

PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only and must be worn in plain sight at all times. Access to the field is permitted via the right field stairway. Due to the limited foul territory behind home plate, all photographers must remain to the outfield side of the coaching boxes at first and third bases.

PRESS BOX: The press box is located on the walkway behind the seats directly behind home plate. Limited seating is available with beat writers receiving priority. Radio positions and additional seating for the media will be made in the rows immediately in front of the press box.

TELEPHONES: The press box number is (714) 278-5327. Additional phones are available in the Sports Media Relations Office, located about 200 yards to the south of Titan Field. A public pay phone is located directly behind the electrical house behind the press box.

RADIO LINES: Up to three telephone lines can be made available to the designated radio station of the visiting team(s). The charge is \$35 per game or \$100 for a three-game series. Please make arrangements with Mel Franks well in advance.

PARKING: Parking is available by:

- a) Using lot G at Yorba Linda Blvd. and Associated Road and paying \$1.50 upon entry for a daily permit (Monday-Thursday only). Parking is free on Friday night and all day Saturday and Sunday.
- b) Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential to the Visitors Information Booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the corner of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues.





WELCOME TO TITAN BASEBALL



The Titans have produced 7 firstround draft picks including Dante Powell (above) by the Giants in 1994 and Brent Mayne (below) by the Royals in 1988.



- Cal State Fullerton won national championships in 1979, 1984 and 1995. Its most recent championship came as a result of a 57-9 season where the Titans finished 1995 with an 18-game winning streak. The Titans also became the first No. 1 seed to win the national title since seeding began in 1988.
- Cal State Fullerton is one of only two schools (Arizona State is the other school) to have three Golden Spikes Award winners. The award is given to the top amateur baseball player in the nation by USA Baseball. The three Titans who won the Golden Spikes Award were Tim Wallach (1979), Phil Nevin (1992) and Mark Kotsay (1995).
- Mark Kotsay and Brian Loyd represented Cal State Fullerton and the United States at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Georgia. In winning the bronze medal as part of Team USA, Kotsay and Loyd join three other Titans who have been members of Team USA (Bob Caffrey in 1984 and Phil Nevin and Jason Moler in 1992).
- 25 Titans have gone on to play in the major leagues. Mark Kotsay became the most recent Titan to make it to "The Show" when he was called up by the World Champion Florida Marlins during the 1997 season.
- Cal State Fullerton is 71-38 (.651) in NCAA post-season play and is ranked in the top five all-time in winning percentage for teams that have played over 100 games in post-season competition.
- No school has made more trips to Omaha, Nebraska, and the College World Series by winning on the road. Cal State Fullerton has won nine regional titles, all on the road.
- The Titans in 23 years at the Division I level have made it to the NCAA Tournament 19 times and have won 16 conference championships.
- Mark Kotsay became the seventh Titan to be selected in the first round of the amateur baseball draft. Kotsay, who was selected ninth overall in the 1996 draft by the Florida Marlins, joins Tim Wallach (Montreal-1979), Bob Caffrey (Montreal-1984), Mike Harkey (Chicago Cubs-1987), Brent Mayne (Kansas City-1988), Phil Nevin (Houston-1992) and Dante Powell (San Francisco-1994).
- Cal State Fullerton has had 59 first-team all-conference selections in 15 years. CSF first joined the Pacific Coast Athletic Association in 1975 when it made the jump to Division I. The baseball conference was not in existence from 1977 to 1984 (CSF played in the SCBA), but returned in 1985. On July 1, 1988, the PCAA officially changed its name to the current Big West Conference.
- The Titans have never had a losing season in the 23-year history of the program at the Division I level.

The seven-team Southern California Baseball Association was made by Fullerton, Pepperdine, San Diego State, Cal State Los Angeles, Loyola Marymount, UC Santa Barbara and Long Beach State. Pacific, Fresno State and San Jose State became part of the Northern California Baseball Association.

The new schedule failed to disrupt the Titans' championship rhythm, although they had to share the inaugural SCBA title in 1977 with Cal State Los Angeles. Fullerton lost a one-game playoff with the Diablos but gained an atlarge NCAA bid where they lost in the regional title game to Washington State in Pullman.


There was another SCBA title in 1978 and a regional elimination at USC before the Titans struck paydirt in 1979. They parlayed another SCBA crown into a

national championship, but they did it the hard way.

Fullerton lost the regional opener at Fresno, but came back through the losers' bracket, finally beating UCLA twice to earn a return trip to Omaha. Again, the Titans lost the opener, this time to Mississippi State. But a confident Garrido still liked his team's chances and they proved him right. They won five games in a row including a 2-1 verdict over Arkansas for the NCAA championship, the first title for Fullerton in a men's sport in Division I play.

Pitcher Tony Hudson was the College World Series Most Outstanding Player. Tim Wallach became the first Titan to win the Golden Spikes Award, given to the top amateur baseball player in the nation by the United States Baseball Federation.

