Dear Miss Morgan:

Please find enclosed check for \$20,000 for February.

In order to continue the \$20,000 it will be necessary for me to cut down the Slattery force to an absolute minimum. Part of the work that Slattery has been doing has already been transferred to Parks. The other part can be supervised by R. A. Clark's office without the retention of Mr. Slattery.

I think, as I have already said, it can be done just as well and more cheaply in this manner.

I hope to have the expenses of the domestic conduct of the house and of the garden cut down to \$5,000 or \$6,000 a month. All the rest is on Park's payroll, as I understand recent adjustments. If all the rest is not on Park's payroll it better be immediately transferred thereto.

Beginning the first of May we will, I hope, be able to loosen up a little.
