minds of media and fans when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, here are the recognized legends.

“It was the students’ decision in a vote,” explains Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname ‘Titans.’ “More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels.”

It was a unique student body at the outset, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College. They voted to organize as a student body and to assess themselves a fee of \$10 per semester.

“Even when it was decided that ‘Titans’ would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented,” said Becker. “I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence.”

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until, of course, the “First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History.”


What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest “happening” on the campus to this day. The “gag” attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at

more than 10,000 people turned out on “Dumbo Downs” as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek.

The mascot outlived the race. In 1963, one elephant charged the crowd causing minor injuries and an early sign of a now-common liability insurance crisis nipped a tradition in the bud.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was an appropriate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The

unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue in uniforms and printing instead of the "reflex" blue of recent years was initiated in 1992 with a de-emphasis of the orange, furthered by former athletic director Lynn Eilefson in the mid 1980s.

And, finally, there is the matter of the school's name. As mentioned earlier, the name originally was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State College Boulevard. And that's only the start of the confusion.

To out-of-staters, the picture clouds quickly because most don't realize there are two distinct systems of higher education in the state — the University of California and the State University system. So, the school has been called everything from Cal-Fullerton to UC Fullerton to California State Fullerton State to simply Fullerton State. The preferred moniker is Cal State Fullerton, with no hyphens or commas, which is what most of the more than 95,000 graduates recognize. But since there are only two other major institutions known as Titans (University of Detroit and Oral Roberts University), just call Fullerton teams the "Titans!"


How many universities can claim national championships in seven different sports, a star major league third baseman, baseball and men and women basketball players in the Olympics, two rookies in the Super Bowl and the subject matter of a Walt Disney feature film?

The tenor was set by the first Titan intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only their second season, the Titans of coach Alex Omalev advanced five rounds into the NAIA national playoffs in 1961-62.

Sixteen seasons later, the entire nation watched another "cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the Western Regional.

The basketball tradition, which included a women's national title in 1970 and coach Billie Moore and star Nancy Dunkle on the women's 1976 Olympic team, was continued in 1984 as Leon Wood helped the men to a gold medal before he became a first-round NBA draft choice. Coach George McQuarn's teams were usually factors in the PCAA race and had national Top 20 rankings and a victory over the nation's No. 1-ranked and undefeated team to their credit. Fullerton, which seemingly specialized in last-second wins behind NBA slam dunk champion Cedric Ceballos, also has competed twice in the post-season NIT Tournament while the women have recently been in both the WNIT and the NCAA fields. In 1991, Genia Miller was selected a Kodak All-America after ranking No. 2 in the nation in scoring and blocked shots and No. 7 in rebounding.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton more fame. Former men's Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had recent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation



led by former Chinese Olympian Li Xiao Ping. Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation virtually every year and won the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while more recently Tami Elliott won 10 All-American awards before suffering a fractured vertebra in her senior season.

Baseball exploded on the national scene with the arrival of coach Augie Garrido. He broke the USC monopoly in the western regionals in 1975 and won the national title in 1979 behind the play of Tim Wallach, now of the Montreal Expos. He won the College World Series again in 1984 with players such as CWS Most Valuable Player John Fishel. The Titans won their first six-team regional and finished third in the CWS in 1988 under the direction of Coach Larry Cochell, who in 1990 guided them to a Big West title, a regional championship at Texas and a sixth trip to Omaha in 1990. A total of 16 Titan products have played in the major leagues and now Garrido is back from a 3-year stint at Illinois. He punctuated his return with a share of the


1991 Big West title and a second-place finish in the 1992 College World Series despite losing his old diamond to construction for the new complex. Fullerton has a current 12-game winning streak in NCAA regional play -- all on the road at Starkville, Austin and Baton Rouge-- and boasted two players on the 1992 U.S. Olympic team in Phil Nevin and Jason Moler. Nevin also gained notoriety as the first player drafted (by Houston) in the 1992 amateur draft.

Women have sparkled on the Fullerton diamonds, too. Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and the Titans have been a powerhouse, making seven trips to the College World Series and 13 consecutive regional appearances. The Titans brought home their first NCAA Championship in 1986 and often have been ranked No. 1 in the country.

There have been national titles in men's cross country and women's fencing and individual standouts like golfer Martha Wilkerson and runner Mark Covert. But football is the name of the game in intercollegiate sports and the Titans have had their moments on the gridiron as well.

Dick Coury was the inaugural coach in 1970 and he built an instant winner at the Division II level. The Titans were 27-16-1 over the first four years under Coury and successor Pete Yoder before the growing pains of moving up to Div. I were endured. The program came of age under the guidance of Gene Murphy in the 1980s with a pair of championships and four runnerup finishes in a seven-year span. The new stadium complex should add more luster to the Titan football and athletic reputation.

# Head Coach Gene Murphy



"We're going to have some fun in 1992, no matter what happens," says Cal State Fullerton football coach Gene Murphy.

Murphy is taking the upbeat attitude into preparations for the 1992 season after overcoming monumental challenges a year ago. The existence of the program was in limbo between Jan. 24 and Feb. 1, 1991. On the latter date, President Milton A. Gordon announced that the sport would be continued on the basis of pledged community financial support.

