- Tiffany Boyd, Sr., Pitcher, Named First-Team All-American the last two years, in 1992 finished 30-7 with a 0.75 ERA, finished tied for fourth in the nation with most victories and 13th in strikeouts per seven innings (7.4). Named Big West Pitcher of the Year for the second straight time and led the conference in wins, strikeouts (297) and strikeouts per seven innings. Her 297 season strikeouts is a career-high and second in the Titan record book. Named First-Team All-Big West and First-Team All-West Region the last two years. Named Big West Pitcher of the Week a conference-high three times.

- Denise DeWalt, Sr., Shortstop, Named Third-Team All-American and Big West Conference Field Player of the Year. Led the Big West in batting average (.377, 83-220) and hits (83). Named First-Team All-Big West and First-Team All-West Region.

Named Field Player of the Week a conference-high three times.

- Marci White, So., Third base, Named First-Team All-Big West Conference as only a freshman. Finished ninth in the Big West in hits (54) which was second best on the Titans. Tied on the squad with most RBI (20) and home runs (3) and second in assists (115) and had a .898 fielding percentage. Named Second-Team All-West Region.

- Cheryl Longeway, So., Pitcher, Named Big West Pitcher of the Week on May 4, 1992. Finished sixth in the Big West in ERA (0.89) and eighth in innings pitched (212.7). Had a 15-13 record with 149 strikeouts. Pitched two victories over Toledo (1-0)

and Long Beach State (3-2, 11 innings) at NCAA Regionals.

# Cal State Fullerton Campus



California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 24,500 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes; some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 700-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told there are 91 degree programs - 41 of them at the graduate level - plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without

the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally-known professional artists to CSUF for residencies and public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups. Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which has spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

Further examples of community outreach are the Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience support group.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the opening of a Marriott hotel on campus in 1989, the University and the city of Fullerton opened the Titan Sports Complex in 1992. A 10,000-seat multipurpose stadium, an adjoining baseball stadium and a separate track facility are newly completed features of the complex. (See page 21 for more details on the Sports Complex)

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, CSUF has embarked on a comprehensive fund raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great institution.

# 993 Season Preview

In athletics, success is measured by wins and losses. With that being the case, Cal State Fullerton has been one of the most successful collegiate women's softball programs in the country. In 13 seasons, Head Coach Judi Garman and the Titans have amassed a record of 657-195-4 for an outstanding .771 winning percentage. Last season Cal State Fullerton finished 45-20 overall and 25-11 (second place and one game behind Fresno State) in the nationally prominent Big West Conference and ranked fifth nationally. As they have every season, The Titans qualified for postseason competition and were only one step away from the College World Series when they were eliminated by Long Beach State in the NCAA Regionals.

Success for the Titans in 1993 won't just be measured by their final record, but by whether or not Cal State Fullerton is playing in Oklahoma City the last weekend in May. Coming into the new season, Garman feels that this is the team that will return the Titans to the College World Series for the first time since 1987.

In the past five seasons, the Titans have been one step away from the College World Series but have been unable to win a regional and advance. Garman feels that last year's team didn't understand what it took to win the "Big Games."

The 13 returning players realize that if they are to make the big road trip to

Oklahoma City something has to change in 1993.

'Last year we thought we were doing well and we were content to play at that level. When we really had to turn it up, we didn't know how to do it," said Garman. "In every game this year, the goal is not to let the other team take it away from us."

In 1993, Garman will have a good mixture of experienced players and new recruits. The team will be anchored by two seniors who were 1992 All-Americans - pitcher Tiffany Boyd and shortstop Denise DeWalt. Boyd was named First-Team All-American, Big West Pitcher of the Year, First-Team All-Big West and First-Team All-West Region the last two seasons. She went 30-7 with a 0.75 ERA in 1992. She tallied a career-high 297 strikeouts which is second in the Titan record book. Boyd finished tied for fourth in the nation with most victories and 13th in strikeouts per seven innings (7.4) and was named conference Pitcher of the Week a record three times. Immediately following the season, she again had surgery on her right knee, but Garman looks for her to be at full strength when the 1993 season opens.

"There is not as much of a concern this year about Tiffany's health." said Garman, "Last year we knew that she was still hurting going into the season. This

year she says for once there is no pain in her knee.

