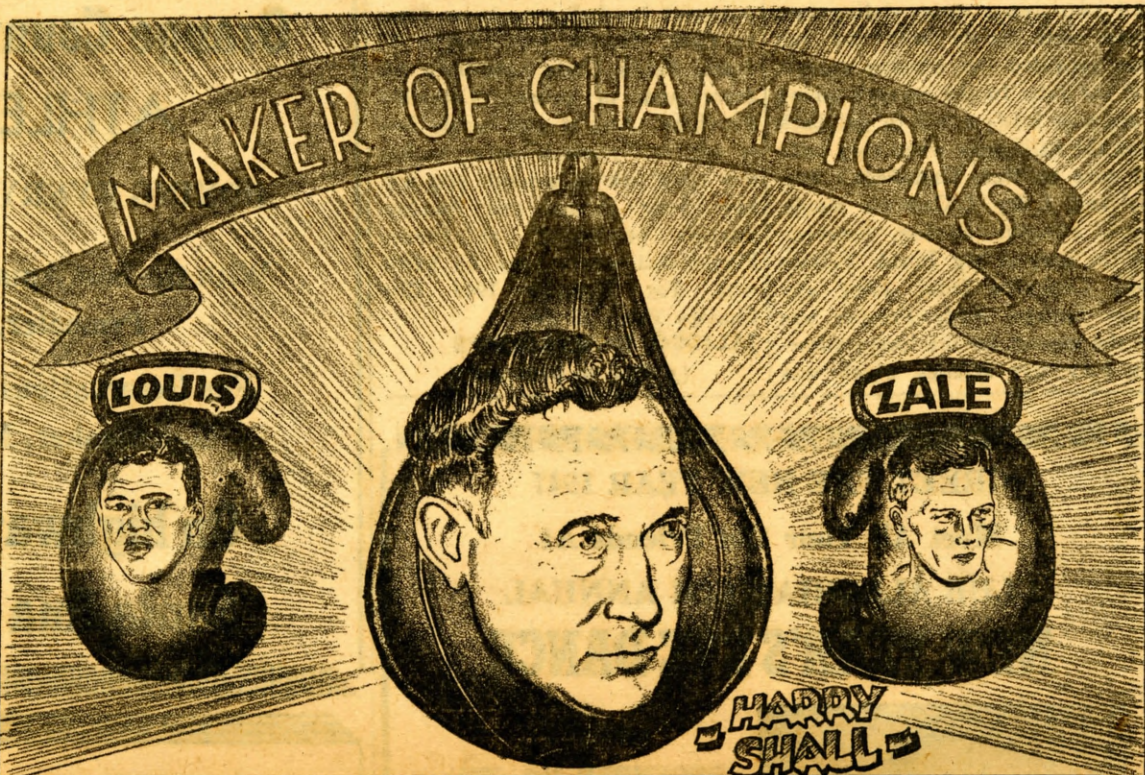
The kids first pro fight was a semi-windup against veteran Bert White. He chalked up an easy win, and since then has yet to meet up with his match. Against Bobby Jackson, his last fight, Fabela turned in such a grand performance that he is now the No. 1 ring idol of little Mexico. Most of his admirers are claiming a ring title for him in the coming year.

Second only to Chavez is Sacramento's Jess Flores, who in his 49th battle fought Enrique Bolaños to a draw. This Mexican lightweight has yet to meet his first defeat, and with little more experience should develop into championship timber.

Not very far behind we find Rudy Cruz. This young Mexican lightweight, who is matched to fight Flores at Hollywood on the night of January 10, made good in his first Hollywood main event when he easily whipped Eddie Hudson. Previous to that, Rudy had been fighting star bouts in Texas without a defeat after getting his discharge from the service. Among one of his Texas victims we find the name of Tony Mar, Mexican lightweight champion, who many Mexican fans think can beat Enrique Bolaños. Rudy under the guidance of Gus Wilson should go a long way.