Given a reprieve, Murphy and his staff proceeded without a dozen returning players who headed for greener pastures and minus the nucleus of his recruiting class, which did likewise. By season's end, the Titans suited up only 43 players but came up with an inspiring 37-36

victory over Long Beach State in the finale to finish 2-9 overall, 1-6 in the Big West Conference.

A year later, Murphy has the largest group of Spring semester junior college transfers in his tenure and ready and waiting for his 13th season at Fullerton is the long-awaited new, on-campus stadium.

"It's an awesome sight, isn't it?" he said to virtually every visitor to the artificial bowl as it was being created. "It's a real turn on. Not many people get the opportunity to play the first game ever in a stadium."

Murphy has brought identity, fun and success in the standings to Titan football while inadvertently establishing himself as one of the traditions of a program about to embark on only its 23rd season. This will be its 13th under the direction of the New Jersey native who spent two decades in North Dakota before migrating to Southern California.

Murphy's homespun sense of humor, his ability to turn negatives into positives and his genuine concern for assistants and players have been the constant threads holding together a football program that has outperformed its resources. He has received coaching offers from more established institutions, but he has remained a Titan. He takes a 57-80-1 (59-78-1 with UNLV forfeits) record at Fullerton into this season.

While Dick Coury (1970-71) brought Cal State Fullerton football into the world and Pete Yoder (1972-74) steered it through adolescence until Jim Colletto (1975-79) guided it into Division I status, it has been the 53-year-old (as of Aug. 6) Murphy who has nurtured it to maturity. He and his staff remodeled an old home for an office complex (Football House), constructed their own weight training facility (Titan Pete's Bulk House in honor of Fullerton contractor Ray Peterson), arranged a fall training camp through the cooperation of Frank Frobisher at Pacific Christian College and even erected their own temporary stadium (Titan Field, on-campus bleachers, 1980-82).

Between 1983 and 1989, the Titans won a pair of conference championships and finished second on four occasions despite playing a difficult non-conference schedule rated anywhere from "ambitious" to "suicidal." The Titans have become ex-officio members of the Southeastern Conference with recent games at LSU, Florida, Auburn, Mississippi State and Georgia. This year they return to Georgia and also play at UCLA.

Murphy has kept the Titans competitive despite fighting for Southern California

football talent against most of the nation's top programs and sharing a municipal stadium with local high schools and a junior college. The stadium situation resulted in a schedule tilted heavily in favor of road games, but that problem has ended thanks to the efforts spearheaded by former Mayor and current City Councilman Dick Ackerman and the City of Fullerton as well as the Marriott Hotel chain. A 225-room on-campus Marriott opened in October, 1989, and began paying off the construction cost to the city of a \$10.4 million football/soccer and baseball complex that will be utilized by the community as well.

Murphy arrived at Fullerton in January, 1980, but it took until the 1983 season for his freshmen-oriented recruiting program to produce a winning record.

"We had to go back to square one — erecting the stadium, fund-raising, recruiting, building facilities, everything — to build a broad base," said Murphy, Pacific Coast Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 1983 and United Press International's West Coast Coach of the Year in 1984. "And from Day One we had to build the self-image of the Titan program. What we have developed is 'Titan Family.' You win with people. We put up with a lot of adversity, but we do it together and I think it has made us stronger. It's something you have to experience to properly appreciate."

Murphy is No. 1 in seniority in the Big West Conferencenow that Jim Sweeney and Fresno State have moved to the Western Athletic Conference. Murphy left a nationally prominent Div. II program at North Dakota to "throw the football." His early Titan teams featured wide-open aerial assaults and more than a bagful of trick and gadget plays, collectively known as the "squirrel derby" offense. But he has adjusted almost annually to the available personnel. This year he is going to an option offense after three years of a wide-open, single-back set.

The 1983 PCAA championship team and California Bowl entrant was built around a stubborn, ball-hawking defense while the 1984 squad put it all together on its way to a UPI No. 20 national ranking: a strong running game to balance an efficient yet deep-striking passing game and an aggressive defense that was second in the country in creating turnovers. In 1985 and 1988, defense carried the load until young offensive units put things together. In 1986 and 1987, the offense played ball control to keep thin defensive units relatively healthy. In 1989, the Titans re-wrote their offensive record book with an innovative one-back

offensive set. Limited numbers, inexperience and numerous injuries combined to make 1990 and 1991 stunning reversals of form.

The one constant has been the importance Murphy has placed on special teams play.

"We feel the game is divided into three phases — offense, defense and special teams — and if you can win two of the three, you have a pretty good chance to win the football game. We spend a lot of time and front-line personnel on special teams and don't just give them lip service."

Murphy was born on Aug. 6, 1939 in Jersey City, New Jersey. He was an all-sports star at St. Peter's High School in New Brunswick and earned all-state honors in football (quarterback) and baseball (shortstop). His late father also was a coach and matched wits with the likes of Vince Lombardi at the prep level.

