

#### The Village Paint Project is Explained



The Board of Directors meeting and the follow-up Town Hall Meetings provided more perspective on the upcoming community paint project. More than anything, the presentation by the colorist from the paint contractor and the guestions from the residents made it apparent that the Board is going to have a real challenge choosing colors and trim that will satisfy a majority of our residents. We should keep in mind that Board Members are our representatives in making the color decisions and any concerns should be voiced to them through written correspondence. When the final decision is made, we should trust that their deliberative process was fair, impartial and in the best interest of the entire community.

It is a complicated issue. The proposal to repaint all 2136 homes in Leisure Village is before LV's Board of Directors, who will make the final decisions. The project has been considered by the current Directors as well as those serving on two previous Boards. The estimated cost for the project is \$4,500,000; the work is expected to take ten years to complete.

Some decisions have been made. A paint contract has been approved and locked in for two years. And bids for the labor involved in painting the first 218 homes have been submitted. However, the question of what colors – generally described as a warm palette or a cool palette - will be chosen for LV's makeover has not been answered yet.

Research toward a resolution to that question has been ongoing. Several presentations by a professional colorist from PPG, the corporation that will provide the paint, have been


The presentation of various color palettes by Pam O'Toole, a professional colorist with PPG Paint Corporation, drew a large audience to the AR last month.

made – including one videotaped and replayed on LVTV. Color palettes of possible hues were displayed in the Rec Center. Sample colors were applied to the wall of a Village house, and two Town Hall meetings have been held to give homeowners opportunities for questions and answers.

Repainting will involve choosing colors for the exterior walls

and also the trim and original front doors. Garage doors will not be repainted, nor will the brick work on some models. The BOD has not yet made a decision as to who will choose individual colors. Such choices were described at a recent Town Hall as "the hard part because we know there is a tremendous variance of opinion."



#### Women's Club Gives Inside and Outside the Gates





At every Women's Club meeting, members drop off extra change, food products, and toiletries to be donated to organizations outside of LV.

The generosity of one of the Village's largest clubs is easy to spot around our grounds: the sensor doors to the Rec Center, LVTV's sound system in the AR, numerous bus and golf benches, to name a few. What may not be as prominent are the donations from the Women's Club to support good works outside the walls – in Camarillo and Ventura County. "We are proud of our vision beyond our gates," explains Marilyn

Thompson, Co-Chair of the Club's

Donation Committee. "Since our

beginning, we've donated almost \$250,000 to organizations that serve our community neighbors. And we've paid for more than \$184,000 worth of projects inside the Village."

That totals more than \$407,000 in donations made by the Club from 1977 to 2018. "It's an impressive number," says Club President Lin Grant. The contributions outside the boundaries of the Village range from money for disaster relief by the Salvation Army, the local chapter of the Special Olympics,

the Somis Food Pantry, and money for local girls to go to a science camp. Projects inside LV included a new cabinet for Bone Builders, the redecoration of the MPR, and chairs for the Sewing Room.

The funds for this community and Village support come from the programs sponsored by the Women's Club. Proceeds from the Boutique and See's Candy Sales held regularly on Tuesday and Wednesday in the MPR go into the donation fund, as does money from special events.

"Committee members bring suggestions, explains Co-Chair Thompson. "We discuss them and make our choices. It's not a difficult process. It makes us feel good."

Two new features have been added to the 2019 Club donations. "Change for Change" asks members to drop whatever change they bring to each meeting in a basket for Food Share. And those who travel are asked to bring home the small hotel containers of shampoo and lotion to go to a local women's shelter.



first problem was simple; he got a job after his middle school classes as a dishwasher in a San Fernando Valley restaurant for \$1 an hour. It took a while, but eventually the slick bike was his.

Rick's contributions in the Village are as often cerebral as they are concrete. After he and his wife finished updating their home here, he began to look outside. "I saw old irrigation equipment, lots of lawn, and water being wasted," he recalls. He joined the Residential Landscape Committee and helped to revise its Guidelines to clarify what residents can do with garden space around their homes. It was a natural jump for Rick to volunteer for the Buildings & Grounds Committee, where he led the effort to plant a water-wise demonstration garden on the edge of the West Parking lot. "It includes plants of color and diversity yet conserves water. It's a sample of what can be done," he says.

Now Rick's mission includes

serving as the Co-Chair of the Architectural Committee, the important group that evaluates and decides on permits for exterior improvements and construction in the Village. "I want people to understand what they can do to their homes," he explains. He's proud of his work at - you guessed it – helping to revise the Committee's Guidelines. "People can get permits to do a lot, like remove wing walls or covering roof rafters in some models. I'm a behindthe-scenes guy. I like to work on solutions," he says. "Homeowners have lots of options."