DeWalt, a Third-Team All-American, led the Titans and Big West in most offensive categories. Her 83 hits and .377 batting averageled the conference. She also tallied 20 RBI, scored 29 runs and tallied 11 extra base hits. DeWalt is an all around player who hits well and plays good defense. She was named First-Team All-Big West, First-Team All-West Region and conference player of the week a record three

"We just hope Denise doesn't wake up from the dream season she had last year," added Garman.

Defensively, the Titans have a very solid infield. As a freshman in 1992, Marci White earned First-Team All-Big West honors and was named Second-Team All-West Region at third base. White batted .266 with 20 RBI and led the team with three home runs.

"Marci has confidence now," said Garman. "I look for her to have a good year." First base will be shared by sophomore Rose Garces and junior Kelly Hunt. Garces hit .219 last year with 17 RBI and 11 extra base hits and she had a fielding

Hunt had a down year by her standards, hitting .197 with 12 RBI, but she hit two

home runs and had a .976 fielding percentage.

"If we can get Kelly and Rose going offensively, we will have a very potent tandem," said Garman.

Second base this year will be played by Laurie LoForti, a sophomore who redshirted last season following a knee injury sustained in fall practice. LoForti transferred from West Valley College in San Jose where she hit .406 with 33 RBI, 14 extra base hits including two home runs. She had a fielding percentage of .955.

"Laurie watched all last year, so she knows how our system works," said Garman. "It's not like she's a new player coming in because her timing is way ahead."

Rounding out the infield will be sophomore catcher Shannon Dolan. Last year she had 12 RBI on 14 hits - three of those were extra base hits - and had a .984 fielding

"Shannon really surprised us last year with her consistency. She is a good

catcher and she can play some infield, too," said Garman. The outfield will be covered by several different returning and new players in 1993 due to injuries acquired during the 1992 season. Junior Melissa Hadfield returns after having shoulder surgery after last season. Junior speedster Jstone Vines gained some experience last year along with sophomore Heidi Robertson. Sophomore Tracie Noggle, who saw some action last season in the infield, may play the outfield as well in 1993.

Vines has spent the fall working on putting the ball into play, in order to use her outstanding speed.

"Istone improved a lot defensively last year. This year we hope that she can get herself on base more frequently," said Garman.

Robertson appeared in 57 games, hitting .269 with a team leading nine stolen

"Heidi lacked experience, but still got on base a lot for us last year," said Garman, "With Chenita Rogers' help, we expect her to improve defensively."

The pitching staff is more a "staff" this year with the return of Ann Van Dortrecht and junior transfer Michele Shanks to team with sophomore Cheryl Longeway and Boyd.

Longeway had a solid freshman year, going 15-13 while striking out 149. She combined with Boyd last year to set a new CSUF record for season strikeouts with 446. Longeway was named Big West Pitcher of the Week on May 4, 1992, and finished sixth in the Big West with a 0.89 ERA. Her two no-hitters last year rank tied for fourth in the CSUF record book for career no-hitters. She's tied with teammate Boyd.

"Cheryl really pitched well for us the last half of the season. She worked very hard learning the change up, and now it is her best pitch," said Garman.

Senior Van Dortrecht attempted to return in 1992 following shoulder surgery, but was unsuccessful. Additional shoulder surgery was performed and after redshirting in 1992, she looks to be back in her old form. In 1990 she was named Second-Team All-America and finished 29-12 with a 0.43 ERA. In 1991 Van Dortrecht was named Second-Team All-Big West going 17-4 with a 1.00 ERA.

Freshman Traci Fischer, who redshirted last season after tearing ligaments in her left elbow in a game against UC Santa Barbara, will return to play infield for the Titans.

Four new players join the Titan roster this season: juniors Tammy Fa'agata, Shanks and freshmen Miki Mangan and Jennifer Crafton.

Fa'agata is an outfielder who transferred from Palomar College where she hit .394 with 36 RBI's and nine homeruns.

"Tammy hits the ball as hard as anyone so she will add some power to our lineup," said Garman. "She also has good speed in the outfield."

Shanks is a transfer from Long Beach City College where she was an outstanding pitcher. In 1992 she was 7-3 with a 0.36 ERA and 102 strikeouts.

