- 1. Minutes – minor changes, otherwise, approved by consensus.
- 2. No petitions were put forward.
- 3. Nelle Moffet was present to introduce the need for adding mission based objectives to the course form. She discussed the need, possible solutions that might work regarding tracking this data through the courses. Although not everyone was present for the discussion, the committee agreed that the data was important to accumulate. In the past, the Curriculum Committee was concerned about how criteria would be developed for determining whether a course met the mission or not. - 4. Phil brought up the recent passing of Senate Bill 1440, and its possible effects on programming at CI. Janet Rizzoli who has been tracking the activity on this bill agreed to send out the synopsis of the bill. She also reviewed the history and possible outcomes of this legislation. This is supposedly effective Fall 2011 and will require some reworking at the CSU level when the Community Colleges advance their information on the new AA degrees.
- 5. Phil introduced Barbara Duffin and everyone introduced themselves.
- 6. Liberal Studies issue. Alex McNeill attended the meeting to support their position on retaining the current UDIGE course in Liberal Studies. He gave the rationale and will provide additional research information to support the position. After some discussion, it was agreed that the committee would review the data and vote on the waiver at a later meeting. Kathy also agreed to have the GE Interpretation document posted at the website.