Rick also has his eye on the future of Leisure Village. "Some of the systems like the sewers and irrigation are old as the hills," he says. "We don't have to tear everything up at once. But we should consider upgrading in sections." But he is quick to add, "This is a good place to live – secure, friendly, lots to do. Where else can you go to get so much green?" he adds with a smile.

#### Generous Members Give LV Golf Course 20 New Trees


With an ample dose of SoCal sunshine, continued early season rainfall, and a little luck, Leisure Village will see a growth explosion of healthy, new trees in coming years, thanks to the generosity of our LV Men's Golf Association.

Gerry Sarno, LVMGA president, said organization members began scratching their collective heads last May, regarding what use might be made of a small fund surplus sitting idle in the club kitty.

Member Harvey Harris immediately lobbied for an on-course new tree plan, Sarno said. "Harvey came up with the suggestion and everyone kind of jumped on it."

Noting that the LV golf course had lost its share of trees to the elements in recent years, the "Harris Postulation" was unanimously adopted, setting the mighty LV Association wheels in motion.

Sarno said an initial \$500 LVMGA tree allocation grew to \$700 once

Don Marquardt, golf club member, and full-time landscape architect in a "past life," agreed to ramrod the effort, elevating enthusiasm for the idea.

Marquardt met with Mike Undum, Association Landscape Superintendent, to discuss details, " ... And it worked out perfectly; I did the design, specified the trees (we wanted) and we spent about two hours driving a cart around the golf course spotting tree locations," Marquardt said.

The club's point man, as it turned out, had little reason for concern; all went smooth, as a well-oiled wedge. Marquardt said with Undum's assistance in re-prioritizing his work schedule, association grounds personnel were able to plant an allocation of 20 trees within a two-week period in December, just in time for the substantial rainfall that occurred in December, January and February to provide water needed for fresh, new trees to establish a strong root system.

Set at strategic locations throughout the course, most are expected

to flower for the first time within a two-year period, Marquardt said. Most of the new trees measure just over six feet tall at present. Marquardt estimates they will double in size within two years.

Plans are to continue installing trees on the course this year, as budget allows, Sarno said. "I think the board will propose that any surplus funds we have will go for the same purpose. Don says we could do this for two or three more years, easily, without running out of places to plant trees."

#### **Laughter is the Best Medicine**

A cure for many of our ailments is a joke

There is a nefarious gaggle of four elements lurking in the hood that tends to gang up on us at times: depression, anxiety, anger and fear, climbing into our consciousness to play havoc with contentment, especially when times are tough. It's a pack of negative emotions that can be our worst enemy, persistent in its attack on body and spirit.



Much as exercise can be used to invigorate and revive a sagging

body and spirit, however, there is a somewhat similar remedy for the damage done by this vile little gang of four: Laughter.

Not to be confused with the chirping giggles associated with coffee shop social sniggers, but rather the surging guffaw, a roaring howl that originates deep down in the lower tract.

There exists some strong scientific evidence that such laughter will relax the muscles, increase alertness and memory, reduce pain, lessen emotional stress, optimize function of the immune system, lower blood pressure, improve circulation, defuse anger and even produce those mysterious endorphins that provide a natural high. To expand on this statement, Google is your friend.

Other research suggests that children laugh 150 to 450 times a day, depending upon which studies are considered, while adults will laugh just eight to 15 times daily. Why? Because laughter depends largely upon surprise and incongruity; a thing can occur only so many times before it becomes invalid. As result, a joke is never again as funny as when enjoyed for the first time. Point being, as with the passing of years and exposure to popular culture ebbs as we age, there is less to laugh at, unless we actively seek to discover life's never-ending roster of surprises and incongruities.

To that end, the following is offered by teacher, humorist and author Stephen Leacock (1865-1944) as a four-step search engine to uncover ways to inject a dose of humor into one's life, and thereby life's laughter benefits mentioned above.

First, Leacock says (I paraphrase here) find a laughing buddy; someone who makes you laugh and vice versa – and spend as much time as you can with this person in humorous situations.

Tactic number two: include levity as a part of your surroundings by posting cartoons on the fridge, framing humorous pictures of family and friends, hanging or displaying light-hearted artworks.

Then, open up to see the humor in your own foibles and shortcomings, and tell those stories on yourself. Loosen unrelenting ideals a tad, to allow an atmosphere that promotes laughter in your life. "Comedy is tragedy plus time," Woody Allen said.

And finally, remember that laughter is contagious. So, associate with cheerful people and avoid the grouchy folk. One way to do this is to hang when you can with pre-schoolers. Young kids are natural laughers who don't put a negative spin on setbacks. Let their attitudes rub off on you.

