Budget includes lower assessment

There is good news for LV homeowners in the 2015-16 budget approved by the Board of Directors at the February board meeting. Department heads and Village management continue to look over the dollars and cents that make up the operating budget for 2015-16, and that close attention has brought numbers lower than those presented at the public town hall in January.

As LV budgeteers continue to examine the pages of the Village's financial details, they have been able to reduce some key figures. Perhaps most important to residents is the lowered homeowner's assessment. The new, lower figure is 2.415 percent, re-

duced from the 2.516 percent reported in January. Ted Lansing, LV Treasurer, explains that the adjustments came from a variety of areas such as falling gas prices. The revised operating expenses are now projected to be \$10,899,855 for the fiscal year that begins on April 1. That represents an increase of \$272,105 over last year.

Such reports do sound disturbing, said Leisure Village Security Chief Manny Segovia. And all are treated seriously. That's why he wants residents to know the details. No cars in V.44 were "broken into;" all were unlocked and the thief (or thieves) got 93 cents and a CD from one auto and some paperwork from another.

"The papers and the CD were found by landscapers the next day," he said, and the \$950 report was actually taken from an unlocked car parked at a local super market - its owner lives in Leisure Village. Chief Segovia said he wishes none of it had happened. But in a community of more than 3,000 people, occasional occurrences like these will happen.

He believes he and the residents have the answer. Lock all vehicles parked outside the garage, whether on the street or in the driveway. And never leave anything of value inside the vehicle whether it's locked or not.

"Secure your car the way you would secure

Which leads to the next issue: the security of our houses. Locking doors at home is just as important as locking our cars, no matter how safe and secure we feel in our neighborhoods. Recent crime and arrest statistics at the Camarillo Police Station (which are available for public viewing) show that Leisure Village registers very few reports of thefts or break-ins and none of actual stolen property.

"Usually, when we get a call about a possible theft, it turns out that the resident has misplaced something," explains Chief Segovia. "And if asked, we can help find it."

Security officers should not be admitted to Village homes unless they are responding to an immediate call for help. "Our staff members are not permitted to just enter a house unless we have approval. And then two officers are required to be present," Segovia explains. These rules are designed to protect residents as well as the security team.

Many cleaning fee deposits see an increase

Not sure what it is, but something in the psyche of the American male makes him want to be a super-jock athlete. You know, another Michael Jordan or Shaq, etc. That must be why so many of us are constantly imagining three-pointers as we toss things into the waste basket as opposed to walking up and dropping them in. Swoosh! Most of the time that is a pretty harmless fantasy. After all, how much damage can a crunchedup piece of paper do? But when the fantasy ball is a partially filled cup of coffee, or worse yet, wine, it is a whole different ballgame (pun intended). Then, sink the shot or not, there is an excellent chance that the liquids will spill out and stain the walls or floors.

Unfortunately this is exactly what has happened a number of times—even after the renovation of the AR has been completed. The fabric wall coverings are much harder (and more expensive) to clean. The Board therefore has voted to raise the cleaning fee deposits required from users as follows: AR usage \$175 (from \$50); and the MPR, Garden Room, Pavilion, Santa Rosa Room and Picnic Area \$50 (from \$25). There is no increase for the Sun Room, Lanai Room, Ojai Room, Ventura Room and the West Lot Patio, which remain at \$25.

Our collective actions have forced these increases. Our collective attention can ensure that further increases will not be required.

Boosting recovery after total hip replacement

with doctor-approved exercises. Being in better physical condition before surgery has been shown to result in better outcomes, both long and shortterm, after surgery. If the older adult smokes, quitting will help with recovery as will maintaining a healthy diet and weight.

Following surgery, it is critical that the person be committed to the physical therapy team. Activity will increase mobility. On the other hand, it is equally important that the person not engage in activities that have been shown to complicate recovery, such as bathing in tubs, reaching for items, using stairs, dressing, making beds, driving and many others. It is important

for recovery that seniors obtain help with these tasks after surgery until

they receive a release from the doctor.

While family and friends may be able to help, it is possible that the older individual will need help during certain periods of the day when others are not available, or that they do not have these community resources to lean on. When Paul Coffman wasn't designing Saturn rockets, he was a wellknown amateur driver competing in his beloved MGTD.

golf course, and smile at the memories of the speed and thrust that defined Paul's life for so many years.

First the speed: "I was a quiet math and science student in a quiet family," explains Paul, who graduated from San Fernando High School in 1952. A friend suggested that he apply for a summer job at Rocketdyne, the mysterious rocket development and testing facility in Simi Valley. Paul took something called a data reduction test, got the job, which meant a daily 23-mile commute well before freeways in the area. Paul loved the drive.

"I was into most athletic sports, and, despite modest ability, I was always competitive," he recalls. This calm methodical engineer-to-be got hooked on driving the Morris in local events, the "racing rush" - although he's quick to add that he was and is a cautious driver.

Next came an MG TD, a "street-legal racing car," then his Triumph Spitfire. A pal suggested he compete on racetracks with the Triumph Owners Club. That same friend set up Paul with a blind date named Barbara. He accepted both suggestions: Paul raced as an amateur for the next 14 years, and Barbara and Paul have been married 55 years.

"I went to work every day. And, at home, I spent a lot of time under my race car in the garage," he says laughing. He competed regularly at tracks from Riverside to Willow Springs to Daytona, Florida. "Racing is pretty addictive. It's like flying when we do it right," he adds.

Another kind of flying — rockets was also compelling to Paul. He was promoted regularly at Rocketdyne after that summer job. He also graduated from USC, and became a lead engineer at the age of 28. It was a heady time for rocket science. President Kennedy declared in May 1961, "This nation should commit itself to achieving the goal, before the decade is out, of landing a man on the moon and returning him safely to the earth." Paul and his Rocketdyne colleagues were on it, designing and building Saturn rockets for the Apollo project.

"When we tested those rockets, you could feel the rumbling more than a mile away," he says. As a lead engineer on the Apollo missions, he worked between Simi Valley and Cape Canaveral, focused on power that most can't comprehend.

"There were 7 1/2 million pounds of thrust on the 6-million-pound moon rocket. But we never forgot that three men would be inside the capsule of Apollo 11."

Most of us know where we were when Apollo 11 raced toward the moon in July 1969. Of course, so does Paul Coffman. He was towing his Triumph Spitfire home from a race in northern California. "We stopped at a bar about every hour to check on the flight's progress," he says. Paul stopped racing in 1972 and worked on his last Rocketdyne project in 2011. He still follows NASCAR and Formula I racing. And he enjoys explaining what rocket science really is all about.