Fullerton began a frustrating streak of post-season play in 1980. The Titans won the SCBA title again but had to go to







On Sept. 4, 1996, George Horton fulfilled a life-long dream of being a Division I head coach when he was promoted to replace Augie Garrido, who left to take over at the University of Texas. For six years, Horton served as the associate head coach as the Titans posted a 264-99 record and made three trips to the College World Series, winning the 1995 NCAA championship

and placing second in 1992 and third in 1994.

Last year, in his first season as head coach, Horton guided Cal State Fullerton to the Big West Conference Championship by winning the post-season tournament in Long Beach. The Titans, who at one point were 23-19-1, rattled off 15 wins in their last 18 games of the regular season. After losing the first game of the Big West Conference Tournament, the Titans won four straight, including a doubleheader sweep on the final day against host Long Beach State, to win the title and the automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

Horton, a 1978 graduate, returned to Cal State Fullerton in 1991 as Garrido returned to CSF himself after a three-year stint at Illinois. During the ensuing six years, Horton had input on almost every aspect of the Fullerton baseball program with his primary concern being the development of the pitching staff. His organizational skills, patience as a teacher and his attention to detail provide the backbone of the Titan coaching staff.

Before coming back to Cal State Fullerton, Horton was the head coach at Cerritos College where he guided the Falcons to three junior college state championships in six years.

Horton, 44, compiled a 226-53 record at Cerritos and won the California state championship in 1985, 1987 and 1989. Each of those years he was selected National Junior College Coach of the Year. His best season was 1987 when the Falcons went 46-5. He had a South Coast Conference record of 102-28 (.785) and was a four-time South Coast Conference Coach of the Year (1985, 1987, 1989 and 1990).

He had many players graduate to the major leagues including Brian Hunter, who played for the Atlanta Braves in the 1991 World Series. Other names include Mike Benjamin, Craig

Worthington, Ever Magallanes, Al Osuna, Bret Barberie, Louis Medina and Jeff Hearron.

Horton was a member of the Cerritos College team in 1972 and 1973. He won the most inspirational award in 1972. In 1973 he was the Falcon team captain, won the Dallas Moon Award and was a member of the state championship team. Horton played

two seasons for Garrido at Cal State Fullerton in 1975 and 1976 and won All-PCAA honors as both a junior and a senior. He was on the first Fullerton team to go to the College World Series in 1975. He batted .308 as a junior and .290 as a senior while playing first base. He graduated in 1978 and went on to earn a master's degree in 1980 at Cal Lutheran.


Horton's coaching career began at Cerritos in 1976-77 and he went to Los Angeles Valley College the following three seasons where he coached with current Long Beach State coach Dave Snow. In 1980, he moved back to Cerritos as an assistant to Gordie Douglas before taking the head job in 1985. In addition, he coached during the summer for the Fairbanks Goldpanners (1981 and 1983) in Alaska and the Hutchinson Broncs (1982) in Kansas. A few famous names played for him on those summer teams such as Shane Mack, Oddibe McDowell, Joe Magrane, Dan Plesac, Phil Stevenson and Roger Clemens.

In 1994, Horton was inducted into the California

Community College Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame. During the years that Horton has been responsible for the pitching staff, seven pitchers have received All-America honors. Matt Wagner (1994) and Ted Silva (1995) won Big West Conference Pitcher of the Year honors under Horton's coaching.

Dan Naulty became the first Titan pitcher under Horton's guidance to reach the major leagues when he made the 1996 opening-day roster for the Minnesota Twins.

Horton was born on Oct. 5, 1953. He and his wife Francie have three daughters: Michele (18), Heather (14) and Rebecca (7). Horton and his family reside in Yorba Linda.



Dave Serrano returns for his second season at Cal State Fullerton as pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. He has been very instrumental in putting together the last two recruiting classes which included the No. 10 ranked class last year by *Collegiate Baseball*.

Serrano, 33, was the pitching coach and recruiting coordinator for the 1995 and 1996 seasons at the University of Tennessee for Head Coach Rod Delmonico. In 1995, Serrano helped the Volunteers reach the College World Series for the first time since 1951.


Serrano has coached more than 20 pitchers who are currently playing professional baseball. In his two years at Tennessee they produced two First-round draft picks in Todd Helton (1995, Colorado Rockies), and R.A. Dicky (1996, Texas Rangers).

Rick Vanderhook is in his 12th season with the Titans as a coach. "Hook" will coach the outfielders and hitters, set the defense and handle third base coaching duties this year. "Hook" has coached two first-round draft picks (Dante Powell by the San Francisco Giants and Mark Kotsay by the Florida Marlins) and nine all-americans at CSUF since 1991.





If you want to be the best baseball player you can be, then learn how to properly condition for it. Workouts are comprehensive and scientifically based on an energetic, muscle and biomechanical analysis of baseball. Everyone has their own genetic ceiling and my goal is to show you how to reach it.

My program includes:

Strength Training: Working with weights will increase the kenetic and muscular **power** potential. This greater **power** will increase speed and hitting potential. Resistance training will also lessen the number and severity of athletic injuries and cut the rehabilitation time.

Flexibility: Will increase strength and elasticity of various muscle groups and allow the athlete full range of motion. Good flexibility helps to reduce injuries. A player that works out without stretching is inviting injuries.

