PRESS CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. When time permits, credentials will be mailed. If not, press will call is located at the most southern ticket booth on the west side of Titan Stadium.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only and must be worn in plain sight at all times. NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the field and the team areas and these rules will be strictly enforced. Lighting is totally solar powered.

PRESS BOX: Located on the west side of Titan Stadium, the press box is an "open air" facility - cooled, heated, ventilated and lit by Mother Nature. A limited number of working spots are available with table and chair. Ample seating on adjacent bleachers is available.

TELEPHONES: There is only one telephone - (714) 773-3970 - available in the press box and it must be kept free for messages, other scores, etc. Ample phones are available in the sports information office after games. Additional phones should be ordered through the Cal State Fullerton business office and Mr. Joe Dusbabek (714) 773-2421 and well in advance.

TELECOPIERS: One is available on a page by page basis but only in the sports information office after games.

INTERVIEW ROOMS: After the game, coach Gene Murphy will be available to media in the equipment manager's office in the Fullerton varsity locker room in the gymnasium. Visiting coaches are provided a special dressing room on the west side of the hall at the north entrance to the gymnasium. The gymnasium is located approximately 300 yards south of Titan Stadium.

RADIO: A telephone will be provided the designated commercial station for each visiting school at no charge. But PLEASE take care of line charges. There are no enclosed booths.

SCOUTS: Seating is available in the top rows on the west side of the stadium immediately in front of the press box. Requests should be made at least one week in advance.

PARKING: Is FREE. By request, preferred location passes will be mailed.

HEAD COACH GENE MURPHY



In only 18 months, Eugene Vincent Murphy has made a tremendous impact on the entire Cal State Fullerton athletic program.

Murphy came to Fullerton in January of 1980 after a two-year stint as head coach at the University of North Dakota where his teams compiled a 15-7 record and climbed as high as No. 3 in the Division II national rankings. Since becoming a Titan he has hired a young and enthusiastic staff, erected a home football stadium, instituted a freshman-oriented recruiting program, spurred fund-raising in the community to record levels and currently he is serving as interim athletic director.

"I'm not worried about this interim period detracting from the football team's performance," said Murphy after Mike Mullally resigned in June for a similar post at Boise State University. "I may

be prejudiced, but I think we've got one of the best football staffs, any place, any where. We have outstanding coaches and leadership throughout our men's and women's program."

Murphy, 42, isn't interested in a permanent role, however.

"I would like to live to a ripe old age of 50 and the magnitude of the job is tremendous. Besides, my heart is in football. I don't have the expertise to do both jobs. There are folks who don't think I can do one."

The first Gene Murphy team at Fullerton was a deceptive 4-7. With one exception, the Titans were "in" every game until the final quarter as his players, mostly inherited from the Jim Colletto era, refused to learn the meaning of the word "quit". Included in the victories were a thrilling season-opening PCAA decision over Fresno State, a first-ever CSF victory at San Luis Obispo over Cal Poly's eventual Division II national champions and a last-second triumph at Nevada-Reno. His wide-open "squirrel derby" offense features fake punts, false huddles, naked reverses and passes to every legal receiver and it rolled up points even in defeat.

The fourth head coach in the 11-year history of Titan football, Murphy captured the community's attention by supervising and even lending muscle and sweat to the erection of a temporary on-campus stadium seating 8,700 fans. After 10 years of a vagabond's existence at four "home" stadiums, the Titans finally had a place of their own. The grandstands, which had to be dismantled for use at the Tournament of Roses Parade on New Year's Day in Pasadena, were installed once again by the players during spring drills.

Murphy spent a total of 16 years at North Dakota after growing up in New Jersey. In his 11 seasons as offensive coordinator, the Sioux won six conference championships and participated in three post-season bowl games (1966, 1972 and 1975). As head coach, Murphy won the North Central Conference championship in 1979 and advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs to earn conference coach of the year honors.

As a player, Murphy was the all-conference quarterback in 1962 after transferring from the University of Minnesota where he found himself playing behind Gopher star Sandy Stephens.

Upon graduation he served as a graduate assistant for the Sioux and then coached football, baseball and swimming at North St. Paul High School before returning to his alma mater to stay.

