As president of the Village Farmers Club, Joe Foraker opened last September's meeting intending to be informational. In fact, his words were inspirational.

"I have macular degeneration," he said. "And I am going to be away for two months to learn how to live my life to the fullest."

Joe is now back from a rigorous residential program run by Veterans Affairs in Northern California, and he is sharing what he has learned. After all, age-related macular degeneration affects 1.75 million Americans now, and that number will nearly double in the next decade, according to the National Institutes of Health. That could be a lot of our neighbors.

money redecorating, repaving tennis courts and RV lots and buying new hobby equipment, fixing broken infrastructure should be more important and financially sound spending. Homeowners, you pay for all water. The price is rising. The wasted water today could be tomorrow's drinking water. This is just common sense! Demand the grass project and wasteful spending stop. We need to repair the infrastructure. That costs us money. That will add value to the whole community!





Take action if you feel threatened

One evening last month, a female resident was inside a supposedly safe area in the Recreation Center where she was shocked by a strange man, early middle-age, standing directly in front of her where he had no reason or right to be. Frightened and shaken, she departed as quickly as she could, intent only on reaching the comparative safety of her residence.

Without any further identification of the person or place, because that is not the point of this report, I traced her steps as she related the frightening incident. It was clear to me that what happened to her could have happened to any woman because the area in question has no obvious security other than the casual chance that somebody could have walked in or heard the

woman if she had created a disturbance.

But, that is too big a chance for any of us.

Frankly, I do not know how or if the security in the area could be enhanced without significant expense to the Village, an expense that may prove unacceptable or unavoidable.

The incident occurred on a Monday, the woman did not report it until the next day and did not inform a third party, other than family who does not live in the Village, until the following Thursday.

The Security Officer who took the report offered some consolation and casually said, according to the woman, and I paraphrase, "We will beef up security in that area." Beyond that, there was and is little more that can be done without a costly reconfiguration of our available security force.

No matter how protected or secure we may feel, and most of the time, with good reason, we are secure, we are also still part of a society, whether in or out of the Village, in which, increasingly, individual safety is threatened.

What can happen anywhere can happen here.

However, there is a caution in this story: If you encounter anything out of the ordinary, anything that feels threatening, call the Main Gate, call the Administration (start with our new Chief of Security Manny Segovia), but report any breach of security immediately!

Our best defense is an alert citizenry and an informed Administration and Security & Safety organization. However, they can only know what we tell them, and we must tell them as soon as anything happens that threatens our safety and security.

Realtors Corner: Tax credit for homebuyers has been extended

Good news for consumers and the housing market: Recovery has been announced. The U.S. Senate and House of Representatives voted to extend the homebuyer tax credit, expanding the parameters to include existing homeowners and not just first-time buyers.


It is expected that the federal tax credit will be extended through April 30, 2010, with a 60-day extension if a binding contract is in place prior to the deadline. First-time buyers will continue to be eligible for a tax credit of up to \$8,000, while existing homeowners will be eligible for a reduced credit of up to \$6,500. Existing homeowners must have lived in their current residences for at least five years. Under additional provisions, taxpayers can claim the credit on purchases completed in 2010 on their 2009 income tax returns.

Nationwide, more than 1.4 million first-time homebuyers were given the opportunity to become homeowners as a result of the federal tax credit.

"About four years ago when my wife Marilyn and I were driving to Kansas to visit family, I saw a car in front of me divide in two, then rejoin as one. I thought I was just tired "

Later. Joe learned those visual tricks are symptoms of the eve disease sent by the brain. Because the deteriorating retina transmits incomplete visual signals, the brain misfires, so to speak, resulting in the hallucinations.

'In the program," Joe adds, "I found my classmates (there were 33) had the same hallucinations or lost thoughts. Sometimes I am talking away and suddenly the word I wanted is gone. Now I understand that deficit."

Joe's mission in the pro-

gram was to understand and meet the challenges of macular degeneration. Each day began at 6 a.m., with classes starting right after breakfast for example, classes in mobility, because, as Joe notes, "When you're over 70, with macular degeneration, if you aren't prepared, you can fall and break bones.'

Joe also noted, "The traditional white cane gets results in the world. And so does a nine-power telescope. I wear it on my belt and I can read street or business signs."

Joe and his classmates were taught that life with serious deficits is not over; it just requires a new route. The Don't Give Up Class showed them how to do things they'd never attempted before, yet accomplished now with limited (or no) sight. Joe made an intricate wallet out of a plain piece of leather. He also mastered a scanning machine

that reads out loud whatever printed material is inserted into it. Among numerous helpful aids from Veterans Affairs, Joe has a talking calculator and a device that tells him the color of clothing it touches.

Of course, Joe Foraker's life is much different than it was. For example, he now wears sunglasses outdoors most of the time to stave off painful sun glare. Sometimes people seem annoyed when they say "Hi, Joe," and he doesn't answer quickly. It's because he can't see well enough to recognize them.

"But I have retained much of my independence," says Joe. "Despite serious deficits, you can find the resources and support programs. I want to share that with others. I wake up most mornings feeling fortunate, especially for my supportive wife."


His talks are translated into more than 70 languages and are shown worldwide on the TV series, "Words of Peace."