"We are impressed by the fact that she throws hard and has good ball movement. She has potential for improvement and we think she will surprise people in 1993," said Garman.

Mangan comes from Camarillo High School where she was the varsity catcher in each of her four years.

"Miki is a very talented athlete who will help in the outfield as well as at catcher," said Garman. "She has a good arm and she hits the ball with authority." Crafton is an outfielder who comes from El Segundo High School.

"Jennifer lacks experience but she has very good speed which is always a good asset," said Garman.

Lost from last year's team are four starters in outfielders KC Clark and Jennifer Shuey, catcher Kim Powers and second baseman Karin Knoop. Powers was named First-Team All-Big West last year and Field Player of the Week twice and Clark made the honorable mention squad.

Rogers joins the coaching staff this year to work with the outfielders. As an outfielder for Cal State Fullerton in 1986 and 1987, Rogers won All-America honors in both seasons. She spent the last few years coaching at Sacramento City College and at Valencia High School in Placentia. Coupled with eighth year CSUF Assistant Coach Kathy Van Wyk, who was an All-American pitcher in 1982 for the Titans, Fullerton has an All-American coaching staff.

Garman feels that this team has great potential. She says that the lineup is solid defensively and that they will hit with more power. With a clear focus on a common

goal, and a good work ethic, success is just around the corner.
"This is the year," said Garman. "We had a great year last year, better than many people expected, but if we don't go to Oklahoma City this year..."

Annually the NSCA (National Softball Coaches Association) honors the top collegiate softball student-athletes with a selection to the NSCA All-American Teams. Softball Head Coaches choose three teams - First, Second and Third Teams with 13 athletes on the First and Second Teams and 15 on the Third Team. The NSCA All-American teams are announced every year in the end of May at the College World Series in Oklahoma City, OK. Cal State Fullerton's All-American history is deep. Nineteen different players, under the direction of 14th-year Head Coach Judi Garman, have won such prestigious honors. Only one Titan, first baseman Sue Lewis, won the honor three seasons (1981, 1982 and 1984). Three Titans have won All-American honors twice: pitcher Susan LeFebvre (1983 and 1986), outfielder Chenita Rogers (1986 and 1987) and pitcher Tiffany Boyd (1991 and 1992).



When the Titans defeated the UC Santa Barbara Gauchos back on April 26, 1992, 4-3 in 12 innings, Cal State Fullerton Head Coach Judi Garman became the first softball coach in NCAA history to attain 650 career wins at the Division I level. This coaching milestone is significant in that she achieved it in only 13 seasons at the Titan helm. Garman ended the season with 657 wins. Next in line with the most Division I softball victories is UCLA's Sharon Backus with 650, which she has earned in 17 seasons.

In her 13 seasons at Cal State Fullerton, Judi Garman has led the Titans to no worse than a ninth-place national finish and an NCAA National Championship in 1986. Garman is the only coach in the program's history and has accumulated 868 career victories (includes Golden West College career), which is more wins than any other collegiate softball coach.

Garman established the CSUF softball program in 1980 and finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth nationally. Since then, Garman's teams have won eight conference titles and six out of 13 regional championships while finishing second in the College World Series in 1981, 1983 and 1985; third in 1982 and 1987 and winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.

Since the conference became the PCAA in 1986 and Big West in 1989, Garman has tallied an impressive overall record of 355-111-2 (.762) and 177-61-2 (.744) record in conference games. During those seven years, the PCAA and Big West have been among the nation's elite. That was no exception last season, as the Big West qualified two teams to the College World Series - Long Beach State and Fresno State.

Garman's tremendous success at Fullerton is only the latest in a remarkable string of accomplishments which stretch across the continent from Canada to Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach to Cal State Fullerton.

Garman earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1966 and moved to California where

she began working on her master's degree at UCSB. While at Santa Barbara, she started club softball and soon had a varsity team. Upon completion of her studies, she took the women's athletic director position at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached the volleyball, basketball and tennis programs in addition to softball.

Garman moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79). Garman coached the Rustlers' softball team to an unprecedented four consecutive national championships (1975-78) while compiling a record of 211-40 (1972-79). Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions. Due to those outstanding feats at GWC she was named to the California Community College Hall of Fame in 1992.