Murphy also spent five summers (1967-71) as an assistant coach with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders of the Canadian Football League.

Born August 6, 1939 in Jersey City, NJ, Murphy was an all-sports star at St. Peter's High in New Brunswick and earned all-state honors in football and baseball (shortstop). He was recruited by current Los Angeles Rams' coach Ray Malavasi to Minnesota under coach Murray Warmath.

He has two master's degrees from North Dakota — in physical education (1963) and secondary administration (1977).

Murphy married the former Kathy Fischer on September 25, 1964. They honeymooned at a Minnesota Vikings game. They have two sons, Tim (15) and Michael (11), and live in Anaheim.

SEASON PREVIEW . . .

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK — Tom St. Jacques broke eight school passing records last year but Bob Caffrey might have beaten him out of the starting job at mid-season except for a shoulder separation suffered in Hawaii. St. Jacques has the edge in experience and the ability to read defenses while Caffrey is more mobile and possesses a stronger arm. Junior college transfer Sean Blair will battle impressive freshmen Damon Allen and Robert Murvin for the back-up role.

RUNNING BACK — John Rayford leaves some mighty large shoes to fill — he was responsible for 61 per cent of the rushing yardage and 28 per cent of the pass receptions last year. But everybody else is back and kick return sensation Bob Reynolds figures to add some explosiveness. Ken Jackson and Tony Bushala ranked Nos. 2 and 3 behind Rayford last year and rate the starter's roles. Phil Brown and George Griffin provide experience in reserve.

OFFENSIVE LINE — Experienced with the significant exception of the guard spots where sophomores Larry Baker and Todd Nelson are being asked to replace the graduated Miller twins, Rick and Rod. Two-time All-PCAA center Harris Burnett anchors the line physically and in leadership ability. Returning at tackle are Alan Krueger and Steve Herring. Ed Wooster is fighting off the challenge of letterman Dan Monteverde and junior college transfer John Carpenter to hold down the starting spot at tight end. Freshmen such as Darryl Titsworth and John Parke loom as future stars on the line.

WIDE RECEIVERS — Should be one of the most improved areas on the squad. Half of last year's four regulars return in the persons of Norman Brown and Jeff York, each of whom was a newcomer to the position. Brown, a former defensive back, led the team in reception yardage and York, who went to UC Irvine to play basketball, is the speediest member of the crew. Kentucky transfer Brian Allen and freshman Allen Pitts are the heralded newcomers fighting for back-up roles with Terry Smoot, Vince Gamache and Gary Brown.

DEFENSE

DEFENSIVE LINE — Figures to be stronger than last year if the loss of PCAA star Richard Aguilar can be minimized. The rangy middle guard likely will be replaced by junior college transfer Craig Mitchell, squad member Phil Ofisa or possibly converted tackle Ray Carlos. There's even another Aguilar in sophomore Joe, Richard's younger brother. Returning tackles include all-PCAA candidate Mike Kennedy, Carlos and sophomores Andre Pinesett and Jed Henning. Al Clark is the only returning defensive end but the newcomers are quicker than last year's regulars. Greg Gary has moved from cornerback, Wayne Mitchell moves in from Mt. San Jacinto College and squad member Ken Lyng is challenging.

LINEBACKERS — Terry Hubbard is the only returnee at this spot but it, too, may be improved because of greater quickness. UCLA transfer Rick Senteno earned the votes of his teammates as a co-captain after redshirting last year and Saddleback College transfer Mark Quinn fits in nicely as another strong pass defender. Freshmen Micah Sims, Russell Maybury and Mark Bennett could see some action here.

SECONDARY — Solid at safety and green at the corners. Senior Doug Boswell is practically a playing coach at the strong safety slot and running mate Rodney Weber was one of the team's leading tacklers last year in a "nickel" role and at free safety when graduated Bobby Kemp moved to cornerback. There's a pair of two-man battles raging at the corners with Dale Thompson and Steve Belardi on one side and Lee Miller and Pat Riley going at it on the other side. There are several JC transfers waiting in the wings.

SPECIAL TEAMS — Bob Reynolds was No. 2 in the nation last year in kick-off return yardage but will be a marked man as a sophomore. The punt return team has plenty of room for improvement. Scott Vernoy returns at punter and his 71-yarder in the spring alumni game is evidence of his potential. Vince Abbott is gone so the placekicking duties will fall to either Santa Ana College transfer Jon Kotez or freshman Greg Steinke.