Strength+Flexibility=Power.

Plyometrics: Is a supplemental training method that works on strength, speed and **power**. It is a series of low impact jumps and bounds that help produce great leg strength and **power**.

Aerobic Capacity: Ballplayers should build their aerobic capacity through distance running and stair master. This benefits overall stamina, joint strengthening and longevity in sports. Endurance training provides a base from which to build speed and agility.

Anaerobic Capacity: Speed training should be done two months before the season starts. A variety of drills can be used, but all be done with a visual cue to stimulate reaction time. Volume should be dependent on the condition of the athlete.

Sports Psychology: Baseball is a failure sport, which in turn puts a lot of pressure on the ball player to perform. If you do not understand about sports psychology, you will have a very hard time making it in baseball, especially at the higher levels. Baseball people do not want to know how to deal with success, but how to deal with failure.

Nutrition: Without the proper nutrition habits you will not be able to train or work on baseball skills at a level you need to reach your genetic ceiling. You are what you eat.

Rick Stassi begins his seventh season as the strength and conditioning coach for the Titan baseball program. Among his accomplishments, Stassi has trained over 200 professional baseball players, including nine No. 1 draft picks, and over 1000 collegiate baseball players.

He is also the strength and conditioning coach for the Seattle Mariners and Cypress College baseball teams.

Stassi received his bachelor's degree in kinesiology and health promotions in 1993 and recently earned his masters degree in 1997 from Cal State Fullerton.

Contrasting phrases heard around the Cal State Fullerton baseball diamond as the 1998 season approaches:

- Proven experience and depth in the outfield.
- No returning first-team all-conference players.
- A predominance of good, lefthanded pitching.
- · Lack of experience on the mound.
- · A balanced, effective lineup.
- The absence of a 20-home run bat in the lineup.
- Good overall team speed on the basepaths.
- A roster willing to understand the team concept and accept roles.
- The potential to be successful on a national level.
- A No. 10 national ranking in Collegiate Baseball is too high.
- A No. 30 national ranking by Baseball America is too low.

Second-year Coach George Horton and his staff have an interesting challenge in front of them as the Titans attempt to continue their outstanding baseball tradition. The ultimate goal is to return to the College World Series in Omaha and add to three national championship trophies. The

immediate goal is to distinguish the positives from the negatives and then magnify the former and eliminate the latter.

"There is a lot of newness to this team, which brings with it a lot of unanswered questions," said Horton during January practice sessions. "The most encouraging characteristic of this team is its responsiveness to any tasks presented to them. They are a fun group to work with and they like each other. But they haven't passed all the tests. When only nine guys are getting to play at a time, that's the true test of unselfishness and teamwork.

"The baseball talent is good enough to be successful on a national level. But will that potential be reached this year? Maybe next year? The biggest negative is that the separation of talent on the roster is not that clear cut. It's going to be difficult for us to make the decisions and then

for the players to understand those decisions. We will have to evaluate on a day-to-day basis.

"To have a special year, someone must emerge. Right now, there's not one or two players you can identify as 'the guy' each time he comes to the plate or goes to the mound. But some will emerge."

One thing is unmistakable. This team belongs to Horton

and his staff, led by assistants Dave Serrano, Rick Vanderhook and Mike Kirby. Only three players remain from former Coach Augie Garrido's 1996 roster.

"There is no confusion with that," said Horton. "This is a fresh start with what we think is a team with a lot of potential. The nucleus has national success in its future. They are made of the right stuff."

The pitching staff has almost all new faces while the outfield bears striking resemblance to the 1997 alignment. The infield is more a mixture of new and old.

Three-year letterman Scott Hild (Sr., Yorba Linda, Esperanza HS) and sophomore letterman Mike Garner (Fullerton, Fullerton HS) are the only returning Titan pitchers but the program got a huge boost with the transfer of Cal State Northridge veterans Benito Flores (Placentia, El Dorado HS) and Erasmo Ramirez (Santa Ana, Saddleback HS).

"All of our prominent pitching from last year is gone," admits Horton, who lost first-team All-Big West selections Matt Wise, Brian Tokarse and short reliever Mike Greenlee. "And most of the experience represented on the mound comes from two transfers who are now playing in a different uniform, in a different environment and against different

teams. We suspect they will handle it fine and that's their value to us. If Scott Hild returns to his sophomore form, we can become even more experienced," Horton added.

Flores was 11-3 and Ramirez went 11-5 for the Matadors in 1997. Their career records at CSUN were 19-7 and 25-7, respectively. Both are senior lefthanders whose expressed goals are to get an NCAA tournament berth and pitch in Rosenblatt Stadium.

Likely to join them in the starting rotation are freshman Jon Smith (Nuevo) from Perris High School and Hild, who is 15-8 in a variety of roles in three seasons for the Titans. The top relievers are expected to be freshmen Kirk Saarloos (Long Beach, Valley Christian HS) and Jason Stewart (Huntington Beach, Marina HS). Adam Johnson, another freshman from Torrey Pines High in San

Diego, will be a factor off his Fall performances if he can overcome back problems.