To put Leacock's suggestions simply, just do that which is uniquely human; give it a giggle. I believe it was Voltaire who pointed out, "Man is the only animal who laughs, who drinks when he's not thirsty, and who makes love all seasons of the year." Live up to that proud heritage, fellow Homosapien.

This information goes to our security gate and alerts the staff to allow your agent to call the gate for you. This will let other agents through the gate so that they can show your home, as well as potential handymen and contractors who may need to do some correcting and upgrading.

When our Leisure Village Association staff receives this Authorization Form, an exterior inspection will be completed and you will receive a letter in the mail to let you know what exterior corrections modifications, permits will be required before a new owner can move in. It is very important that you forward this to your Realtor as soon as possible! Your Realtor will be able to assist you in getting estimates so that you can comply and complete the requirements before the close of escrow.

Your Realtor can also assist with installing the required safety items - Carbon Monoxide Detector, smoke detectors, water heater strapping, and a self-closer from garage door to interior of home. Taking care of these requirements before you put your home on the market will make the sale much easier for you.


#### **WORKSHOP FOR WRITERS**


#### MEN'S GOLF






We continue to make improvements, with an eye towards safe working conditions. The entire Woodshop dust collection system is now automatic.







#### Did You Know? Your Pharmacist is Golden!

Did you know that your neighborhood pharmacist is the most accessible, the most prescriptionsavvy, and the least costly health resource for a brief consultation? In fact, you can drop in most anytime without an appointment, and your pharmacist will interrupt whatever he or she is doing — to answer your questions. Retail chains as well as larger independent pharmacies are truly one-stop shopping centers. Specific locales try to serve their community of shoppers. The non-pharmacy aisles are equipped with most every item for which the family shops. And medical equipment, from canes to walkers, and from all over-the-counter medicinals (of just about every brand) are conveniently available.



Formerly we were required to make a trip to the doctor's office for periodic injections; no longer. The neighborhood pharmacy will oblige; sometimes requiring an advance appointment. All such conveniences portray advances in this particular part of the field of medicine.

Rumor has it that some chain pharmacies are now providing home delivery. And your pharmacist may save you money. Some pharmacy-assistants are aware of discount and assistance programs, as well as generic alternatives and brand name therapeutic equivalents for your prescribed meds.



#### **COOKING WITH LARRY**

#### **Chicken That Definitely Passes the Mustard (Sauce)**

I met Virginia from Village 16 in T'ai Chi. She seemed very friendly and we began to chat. When you chat with me, you have to always be prepared for the conversation to drift around to food. So, I asked Virginia if she liked to cook. I told her that I write a column for Inside LV and I'd love to interview her. She was game and offered her recipe for homemade tamales - something I absolutely love. So, we set a time to meet. We found that we have one very interesting characteristic in common - when we are invited over to someone's house for dinner or party; we always end up in the kitchen helping.

I have this theory that due to the diversity of the ethnic population in this country and because many generations have grown up not as "attached" to their mother country, they don't have a cooking connection to their native land. This is a long way of saying, Virginia's daughter asked her mom to show her how to prepare authentic homemade tamales and I was certainly ready for Virginia to show me. But as we chatted about

food and cooking, she happened to mention that she was making dinner tonight. I asked her what she was cooking. "Chicken in mustard sauce," she said. Since I figured it was easier to make that than homemade Tamales, here goes:

#### Virginia's Chicken with Red Potatoes in Yellow Mustard Sauce (for 2)

- 2 legs or thighs and ½ breast frying chicken Juice from two lemons Olive oil
- 4 small red potatoes quartered
- 1/4 cup flour
- **1** cup chicken boullion
- tablespoons of yellow mustard dissolved in ½ glass water Salt & pepper Chopped Parsley for garnish

Marinate the chicken in lemon juice, salt and pepper. Next day, drain the chicken, pat dry and brown in Olive oil. Remove from pan when just browned. Add potatoes to the pan and brown, then remove to a separate plate. Remove pan from heat. Add a tablespoon

or flour in the remaining oil (add more oil as required) and whisk until smooth.

Replace pan on a low heat and gently stir until the "roux" becomes lite tan. Add black pepper to taste. Add yellow mustard/water mixture to the pan, slowly stirring until it is infused with the roux. Return chicken and potatoes to the pan.

Add appx. 1 cup chicken boullion, or just enough to reach ½ way up the chicken. Cover and cook slowly until chicken is done, app. 30-45 minutes. Check after 15 minutes to make sure sauce is not sticking the bottom, stir if necessary, turn and add more boullion if required. Check for doneness by inserting a toothpick into the leg/thigh. Juice should run clear.