Very involved professionally, Garman served a twoyear reign as president of the National Softball Coaches Association from 1990-1991. Each year she hosts clinics which bring over 200 coaches and 1,500 players to the campus. Additionally, she has produced highly successful pitching video tapes with acclaimed pitching coach Don Sarno.

In February, 1991, Garman was honored at the Fifth Annual National Girls and Women in Sports Luncheon sponsored by the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles for her contribution to collegiate athletics in Southern California.

A popular speaker at clinics around the country, Garman has also made numerous trips abroad to Holland, Italy, Czechoslovakia and Japan. She runs a camp each summer in Italy. Many Titans have had the opportunity to play overseas because of these contacts.

Fishing and snow skiing in Aspen, CO, occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has numerous business interests and is actually involved in running a family business in Canada that manufactures moccasins.

### Assistant Coach Kathy Van Wyk

Returning to Cal State Fullerton for her eighth season as a coach is Kathy Van Wyk, a former softball player at Fullerton.

Van Wyk, 32, was the CSUF assistant coach from 1983 to 1987 and a part of the 1986 national championship team. After leaving Fullerton, Van Wyk became a private pitching instructor at Rod Carew's Baseball School in Anaheim from 1987 to 1989. She then went to Azzano Decimo, Italy, to coach the Azzanase Softball Club. Recently, she completed production on four instructional video tapes on pitching and catching. From January to March, 1990, she was the pitching coach for the Walkerville Softball Club in Adelaide, South Australia.

A Titan pitcher in 1982, Van Wyk finished 35-1 (35 wins is a school record and .972 winning percentage is an NCAA record) with an ERA of 0.18 and earned AIAW/NCAA All-American honors and won the Broderick Award, which honors the most outstanding collegiate softball player. She also was named WCAA All-Conference, Orange County Athlete of the Month, PONY All-Tournament pitcher and she won an NCAA post-graduate scholarship with a 3.43 grade point average. Her 1982 stats included 4 no-hitters, back-to-back perfect games, 27 shutouts, 278 innings pitched, 270 strikeouts and 6 one-hitters.

Van Wyk began her college softball career at Texas Women's University. At TWU, she was named 1979 Texas AIAW Player of the Year, along with many other honors. She transferred to CSUF in 1981 after TWU dropped softball.

A 1983 graduate of Fullerton with a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education, Van Wyk is currently working on her master's degree in PE at Azusa Pacific.



### Assistant Coach Chenita Rogers

Joining the coaching staff this year and returning to Cal State Fullerton is former Titan softball player Chenita Rogers. Rogers will spend most of her time working with the outfielders. She replaces Linda Shafor, who retired last spring.

As an outfielder for the Titans, Rogers won First-Team All-American honors in 1986 as a part of the national championship team and in 1987. She is one of only four Cal State Fullerton players to have won that honor twice. In 1990 she was named to the NCAA All-Decade team.

She was named a First-Team ASA All-American in 1990 as a member of the Invasion and has competed for USA national teams in China and New Zealand.

Since leaving Cal State Fullerton, Rogers has been an assistant coach at Sacramento City College and head softball and girls junior varsity basketball coach at Valencia High School in Placentia.

Rogers is currently working on a bachelor's degree in sociology at Cal State Fullerton.



# Women's Trainer Julie Max

Now entering her fourteenth year with her alma mater, women's trainer Julie Max plays a major role in the CSUF women's softball program as well as all nine of the university's women's sports programs.

In June 1990, Julie was elected to the office of district director - representing California, Nevada and Hawaii in the National Athletic Trainers Association. Currently, Max is serving as vice-president of NATA - it is the third highest position in NATA behind executive director and president and she is the first woman to do so.

Max has been recognized in the past on the national level for her outstanding abilities including serving as the administrative coordinator for volleyball and fencing at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles.

She earned her Bachelor's degree from Cal State Fullerton in 1978 and received a Master's of Education with an emphasis in PE at Azusa Pacific University. Max became a Certified Athletic Trainer following graduation in 1979 and is also a Certified Emergency Medical Technician.



# Dedication to Linda Shafor



The departure of assistant coach Linda Shafor has left a hole in the Cal State Fullerton outfield this season.

In her eight seasons as an assistant softball coach at Cal State Fullerton, Shafor redefined dedication.

