Dear Boy.

I received a short letter from you today. I know you must often feel lonely and I am very sorry that it must be so - but I really do not see any way to change it just yet. I could not go home anyway until I get the use of my left hand - it is very inconvenient, all the fingers are well but the first one - yet the hand is so weak that if I use it just a little the pain in it extends all up my arm and into my shoulder - in a little while it is not endurable, I can't hold the hands down at all. but I suppose it will all come right in time.

I was just going to faint. I've a large
bottle of Harlan's I don't dare be without
it fetches me up. Today the three dearest
children went to a Fair in Mr Beecher's
church - Mother Sarah took Emma and
I tried to restrain Sam and Indu
they were all very much pleased.
Emma kept the things she bought for
Grandma for herself and fought her
Grandma for a tin of paint. I brought
her some solid in - she is much stronger
than her Grandmas or I - she is a
terrific child. Indu is very tall and
frightfully thin. They all talk about you
every day and send their love and kisses
to you. I enclose Sam's School report
for last month. He tried real hard
and would have been perfect - had

I not kept him home one day. I'd
no muse and but one hand and it
was snowing - so I thought I must keep
him home - I told him I'd tell you
as he br^oke so hard and was very good.
He is terribly conceited. Poor Julia is
looking and feeling very miserable.
Mother keeps about the same. She takes
cold very easily and needs watching
and care. Julia can't do anything
and won't be able to do much,
so it don't seem right to leave Mother
and I don't like to ask Father to
give me the money to go home with
~~and~~ neither do I see how I can pay
board for so many of us this Summer.
Give your advice old Boy - time passes
so swiftly it will soon be time to
decide

It snowed all morning and I forgot
to mail this. We all send lots of
love I am
