Pre-Election Forums Set For Leisure Village

As the November elections approach, residents will have the opportunity to get information first-hand about several upcoming contests. Candidates for the Camarillo City Council will participate in an open forum in the Village on Thursday, October 11 at 7:00 p.m. in the AR. Nine candidates are running for three seats on the Council. Each will have the opportunity to make opening and closing statements and answer questions from the audience. Villager Dick Guttman will be the moderator. The candidates are Charlotte Craven, Bev Dransfeldt, Susan Santagelo, Jessica Romero, Shawn Mulchay, Mike Morgan, Jan McDonald, Daniel Goldberg, and Angus Simmons.

Also on the agenda that night will be explanations of two proposals regarding term limits for City Council members, an issue that is also on the November ballot. Resolution 2018-54 would impose a lifetime limit of "two four-year terms." Resolution 2018-21 would limit members to "no more than three consecutive four-year terms."

Later in October, Steven Z. Perren, former Associate Justice on the California Court of Appeals, will present to Villagers a non-partisan explanation of the eleven statewide propositions on the ballot. The subjects of the propositions range from a bond to support more affordable housing statewide to a question about implementing daylight savings time year-round to reconsidering the gas tax. 'Heard any Good **Books Lately?**

Audiobook narrations keep Villager busy.

It sounds like a routine question: "Read any good books lately?" The answer by Villager John Mayer is anything but routine. John responds with a laugh, "Yes, nearly fifty!"

What he describes as the "latest lap" of his decades-long career as a performer and voiceover commercial actor is John's work as a narrator of audiobooks. He's recorded fortynine so far, giving voice to subjects ranging from important figures in American history, contemporary journalism about Middle East terrorism, some fiction, even "Og the Frog" for younger readers. John says, "I found something I love, and I'm happy to still be working."

John began his career in film work (behind the scenes and on screen) after graduating from UCLA's Theatre Arts School. It wasn't long before his voice at-



during the Clinton years. Film narration and commercials followed, along with a stint with the Groundlings, LA's well-known improvisation group. "I knew I was getting older, which affects the jobs available. But fortunately, my voice didn't age," John explains. "And I was always open to work a new opportunity."

And so began his "latest lap." tracted attention. He recorded the John auditioned for and got his

in-flight tapes for Air Force One first job as the narrator for an audio book. "I got the job for being real," he recalls. "I narrate like someone telling a story to a friend; I do not act out each character." He admits it's not easy work. He records in a studio for five to six hours at a time. He familiarizes himself with the book, not necessarily reading every word before he goes into the booth, but getting the sense of what and how the author writes.



A Special Sight - The Africa Tulip Tree


There is a relatively newly planted boulevard tree that just began blooming in late August, this year. Most years it is an eye-catcher because this tree's early autumn flamboyant scarlet flowers are showing off, right now.

Your attention is directed to this lone LV species tree, the African Tulip tree. It is located along Leisure Village Drive, across the street from the south facing Village 13 roadside sitting bench. Very few ornamental trees in our Camarillo growing zones realm (Sunset Zones 21 & 23) have such a spectacular late growing season floral presentation. The tropical dark green compound leaves may be semi-deciduous in our Camarillo winters.

The tree's Latin binomial name is Spathodea campanulata. This is a tender, subtropical climate species that successfully adapts to our Village Mediterranean climate. Its origin is tropical Africa, and is commonly seen growing in Hawaiian rain

forests. This species tree is a bit of a rarity in mild climate, coastal southern California.

that sometimes cuts the blooming duration of the tree in Camarillo. Fierce autumn season Santa Ana winds can assault and wither its large clusters of orange-red, four inch cupped blossoms. But if nature is kind, a month or more of stunning flowers are a gift to behold. It can grow 40 feet or more, with a width of 20 feet or more. It is a well behaved tree, but is an uncommon sight hereabouts.



New Official Golf Rules Simplified


It took a half-dozen years of planning and discussion, but the Royal and Ancient, and the United States Golf Association, have finally crafted what is touted as the new, modern rules of golf.

Thomas Pagel, USGA's senior director of rules and amateur status, said with over 30 years of tinkering, the rule book has become far too complex, "...in trying to make the rules more fair, they have become too complicated," Pagel said, "and that's not good for the game".

As a result, new rules will go into effect nation-wide beginning officially on January 1, 2019. There is, however, a caveat here for Leisure Village golfers; the LV Mens Golf Association voted at its July monthly meeting to adopt immediately the revised 2019 rules, both on the home course and regulation courses played once monthly outside the Village.

Patricia Turner, president of LV Womens' Golf Association, said WGA members also play under the new rules. So, Village players can now drop from knee-high rather than shoulder- high; will suffer no penalty if a club should touch the sand in a hazard, or if a ball hits an unattended flagstick or accidently moves while on the green.

Lowering the ball-drop to knee-high is intended to keep the ball from bouncing away from the expected drop location, yet maintain some element of randomness. The flagstick rule will allow players to lag-putt or finish a tap-in hole without having to wait for someone to first extract the stick.



Also on the rules modification list are such items as: eliminating penalties for accidentally moving a ball on the green or while searching for a lost ball, allowing three rather than five minutes time to search for a lost ball, and players can now repair spike marks or shoe prints on the putting green. Lost ball/out-of-bounds rules have changed as well. "It's the skill we are testing," Pagel said, "We're not testing whether you can navigate around a shoe print."

Judged the most comprehensive change in golf regulations since 1744, when the first book of golf rules was published, it is the only case in history when the rulebook actually got smaller with its creation. There are now 24 rules, down from 34, and replacing about 1,300 Decisions (Ed. note, cap D intentional.) in "The Official Guide to the Rules of Golf" for 2019.