"The unique thing is, 'Where's the righthanded pitching?'," ponders Horton, who had only one southpaw (Garner) on his 1997 staff. "Of that top six, only Hild and Saarloos are righthanders. Someone will step up. Coach Serrano has done a good job of bringing the staff along. But

when they see different colored uniforms, how will they react? That's a part of the youth equation."

The outfield provides a much different quandry — no matter who is in the game," said Horton.

maybe too much proven talent with six experienced lettermen joined by some exciting newcomers.

"There will be some tough calls out there," said Horton. "We will have to be aware of the day-to-day battles and make the right choices. We had musical chairs in the outfield last year and while I hope not, it might be that way this year, too.

"It's changed from the Fall, but today I would say our opening day lineup would be **Steve Chatham** (Sr., Vista, Vista HS) in left, **Reed Johnson** (Soph., Temecula, Temecula Valley HS) in center and **Aaron Rowand** (Jr., Glendora, Glendora HS) in right. Our designated hitter will likely come from the outfield — **Greg Jacobs** (Jr., Anaheim, Cypress JC) against a righthander pitcher and **Pete Fukuhara** (Sr., Stanford, Canada IC) against a lefthander.


"That still leaves Chris Beck (Soph., Placentia, El Dorado HS), who could help us be a better team because of his athletic ability in center, but he hasn't been playing up to his April-May form of last year. Ryan Fullerton (Long Beach, Santa Ana JC) still hasn't come all the way back from his knee problem. And freshman Mike Tomarelli (Anaheim) from Canyon High is going to be a good player — he's just up against the numbers right now."

Chatham and Fukuhara were second-team All-Big West selections in 1997 while Rowand, a BWC honorable mention in 1997, is a second-team pre-season All-American for 1998 according to Baseball America. Jacobs was an All-American outfielder-pitcher last year for Cypress College.

The infield is equally competitive but less experienced. The headliners are Team USA invitees **Ryan Owens** (Soph., La Habra, Sonora HS) and catcher **Craig Patterson** (Soph., Fullerton, El Dorado HS) but the strength of the group is its


quality depth.

"It's very competitive and we expect it to function well no matter who is in the game," said Horton.

"Freshman David Bacani (Los Alamitos, Los Alamitos HS) is a tough guy to keep out of the lineup and Gaby Halcovich (Sr., Granada Hills, College of the Canyons) is a proven, effective player," said Horton. "He's a winner by all definitions." Freshman Jeremy Weinberg (La Habra, Sonora HS) is a good player at third base and Jojo Hernandez (Sr., Rowland Heights, Mt. SAC JC) is a solid lefthanded hitter at first. We would like to find a righthanded hitter for first base and could put Halcovich there or even Chatham, although he's never played the position before.

"Patterson is returning to form from his injury of last year but he's still not there yet. There are a lot of parallels there to Brian Loyd (1996 Olympian), but only time will tell. **David Trentine** (Sr., Santa Ana), a transfer from San Diego State, has performed well and it's nice to have a lefthanded hitting catcher. **Chad Baum** (Jr., Anaheim) from Santa ana College would be the third guy right now."

While Rowand is the closest thing to a bonafide power hitter (7 HR, 43 RBI in 1997), Horton expects to score runs with a balanced lineup that possesses more running speed than most Titan clubs of the recent past.


"Olszanski has the potential to be a Dante Powell or Jeremy Carr caliber base stealer," said Horton. "Reed Johnson is a great base stealer and Bacani has the potential to become one. Our slowest guy would be Duck, and he's not a slug. We expect to put pressure on the defense much of the

time. The key is balance. An effective lineup counts for consistency."

Fullerton's 1998 schedule is typically challenging with exclusively Div. I opponents. The season opens with three-game series against Pac-10 foes California and consensus national No. 1 Stanford. WAC powers Fresno State and UNLV and Southeastern Conference rising giant Alabama complete the February weekend schedule. There are several midweek games with local rivals USC, UCLA, Cal State Northridge, Pepperdine, LMU and USD scattered throughout the season.

The Big West schedule starts in March and again consists of 30 games featuring six more chapters of the love-hate relationship with Long Beach State. Fullerton is scheduled to host the 6-team post-season tournament May 14-17 for the automatic NCAA tournament berth. Ironically, the host team has yet to win any of the three previous Big West Tournaments.

WE MAKEA GREAT TEAM



The "George Horton Era" at Cal State Fullerton began in 1997 and the initial results were mixed. The Titans broke from the gate strongly under their new head coach but lost two series with rival Long Beach State to fall into a runnerup role in the South Divison of the Big West Conference. A lackluster overall record developed, Fullerton fell out of all the national polls and the seemingly annual trip to the NCAA Tournament was in jeopardy.

The stretch run, however, was vintage Titan baseball. Horton went with a defensive-oriented lineup in mid-April and Fullerton came alive with the bats as well. The Titans went on a 9-game winning streak and won 16 of their last 21 games including four come-from-behind wins in a row to capture the Big West Conference championship at Blair Field on May 18. The NCAA tourney berth arrived in the form of a No. 2 seed at Stanford but the Titans were eliminated after three games.