## A Glossary of "Murphisms"

As a native of New Jersey, nurtured in the upper Midwest, employed in Canada and now working and living in southern California, Gene Murphy has developed a language all his own. In the interest of better communication, here is a glossary of often-used words and phrases:

"Hail damage in the attic" - questionable mentality or lack of common sense

"Jordanians" - his kickers, either punters or placekickers or both

"Keeper" - a player who will contribute to a winning program

"Little Sisters of the Poor" - school with a lightly regarded football program... an opponent that will enhance your W/L record

"Munchken" - small, tiny person... usually a defensive back

"Norp" - someone from North Dakota

"Sandy Koufax" - a "no-hitter"... a player afraid of contact

"Smash Mouth" - an offensive style of football common to the upper Midwest that makes Woody Hayes look like LaVell Edwards... up the gut... in your face... trench warfare

"Snuse" - smokeless tobacco

"Son of a Buck" - see "stallion," but more ornery

"Spudbutt" - physical description of a football player, typically big but slow and indigenous to the upper Midwest... currently being artificially harvested in the Titan weight room

"Squirrel derby" - Murphy's offensive philosophy that carries over into special teams play... men in motion, passes from and to all backs... end arounds, flea flickers, fake punts and gadget plays still to be devised

"Stallion" - a notch above a "keeper"

"That's Us" - all encompassing exclamation when something goes wrong away from the gridiron like a late bus... being bumped from an airliner... locked stadium gates... photo day bleachers stolen... kicked out of Anaheim Stadium the morning of a game, etc...

"Yewper" - someone from Northern Michigan

Murray Warmath, Murphy soon found himself sitting on the bench behind Gopher star Sandy Stephens. He transferred to North Dakota and as a senior was the All-North Central Conference quarterback.

After obtaining his bachelor's degree (double major of physical education and social studies) in 1962, Murphy served one year as graduate assistant and then coached football, baseball and swimming at North St. Paul High School before returning to UND. He remained there 14 more years — the first 12 as an assistant and the 1978 and 1979 seasons as head coach.

While he was offensive coordinator, the Sioux won six conference titles and participated in three (1966, 1972 and 1975) post-season bowl games. As head coach he won the conference championship in 1979 and was named coach of the year as the Sioux went 10-2 and were ranked as high as No. 3 in the Div. II national rankings. His 1978 team was 5-5, giving him a two-year mark of 15-7 at UND and a current career mark of 70-78-1 (72-76-1 including forfeits).

Murphy spent five summers (1967-71) as a "guest" coach with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders of the Canadian Football League. During his Fullerton tenure he also has turned down opportunities to return to Canada.

A holder of two master's degrees (physical education in 1963 and secondary administration in 1977), Murphy served as interim athletic director at Fullerton for much of 1981.

Murphy has two sons. Tim, 26, serves as media liaison for the highly successful baseball program. He also assists with game-day football equipment and operations. Michael, 22, is a Fullerton senior who was on the spring playing roster as a defensive back.

### Fullerton: A Coaching Incubator

While Miami of Ohio has earned the label "cradle of football coaches," Gene Murphy is building an impressive record of his own in helping to develop assistant and head coaches. # 1992 Season Preview

Despite the presence of more junior college transfers at Spring practice than ever before, Gene Murphy and his Titan coaching staff still carry into Fall camp a bundle of unanswered questions about the Cal State Fullerton football team that will open the long-awaited on-campus stadium this season.

The most basic query will be, "Who's Here?" Summer academic needs and an unprecedented number of walk-ons have combined with revised scholarship funding to create a roster in flux. The alphabetical listings on pages 48 thru 50 of this guide show 147 players as of July 14, the day it went to the printer. Don't even bother looking for a depth chart. As many as six players are vying for the starting quarterback spot and the candidates to replace kicker Phil Nevin are almost as numerous.

"It's something we're used to at Fullerton," says Murphy, beginning his 13th season. "The fact that Long Beach State has suspended its program has had more of an effect on us than I would have guessed."

An immediate repercussion is felt in the schedule where five non-conference foes are aligned alongside five Big West returnees and newcomer Nevada, filling the spot vacated by Fresno State. The Titans open their new home stadium on Sept. 5 against Cal State Northridge and also host Cal State Sacramento. Road games are at UCLA, Georgia and Southwestern Louisiana.

Fullerton has a nucleus of 27 lettermen back from last year's squad that went 2-9 overall and finished 1-6 in the Big West Conference plus two more letter winners from the 1990 squad. The returning strength can be found on the defensive side. Most noticeable in absentia are Reggie Yarbrough and the single-back passing-oriented offense along with last year's jerseys and helmet design.

"We had an excellent Spring session," says Murphy. "This team worked as hard on and off the field as any we have had. We still have a lot of work to do before the games and the fun begin."

Installing the option attack after 12 years of a pro-style passing game was the major accomplishment of Spring. Redshirt Trendell Williams (6-1, 205, Jr., L. A. Valley JC) and junior college transfers Mark Wilson (6-2, 210, Jr., Citrus JC) and Jamal Smith (6-1, 199, Sr., Dodge City JC) emerged as the top three quarterback candidates but no one stood out as a clear-cut favorite to start the opener and Wilson withdrew from the team in late June. Fall arrivals Rich Fanti (5-9, 180, Jr., Rancho Santiago JC), Quincy Guy (5-9, 180, So., Fremont HS), Jack Manu (5-11, 205, Jr., Riverside CC) and Mark Mendenhall (5-9, 180, Jr., American River JC) will all be given a look in August.