Oh, and one more thing; this from the golf oddity department to address one of those rare and pesky accuracies when a ball flips back after being struck, and hits the club a second time. The double-hit, one-stroke penalty is no longer. "About damn time, Sergio!"

Included here is not a complete list of forthcoming new rules, but encompasses most at our LV course. A complete list can be found at www.usga.org/rules.



At the Center of our **Health and Fitness**

There was no birthday cake, but LV's Fitness Center turned two years old last month. And it continues to attract attention as one of the stars of Village life. Nearly half of all residents have received key fobs after completing the required safety orientation; that means nearly 1500 Villagers so far, with more added every week.

Realtor John Baker says "I always make it a point to show people the Fitness Center, and their reactions are very positive. The response we hear most is 'Now I don't have to leave the Village to workout!"

Crucial to the success for residents and their ongoing fitness is the necessary focus on using the equipment in the Center safely. The personal orientations by the eight volunteers who show Villagers how to use the equipment safely emphasize the features that provide good exercise without putting the exerciser in jeopardy of getting hurt. For the most part, the system is effective. In two years, only five incidents have required security officers to respond to the Center, according to Recreation Manager Shelly Runge.

However, Shelly and the team of volunteers don't want residents to become complacent and forget the workout rules and precaution. Here are some reminders.

- 1. When using the treadmill, always make sure the safety clip is attached to your clothing. Always!
- **2.** Do not drop or slam the free weights.
- **3.** No street shoes, sandals, or flip flops should be worn in the Fitness Center.
- **4.** Don't drop or abruptly release the bars on the exercise machines. The value of the exercise includes the rigorous lift and the slow return.
- **5.** Wipe down your hands and the equipment with sanitizing wipes.
- **6**. Don't bring food or drinks other than water in the Center.
- 7. Don't be reluctant to ask questions about the proper use of the machines; the Recreation Office is a good place to inquire.
- **8.** If you feel uncomfortable, don't use the machine.
- **9.** Caregivers and guests (who must be over 18) must receive a safety orientation and can use the Fitness Center only when the resident is present.



CLUB IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Indeed, Vita, Harvey Is Real At the Players Guild

"Hm? What? Did you say something, Harvey?"

A famous line, that; It is from Mary Chase's 1944 Pulitzer Prize winning comedy depicting the wacky life and times of one Elwood P. Dowed and his imaginary nine-foot-tall lapin chum by the same name. "Harvey"-- immortalized in B&W celluloid by the incomparable Jimmy Stewart -- arguably the 20th Century's most beloved film actor -- is alive and ready for prime time in all its furry glory as next year's Leisure Village Players Guild feature, directed by Paul Newman, come next April.

Spring's big bunny notwithstanding, it is a cold, hard truth that Players Guild members are a category 5 force in the village any time of the year. Joyce Belcher, LV Players Guild president, said resident talent performs monthly -- every third Thursday evening -- in productions Guild members call workshops that are open to residents. "Each workshop can run 40 minutes to an hour and is free to Players Guild members." PG member/supporters, Belcher explained, are those who have paid a \$10 membership fee to support the Guild for a year, and any Village resident can join. Non-members pay \$10 per performance.

Every October, monthly workshop directors are selected by the PG board of directors. Production subject - comedy, musical, drama, etc. - and cast members are chosen by that month's director, and then, "they work hard for a month and a half in rehearsal before they open," Belcher said.

Set for Thursday, November 18, is "The Latin Show", Belcher said, a musical review directed by Vivian Hollander. The production features 23 singers and dancers performing familiar Latin music.

Production cast members are selected most frequently from among Village talent previously known by directors, Belcher said, but occasionally auditions are conducted for some parts. New performers are oft-times

chosen from a Player's Guild Actors Class conducted by Helene Cohen. Any LV resident can enroll in the Actor's Class, Belcher said, but there is a 12-student limit to facilitate time management requirements.

Nevertheless, full auditions are always conducted each December

to cast the major Players Guild April production. "It gives residents a chance to be on stage doing something they never thought they could do," Belcher said.

For those attending the April show, a \$10 admission is charged for any one of the four day performances.

COOKING WITH LARRY

What's the Wurst That Could Happen?

My son, the biologist, and I were having a chat the other day at the sushi bar and I asked him why an eel was shaped the way it was. He replied "Form follows function" which was a phrase coined by an architect but fits living things as well as buildings, he said.

I was reminded of this during my visit with Gudrun (pronounced goodroon with the accent on the 2nd syllable) from Village 32. It just seemed like the way she moved about her life fit that phrase - "form follows function"- and that's a big compliment. She was born in Czechoslovakia (into an affluent family) to an Austrian mother and a German father in the early 40s. So, when I asked her if she had any memories of being in the kitchen as a child cooking with her mom or dad, she responded that she wasn't allowed in the kitchen; the servants did the cooking.

Me: "So how did you learn to cook?" Gudrun: "Long story short; my family was eventually expelled from Czechoslovakia into Germany where my grandmother showed me around the kitchen; soon after my mother met an American Army officer whom she married, and we immigrated to the States. As a 9year-old in a new country, with no English skills and a funny sounding name, my teacher had the foresight to tell my mother that I would have a much easier time integrating, if I learned English as soon as possible. That was October 24, 1948."

Me: "You remember the exact date???" Gudrun: "Yes, and I was very motivated ... I wanted to know what the other kids were saying about me. So, I sat down and learned English with my family's help." By Christmas of that year, a mere two months later, she could recite "T'was the Night before Christmas" -perfectly.

Whereas her mom didn't really show her how to cook native Austrian or Czech dishes because she wanted to assimilate into this country, Gud-