"I think it was mostly a period of adjustments," said Horton after accepting his first Big West championship trophy.

"There weren't a lot of changes from Coach (Augie) Garrido, but the players had to adjust to me and Coach (Dave) Serrano. We are not always as positive as Augie was and the players had to learn how to read us.

"The expectations might have been too high and they got frustrated and let if affect their play. Things started to change when everyone quit trying to do too much and just tried to contribute to the team effort."

The Titans won a season-opening series with traditional rival Stanford and impressively swept a 3-game series at Arizona to open with a 7-2 record. But they lost two out of three at Florida State to trigger a 4-game losing skid and they had to settle for a 12-8 record going into Big West Conference play.

Long Beach State won the rubber game of a 3-game series at Blair Field Mar. 7-9 on its way to a 14-1 start in Big West play and the Titans were doomed to play catch up all season.

A showdown series Apr. 11-13 at Titan Field provided Fullerton with an opportunity to take care of business itself. Matt Wise took a perfect game into the seventh inning of the series opener but only a 1-0 lead. An eighth-inning double and an infield single erased the shutout and the lead and the game was lost with two out in the ninth when Izzy Gonzalez hit a solo home

Long Beach handed starter Brian Tokarse his first loss of the year the next night, 13-7, and the 49ers had a 16-1 Big West record and a 6-game lead over the Titans in the South Division standings. Fullerton had a 4-game losing streak and its overall record was down to 22-18-1.

The Titan bats came alive on Sunday and Mike Greenlee held onto an 8-5 decision for Brandon Duckworth and there still was a glimmer of hope.

A second loss of the year to Pepperdine ace Randy Wolf followed and Horton decided to re-arrange his lineup for the New Mexico State series beginning on Apr. 18. It would prove a turning point.

With Ryan Owens at shortstop, Gaby Halcovich at second base and Jerome Alviso at third base, the Titans swept three games from the Aggies by a cumulative score of 44-13. Unfortunately, Halcovich suffered a season-ending knee injury but with Nakia Hill back in the lineup and Chris Beck now the regular centerfielder, the Titans logged an unlikely 3-game sweep at Nevada, the runaway winner of the North Division. A critical home win over UCLA, 11-8, and two more victories at Cal Poly ran the winning streak to nine games and pushed the overall record to 32-19-1, enough to keep the Titans in an NCAA at-large picture.

Cal Poly salvaged the final game of the series on an emotional Senior Day in San Luis Obispo to snap the Titans' winning streak. Concerns arose again when UC Santa Barbara's Brian Noyes handed Matt Wise another hard-luck loss, 2-1. But the Titans bounced back with 17-0 and 6-1 victories to take some momentum and a 34-21-1 record into the third annual Big West Conference post-season tourney.

Twice within two outs of elimination, the Titans staged a remarkable rally and won more impressively with each subsequent game. A dramatic 10-9 win in extra innings over Nevada was followed by an 8-5 win over Cal Poly in which the Titans twice came from behind. They beat Long Beach State, 7-2, and then embarrassed them by building a 15-1 lead on the way to a 15-6 verdict that secured an automatic NCAA bid.

At Stanford the Titans ran into Santa Clara lefthander Mike Frank. He not only pitched 8 innings of 3-hit shutout ball, but hit a 3-run home run to stake the No. 5-seeded Broncos to what proved to be an insurmountable lead on the way to a 5-0 victory.

Fullerton maintained its record of always winning at least one regional tournament game by outlasting Northeastern, 8-4, as John Alkire got a lot of support to pick up his second post-season victory. Steve Chatham, who had slumped in the Big West Tournament, had four hits.

The baseball adage about being a game of inches was never more clear than the next day, when the Titans were eliminated by Fresno State, 8-7. Pinch-hitter Ryan Fullerton's bid for ninthinning heroics instead became a game and season-ending double play when Bulldogs' third baseman Craig da Luz went behind the bag to make a fine backhanded play in a bases-loaded situation. The Titans finished 39-24-1 for a .617 winning percentage but had to watch Stanford advance to Omaha with the Titans watching the College World Series on TV for the second year in a row.

No All-American awards were bestowed on Titans for the first time in many years. Lamb, Alviso, Wise and Greenlee made the first-team All-Big West team with Chatham, Pete Fukuhara and Tokarse on the second squad. C.J. Ankrum and Aaron Rowand earned honorable mention.

Wise was the highest Titan draft pick, going in the sixth round to Anaheim. Others selected were Mike Lamb (Texas, 7th round), Tokarse (Anaheim, 11th round), Alkire (Detroit, 13th round), Ankrum (San Francisco, 13th round), Alviso (Colorado, 17th round) and Scott Seal (San Diego, 20th round).

Founded in 1969, the Big West Conference consists of universities in California, Nevada, Idaho, Texas, Utah and New Mexico after a move to 12 teams for the 1996-97 academic year.