"We went to the option to improve the toughness of the team and have more ball security," said Murphy, who saw 1991 QBs Chad May (Kansas State) and Terry Payne (Southern Utah) transfer to more air-oriented programs. "We want to control the clock and make defenses play us honest. They have to be fundamentally more sound against an option. The last few years, they just came roaring off the ball after the quarterback."

A stable of potentially fine runners also influenced the change. The key returnees are Arthur Davis (5-10, 195, Sr., Taft JC) and Dan Pasquil (5-10, 215, Jr., Delta HS). Davis alternated with Yarbrough in 1991 and netted 683 yards with a team-high 4 touchdowns while earning honorable mention All-Big West Conference honors. Pasquil, primarily a slotback last year, was forced into the running back spot for the season finale against Long Beach State and responded with 101 yards and 3 touchdowns.

"Arthur will be our 'go-to' guy in 1992," said Offensive Coordinator Jim Chaney. "In the option, he won't get the ball 25 times a game like last year so we will probably have him returning kicks as well. Danny will be in there somewhere. He's what college football is all about."

Top newcomers in the spring were Mike Peters (5-10, 183, Jr.) from Cerritos College, redshirt freshman Tim Ryan (5-10, 220, San Marcos HS) from the wrestling squad and converted wide receiver Steve Danzy (5-9, 170, Sr., El Camino JC). Challenging in the Fall are sophomore Reggie Carter (5-11, 190, So., Canyon Springs HS) and transfers Enoch Alexander (6-1, 210, Jr.) and Bryan Davis (5-9, 195, Jr.) from Riverside CC, Jarrod Bible (6-0, 205, Jr.) from Compton JC, Willie Bowens (5-9, 190, Jr.) from Merced JC, Eric Gamble (5-11, 240, Jr.) from El Camino JC, Eddie Lua (5-10, 205, Jr.) from Santa Rosa JC and Steve Papin (5-9, 185, Jr.) from West Valley JC. The latter will likely be the No. 1 punt returner.

The receiving corps will diminish in numbers from a year ago. Frank Davis (6-3, 190, Sr., Grossmont JC) topped the 1991 squad with 20 catches for 301 yards and he is back along with Pat Lynch (5-11, 180, Sr., Glendale JC) and Andrew Hill (6-4, 190, So., St. Mary's HS). Santa Monica CC transfer Polee Banks (5-8, 170, Jr.) is most prominent among the newcomers. At tight end the Titans may have the most quality competition for any position on the team among letterman Robert Bedford (6-2, 240, Sr., Golden West JC), redshirt Gerry McDonald (6-2, 235, Jr., Delta JC) and Long Beach State transfer Jeff Williamson (6-4, 220, Jr.). Maturity is a plus with Bedford age 27 and the other two 26 years old by season's end. The position could get even tougher if Maurice Hayden (6-4, 250, Jr., Monterey Peninsula JC) gains eligibility.

The offensive line, with a new emphasis on run blocking instead of pass protection, is expected to be a strength but Chaney and line coaches Bill Dobson and Don Johnson list probable starters only in pencil. The veterans with the best chance of keeping their jobs are center David Porter (6-3, 260, Sr., El Camino JC) and honorable mention all-conference tackle John Cotti (6-5, 285, Jr., Burbank HS). Other veterans back are Wally Bonnett (6-4, 275, Jr., Ontario HS), Ara Ishkhanian (6-4, 265, Sr., LaVerne Univ.), Brian Johnson (6-2, 260, So., Blair HS), Terrance LaCount (6-3, 275, Sr., Taft JC), and converted defensive lineman Dan Garcia (6-2, 295, Sr., Fullerton JC) as well as young Seth Braithwaite (6-3, 280, So., Pasadena HS) and redshirt Abe Elliott (6-5, 280, Jr., Fullerton JC). Among the newcomers are Dan Erickson (6-1, 260, Jr., Pierce JC), Robert Hudson (6-1, 325, Jr., Cerritos JC), Rabinder Khurana (6-2, 290, Jr., Golden West JC), Alex McTrusty (6-0, 313, Jr., Grossmont JC), Ben Siliga (6-0, 317, Jr., San Bernardino Valley JC), and, most impressively, Bryan Campbell (6-4, 275, Jr., Lynwood HS), a starter as a sophomore on Colorado's 1990 national championship team.


Defensively, the Titans are doing more refining than rebuilding. The linebacking corps appears most solid. Inside, the key is the return of 1990 tackles leader Lorenzo Hailey (5-11, 253, Sr., College of Sequoias JC) and 1991 stars Dan Godfrey (6-0, 215, So., Paramount HS) and John Haynes (6-1, 225, Sr., Citrus JC) along with three-year veteran Mike Gullo (6-1, 235, Sr., Fremd HS in Illinois) and redshirt Jeff Robbins (6-2, 230, Jr., Golden West JC), the most improved defensive player of the spring. Top newcomer is Jason Stanley (6-0, 220, Jr., Glendale JC). On the outside, former San Fernando High School teammates Keary Johns (6-1, 190, Jr.) and Howard McCrary (6-3, 209, Sr.) are fighting for one job with 1990 letterman Dan Seymour (5-10, 185, Sr., Orange Coast JC), converted quarterback Mike Simmons (6-1, 200, Jr., Bellflower HS) and possibly Godfrey competing on the opposite flank.