She was not paid for her work as the outfield coach yet she juggled her full-time job as a college professor in order to be with the Titans as much as possible. And her enthusiasm for coaching and for softball greatly benefitted Fullerton's program.

"There's no coach who cares more for her athletes than Coach Shafor does," said Titan Head Coach Judi Garman. "Her outfielders

always felt special and her love for the game was apparent."

Affectionately called 'Shaf' by coaches and players, Shafor would never be on the field without her trademark little pink bat that she used to run her outfielders all over the field. She'd hit fly balls to them and watch the plays, making sure her players followed fundamentals. Even though she has a vision problem, Shafor always seems to pick out a particularly bad or good play.

"If someone made a really bad fundamental play, 'Shaf' would go ballistic, and if someone made a great play, you could hear her all over the

stadium," Garman said.

Shafor wasn't always able to make practice but she had her reasons. Last season, she'd teach all day at L.A. Harbor College, get in her car and drive an hour to Fullerton, coach three hours and drive back to L.A. Harbor to teach a night class. But what 'Shaf' missed in quantity, she made up for in quality.

Shafor coached three All-American outfielders (Chenita Rogers in 1986 and 1987; Carey Hess in 1989 and Mich DeBree in 1991) and her expertise and passion for the game pushed Cal State Fullerton to higher levels of excellence than what would've been possible without her. Garman credits Shafor with establishing a Titan tradition of excellence in the outfield and believes that without her help, Cal State Fullerton would not have enjoyed the success it did.

Excellence is the only goal Shafor has for her players and she often

expresses her feelings very clearly.

"She ranted and raved all the time," Garman said. "But she has a heart of gold. Of the eight seasons Shafor coached, six times she said she couldn't take it anymore, that the kids were driving her crazy," Garman

said. "But each time, come June or July, she'd call up and ask when practice started."

But that's 'Shaf.'

Shafor was the head softball coach at L.A. Harbor from 1971 to 1979. She was an assistant at Arizona for a year before coming to CSUF in 1980. After that season, she left the Titans until 1986, the year Cal State Fullerton won the NCAA National Softball Championship.

Time commitments at L.A. Harbor College have forced Shafor to forego coaching this season, but her legacy here at Cal State Fullerton goes on

The new Titan outfield coach is Chenita Rogers - the first and only two-time All-American Shafor coached.







# 1992 Season Review



With a sweep of the Big West Conference individual honors in 1992, the Titans, behind Big West Pitcher of the Year and First-Team All-American Tiffany Boyd and Big West Field Player of the Year and Third-Team All-American Denise DeWalt, qualified for the NCAA Softball Playoffs for the 11th consecutive season. This makes for the 13th season overall the Titans have qualified for post-season play. Unfortunately, conference-rival Long Beach State kept the Titans from making the College World Series by winning the regional tourney.

The Titans, ranked fifth nationally, finished 45-20 overall and 25-11 in the Big West Conference, in second place only one game behind Fresno State. After finishing third in the conference the last two seasons, the Titans and Head Coach Judi Garman were elated to finish only one game out of first place in the best conference in the country. The Big West had the most 1992 NCAA playoff teams with six.

DeWalt, the shortstop, led the conference in batting average, hits and runs. She was named First-Team All-Big West Conference and conference Field Player of the Week a record three times. Her hit total in 1992 was third best in school history. DeWalt was the offensive power behind the Titans leading the team in almost every offensive category.

Another 1991 First-Team All-American, Boyd finished last year with a record of 30-7 and a 0.75 ERA. She was named First-Team All-Big West Conference and Pitcher of the Year for the second straight season. Her season highlights included a 20-game win streak, which ranks tied for third best in the NCAA record book; being named Big West Pitcher of the Week a record three times and leading the Titans to the PONY Championship as she pitched six of the Titans' seven victories including the 2-1 (in 12 innings) victory over Arizona in the final. Another highlight for Boyd was on April 5, when the Titans defeated the Pacific Tigers, 2-1 in 12 innings, and she collected a career-high 16 strikeouts. Boyd finished 1992 ranked fourth in the country in wins and 13th in strikeouts per 7 innings with 7.4. She led the Big West in wins, strikeouts (297) and strikeouts per 7 innings. Her season strikeout total is second best in the Titan record book and she trails only Terry Keasling, who tallied 328 K's in 1981. Her victory total is fourth best.