SUMMARY — The offense should be better with more experience at quarterback, wide receiver and the backfield. New guards and the ability to compensate for the loss of John Rayford are the keys. What the defense lost in experience via graduation should be countered by greatly improved team speed. How the team survives a rugged season-opening four-game road trip will set the tone.







Two emotional victories and a well-publicized Northern Arizona injury list led to a letdown by the Titans in game three but they asserted themselves in the final six minutes to register a 21-13 victory over the visiting Lumberjacks.

Fullerton had the ball inside the Northern Arizona 20-yard line four times in the first quarter but came away with only seven points on a one-yard plunge by John Rayford. Two field goals were missed (one after a penalty negated a good kick) and an interception was thrown. A 50-yard drive culminating in a 9-yard pass from Tom St. Jacques to Jeff York gave Fullerton a deceptive 14-0 halftime lead.

Given a life, the Lumberjacks rallied in the fourth quarter behind sophomore quarterback Scott Lindquist, failing to tie the game only because of a missed conversion kick. Their unbeaten record threatened, the Titans responded with a 10-play, 80-yard scoring drive climaxed by St. Jacques' naked reverse run of three yards around left end.

Rayford again was the heart of the Fullerton offense, rushing for 120 yards and catching five passes for 61 more.

The lightning speed of the Nevada, Las Vegas Rebels handed Fullerton its first loss of the 1980 season, 36-17, on the artificial surface of Las Vegas Stadium.

Fullerton scored first on a 51-yard field goal by Vince Abbott after a Rebel fumble. Fullerton's defense contained the explosive UNLV offense most of the first half but defensive back Charles Jarvis intercepted a Tom St. Jacques pass and returned it 39 yards for a touchdown and a 7-3 lead. The Rebs made it 14-3 on a 13-yard touchdown pass from Larry Gentry to Michael Morton before Abbott kicked two more field goals in the second guarter to narrow the gap to 13-9 at halftime.

With the Titan defense concentrating on a surprisingly ground-oriented UNLV attack, the Rebels struck judiciously through the air with backup OB Mark Gabrisch throwing a 48-yard bomb to Sam Greene for one score and an 18-yarder to Greene to set up another one.

Fullerton blocked a punt late in the third quarter but the ball rolled out of the end zone for a safety instead of a touchdown. Tony Bushala's 60-yard run set up the first collegiate touchdown pass for Bob Caffrey, a two-yarder to Phil Brown, late in the game.

Nevada was cited for 16 penalties, establishing a Titan opponent record, for 135 yards. Still, the Rebels' 19-point victory would be the most lopsided game of the season and the only one the Titans were out of before the fourth quarter.

Fullerton closed out its home schedule before an enthusiastic but disappointed Homecoming Crowd as Utah State scored a 28-17 victory behind the passing of quarterback Bob Gagliano.

Gagliano, a transfer from the defunct USIU program, completed 10 of 17 passes for 144 yards and two touchdowns in the first half of the PCAA encounter. He hit Ken Thompson with a 4-yarder to cap an 80-yard first-quarter drive and then hit James Murphy with a 38-yarder at the end of a 74-yard advance in the second quarter.

Vince Abbott countered with a 34-yard field goal when a long Fullerton drive stalled but that was more than negated just before halftime when Gagliano engineered a 53-yard scoring drive climaxed by Willard Browner's 3-yard score.

Bob Caffrey replaced an injured Tom St. Jacques and rallied the Titans. He hit Norman Brown with a 4-yard pass to make it 21-10 before Gagliano connected with Murphy from 4 yards out to ice the game. Doug Boswell came up with the longest Titan run of the season when the strong safety went 80 yards on a fake punt to score his first Titan touchdown.

The game capped a milestone in Titan football history. Home games had been brought to the campus after a decade of vagabond existence, bouncing from Cerritos College to Santa Ana Bowl to Anaheim Stadium and even to the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum for one date with Grambling.