Several newcomers to the defensive line are expected to challenge the incumbents for starting roles. Regulars returning include ends Mike Allen (6-2, 230, Sr., Cerritos JC) and Shambi Scott (6-3, 250, Sr., Moorpark JC), tackles Bill Jones (6-5, 245, Sr., Citrus JC) and Randy Strickland (6-1, 285, Sr., El Camino JC) and nose guard Jason Wells (6-0, 260, Sr., Taft JC). Taft JC product Thomas Cale (6-2, 265, Jr.) and Sacramento City College products Ron Braxton (6-3, 220, Jr.) and Lamont Mason (6-2, 250, Jr.) figure to make an immediate impact as do Tracy George (6-3, 270, Jr., Delta JC), redshirt Keone Simon (6-3, 230, Jr., Golden West JC) and returnee Pooh Jenkins (6-3, 258, Sr., Glendale JC).

The secondary will likely be a blend of old and new. The key returnee is Darrius Watson (6-0, 185, Jr., Bishop Montgomery HS) at cornerback. He was the No. 2 interceptor in the Big West with 6 last year and made other numerous big plays. Back on the opposite side is B. B. Hudson (5-9, 180, Sr., Mt. Sac JC), but he will be challenged by Lee Brown (5-10, 185, Jr., Sacramento CC), Justin Mills (5-10, 185, Jr., Rancho Santiago JC) and possibly Quincy Guy if things don't work out at quarterback. Back at the safety spot is letterman Michael McGuire (6-1, 195, Sr., Fullerton JC) along with challengers Al Whitten (6-0, 220, Jr., Modesto JC), Tim O'Neil (5-11, 198, Jr., Fresno CC) and Long Beach State transfer Cardell Avery (6-1, 190, Jr.).

Nevin, a three-year fixture as punter and kicker, left a huge hole when *Baseball America's* Player of the Year passed up his senior football season after being the No. 1 pick in the June amateur baseball draft and signing with the Houston Astros. The replacement will come from among San Bernardino Valley College transfer Julio Ocana (6-0, 180, Jr.), Rio Hondo JC walk-on Jorge Madrigal (5-10, 175, Jr.) and Oceanside El Camino High School's Noel Prefontaine (6-0, 190), the only scholarship freshman on the squad.



### TITAN PETE'S BULK HOUSE


A monument to the success of Gene Murphy's coaching and entrepreneurial skills rests a few yards to the north of the Football House -- "Titan Pete's Bulk House."

Named after former Booster Club president Ray Peterson, the "bulk house" is Fullerton's eight-year-old weight-training facility. Built by donated labor and materials and specially designated monetary gifts, the "bulk house" is the symbol of the "growing" Fullerton football program.

Unable to consistently recruit the polished, large linemen necessary to compete on the Division I-A level, Fullerton builds its own -- by recruiting lanky high school seniors with large frames and the desire and dedication to spend countless hours in the "bulk house" to build themselves into Big West championship caliber physical specimens.


Three prime examples of this process are former offensive tackles Daren Gilbert and Hank Goebel and tight end Jim Thornton. Gilbert and Goebel were high school basketball players in the 225-pound range. They ended their Titan careers in the 275-pound range and as NFL draft picks -- Gilbert on the second round to New Orleans in 1985 and Goebel to the Los Angeles Rams on the eighth round in 1986.

Thornton came to Fullerton in 1983 as a 200-pound quarterback. Two years later he was converted to tight end and by 1988 he was a 250-pounder playing in the Hula Bowl and later was a fourth-round draft pick by the Chicago Bears.



### FORMER TITAN A HERO IN LOCAL FIRE

Wade Lockett, the last Titan to return a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown (on Nov. 2, 1985 at Fresno State), rescued several people from an apartment complex fire in Anaheim on June 23, 1992. Witnesses told the *Los Angeles Times* that Lockett had run from door to door until he was sure everyone was out of the building. The fire gutted 24 units and damaged many others including Lockett's.

"He was pulling people out of their places even though the fire was everywhere," said witness Treva Thomas. "He saved my daughter and others," said Rebecca Sandoval.

Lockett played for the Titans from 1982 through 1985 and went on to play for the Los Angeles Raiders during the NFL strike and for several teams in Arena Football. He currently is a record producer.


**100-YARD TANDEM**

# 1991 Season Review

The most memorable thing about the 1991 Cal State Fullerton football season was that the Titans had one. Earlier in the calendar year, between Jan. 24 and Feb. 1 to be exact, the program's existence was in limbo after a recommendation by the Athletics Council to drop the sport due to state budgetary concerns. But President Milton A. Gordon launched a community fund-raising drive in conjunction with the about to be completed Titan Sports Complex and the games went on.

Coach Gene Murphy and his staff looked forward and tried not to dwell on those who had abandoned ship, including about a dozen former players and many incoming recruits who had made verbal agreements to become Titans. Working with what they had, the Titans hung together and capped a 2-9 season with an inspirational 37-36 victory over Long Beach State in the season finale despite suiting up only 42 players.