Also named First-Team All-Big West for the Titans in 1992 were third baseman Marci White and designated player and catcher Kim Powers. Outfielder KC Clark was named honorable mention.

White, as only a freshman, finished ninth in the Big West in hits (54), which was second best on the Titans. She was tied on the squad for most RBI (20) and home runs (3) and was second in assists (115) and had a .898 fielding percentage. White was named Second-Team All-West Region.

Powers hit a career-high .263 and fnished second on the squad in doubles (8), plus tallied 11 runs, 36 hits, 7 RBI and one home run. Powers was twice named Big West Field Player of the Week.

Another senior providing stability and leadership was Clark. She finished second on the team and tied for eighth in the Big West in runs (24). She tied for second in triples (3) and was third on the team in hits (49) and stolen bases (5) while hitting .241.

Other personal accolades from the season included Garman becoming the first NCAA coach to attain 650 Division I wins. She reached this coaching milestone on April 26, when the Titans defeated UC Santa Barbara, 4-3 in 12 innings. She ended the season with 657 career wins, the most in the NCAA.

Freshman pitcher Cheryl Longeway (15-13, 0.89 ERA) had the Titans' only no-hitters of the season. Her first no-hitter was also the first win of her Titan career with a 1-0 victory over Oregon State in the UNLV Spring Fling Tournament on Feb. 28. The second no-hitter came against New Mexico State, as the Titans routed the Roadrunners, 10-0. With two career no-hitters, Longeway's total ranks fourth best in school history and ties her with teammate Boyd.

The 1992 season started on a winning note when the Titans shut out Ohio State, 4-0, at the Arizona Tournament in mid-February. The winning ways continued and the longest win streak of the year was 11 games which included the 7-0 record and PONY Tournament championship for the second straight year.

Following the PONY tournament, a tired CSUF softball team went to play at Big West rival Fresno State. The teams split with CSUF winning game No. 1, 2-0, and barely losing in game No. 2, 2-1.

The Titans hosted Fresno State on May 3 for the conference lead. Fullerton won the first game, 3-2 in 21 innings. Following that five and half hour game, the Titans came back and won again, this time 2-1.

Two of the Titans' victories last season came on national television. On March 11 at the Titan Softball Complex, the Titans defeated conference-rival Long Beach State, 3-0, and that victory aired on ESPN. On April 21, SportsChannel aired the Titans' 1-0 win over the 49ers in Long Beach.

The Titans ended the 1992 regular season with a five-game win streak. The streak started on May 2 with a shutout, 3-0, over Pacific and continued with sweeps of Fresno State on May 3 and at UNLV (2-1, 5-0) on May 9.

At regionals at the Titan Softball Complex, Fullerton defeated the Toledo Rockets in game No. 1 by the score of 1-0 when Boyd hit a home run in the bottom of the ninth. In game No. 2, the Titans defeated Long Beach State, 3-2, in 11 innings when

Shannon Dolan singled home Rose Garces. However, the following day, the Titans lost two close games to the 49ers and did not make the annual trip to Oklahoma City.



# The Titan Softball Complex




Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the opening of a Marriott Hotel on campus in 1989, the university and the city of Fullerton opened the Titan Sports Complex in 1992. A 10,000-seat multipurpose stadium for football and soccer, an adjoining baseball stadium, renovations at the Titan Softball Complex, new tennis courts and a separate track facility are newly completed features of the complex. On April 18, 1992, the Titan baseball team played its first doubleheader at Titan Field and defeated Loyola Marymount, 8-2 and 11-3. The official 'Grand Opening and Dedication' of Titan Field was held on May 4, 1992. That night CSUF alumnus Kevin Costner threw out the first pitch in a "Field of Dreams" night, as the nationally ranked Titan baseball squad defeated cross-county rival UC

Irvine, 8-2. The first football game in Titan Stadium was on September 5, 1992, as the Titans defeated Cal State Northridge, 28-7, before a record home opener crowd of 8,279. The first event in Titan Stadium was commencement exercises last May. President Milton A. Gordon conducted several ceremonies for the class of '92. (See picture on top left)