It was also the third and final home game broadcast on a tape-delayed basis by KOCE-TV, Channel 50 of Huntington Beach. The play-by-play accounts of Bob Harvey and Marshall Klein and excellent production techniques were made possible due in large part to a grant from Carl Karcher Enterprises and the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Fullerton got a taste of Bronco Fever in Boise, Idaho, Iosing 26-11 to the eventual national champions in the Division I-AA category before a crowd of 17,052 that saw a game swing on three key plays.

The Titans took the opening kickoff and drove basically on the ground to the Boise State 30 only to come up short on a fourth and inches play which served to fire up the host Broncos. Both secored on a four-yard pass from Joe Aliotti to Terry Zahner late in the first quarter and padded its advantage on the second big play.

After taking a pass from Aliotti, fullback David Hughes fumbled for Boise when hit by Greg Gary. But the impact of the tackle sent the ball downfield where tight end Duane Dlouhy caught it in stride behind the converging Titan defenders and ran into the end zone to complete a bizarre 30-yard scoring play. Boise added another touchdown in the final minute of the half on a 2-yard run by Zahner.

As in the first half, Fullerton marched methodically down the field on its first possession of the second half only to stall at the Boise 12 and then lose even the field goal on a bad snap. The dejected Titans didn't get into scoring position again until it was too late. Bobby Reynolds caught a nine-yard scoring pass from Tom St. Jacques to climax an 80-yard drive midway through the fourth quarter.

This was the third meeting of the two schools in a rivalry that promises to become an interesting one. The Broncos are on the Fullerton schedule for the next several seasons and when they come to southern California this fall they will be shepherded by their new athletic director, Mike Mullally. He hired Gene Murphy while serving in a similar role at Fullerton for 18 months before moving to Boise this summer.

Fullerton maintained its winning season record (4-3) when Vince Abbott kicked a 21-yard field goal with 11 seconds to play for a 17-16 victory at Nevada, Reno. The Wolfpack's homecoming game was played in bitter wind and cold and included an early game rainstorm.

The teams struggled for position on the slippery field in the first quarter before Tyrone Justin's 27-yard punt return put Fullerton in business on the Nevada 44-yard line early in the second period. Tom St. Jacques passed to John Rayford (14 vards) and Jeff York (24 vards) to set up Tony Bushala's first touchdown of the year, a 4-yarder.

But the ground-oriented hosts came right back with freshman guarterback Jeff Ardito hitting Billie Byrd with a surprise 60-yard bomb two minutes after the Fullerton score. Reno drove 80 yards just prior to intermission with freshman kicker Tony Shaw booting a 34-yard field goal with 24

seconds to go.

Doug Boswell intercepted an Ardito pass and returned it 52 vards for a touchdown and the lead, which was pared to a single point when Shaw booted a 26-yarder at the gun ending the third quarter.

Shaw looked like the game winner when he kicked another 34-yarder with 3:44 to play but St. Jacques calmly drove the Titans from their own 20 to the Reno 3-yard line to set up Abbott. Key plays on the drive were a 19-yard pass to Jeff York and two Reno personal foul penalties.

This was the first "last-gasp" Titan victory in several seasons. The most recent nail biter had been a 32-31 victory over UC Riverside back in 1975. The only other game decided by less than a field goal was an exciting 41-39 Fullerton victory over Cal State Northridge in 1972.

Two critical turnovers deep in Fullerton territory gave Hawaii two easy touchdowns and the battlin' Titans never could overcome the early disadvantage in a 31-21 loss before 38 166 at Honolulu.

A fumble at the Fullerton 16-yard line resulted in a 16-yard touchdown run by David Toloumu less than five minutes into the game. Another fumble and one-play "drive" from the 18 produced another Hawaii touchdown 21 seconds later.

Conversely, it took 17 plays and a 66-yard drive before Fullerton got on the scoreboard with a 33-yard field goal by Vince Abbott late in the first quarter. Hawaii fumbled. however, and Bob Caffrey, replacing injured Tom St. Jacques, passed to Kevin Allen for a 31-yard scoring play to get Fullerton back into the contest. But after Fullerton made it 14-13 on another Abbott field goal, the Rainbows blocked a punt deep in Fullerton territory and the ball came down in the end zone where it was recovered for a touchdown.