The schedule maker didn't do Fullerton any favors in 1991. They opened on the road at Mississippi State and Texas Tech and inexperienced quarterbacks Terry Payne, a sophomore, and Chad May, a redshirt freshman, had difficulty getting the offense moving. Running backs Reggie Yarbrough and Arthur Davis did yeoman duty all year while sharing the load in the 1-back set. Each gained more than 100 yards in a victory over Cal State Northridge in game No. 3. Davis carried 39 times in the 41-7 loss at Texas Tech after Yarbrough aggravated an injury and then Reggie carried a school record 43 times in a surprisingly close loss at Georgia, which scored in the final seconds to secure a 27-14 victory.

After a wild shootout at Pacific that the Titans lost, 56-28, the offense stagnated and Fullerton scored only 32 points over the next five games. Yarbrough's amateur career ended with a fractured ankle at San Jose State in Game No. 9. May, who had replaced Payne as the starter at Georgia and taken his lumps learning on the job, stepped forward with the game of his collegiate life and led a last-minute touchdown drive to beat Long Beach State. He got a major boost from converted slot back Dan Pasquil, who replaced a suspended Arthur Davis at running back and responded with 103 rushing yards and three touchdowns while also running back kickoffs. The lead changed hands six times and there were three touchdowns in the final 2:21. May threw a 13-yard TD pass to Frank Davis with 0:38 to play to cap a 10-play, 86-yard drive that won it. Fittingly, fifth-year linebacker Teddy McMillan sealed the win with a pass interception in Fullerton territory.

Fullerton opened the 1991 season in a familiar spot but in a new frenzied atmosphere. The arrival of Coach Jackie Sherrill at Mississippi State had the Bulldog faithful fired up and the Bulldogs did not disappoint them.

The Titans, who surprised the Rocky Felker-coached Bulldogs in 1990 by taking a 13-6 halftime lead, got off to a strong start again. With Reggie Yarbrough and Arthur Davis hammering away inside, Fullerton controlled the ball most of the first quarter and well into the second quarter and was close at 7-3 late in the half.

However, Mississippi State got two big plays and converted them into 14 points. Sleepy Robinson hit Willie Harris with a 55-yard bomb to set up a short TD run for a 14-3 lead. Terry Payne and Davis then fumbled away an exchange on the Titans' second play at their own 11-yard line and the Bulldogs scored again three plays later.

Mississippi State scored on its first possession of the second half for a 28-3 lead and then took advantage of late Fullerton mistakes to run up a lopsided score. The Titans attempted only 11 passes -- 10 by starting quarterback Terry Payne and one by punter Phil Nevin -- and completed 6 for 87 yards. The 11 attempts matched (11 vs. UNLV in 1983) the next to lowest total of the Gene Murphy era (10 vs. San Jose State in 1983) and the yardage total was under 100 yards for the first time since at Northern Illinois on Oct. 24, 1987.

Fullerton made its initial venture into Southwest Conference football and it wasn't enjoyable as the Red Raiders exploded for four quick scores before the Titans could manage a first down.

Texas Tech moved 39 yards to a Lin Elliott field goal on its first possession and then had to go only one yard for a touchdown the next time when Terry Payne was sacked and fumbled the ball away on Fullerton's first play after the field goal. The Red Raiders then marched 46 yards for a TD and 16 yards to another Elliott field goal before Payne hit Gary Stick with a 24-yard pass on the first play of the second quarter for Fullerton's initial first down. It ignited an 80-yard drive culminated in a 17-yard pass to Pat Lynch.

The Titans stopped Texas Tech on the next series and moved to the TT 30 before a penalty stalled the drive and Phil Nevin missed a 52-yard field goal try. Texas Tech added another field goal and the Titans got only three tentative rushes from Reggie Yarbrough before he aggravated his ankle injury and sat out the rest of the game.

Arthur Davis stepped to the forefront and carried 39 times, the second most attempts ever by a Titan, and netted 128 hard-earned yards. Chad May replaced Payne late in the third quarter and directed a late drive from the Fullerton 7-yard line to the Texas Tech 2, but the Red Raiders brought back their starting defensive unit to keep the Titans out of the end zone.

A bye week, a return to Santa Ana Stadium, a switch to Chad May at quarterback, a pair of 100-yard rushers and two fourth-quarter interceptions by Darrius Watson. All of those elements were needed for Fullerton to snap a 13-game losing streak with a narrow 17-10 win over Div. II Cal State Northridge.

Watson's second interception came in the Fullerton end zone with less than two minutes to play and preserved the win. Watson had stopped Northridge's previous possession with an interception at the Titans' 44-yard line. That led to a 44-yard field goal by Phil Nevin which then gave the Matadors the ball and Marty Fisher drove them from their 15 to the Titans' 16-yard line.

Northridge scored first when flanker Comell Ward threw a touchdown pass to Paul Peters on the first play after May threw his second interception of the first quarter. The Titans came right back with a 13-play, 65-yard drive capped by Davis' 10-yard run. Just before the half, Davis scored what would turn out to be the game-winning TD from the 2-yard line, when the Titans had no timeouts remaining and probably could not have gotten off another play.

Reggie Yarbrough and Davis became the first pair of Titan backs to each rush for more than 100 yards in the same game since Obie Graves and Mike Martin did it vs. Fresno State on Oct. 28, 1978. Fullerton set a school record with only 28 passing yards.

Northridge drew within 14-10 in the third quarter, taking advantage of a minus 6-yard punt by Phil Nevin, who had made an excellent play to field a high snap.