Members are Boise State (no baseball), Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, Cal State Fullerton, Idaho State (no baseball), Long Beach State, UC Irvine (no baseball), New Mexico State, North Texas (no baseball), UC Santa Barbara, Utah State (no baseball), Nevada and Pacific.

With Cal Poly San Luis Obispo being the only new member to have baseball, the Big West Conference brought in Sacramento State as an affiliate member to make two four-team divisions: Cal State Fullerton, Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, Long Beach State and UC Santa Barbara in the Southern Division; Nevada, New Mexico State, Pacific and Sacramento State in the Northern Division.

Each team will play six games (three home, three away) against the other three teams in its division and three games against the teams in the other division with the sites alternating each year for a schedule of 30 conference games. The top six teams qualify for the post-season tournament with its winner receiving the automatic NCAA berth.

If birth certificates were give to conferences, the one issued to the then Pacific Coast Athletic Association would be dated July 1, 1969. However, the unofficial history of the conference pre-dates that point of time, extending back to 1967.

Cal State Los Angeles, Fresno State, Long Beach State and San Diego State were members of the California Collegiate Athletic Association, long recognized as the nation's premier college circuit.

That conference was classified college division and therein lay a major source of dissatisfaction. Beginning in 1963, the four institutions had captured 16 national titles. The number swelled to 21 if the mythical football championships were included.

With no more territory to conquer at the college division, a step up to university ranks had to be considered.

At the time, San Jose State, UC Santa Barbara and Pacific were members of the West Coast Athletic Conference but were enduring a strained relationship due to the limit of conference sports sponsored. That, plus the fact that national football figures UOP and SJSU were already competing as independents, led the schools to pursue a more broad-based conference alignment.

Therefore, officials of the seven colleges and universities assembled as a body in May of 1969, tied up loose ends and less than two months later the PCAA was born.

Direction in the early days of the conference came from such men as Dr. Stephen Goodspeed, vice-chancellor at UC Santa Barbara, the first president and chairman of the founders committee. J. Kenneth Fagans provided guidance as the league's first commissioner. Jesse T. Hill, one of the nation's most successful directors of athletics at USC, followed Fagans as the conferences's first full-time commissioner.

SJSU was already labeled a university division school in all sports when the PCAA emerged. San Diego State and UOP were granted university division status in 1970 and the remaining conference members shed the college division by 1972.

The conference's first 20 years were characterized by expansion and change.

The original PCAA lineup changed in the early years and by 1975, charter members UCSB and CSLA had dropped football and SDSU bolted the conference in football only. In 1974, Cal State Fullerton moved into the conference. By 1977, UC Irvine joined the Big West and UCSB was back in — both as non-football playing institutions — while Utah State became the first non-California member of the circuit, transforming the PCAA into a regional conference.

Nevada-Las Vegas (1981) and New Mexico State (1984) soon followed suit, bringing the league's membership to 10 universities.

In the fall of 1983, the PCAA became the first western conference to incorporate women's athletic programs into the conference. Charter women's members UC Irvine, UC Santa Barbara and UNLV competed in five championships.

By the end of 1985, Pacific, Hawaii, Cal State Fullerton, Long Beach State, San Diego State, Fresno State and San Jose State had joined the women's conference. The PCAA upped its women's sponsorship to eight championships.

The PCAA began its 20th year of existence by changing its name to the Big West Conference in 1988. With the inclusion of the states of Utah, Nevada, and New Mexico into the loop, the term "Big West" more accurately represented the conference. In addition, Fresno State left the conference and was replaced by the University of Nevada, Reno, in the fall of 1992.

The Big West Conference has had baseball teams advance to the College World Series in eight of the last 10 years and two Big West teams appeared in the 1988 and 1991 tournaments. In addition, college baseball's Player of the Year has come from the Big West in three of the past seven seasons.

Numerous major league players have come out of the PCAA and Big West. The most notable are: Cal State Fullerton - Tim Wallach, Brent Mayne and Mike Schooler; UNLV - Matt Williams, Cecil Fielder and Todd Stottlemyre; San Jose State - Mark Langston and Ken Caminiti; Long Beach State - Steve Trachsel and Randy Moffitt; Pacific - Joe Ferguson; UC Santa Barbara - Chris Speier; and UC Irvine - Brady Anderson.

The 1998 season marks the fourth year of the Big West post-season tournament. Fullerton and Long Beach State co-host the event which is held primarily at one campus in alternate years. In 1998, Long Beach State, if in the field and not seeded against Fullerton, will play its first round game at home on May 14. All other games will be played at Titan Field with the championship determined on Sunday, May 17.



California State University, Fullerton plays a major role in the intellectual, cultural and economic lives of Orange County.

Given the charge of teaching as a member of the state's three-tiered system of higher education, Cal State Fullerton does an exceptional job of educating the residents - and future - of Orange County. It prepares highly skilled and well-prepared university graduates.

Now in its 39th year, the university points proudly to its product, approximately 115,000 graduates. With 85 percent of them remaining within a


50-mile radius of campus, they occupy key spots in business, industry, government, the political arena and education.