Rudy Davila is named by the SPORT PAGE as the prelim fighter of the past year. Manuel Davila's little brother, has only had 5 fights, and in his sixth was given a semi at Hollywood by Charley McDonald. Jimmy Shans might have whipped Davila last night, but keep your eyes on this boy, who is a returning G. I. who fought in France, during the war.

The Tony Olivera versus Luis Castillo feud continues in it's 8th. episode next Friday at Hollywood in the Legion's initial 1947 opener. Their previous battles have all been thrilling encounters, and the two little midget battlers are very evenly matched. In their last battle at Sacramento they fought for Olivera's state bantamweight title, with the Mexican coming out the winner.

The Mexican has been here campaigning around this parts for the past 5 years with much suc-

cess, and for this reason the boxing commission sanctioned his title battle with the San Francisco portuguese, who is one of the few to hold a win over bantamweight champion Manuel Ortiz. Castillo has also met up with Ortiz, and in one occasion had the hot tamale from El Centro on the deck.

Castillo has been kept very busy of late up north, and after his battle with Tony next Friday leaves for Cuba, where he has signed for a battle there with the bantamweight champion of that country.

TOP TEAMS ENGAGE IN CYO CLASSIC

Another New Year's Day is upon us and all CYO followers are anxiously awaiting the whistle which will start things moving at Loyola High Stadium on Jan. 1st 1947. This year it is the CYO senior champions, the powerful Chelsea Tigers, and their runner ups the flashy Royal Falcons who will inaugurate the proceedings. In the main event it will be the Purisima Aztecs and La Soledad.

The Purisima Aztecs coached by Mr. Bill Kaiser, played in the Los Angeles Municipal league and, while they weren't a serious threat at anytime, they put up some very interesting games against all their opponents which included the Verdugo Knights, San Pedro Longshoremen, Chino, Blue Devils and Russian-American Vets. La Soledad Crusaders finished in second spot right behind the Omar Raiders in the CYO league. They dropped the duke to the Raiders early in the season and then picked up steam as they rolled along, hoping that the Omar boys would get knocked off but no soap. Later, in the CYO football carnival, the two teams battled to a draw, neither team being able to make much headway against the other.

The Crusaders coached by Mr. Hank Ibarra rate an edge in this tiff and I'll go on the limb picking them to cop the verdict 13-6.

The senior contest figures to be the "piece de resistance" of the day. The Valenzuela-led Tigers won the CYO senior title in one of the hottest games of the season against these same Royal Falcons 7-6. The Falcons haven't gotten over this their only setback of the season—especially when they lead 6-0 throughout the first half. Coach Mundhenk is priming his boys to avenge themselves and the Tigers are not too happy over the way the Falcons treated them in the Carnival two weeks ago. (The Falcons scored twice on them) So both teams are raring to go-my prediction Tigers 19 Falcons 13. (Mostly on account of a Tiger by the name of Cano).

Last New Years day the CYO set a precedent by staging "Bowl games" and all teams favor the idea very much. It appears that the CYO New Years games are definitely in as a part of the football program offered to all young men in California. On that memorable day Jan. 1st 1946 we saw the highly touted CYO Adult Champions the Verdugo Knights soundly trounced by the second place Chelsea Tigers 26-6. Dade is very fast, and Manuel will have trouble catching up with him. They are billed for 15 rounds.

Frankie Sinatra has announced that he will promote boxing at the Pan Pacific Auditorium next year. His first show in January looks like Joe Maxium and Francisco de la Cruz. Frankie Garcia's Mexican heavyweight is now in big demand since his win over Ragon Kinney at El Paso 2 weeks ago. El Paso wants Pancho against Adolpho Quijano, in a bout that will hit 20 grand at the border.

Larry Cisneros is wanted for Honolulu against Frankie Fernandez, the lad who in his last two fights had whipped Bobby Yeager, and stopped Nick Moran. Cisneros has already signed on the dotted line for a rematch against Frankie Moore at Oakland. Larry already holds a win over the Oakland Colored boy. Gus Wilson will make Larry a lot of money during 1946.

The Olympic opens the new year on January 7th with Fitz Fitzpatrick meeting Pat Valentino.