Fullerton flirted with a major upset and probably the biggest victory in the school's history before 76,117 stunned Bulldog fans in Athens, Georgia.

The Titans had the ball at their own 41-yard line with 3:30 to play and trailing only 20-14. But on fourth and one, Reggie Yarbrough was stopped for no gain and the Bulldogs then marched 40 yards to score a clinching touchdown with 32 seconds to play.

With Arthur Davis sidelined with an ankle injury, Yarbrough was the Titan offense. He set a Big West Conference record with 43 carries and totaled 192 yards against the perennial Southeastern Conference power. His 35-yard run to the Georgia 9 set up a game-tying touchdown pass from Terry Payne to Robert Bedford and he then tied the game again after Bedford had recovered a Bulldog fumble of a punt at their 6-yard line. Georgia went ahead again on a field goal and Fullerton almost tied it a third time at the halftime gun, but Nevin missed a 47-yard try. Nevin took another unsuccessful shot in the third quarter from 53 yards after Teddy McMillan's interception. Kanon Parkman eventually countered successfully with a 20-yarder for the final scoring until the closing seconds.

Payne entered for one and a half series when Chad May suffered a broken nose on a sack. May came back to finish the game. Georgia would come back a week later to handily defeat rival Clemson. Remarkably, the Titans came closer to beating the SEC foe than any Big West Conference conqueror in 1991.

Fullerton took the momentum of its win over Northridge and near miss at Georgia into Big West Conference play and got off to a great start, stopping Pacific on its opening possession and then driving 75 yards in 11 plays for a go-ahead touchdown. But it was all Tigers after that as quarterback Troy Kopp, running back Ryan Benjamin and flanker Aaron Turner executed more big plays than the Titans' ball-control offense could imagine.

Benjamin, who would lead the nation in all-purpose yardage and make *Associated Press*' All-America first team, was the biggest thorn. His 72-yard run in the second quarter put the Tigers ahead by two touchdowns for good. And when Reggie Yarbrough broke an 80-yard scoring run to raise Titan hopes in the third quarter, Benjamin returned the ensuing kickoff 83 yards to set up a nullifying Pacific score.

Fullerton enjoyed its biggest offensive day of the season at the expense of the Tigers' outmanned defense and both Yarbrough and Arthur Davis went over 100 yards rushing. But UOP's offense was more explosive, taking no more than nine plays for any of its eight touchdown drives.

UNLV's defensive front attacked the Titans' offensive line and the disruption led to one of the poorest offensive performances of the year for Fullerton. Forced to the air, the Titans completed only 15 passes for 121 yards and UNLV recovered from an early Phil Nevin field goal to claim the victory.

Nevin's 52-yard field goal, which would be the longest in the Big West Conference all season, was set up by Michael McGuire's kickoff return to near midfield. The Rebels' problems with their kicking game kept Fullerton in the game. Nick Garritano missed 40 and 24-yard field goals in the first quarter and then he and Brian Parvin each missed an extra point in the second quarter. UNLV blocked a 32-yard attempt by Nevin to set up its second touchdown.

UNLV finally got a field goal from Garritano in the third quarter and another in the waning minutes after Jabbar Thomas' run had put the game out of reach.

Terry Payne relieved Chad May in the third quarter and brought the crowd to life with a 20-yard completion to Frank Davis. But the only other pass he completed was to himself on a deflection and he fumbled the ball away at midfield.

Derek Stott paced a balanced UNLV attack that featured fullback Derek Black, who had signed with Fullerton two years earlier but was academically deficient for admission. Wide receiver Henry Bailey accounted for most of Stott's 209 passing yards with 151 yards on 4 catches.

A winless Utah State team, staggered by losses to the likes of Nebraska and Oklahoma, got well against the Titans. The Aggies of beleaguered Coach Chuck Shelton, who would resign a few weeks later, balanced the passing of Ron Lopez with the running of Roger Grant to beat the Titans for the third year in a row and take a 7-6 lead in the head-to-head series.

Arthur Davis had a good day running for the Titans but Reggie Yarbrough seldom got out of his backfield and the Titans managed only 128 yards on 28 pass attempts. Most of that yardage came in a fourth-quarter drive that bogged down inside the Utah State 20-yard line.

Fullerton got to the Utah State 14 in the first quarter after a Michael Jones pass interception and settled for a Phil Nevin field goal after a penalty moved them back.

Utah State came back with a drive to the Fullerton 19-yard line and got a field goal to tie. The Titans came up short on a fake field goal play and the Aggies drove 70 yards to a go-ahead touchdown. Fullerton tackled the other Big West co-champions and met very similar results in Fresno, where Gene Murphy was coaching for the tenth time in his 12-year Titan career. With the Bulldogs heading for the Western Athletic Conference in 1992, it may have been Murphy's last appearance in "The Doghouse" before a crowd of 31,081, which was held down by local television coverage.

The California Bowl-bound Bulldogs dared the Titans to pass on them, bunching eight defenders at the line of scrimmage and playing man-to-man defense in the secondary. The Titans made few connections and only back-to-back completions of 28 and 22 yards from Chad May to Frank Davis got Fullerton on the scoreboard shortly before halftime.