The university - with its main campus in Fullerton and a branch in Mission Viejo - is one of the county's largest employers and purchasers. Its presence is a key factor in the prosperity and progress of this area. With more than 24,000 students currently enrolled and more than 2,200 faculty and staff employees, Cal State Fullerton impacts the community by approximately \$600 million annually.

With a mission of making learning preeminent, the university's 700 faculty members combine the best qualities of teaching and research universities to work in close collaboration with students and staff to expand knowledge. The instructional program is offered by seven schools: The Arts; Business Administration and Economics; Communications; Engineering and Computer Science; Human Development and Community Service; Humanities and Social Sciences; and Natural Science and Mathematics.

With full accreditation for its overall program, Cal State Fullerton has national recognition for its programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, computer science, dance, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing, teacher education and theater. In all there are 94 degree programs - with 44 of them at the graduate level - plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Students are provided the best of current practice, theory and research and integrate professional studies with preparation in the



arts and sciences. Through experiences in and out of the classroom, students develop the habit of intellectual inquiry, prepare for challenging professions, strengthen relationships to their communities, and contribute productively to society.

Cal State Fullerton is the most affordable and ethnically diverse university in the area. It ranks 16th nationally in the total overall number of minorities who graduate, with a ranking of 12th for both Asians and Hispanics (No. 3 for both in Communications and No. 4 for Asians in both Education and Business). In California, the univer-

sity is No. 1 for awarding undergraduate degrees in business and management to Hispanic and Native Americans, and communications degrees to Hispanic, Asian and Native Americans. A No. 2 ranking is held in California for undergraduate education degrees to Hispanic Americans.

An extended education program, with open enrollment, offers individual courses, seminars and workshops, as well as 31 certificate programs ranging from entrepreneurship and sales management to creative writing. Classes are held evenings and weekends both on-and off-campus.

Community members also may visit campus for theater, music and dance performances and art exhibits of off-campus artists, plus those of university students and faculty members. While here, both the Fullerton Arboretum and Heritage House are worth touring. And, an extensive recreation program is aimed chiefly at students, but is open to the public.

Volunteer opportunities are open through Cal State Fullerton's many support groups, such as the Art Alliance, Music Associates, Patrons of the Library and President's Associates. One such group, Continuing Learning Experience, holds many of its programs in the Ruby Gerontology Center, for which it spearheaded the fund-raising campaign. The center serves as an educational and research facility for the study of successful aging.

In less than four decades, Cal State Fullerton has taken its place as a primary force in the growth and prosperity of Southern California.

"What Exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that pop into the minds of media and fans when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, here are the recognized legends.

"It was the student's decision in a vote," explains Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname 'Titans.' "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body at the outset, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College. They voted to organize as a student body and to assess themselves a fee of \$10 per semester.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories where named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until, of course, the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest "happening" on the campus to this day. The "gag" attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became know that spring afternoon in 1962.


To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek. The costume that brings the elephant mascot to life also has changed. Tuffy even attracted a Tiffy in 1992.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was an appropriate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987. A change to a navy blue in uniforms and printing instead of the "reflex" blue of recent years was inititated in 1992 with a

de-emphasis of the orange, furthered by former athletic director Lynn Eilefson in the mid 1980s.

Finally, there is the matter of the school's name. The name originally for CSUF was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State College Boulevard.

To out-of-staters, the school's name causes confusion because most don't realize there are two distinct systems of higher education in the state - the University of California and the State University system. So, the school has been called everything from Cal-Fullerton to UC Fullerton to California State Fullerton State to simply Fullerton State. The preferred moniker is Cal State Fullerton, with no hyphens or commas, which is what most of the more than 100,000 graduates recognize. But since there are only two other major institutions known as Titans (University of Detroit-Mercy and Oral Roberts University), just call Fullerton teams the "Titans!"





DR. MILTON A. GORDON

PRESIDENT, CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on August 6, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for four years, as dean of the College of the Arts and Sciences for Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for six years.

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as mathematician at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences.

He is the vice chairman of the NCAA Presidents Commission and the California state representative to the American Association of State Colleges and Universities. He also serves on the governing boards of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, California Coalition for Mathematics, Orange County Chamber of Commerce, Orange County Community Foundation, United Way of Orange County, YMCA of Orange County and Fullerton Chamber of Commerce. In addition, he is on the advisory boards of St. Jude Medical Center and The California State University's Institute for Teaching and Learning.

The President has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of Louisiana.



JOHN EASTERBROOK

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR, CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON

John Easterbrook is in his fourth year in charge of the Cal State Fullerton athletic department, riding the momentum of a most noteworthy inaugural three years. Under his leadership, the Titans have come out in the black budgetarily and have had three teams advance to the NCAA quarterfinals led by the 1995 championship baseball team.

Easterbrook was appointed on September 1, 1994, by President Milton Gordon. He was chosen from a field of 41 candidates on the strength of his experience at a successful Division I program and his familiarity with the California State University system as an associate athletic director for nine years at Fresno State. Easterbrook, 58, was involved primarily in compliance, facilities and event management at Fresno State, which annually draws more than 500,000 fans to athletic events.

