In response to a directive from the Chancellor's office, the President has appointed a campus wide committee, under the leadership of Joanne Coville, vice president for Finance and Administration, to develop a plan to ensure the maintenance of critical University operations when confronted with adverse events such as natural disasters, technology failures, human errors, or terrorism. Among the risks that will be addressed is the potential of any future pandemics including the Avian (Bird) Influenza. As mentioned in today's reminder section there is a special symposium today from 12:30 – 5:30 p.m. in the Aliso Hall Auditorium on this specific topic as well as others.

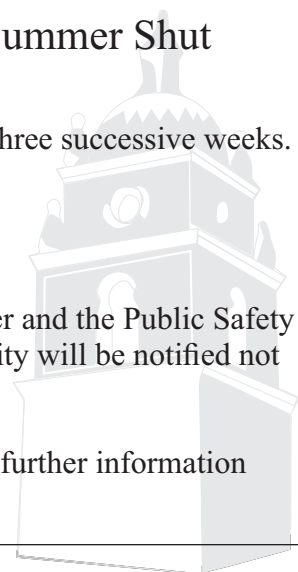