Four turnovers by the usually ball conscious Bulldogs kept Fullerton in the game. Third-string quarterback Brian Rowe got some help from second-stringer Trent Dilfer in relief and a big, physical offensive line in front of him. The Bulldogs had four runners gain more than 50 yards.

Fresno State scored on three of its first five possessions, failing on a fourth-down try and throwing an interception to miss being perfect. Meanwhile, Phil Nevin was setting a Fullerton record by punting 13 times for a record 544 yards. Fullerton played without four regulars on the defense who did not suit up due to disciplinary reasons.

One of the most exciting games of this or any college football rivalry was played between teams whose records were not indicative of the efforts displayed in the final game. The lead changed hands six times and there were three touchdowns in the final 2:21.

Fullerton suited up only 42 players and used Y-U backs Dan Pasquil and Kevin Koontz at the running back spot. The Titans had no experienced quarterback behind Chad May. Pasquil responded with three first-half touchdowns and finished with 101 rushing yards despite having a 73-yard TD run nullified by a penalty.

Fullerton broke a 24-24 tie with 9:18 to play when May threw a scoring pass to Robert Bedford. Phil Nevin missed a 45-yard field goal that would have meant a 10-point lead and Long Beach seized the opportunity. Todd Studer hit Mark Seay with a touchdown bomb on the next play but Joe Vaughn broke up a go-ahead 2-point conversion pass to leave CSF up 1.

The 49ers successfully recovered an onside kick and quickly scored an apparent game-winning touchdown. But they missed another 2-point conversion try. May marched the Titans 86 yards in 10 plays and produced a go-ahead touchdown in only 69 seconds. Studer was intercepted a fourth time by Teddy McMillan inside Fullerton territory to kill the final rally try.

# Titans in the Pro Ranks

The growth and development of the Fullerton football program can be seen quite graphically in the output of players into the professional ranks in the late 1980s. Although only running back Reggie Yarbrough (Phoenix, 10th round, 1992) was drafted in the past two years, the Titans have typically had multiple selections in the annual NFL draft with 17 players chosen in the past eight years after a total of only three Titans were picked in the previous 14 drafts.

The zenith was reached in 1986 when four Titans were chosen in the first eight rounds. Cornerback Mark Collins went to the New York Giants on the second round; wide receivers James Pruitt (Miami) and Corn Redick (Philadelphia) were picked on the fourth and seventh rounds, respectively; and offensive tackle Hank Goebel went to the Rams on the eighth round.

Actually, the list would have been more impressive had fullback Todd Gerhart and linebacker John Nevens not signed USFL contracts prior to the NFL draft.

The 1988 draft ranked among the highest ever for Titans as tight end Jim Thornton was tabbed by the Chicago Bears on the fourth round and wide receiver Todd White went to the Philadelphia Eagles on round No. 7. Only second-round picks Daren Gilbert (New Orleans, 1985) and Collins rank higher than Thornton, who came to Fullerton as a quarterback.

Three physically unique members of the defensive wall were tabbed remarkably close together in the draft of 1989. Alex Stewart, a transfer from Fresno City College and USC who had limited playing experience but was built like the model for a bodybuilding trophy, went on the eighth round to Minnesota. On the ninth round went A. J. Jenkins, a down lineman with linebacker quickness, to Pittsburgh, and Jerry Leggett, a linebacker the size of a tackle, to New Orleans.

In the 1990 selection, two Titans became Falcons in consecutive rounds as offensive tackle Reggie Redding and running back Mike Pringle went to Atlanta in rounds five and six, respectively.


Titans have done more than just sign contracts and make rosters. Both Bobby Kemp and Collins hit the

jackpot early, playing in the Super Bowl as rookies. Kemp started for the Bengals in a losing cause against San Francisco in 1982 and Collins saw considerable action in a winning effort against the Broncos in January, 1987. The former PCAA Defensive Player of the Year also gained a berth on the NFL All-Rookie team and has gone on to earn All-Pro consideration and, more importantly, a second Super Bowl Championship ring. Thornton became a starter as a rookie and began cashing in on endorsements in Chicago with extensive exposure in the Sears Big and Tall Man's Spring Catalog and poster fame as "RoboCop."

Free agents from Fullerton have had good luck gaining professional status. Johnnie Gray unseated current KCBS-TV sportscaster Jim Hill at cornerback for Green Bay and started for many years. Lucious Smith played defensive back in the NFL for several seasons with Buffalo, San Diego and the Rams and Vince Gamache was the regular punter in 1986 for the Seattle Seahawks. The Titans also have made a good showing in the Canadian Football League led by recent graduates Damon Allen (Edmonton and Ottawa QB), Greg Gary (Hamilton LB) and Eric Emery (British Columbia LB); the WFL and USFL; NFL strike squads and Arena Football, where Wade Lockett was one of the top players for the Los Angeles Cobras and Quinton Knight was a regular for the New York Knights.

After also helping to promote the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History" as a student, he went on to become the SID at USC, public relations director for the World Football League and vice president of the Seattle Seahawks. He currently is executive director of the Orange County Sports Association, which stages the Pigskin Classic and the Freedom Bowl. Bob Bowser, SID in 1970, went on to work for the Washington Redskins and Pat Mooney, a former assistant athletics director, was the Director of Advertising for the Great Western Forum in Inglewood.
