In 1946, Great Britain was in terrible shape. The war had just been won, but the economy was ruined.

I visited England in 1949 on a tour. The Brits we met said they were still in the midst of severe shortages of everything. One family of four was limited to one chunk of meat per week about the size of your fist. A tiny amount of butter per person, a small loaf of bread were all they could buy. Luxuries? Forget it.

Under these circumstances, it is a wonder that our film for August ever got made at all, much less in the grand style it did.

David Lean had directed three films prior to this, but his dream had been to do Dickens properly. "Great Expectations" was the vehicle for just that.

There was a stellar cast. You will recognize John Mills from "The Wrong Box" of April. You will always recognize Jean Simmons, here at age 18, unearthly beautiful as always. Other major stars include Ivor Bernard, Francis L. Sullivan and Finlay Currie as Magwitch. Oh, yes, you won't forget Alec Guinness as the insufferable Herbert Pocket.

Guy Green, the cameraman, won an Oscar for this film. You'll see why when you see the picture. Every frame could be an award winner. The moody shadows of the black-andwhite photography should put paid forever to the idea that a film must be in color to be attractive.


I had the great pleasure of meeting Mr. Green at a mutual friend's home some 20 years ago and for the next two hours was




David Lean, the director, would go on to direct "Bridge Over the River Kwai" and "Lawrence of Arabia." No need to elaborate on that.

Griffith Park Observatory better than ever today

I promised to write about the reopening of the Griffith Park Observatory. This is a little later than I planned, but here goes.

After five years and \$93 million, it is now open to visitors. The once-peeling exterior of the triple domed building has been completely restored, the exhibits have been updated and the floor space has been doubled by adding an underground level. It was a world-class facility when it opened in 1935, and it now has been brought into the 21st century.

The Zeiss telescope in the eastern dome is the same instrument that the estate of Griffith J. Griffith bequeathed to the city some 70 years ago.

"More people have looked into that telescope than any other telescope in the world," Observatory Director E.C Krupp stated.

The solar telescope, or coelostat, in the western dome funnels sunlight into the same vintage instruments that generations have used to safely view

the sun's fiery surface up close. The Foucault pendulum still swings in the center of the building beneath restored neoclassical murals by Hugo Ballin, and a bust of the late actor, James Dean, remains on the grounds where part of "Rebel Without A Cause" was filmed.

So much remains the same, but many new attractions have been added.

The observatory building has been expanded to 40,000 square feet and includes scale models of planets (including recently demoted Pluto) that hang in the bunker-like underground level, and exhibits on tides, optics, electricity and other natural phenomena line the corridors.

The projector that throws stars and planets onto the planetarium's domed ceiling has also been replaced with a newer model that can more accurately to replicate the heavens.

"The combination of old and new embodied in the renovated observatory continues Griffith's mission of helping people understand their place in the world through a knowledge in the stars," Krupp said.

New architectural and exhibit features designed to complement the existing art deco structure include updated and expanded interactive displays, larger observation terraces, a completely reconstructed and re-

envisioned planetarium dome and program, said to be the world's finest. The observatory's new Café at the End of the Universe is operated by Wolfgang Puck.

It's very difficult to give you a proper picture just writing about it. Go see it and take your grandchildren. I assure you it will be a trip well worth it.

Chuck Russell here in the Village gave me an article about original street names in Los Angeles, and I thought you might find it interesting.

In 1910, Hollywood Boulevard was named by Horace Wilcox when he bought 120 acres northeast of Los Angeles. It was developed and was called Hollywoodland. The developers put up a large sign on the hillside to promote the area. The "land" was eventually dropped.

Another street named Wilcox was named after the same man.

Cahuenga was an Indian settlement in the middle of the pass at the lower end of what would later become San Fernando Valley. Cahuenga was the site

of the Battle of Cahuenga. On January 13, 1847, the Treaty of Cahuenga was signed by General Pico and John C. Fremont. It ended the Mexican-American war in California and declared as part of the United States all land west of the Rocky Mountains, south of Oregon and north of Mexico. California officially entered the Union on April 4, 1850. A little history lesson here in case you have forgotten some of the facts. I had.

I have more streets to tell you about if you are interested. Please let me know at 383-0651.

Finally, I would like to tell you about some early names of towns in the San Fernando Valley. Reseda was originally Marion; Canoga Park was Owensmouth; and Northridge was Zelzah, then North Los Angeles. Girad became Woodland Hills, Winnetka was Weeks Colony.