Easterbrook was hired at Fresno State by Dr. Gary Cunningham. The pair had crossed paths at the University of Wyoming in Laramie where Easterbrook was the president and chief executive officer of American National Bank and Cunningham was the UW athletic director.

Easterbrook previously coached college football for 13 seasons at Idaho, Oregon State, Illinois and Wyoming. He was a three-year starter at quarterback and also played two seasons of basketball at Illinois. He was the Most Valuable Player of the Copper Bowl. He earned a bachelor's degree (1961) in commerce and law and attended law school for two years before entering coaching.

The Champaign, Illinois, native and his wife, Cynthia, have three adult children and three granddaughters. John and his two sons are avid golfers.

McCARTHY

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETIC
ACADEMIC SERVICES

The Athletic Academic Services department was established at Cal State Fullerton to help ensure the academic success of intercollegiate athletes.

The mission of Athletic Academic Services, according to Director Christine McCarthy, is to provide academic and effective support services to help each student reach his or her academic goals.

"We want all of our student-athletes to benefit fully from his or her educational experience at Cal State Fullerton," said McCarthy.

The department's many programs and services are directly aimed at this goal. The office is responsible for academic advisement, coordinating study plans, class schedules, study skills workshops, tutoring, study hall, faculty and peer mentoring and referrals to the many campus services available.

The office is staffed by two full-time personnel in McCarthy, an Administrative Assistant Barbara Kempton and four half-time graduate assistants — Tammi Bories, Tish Van Bibber, Jason Cetak and Tim Hamel, who serve as academic counselors and peer mentors. Kempton has been at CSUF for over 30 years, and her knowledge of the campus and the athletics department is immensely valuable to student-athletes who may need help with adminstrative paperwork.

Coaches rely on Athletic Academic Services to track student-athletes' progress in classes and to alert them and the students to any potential problems. The department has an "Early Warning" system — periodic grade checks — in place which encourages faculty members to notify the office if a student is having problems with coursework and may require academic support.

Student-athletes at CSUF take an average of 4 1/2 to 5 years to graduate, and some of that success can be credited to Athletic Academic Services. The staff members assist with selecting and registering for classes, referring student to faculty advisors and tracking and evaluating their progress toward graduation. The office's services are available to all past and current student-athletes.


"Not all student-athletes are able to graduate in four years, because of professional opportunities or personal commitments," said McCarthy. "We developed a re-entry program for former student-athletes who wish to complete their studies, offering them the same services which were available to them when they competed for us."

The office of Athletic Academic Services helps stu-


dent-athletes feel comfortable in the CSUF environment and McCarthy's experience before coming to the department in July, 1992, helps the orientation process.

McCarthy received her masters degree in social science from Cal State Fullerton in 1987 and has been working in education since 1984. Previous to her appointment in athletics, McCarthy worked for three years as the Assistant Director of the Learning Assistance Resource Center at CSUF before budget cuts eliminated the department. At the LARC, she supervised 80 student employees who were responsible for the various tutorial, strategies classes, computer skills and study skill programs which were available for the university students.

Before coming to Cal State Fullerton, McCarthy was the director of student services at Western State University, College of Law, and before that was the director of student services at the University of Phoenix.

TITAN FIELD

The current Titan Field became the home of Cal State Fullerton baseball on Apr. 18, 1992, when the Titans swept a doubleheader from Loyola Marymount, 8-2 and 11-3. It is the third on-campus diamond to serve Cal State Fullerton, which also has played "home" games at city parks such as Amerige in Fullerton and Boysen in Anaheim as well as borrowing junior college fields at Fullerton, Rancho Santiago and Orange Coast Colleges during the installation of lights in 1983.

The first Titan diamond was laid out to the west of Titan House, located to the southeast of the current stadium. Home plate was in the southeast corner of the field plowed out of citrus groves. A new field was built around 1970 on today's site, but with home plate located where the current left field foul pole rises. The largest crowd to see a game at that field, with small portable bleachers and plenty of standing room, was estimated at 5,000 in 1979 when Fullerton hosted the University of Hawai'i and heralded pitcher Derek Tatsuno.

The current stadium boasts 1,540 permanent chairback seats with another 200 spots available on the concrete steps above each dugout. There is ample standing room around

the concourse to the left and right of the press box..

The first stage of the press box pavilion has been completed with the addition of permanent restrooms. The second stage involves the concession stands located in the pavilion with the final stage involving the building of the press box on top of the restrooms and concession stands.

No timetable has been set for the completion of the pavilion, along with additional seating to fit with plans for Cal State Fullerton to eventually host a regional.

Titan Field's playing surface sported a brand-new look for the 1996 season thanks in part to the efforts of the Sports Turf Managers Association led by Steve Guise. The organization donated materials and labor in rebuilding the pitcher's mound and batters' box, along with planting new grass in the outfield. Turface was added to the warning track.

Grass also is planted on the berms where future seating is to be located. Bushes were planted that will spell out "CSF" on the first base side and "Titans" on the third base side. Additional landscaping has been placed on the outside of Titan Field, including palm trees along the batting cages in left field.