Caffrey, who completed 19 of 33 passes for 209 yards before suffering a season-ending shoulder operation, kept the Titans close with a 23-yard scoring pass to Jan Deloch. St. Jacques returned to the field despite damaged ribs but was unable to get Fullerton closer and Hawaii padded its lead in the fourth quarter on a 3-yard run by quarterback Mike Stennis.

The Titans didn't leave the Islands until Sunday afternoon and it led to a short week in preparation for the annual skirmish with Long Beach State the following Saturday.

Long Beach State took advantage of tremendous field position in the early going and held off the Titans in the second half for a 20-10 victory at Anaheim Stadium.

Long Beach drove 43 yards on its first possession after a short Fullerton punt. Dan Duddridge ran seven times to take the ball to the 13-yard line where quarterback Kevin Starkey went to the air and hit Ron Johnson for a touchdown.

Another short punt set up Long Beach at the Fullerton 45 later in the quarter and Starkey struck quickly, hitting Johnson with a 42-yard scoring bomb.

St. Jacques, playing with injured ribs, ran 21 yards during an 80-yard drive culminating in a 3-yard run by Phil Brown to make it 14-7 early in the second quarter. A 76-yard advance was stopped by the clock at halftime with Fullerton settling for a 27-yard Vince Abbott field goal at the gun.

An interception of a deflected pass at the Long Beach 40 thwarted Fullerton's most serious second-half scoring bid and Ralph Petrosian, who had missed twice from inside 30 yards, added field goals of 44 and 36 yards for the 49ers to wrap up the scoring in the fourth quarter.

A simple five-yard offsides penalty on a kick-off might have been the decisive play in Fullerton's heartstopping 33-21 loss to San Jose State, a team the Titans have yet to beat on the

playing field.

Fullerton struck paydirt on the first play of the game with Tom St. Jacques hitting Norman Brown with a 79-yard touchdown bomb. Kevin Reddick intercepted a pass and Fullerton scored again on a 10-yard pass from St. Jacques to Jeff York and it was 14-0 less than six minutes into the game.

San Jose fumbled away the ensuing kickoff to the Titans but, because of the off-sides call, Fullerton was denied that momentum and had to kick again. With PCAA Co-Player of the Year Gerald Willhite leading the way, the explosive Spartans bounced right back to take a 19-14 halftime lead.

The Spartans advanced to a 26-14 lead in the third quarter before a Greg Gary pass interception set up a 38-yard scoring drive climaxed by Tony Bushala's 9-yard run up the middle.

Fullerton had a chance to take the lead when St. Jacques hit Jan Deloch with a long bomb only for the Titan wide receiver to fumble the ball when caught from behind at the San Jose 26. It took a 17-yard scoring run by Willhite with 2:07 to play to kill the Titans rally efforts.

The Titans' chances for an upset were hurt dearly by the second quarter loss of safety Doug Boswell, who received severe lacerations when the chain gang crew failed to properly drop their equipment on a sideline play. Boswell also would miss the final game against pass-happy Pacific.

The 1980 season ended on a frustrating note as Pacific completed a pass into the end zone with only 9 seconds left to play to score its only PCAA victory of the season in a game played on a wet field. The Tigers drove 81 yards on 11 plays in 1:37 with quarterback Harley Miller completing 8 of 9 passes and running twice for six yards to account for all the yardage. He was 30 of 45 for 315 yards and four touchdowns. Thirty completions established a one-game record by a Titan opponent.

Pacific's last-minute score stole the hero's role from freshman running back Bobby Reynolds, who sparked Fullerton in the fourth quarter. He replaced the injured John Rayford and on his first carry burst 34 yards untouched up the middle for a go-ahead touchdown. After the Tigers regained the lead, Reynolds returned the ensuing kickoff 46 yards to set up a 32-yard touchdown drive culminated in his two-yard touchdown with 1:51 to play.

The wet and cold weather contributed to 10 turnovers in the game, five per side, with seven of them coming in the first half before the rain stopped.

The Fullerton-Pacific rivalry will gain significance in the upcoming seasons as two young coaching staffs work to rebuild programs. Bob Toledo wrapped up his second year at Pacific, where he has concentrated recruiting efforts on the high school graduates. Gene Murphy and his staff have launched a

similar campaign in Fullerton.


