How would you have voted?

Welfare Increases MacDonald voted YES



(AB 6-2X) Unruh amendment to divert \$25 - \$50 million revenue recovery from General Fund to pay for welfare costs. (Passage twice refused by bi-partisan majority)

Campus Radicals MacDonald voted YES



(AB 2466) Bill to broaden range of publications which may be distributed on campus including pornographic, anti-war and other such radical material. (defeated)

Pollution Control MacDonald voted NO



(SCA 18) Allows voters by General Election action to permit individual counties to divert portion of highway funds for pollution control. Bill had bi-partisan support, passed both houses and was signed by Governor.

Tax Relief MacDonald voted NO



(AB 1000) Governor's tax reform program granting substantial relief to property taxpayers. MacDonald switched his vote in coalition with Unruh inspired minority. MacDonald was part of small Assembly block to reject bi-partisan effort to consumate much needed tax reform funding during 1970 legislative session.



Randy Siple believes...

Tax Relief

"As your Assemblyman, I'd first support Governor Reagan's tax reform program for immediate home-owner relief. I would then join forces with other responsible legislators who favor pay-as-you-go government. It's time we concern ourselves with long range tax relief before we enact new spending programs demanding additional funding."

Environment

"I have pledged that Ventura County will not become a polluted backwater of Los Angeles. The recent legislative session made much of environmental studies, but little was accomplished. I will support legislation demanding clean air and water. Waste and soil controls must be acted upon now!

Narcotics

"Drug abuse is a serious, complex national affliction. We must give law enforcement officials the funds and the freedom to cut off narcotic traffic at its source. Restriction of domestic drug production must be considered. Concurrently, we must increase our efforts to better educate both parent and child on the dangers inherent in drug usage."

Welfare

"When politicians stop buying votes with ever-increasing handouts, we'll start to reverse the trend, away from welfare fraud and deception. We must also appeal court decisions which virtually encourage welfare as a way of life. Quite honestly, a total revamping of the system is in order. Welfare is a negative program as it is presently constituted. It must be re-cycled to perform positive functions."

Leadership

"It is not enough to want to accomplish something. It is of little value to promise more than your abilities permit. But, I have been assured by the dedicated leadership in Sacramento, on both sides of the aisle, that sound social and fiscal legislation will occur as we work in concert with the administration. In rejecting petty partisanship, we can attack our state's most pressing problems . . . and all have a better tomorrow."
