Dear sir:

During November of the year 1931 Mr. William Randolph Hearst contributed the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to the Monday Club of San Luis Obispo Building Fund.

The Monday Club of San Luis Obispo is a nonprofit sharing organization; any net earning not to pass into use or benefit of any private shareholder or individual whomever. No part of the activities of this club whatsoever is to be applied or concerned with carrying on propaganda of any nature. Political discussion is barred in the club.

Mr. Hearst's contribution was to the Building Club Fund, the purpose for which was solely to pay for the erection of the club house and its furnishings. Our club organized and is operated for charitable, literary and educational purposes.
